Bruce Marchionda

7th Season as Head Coach 10th Season Overall 95-12-1 Record

Bruce Marchionda, who carries 28 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and prep levels, enters his 10th season on the Hill and his seventh season as head coach of the Western Kentucky University swimming and diving teams.

Marchionda, who was called to replace Bill Powell when he retired in the spring of 2005 after 36 years at the helm of the WKU program, was an associate head coach for three seasons until replacing Powell.

The 2010-11 season saw Marchionda lead the Hilltoppers and Lady Toppers to second-place finishes at the 2011 SBC Swimming and Diving Championships. Marchionda was named the Men's Swimming Coach of the Year while senior Claire Donahue earned her second Women's Swimmer of the Year award. Under Marchionda, Donahue finished her career as the most decorated swimmer in WKU history.

At the conclusion of the four-day conference meet, the two teams combined to set 18 school records, tallied 22 NCAA provisional qualifying times and one automatic qualifying times. Donahue, along with 10 teammates, were named Mid-Major All-Americans by CollegeSwimming.com.

Donahue finished second in the nation in the 100-yard butterfly event at the 2011 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, the highest finish in WKU history. She finished the 100-yard butterfly in a school-record 51.68 seconds. The second-place finish improved on her fourth-place finish in the same event at last year's NCAA championships.

The Lenior City, Tenn., native finished her WKU career as the school-record holder in both the 100-yard and 200-yard butter-fly along with eight individual Sun Belt Conference titles, three conference championships and the highest individual finish at the NCAA championships in school history. She also participated in three NCAA Championships.

The WKU men's and women's swimming programs swept the 2010 Sun Belt Conference Championships, the Hilltoppers claim-

ing their first championship since 2007 and the Lady Toppers winning their third consecutive title and eighth in the program's history. Two WKU swimmers picked up Swimmer of the Year honors while Marchionda was named the Coach of the Year on the men's and women's side.

At the 2010 NCAA Championships, Donahue became the first female swimmer, and only the second person in WKU history, to qualify for the finals session at the national meet. She placed fourth in the 100 butterfly and 17th in the 200 fly.

Following the 2009-10 season, Marchionda was recognized by the ASCA as a Coach of Excellence for the 2010 season. The award is given to a coach who guides a swimmer to a top-8 finish at a USA swimming national-level meet or a USA collegiate champion.

Marchionda ended the 2008-09 season by guiding the women's team to their seventh Sun Belt Conference Championship. At the championships, the Lady Toppers posted nine first place finishes and nine second place finishes. The Lady Toppers also concluded the season with a perfect with 12 dual meet victories. Marchionda also guided Lady Topper Claire Donahue to the NCAA Championships and the 2009 ConocoPhillips USA Swimming National Championships, where the sophomore placed ninth in the 100 Fly.

Marchionda guided the men's team to a third place finish at the 2009 SBC Championships. There, the Hilltoppers grabbed eight top five finishes. At the conclusion of the season, Sean Penhale competed in the NCAA Championships placing 30th in the 500 Free and 24th in the 1650 Free. Additionally, the Hilltoppers recorded a 9-1 overall record during the season.

Academically in 2008-09, Marchionda had 21 athletes named to the SBC Commissioner's List and 14 placed on the SBC Academic Honor Roll.

In 2007-08, the Lady Toppers added to their list of Sun Belt Conference Championships after winning the coveted title with 775 points. Additionally, Marchionda guided the Toppers and Lady Toppers to dual meet records of 8-1 and 7-2 respectively and had both teams finish in the top ten in the final Collegeswimming.com polls, with the WKU men's team finishing the season ranked eighth and the women ranked sixth. Under Marchionda, seven student-athletes were also named to the Collegeswimming. com All-America Honorable Mention team. Claire Alexandre, Jessica Aspinall, Claire Donahue, Brittany Doss, Francis Gilmore and Sean Penhale all picked up the honor in 2008.

Academically in 2007-08, Marchionda had three student-athletes named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District IV team. Wes Brown was named to the first team and Mitch Miller and Jennifer Adams were named to the second team. Additionally, Brown was awarded an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship after the 2008 season, one of only 29 male student-athletes that competed in winter sports to be awarded the honor and the first WKU student-athlete to win the award since the 2006 season.

In his first season as WKU's head coach, Marchionda guided the men's squad to the Sun Belt Conference Championship after

an undefeated regular season topped off by a No. 10 ranking in the national polls. After finishing the regular season with a record of 8-1 and earning a third-place finish in the Sun Belt Conference Championships, the women's swimming and diving team held the number eight spot in the final CollegeSwimming.com poll. Ten school records were broken or matched during the 2005-06 campaign and two of Marchionda's seniors gained recognition for their achievements out of the pool. Lisa Ross was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District IV second-team while Karl Swanson was named WKU's male student-athlete of the year and the 2005-06 SBC male student-athlete of the year.


Before coming to WKU, Marchionda helped lead the Tigers to the ACC Championship in 1997 and for his efforts, Marchionda was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach-of-the-Year following the 2007 season. At Clemson, he produced 26 Atlantic Coast Conference champions, as well as, several swimmers that attained national and international awards.

Marchionda also has international coaching experience on his resume, spending time as a member of the Peruvian National Staff.

Prior to his stint as the leader of the Tigers, Marchionda served in coaching roles with the Clemson Aquatic Club, Old Dominion and Norfolk Academy. During his 13 years at Norfolk Academy, he won 15 Virginia state championships, and produced 21 high school All-Americans, as well as, 79 high school state champs.

Marchionda graduated from Westminster College in New Wilmington, Pa., in 1979 with a bachelor's degree in biology. At Westminster, he was a six-time NAIA swimming All-American in the sprint events. An Olympic Trials qualifier in 1980, Marchionda was also a three-time Master Swimming All-American.

A native of Aliquippa, Pa., Marchionda is a 1975 graduate of Quiqley High School in Baden, Pa., Marchionda and his wife, Hope, have two children, Jacob and Mason.

Bill Powell Assistant Coach Western Michigan, 1959

Bill Powell enters his sxith season as assistant coach on the Hill and his 43rd season overall at WKU. After announcing his retirement from head coaching on April 20, 2005, Powell remains a vital part of WKU's success in and out of the water.

After 36 seasons, Powell ranks second in wins on the NCAA All-Time list for Division I coaches after winning a total of 336 men's dual meets.

Powell came to Western Kentucky University in 1969 and founded the school's swim program. In 36 seasons, Powell's Toppers endured just one losing record, which game in the inaugural season when WKU finished 3-4, which included a one-point loss at Tennessee State. Since then, Powell notched 35 consecutive winning seasons, seven undefeated marks and seven one-loss records. The men enjoyed three undefeated seasons between 1998 and 2004 racking up a 69-8 mark (.896) over that span.

Additionally, the Lady Topper program experienced similar success under Powell. After a 5-7-1 record in its inaugural 1997098 campaign, the women's team enjoyed seven-straight winning seasons (two undefeated and four one-loss marks), while capturing five straight Sun Belt Conference titles. Since that debut season, the Lady Toppers have lost just nine dual meets, going 90-9 (.910 winning percentage) over the past seven years that Powell has controlled the reins.

Over the course of his career, Powell has earned 11 Coach-of-the-Year awards, including being named the Michigan High School Coach of the Year in 1968 and the SBC Coach of the Year four times.

Powell earned a bachelor's degree at Western Michigan where he won three letters as a backstroker from 1957-59, and then went on toe earn his master's degree from WMU. In November 2005, he was inducted into the WMU Athletic Hall of Fame. He and his wife, Joanne, have four grown children: Mary Beth, Anne, Dan and Katie and nine grandchildren, Pete, Mike, Will, Ike, Jake, Margaret, Dan, Isabelle and Edie.



Danielle Grobmyer Assistant Coach

Assistant Coach
St. Bonaventure, 2007

Danielle Grobmyer was named to the Western Kentucky University staff in July of 2011. Grobmyer arrives at WKU after serving three years as the graduate assistant for the University of Massachusetts, Amherst.

With the Minutewomen since 2008, Grobmyer was responsible for assisting in all aspects of running a perennially successful Atlantic 10 program, including training, stroke technique, recruiting and dryland. 16 varsity records were set during her three year stint as an assistant. In addition, over the past two summers, Grobmyer has served as a coach at the Longhorn's Swim Camp at University of Texas in Austin.

Prior to joining UMass, Grobmyer competed for St. Bonaventure University and served as a two year captain of the Bonnies. Grobmyer excelled academically for Bonaventure as well, being named to the Atlantic 10 All Academic Team in 2011 and was a member of the Commissioner's Honor Roll every semester of her collegiate career.

Grobmyer graduated summa cum laude in 2007 from St. Bonaventure earning a bachelor's degree in history. She recently completed a masters degree in Sport Management from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst.



Brian Thomas

Assistant Coach U Conn, 2009

Brian Thomas is entering his second season on The Hill. The Duxbury, Massachusetts native comes to WKU from New Jersey where he spent the past year volunteering with the Women's Swimming program at Rutgers University. During this time, Thomas also worked as a Product Specialist for Event Solutions International, a marketing firm based in East Brunswick, NJ.

Prior to his stint at Rutgers, Thomas served as an assistant coach for the men's and women's swimming and diving program at his alma-mater, the University of Connecticut. Throughout his two seasons at UConn, Thomas was the primary coach for the mid-distance and distance freestylers. During that time, Thomas guided the UConn distance crew to two varsity records, two NCAA "B" cuts and six top-16 finishes in the 1,650-yard freestyle at the 2009 Big East Championship, the most by any school in the conference. In addition to their success in the distance lane, UConn swimmers set twenty-seven varsity records during Thomas' tenure, posting a dual meet record of 28-6 and sending one swimmer to the 2008 NCAA Division I Championships.

In addition to his responsibilities with the Swimming and Diving program at UConn, Thomas also served as Head Coach and Director of Swimming Operations for The University Aquatic Club in Storrs, CT from 2005-2009. Over the course of four years, Thomas guided the USA-Swimming club program back to prominence on both a regional and national scale. At UAC, Thomas' athletes enjoyed many achievements including a Connecticut Resident Record, a National Age Group Top-Ten time, a Junior National and Short Course National qualifier and numerous Speedo Champions Series qualifiers. Thomas' time at UAC culminated with a top-5 combined team finish at the 2009 Connecticut Senior Open.

From 2005-2007, Thomas also served as the Head Coach of the Boys' and Girls' Swimming and Diving Teams at E.O. Smith High School in Mansfield, CT. Thomas' teams at E.O. Smith set several school records, achieved a top-5 finish at the Connecticut Class "L" State Championship and compiled a dual meet record of 28-8.

Thomas, a University of Connecticut graduate and four-year letter winner for the Huskies' Swimming and Diving team, grew up outside of Boston, MA swimming for Bernal's Gator Swim Club under the guidance of former U.S. Olympic Coach Joe Bernal and NCAA All-American Jay Craft.



Bob Benson Diving Coach Villanova, 1999

Diving coach Bob Benson enters his eighth season at WKU after being named the 2009-10 Sun Belt Conference Women's Diving Coach of the Year.

Last season, Benson guided freshman Caitlin Dean to the individual title in the one-meter diving event at the 2010 Sun Belt Conference Championships. Fellow freshman Kylie Ruiz finished third in the event. On the three-meter, Ruiz placed third with Dean in fourth.

In August 2010, Benson led divers Jim Ritter and Vinnie Rominger at the AAU Diving National Championships and came away with WKU's first AAU National Diving Champion. In the 3-meter springboard competition, Ritter took gold while Rominger earned the silver after a close battle. The championships started with the 1-meter springboard event. Rominger took third in the finals with a score of 381.60 while Ritter scored 372.45 to place fourth.

In 2007-08, under Benson's direction, senior Emily Waits claimed the women's one-meter diving title and senior Erica Wilson finished third in the event. Also at the championships in the women's three-meter competition, Waits' posted a second place finish while Wilson finished seventh. Benson was named the 2007-08 Sun Belt Conference Women's Diving Coach of the Year following the season.

Benson, who has seven years of professional diving experience, was a twotime team captain at Villanova. Benson attended Villanova from 1995-1999 after graduating from Penn Crest High School in 1995. 



Hilltoppers, Lady Toppers Finish Runner Up at 2011 SBC Championships

DALLAS, Texas - The Western Kentucky University men's and women's swimming and diving teams each finished in second-place as the 2011 Sun Belt Conference Swimming and Diving Championships came to a close Saturday at Rockwall Aquatics Center of Excellence in Rockwall, Texas.

The University of Denver swept both the men's and women's team titles with 1,009 points and 924.5 points, respectively. The Hilltoppers finished with 943.5 points while the Lady Toppers tallied 795 points.

"Obviously our main goal was to win both and with the men it basically came down to the last couple of events, and over a four-day competition, I couldn't be more proud of them," WKU coach Bruce Marchionda said. "On paper Denver was just supposed to win by a landslide and for us to be up by two points going into the last day and battling back and forth, I just can't say enough about the men's team and really stepping up and meeting the challenge.

"On the women's side we obviously fell short, but we had some great swims and a lot of school records."

WKU head coach Bruce Marchionda was named the Men's Swimming Coach of the Year and senior Claire Donahue earned Women's Swimmer of the Year honors for the second consecutive season.

"We got second place and I got coach of the year basically because nobody thought anybody could challenge Denver and they did it," Marchionda said. "We will regroup and our goal will be to win both next year."

Donahue capped her fourth and final conference meet with a first-place finish in the 200-yard butterfly event, touching in at 1 minute, 57.77 seconds. Donahue has won both the 100y and 200y butterfly events at the conference meet each of the last four seasons. Courtney Marx (2:06.56) and Chelsea Larsen (2:07.12) also finished in the top 16.

Lady Toppers sophomore Hilary Mishler set a new SBC meet, school and conference record in the 200y backstroke on her way to a first-place finish in the event. Mishler's time of 1:56.85 also represented an NCAA provisional qualifying mark. Alex Van Oost also finished in the top five with a time of 1:58.66.

WKU senior Claire Alexandre finished runner up in the 100y freestyle with a mark of 50.16, just four-hundredths of a second behind Denver's Rachel Burns.

Samantha Holmes was the top finisher for the Lady Toppers in the 1,650 freestyle as was Stephanie Martin in the 200y breaststroke. Holmes placed fifth with a time of 17:05.43 while Martin finished fourth with a time of 2:17.98. In the preliminaries of the 200y breast, Martin posted a time of 2:17.00, setting a new school record.

The quartet of Donahue, Kristiana Feeser, Alexandre and Meredith Dement posted a school-record time of 3:22.14 in the women's 400y freestyle relay.

In women's 3-meter diving, sophomore Caitlin Dean placed third with a score of 271.25. Margaret Stringer and Kylie Ruiz also placed in the top 10.

Hilltoppers senior Nick Slattery capped his final conference meet by setting a school record in the 200y butterfly, posting a time of 1:46.56, breaking the previous record of 1:47.73 set by Endi Babi in 2009. Adam Pendry, Neal Rushing and Ethan Arave all placed in the top 10.

The 200y backstroke event was the strongest event of the night on the men's side. The Hilltoppers tried to keep pace with the Pioneers by placing five swimmers in the top eight, led by sophomore Adam Dajka. Dajka placed third with a time of 1:46.40. David Menchinger (1:47.01) finished fourth followed by Arave (1:48.46) in fifth, Cameron Watkins (1:49.71) in seventh and Chris Housden (1:51.53) in sixth.

WKU sophomore Billy Kunkel picked up a third-place finish in the 100y freestyle, posting a 44.72 and classmate Luke Musser finished sixth in the 200y breastroke with a time of 2:01.96. Both were the top finishers in their event for the Hilltoppers.

In the 1,650y freestyle event, David Rayner led the way for WKU with a fifth-place finish, touching in at 15:51.41. Pendry (15:57.61) and Rushing (15:59.82) finished sixth and seventh, respectively.

Over the four-day meet, the two teams combined to set 18 school records, tallied 22 NCAA provisional qualifying times and one automatic qualifying time.

"Right now what we are going to do is regroup and see who makes the NCAA meet and prepare them to do that so that Western Kentucky gets the name out and gets national recognition," Marchionda said."
