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Poll finds incumbents with tenuous leads

Raleigh, N.C. – Large numbers of undecided voters give incumbents on the Raleigh City Council tenuous leads over their challengers three weeks from Election Day, according to a Public Policy Polling survey of likely Raleigh municipal election voters.

In the at-large race there are two seats up for election and voters can choose two of the six candidates. Incumbent Russ Stephenson leads among voters' first choices with 20% and he receives 7% of second choices. Mary Anne Baldwin is close behind with 16% of first choices and 10% of second choices. Paul Anderson is third with 12% and 6%. No other candidate received more than 5% of combined first and second choices.

Among 245 respondents from Raleigh's District A, incumbent Tommy Craven leads challenger Nancy McFarlane, 38%-25%. Thirty-seven percent are undecided.

Among 184 respondents in District B, incumbent Jessie Taliaferro (35%) leads over challengers Rodger Koopman (21%) and Angel Menendez (8%), with 36% undecided.

"The incumbents are far from reaching the necessary 25% in the at-large race and 50% in the district races to secure reelection," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling.

The survey also tested key issues in the municipal campaigns. Sixty percent of Raleigh voters plan on voting for the \$88.6 million city parks bond, while only 27% will vote against.

Sixty percent of respondents support raising the impact fee on newly built homes and business closer to the statewide average. Likewise, 54% said that they would be more likely to vote for a candidate that supports raising impact fees.

Eighty-one percent of voters said they would be less likely to vote for a candidate that received large campaign donations from developers. There was a more mixed reaction to the Sierra Club; 41% of voters are more likely to vote for a candidate endorsed by the Sierra Club, 30% are less likely, and 29% say it makes no difference.

PPP surveyed 875 likely municipal voters in Raleigh on September 17. The survey has a margin of error of \pm 3.25%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
