<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for decisions, opinions, and orders of administrative agencies.

## **Administrative regulations**

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for rules made by administrative agencies under the authority delegated by statute.

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for voluntary declarations of facts written down and sworn to before an officer authorized to administer oaths, such as a notary public.

## **By-laws**

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for rules or administrative provisions adopted by an organization for its internal governance and its external dealings.

#### **Casebooks**

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for law school textbooks containing leading court decisions in a particular field, together with commentary and other material useful for classroom discussion.

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for : 1. Instruments that establish bodies politic or other organizations, or that grant rights, liberties, or powers to their citizens or members.

2. The governing documents that set forth the basic terms of a corporation's existence.

#### **Citators**

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for compiled lists of cases, statutes, and other legal sources showing the subsequent history and current precedential value of those sources.

#### Claims

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for texts asserting existing rights to payments or to equitable remedies.

## Codices (Law)

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for ancient or historical codes (e.g., the Code of Hammurabi); the different Roman or Roman/Germanic codices (e.g., Codex Hermogenianus, Codex Theodosianus, Codex Justinianus/Codex Vetus); and the Codex Iuris Canonici.

#### **Commentaries (Law)**

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for scholarly explanations, interpretations and evaluations on statutory and case law, often including citations to other sources.

## **Commercial arbitration agreements**

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for contracts between two or more parties to refer commercial disputes to arbitration.

## **Concordats**

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for agreements between a government and the Roman Catholic Curch.

## Consilia

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for expert opinions and legal briefs addressing questions of law during litigations in 14th to 18th century Europe, prepared for a judge or a party by Roman law or canon law scholars. Since the opinions were often given in response to a question (quaestio) by a judge or party, the titles often read: "Consilia sive responsa" (Opinions or rather answers). Jewish decisions (She'elot u-Teshuvot -- questions and answers) are entered under Responsa.

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for agreements between a government at any level and a non-governmental corporate body.

- 2. Concession agreement between the Government of the Republic of Liberia and Liberia Iron and Steel Corporation.

## **Indulgences (Canon law)**

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for texts granting remission by the Catholic Church of temporal punishment due for sins that have been forgiven.

#### **Intergovernmental agreements**

<u>Scope Note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for agreements between two or more jurisdictions below the national level, or between a national government and one or more jurisdictions that are not national governments.

# **Examples**:

- 1. Foster care agreement between the Citizen Band Potawatomi Indian Tribe of Oklahoma and the Oklahoma Department of Human Services.
- 2. Agreement on Murray-Darling Basin Reform [between the Commonwealth of Australia, four state governments and the Australian Capital Territory]

# Legislative histories

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for compilations of texts (committee hearings, reports, debates, etc.) that document the process of enacting a particular law or a group of laws.

## Legislative resolutions

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for main motions that formally express the sense, will, or actions of a legislature.

#### Loose-leaf services

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for legal publications that bring together primary and secondary materials pertaining to a particular field or topic. To maintain currency, they are issued in binders and updated with replacement pages, sequential newsletters, or both. Legal treatises issued in binders and updated with replacement pages are entered under Treatises.

# **Examples**:

- 1. Standard federal tax reporter published by Commerce Clearing House (CCH)
- 2. U.S. law week published by the Bureau of National Affairs (BNA)
- 3. United States tax reporter published by the Research Institute of America (RIA)

#### Orders in council

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for British royal orders issued by and with the advice of a privy council.

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for documents that grant sets of exclusive rights by a government to inventors or their assignees for limited periods of time in exchange for disclosures of inventions.

## Privileges and immunities

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for texts granting special legal rights, exemptions, or immunities to persons or classes of persons.

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for formal public announcements made by a government.

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for documents representing the arguments of one or more parties and other documents submitted to or generated by a court in a particular case.

<u>Scope note</u>: This heading is used as a genre/form heading for collections of decisions in Jewish law (She'elot u-Teshuvot -- questions and answers). Expert opinions prepared by Roman or canon law scholars are entered under Consilia.
