As you know we conducted a survey in North Carolina last week. Specifically we conducted 500 interviews on $9 / 11$ and $9 / 12$. The margin of error associated with the results is $+/-4.4 \%$. The results show the following:
$\sqrt{ } 64 \%$ of the voters approved of the job Senator Dole is doing, while only $24 \%$ disapprove.
$\checkmark$ Compared to our June survey, job approval increased by $3 \%$, while the number of people who disapprove dropped by $3 \%$ as well.
$\checkmark$ Name id improved by even larger margins. At this time $64 \%$ of the voters have a favorable impression of Senator Dole, while only $23 \%$ have an unfavorable impression. This represents a substantial 13 point net shift compared to June, when $59 \%$ approved and $31 \%$ disapproved.
Support for Senator Dole is broad based. She receives net positive approval ratings from all voter groups and regions of the state; this includes age, income and other demographic characteristics. Even in today's polarized environment, Senator Dole gets net positive ratings from the Democrats in our sample.
