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
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


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
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"Managed Device" means a Device that is managed, monitored and/or protected by the Licensed Software but that may not actually be running the Licensed Software itself.


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#### 17.2D Use of the Licensed Software in a Failover Cluster Configuration.


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Failover clustering support can be configured two ways:

- a. Active/Active. This option allows all servers in the failover cluster to regularly process information. When a server fails, one server or more takes on the additional workload of the failed server ("Active").
- b. Active/Passive. This option is characterized by at least one server in the cluster that does not regularly process information, but waits to pick up the workload when an Active server fails ("Passive").

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
