BACKGROUND

- 12.4 million people need urgent humanitarian assistance in Djibouti, Kenya, Somalia and Ethiopia.
- Famine has been declared in five regions of South Central Somalia and refugees continue to flee into Kenya and Ethiopia.
- UN Secretary-General Ban Ki Moon has made a global appeal for everyone to do what they can to bridge the US\$1.1 billion still required by aid agencies to reduce the loss of life.
- In Somalia, the UN and its partners are already serving daily hot meals to 92,000 people, provided chlorinated water for 500,000 people to prevent cholera, and the emergency measles vaccination campaign to reach 88,000 children (80% coverage) and 46,000 women is already under way. An additional 1.3 million Somalis are still awaiting for humanitarian assistance.
- In Ethiopia food aid is provided to some 3.5 million Ethiopians, and 226,000 refugees. In Djibouti, all the affected population is now receiving food aid; and in Kenya, 1.3 million drought affected people have received food aid, out of the 2.7 million targeted.

2. Give to the Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF)

Emergency Relief Coordinator Valerie Amos has allocated US\$107.3 million from the Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) to provide urgent, life-saving assistance to people in the Horn of Africa.

Humanitarian agencies in Ethiopia received \$25.6 million, \$52.9 million went to Somalia, \$22.7 million to projects in Kenya and an additional \$6.1 million went to Djibouti.

CERF is an emergency fund which helps UN organizations to provide immediate relief. Your contribution will ensure that CERF can continue to provide that immediate relief. The Common Humanitarian Fund (CHF) for Somalia, Emergency Response Fund (ERF) for Kenya and the Humanitarian Response Fund (HRF) for Ethiopia are 'pooled' funds that can be accessed by UN Agencies and NGOs to fund collectively to critical needs in our response. Decisions and allocations on priority sectors and geographical areas within the response are taken locally in each country.

The Financial Tracking Service (FTS) is a global database, managed by OCHA, that records all humanitarian contributions (cash and in-kind) to emergencies is available online at fts.unocha.org

To help ensure comprehensive coverage on FTS and give visibility to all international humanitarian efforts, please report your contributions to fts.unocha.org with at least the following information:

- Donor name (country/organization)
- Name of recipient organization (or mark "bilateral aid" for all assistance directed to the Government of the affected country)
- Contribution description
- Amount in US\$ or original currency

For in-kind support, please provide a brief description of the goods or services, and an estimated value in US\$ or original currency where possible.
