Rutgers Business School – New Brunswick

The Project:

A new \$85 million facility for the Rutgers
Business School, supported by a generous gift of
\$10 million from an anonymous donor, will be
constructed on the Livingston campus. This new
building will provide much needed space to
accommodate significant program expansion and
increased interest in the business degree. The
state-of-the-art 155,800 square foot building will
include classrooms, instructional labs, meeting
rooms, faculty offices and a trading floor.



Rutgers has awarded the commission for this building to Enrique Norten of TEN Arquitectos, an architect and firm of international stature. The Business School building will serve as a centerpiece for the redefined Livingston campus. Design is underway and construction is anticipated to start in spring 2011 with anticipated occupancy in fall 2013.

The new Rutgers Business School – New Brunswick will be a signature building that defines the entrance to the Livingston campus and anchor the planned expansion of the academic core. The building will be situated along Avenue E and Rockafeller Road with a portion of the upper stories spanning over the intersection to create an iconic gateway. The facility will accommodate over 3,200 undergraduate students in addition to graduate and continuing professional education students.

Academic Program:

Major program components include space to accommodate six business school academic departments and associated research centers with each organized in identifiable clusters with dedicated faculty offices, visiting scholar offices and conference/meeting room spaces.

Instructional space will include a business library and classrooms of varying size and purpose for the teaching of undergraduate, graduate and executive MBA students. Also incorporated are break out rooms for group study, an Executive Education Center and a Global Financial Center that features a showcase-quality trading room.



Common areas throughout the building include lounges, food service areas, event activity space and a business center which will encourage exchanges across disciplines, departments and specialties. Administrative areas of the building consist of the Dean's office suite and space for the undergraduate business program, MBA program and Career Management office staff.
