And with less than a month to go before the event, we here at DiaCon HQ would





Dates and Times

DiaCon Alley starts on Thursday 21 July and ends on Sunday 24 July. Check in for accommodation opens at 14:00 (2pm) on Thursday. Registration desk opens at 16.00 (4pm). Opening Ceremony will be starting at 19.30 (7:30pm). Closing Ceremony will be on Sunday and end by 16.00 (4pm).

Membership, Accommodation and Extras

We can still take memberships until 16 July, *however* the last date we will be accepting bookings for accommodation is 1 July. You must have a membership number to book your accommodation.

The last date to book your Ball ticket will also be 1 July.
Please be aware we cannot sell ball tickets at DiaCon, they must be pre-bought!

Payment and Refunds

The date for sending international cheques has passed. We can no longer accept international cheques.

You can still pay via Google Checkout, with a debit or credit card, or by international bank transfer. Please note that international bank transfers may include a fee that you will need to absorb.

How to Apparate to Canterbury ... the Muggle Way

Air

London is served by five international airports:

- · London City
- Heathrow
- Gatwick
- · Stansted
- Luton

Rail

The best train station for the University is Canterbury West but you can also get trains to Canterbury East.

- From London: High speed trains run regularly from London St Pancras to Canterbury West. You can also travel from London Charing Cross, London Waterloo East or London Bridge to Canterbury West (about 90 mins). Or London Victoria to Canterbury East.
- From Dover: Direct trains from Dover Priory to Canterbury East every half hour on weekdays (times vary during weekends). Journey time approx. 30 minutes.
- From Ramsgate: Frequent direct trains from Ramsgate to Canterbury West.
 Journey time approx. 20 minutes.

Taxis are available at both Canterbury West and Canterbury East Stations. Fares should cost about £6. You can also get to the campus by foot or by bus.

Bus

There is a regular bus service to the University from both the rail and central bus stations. Return tickets cost £2.50, which can be used all day. These can be bought on board the bus. The Unibus and some Triangle buses, to Whitstable, stop at the University.


By foot

You can walk from Canterbury West train station (about 25 - 30 minutes).

Turn left out of the station and walk to the end of the road. Just after the 'Goods Shed' market on your left, take the footpath on the left and take the subway under the railway line. The University is signposted on blue signs from here.

Also one of my favourite HP moments is Draco telling Pansy how incredibly STOIC and MANLY he is then winking at Crabbe and Goyle. And when Hermione walks out on Divination!!

What is your favourite scene from the books?

The moment where Draco shows up with the Potter Stinks badges. It's so incredibly juvenile and yet he's obviously put loads of time into making cool magical badges. I just love that Harry gets so enraged that his nemesis fights him with arts and crafts.

What is your favourite piece of fanfiction/fanart?

SUCH A HARD QUESTION, DEAR GOD. Right now I'm nominating One Step by l3petitemort—it's a bit of really excellent Ron/Draco fic, funny and intense, set while Ron was away during Deathly Hallows. Having seen the seventh film again I was left with the massive urge to reread!

What are you most looking forward to about DiaCon Alley?

The programming looks fantastic, but on balance I think it's the meet-ups and sitting about in the bar. The size of it—big enough to meet lots of people, small enough to get to know them—is perfect for that sort of thing:D
