Obama on pace to win Florida again

Raleigh, N.C. – After going Republican in 11 of the last 14 presidential elections, Florida broke for Barack Obama as part of his overwhelming victory over John McCain two years ago, but only by two and a half points. But if the 2012 election were held today, even only a month and a half after the GOP's resounding successes at the polls, Obama would exceed that margin against all but one of the five candidates tested against him, including one of those successful, up-and-coming 2010 candidates.

A Mitt Romney nomination would make the race in the Sunshine State neck-and-neck, with Obama prevailing only 46-44, but the president would beat the other four by at least five points: Mike Huckabee, 49-44; Newt Gingrich, 47-42; and Sarah Palin by a whopping 52-38. He would also lead a hypothetical challenger, new conservative darling Marco Rubio, 48-40.

All of the Republicans but Palin, including Rubio, take more Democratic support from Obama than he does GOP support from them. The largest discrepancy is Romney's 21% of Democrats to Obama's 12% of Republicans, followed by Huckabee's 21% of Democrats to Obama's 15% of Republicans. But though they make up only 18% of the electorate, the president's huge leads with independents make up for his party-unity disadvantages and completely explain his overall leads. He wins independents by 44 points over Rubio, 41 over Palin, 36 over Huckabee, 34 over Gingrich, and 24 over Romney—remarkable considering how sharply unaffiliateds tilted right last month.

"Florida is emblematic of something we've been seeing in one state after another," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "Barack Obama is not very popular there, but voters still find him more appealing than the Republican alternatives."

Off the ballot for now, outgoing Governor Charlie Crist would be in a tough spot if he were to run statewide again; more (35%) are dead-set against voting for him than say they would definitely vote for him (26%). He is now essentially a Democratic-leaning independent. His 50-39 approval rating depends entirely on a huge 70-26 from independents and 54-30 from Democrats to offset the 36-54 from his former party.

PPP surveyed 1,034 Florida voters from December 17^{th} to 20^{th} . The survey's margin of error is +/-3.0%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
