

Interviews with 700 adult Americans conducted by telephone by Opinion Research Corporation on May 2, 2011. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

The sample also includes 649 interviews among registered voters (plus or minus 4 percentage points).
