Directions to Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium

From I-65 North (heading south): Take the first Bowling Green exit (exit 28) at the Corvette Plant and Corvette Museum onto the connector road that will take you to US 31-W. Follow the signs for US 31-W South — Bowling Green. Stay on the four-lane US 31-W South (Louisville Road) to the stop light at the bridge over Barren River. 31-W turns left at that stoplight; however, you want to continue straight through the light on Louisville Road which will split into two one-way streets at Sixth Ave. The one-way SW is Adams Street. When the one-way streets merge into the four-lane University Blvd., you will be on the NW corner of the Western Kentucky University campus (railroad on right, WKU on left). Go straight through the first stoplight (at Old Morgantown Road/Dogwood Drive) and the University Parking Structure will be the first building on your left, followed immediately by the back side of E.A. Diddle Arena, the Arena/Stadium Parking Lot and L.T. Smith Stadium.

From the Cumberland Parkway: Take I-65 South at the west end of the Cumberland Parkway and follow the directions for I-65 (heading south) above.

From I-65 South (heading north): Take the first Bowling Green exit (The Natcher Parkway, exit 20) and proceed on the Natcher Parkway to the Bowling Green-Franklin exit (exit 5 — US31-W). At the end of the ramp, turn right (north) onto US 31-W (Nashville Road) into Bowling Green. The second stoplight after passing through the Campbell Lane intersection (Bowling Green Mall is on your left and a Burger King and Kroger are on the right at the Campbell Lane intersection) will be University Blvd. (to the left). Turn left (there is a left-turn lane and arrow) onto University Blvd., to the Western Kentucky University campus. You will pass through two stoplights and the athletics complex will then be on your right. You will pass Nick Denes Field (baseball) first, followed by the University Tennis Courts and L.T. Smith Stadium. The Arena/Stadium Parking Lot and E.A. Diddle Arena will be on your right just past the Stadium.

From US 68-80 West (heading east): Follow US 68-80 (Russellville Road) into Bowling Green. You will pass under a railroad overpass (with its "Welcome to Western" sign) and then, at the stoplight, both the center and left lanes turn left. You want to turn left at that light onto University Blvd. The athletics complex will then be on your right — first Nick Denes Field (baseball), then the University Tennis Courts and L.T. Smith Stadium. The Arena/Stadium Parking Lot and E.A. Diddle Arena will be on your right just past the Stadium.

From the Natcher Parkway (heading south): Take the first Bowling Green exit (US 231, exit seven) and turn right onto Morgantown Road (US 231) into Bowling Green. You will cross Veterans Memorial Lane and pass Warren Central High School (on the right). When you reach the junction of US 231 and US 68-80 (Burger King on your left, Holley Corporation on your right and Arby's straight ahead), turn left onto Russellville Road and follow the directions for US 68-80 above from the railroad overpass ("Welcome to Western" sign) on in to Diddle Arena/Smith Stadium.

MESSAGE TO THE MEDIA

HOUCHENS INDUSTRIES-L.T. SMITH STADIUM PRESS BOX

The East side of Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium is topped by a press box designed to meet the needs of members of the media who staff Hilltopper football. The Press Box staff will supply programs, flip cards, pregame notes and complete statistical information.

A pregame meal and soft drinks are also available on the ground floor of the Smith Stadium East side in the media work room.

Complimentary wireless internet access will also be available to media members needing to get online.

Admission to the Press Box will be granted only to authorized persons with WKU Press Box passes, which must be reserved in advance (no other press passes of any kind will be honored). Each credential entitles the authorized bearer to the full courtesies and complete services of the Press Box. Press Box tickets are non-transferable. Spouses, dates and non-workers are not permitted in the media working areas.

SIDELINES

WKU sideline passes will be issued to authorized personnel and must be displayed at all times. No free-lance photographers will be admitted to the sidelines or to the Press Box. A sideline pass will admit the bearer to the Press Box and media work room for programs, stats, refreshments, etc.

Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines within the team area.

In an effort to insure the best possible working conditions for media photographers, security personnel and WKU athletic staff will be patrolling the sidelines, and will escort non-credentialed media from the sidelines.

UNAUTHORIZED USE OF MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials will be issued to working media only. Credentials are non-transferable. Use by anyone other than members of the working media are unauthorized, and those credentials will be revoked immediately. News organizations allowing unauthorized individuals to use credentials will have their credentials revoked for the remainder of the year.

ADDITIONAL INTERVIEWS

In addition to Monday's media luncheon, WKU student-athletes and coaches will be available for in-person or phone interviews after practice on select days. Contact WKU Athletic Media Relations for those availabilities.

All interview requests must be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations office. Student-athlete's phone number will not be given out.

RADIO COVERAGE

Radio broadcast permission must be obtained in advance, along with Press Box reservations. WKU maintains two courtesy lines for use by schools who can provide reciprocal arrangements for the Big Red Radio Network. Other arrangements for installation of broadcast lines should be made well in advance with WKU Athletic Media Relations and WKU Telephone Communications (270-745-6370).

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS / PICKUP

Credentials for media on a list submitted by the visiting SID will be sent to the school's media relations office early in game week. No other passes will be mailed. Credentials may be picked up at the Athletic Media Relations Office in E.A. Diddle Arena (Room 1459) prior to game day; or, on game day at the Media-Will Call (Reservations) window at Gate 4 at Smith Stadium. The window will open 90 minutes prior to each contest.

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking is available on a limited basis. Reservations must be made well in advance with WKU Athletic Media Relations.

WEEKLY PRESS LUNCHEON

Head coach Willie Taggart and select student-athletes will be available to the media each Monday of a game week in the E.A. Diddle Arena media room. Lunch will be served at 11:30 a.m. (CT) in the Diddle Arena Media Room, followed by interviews.

ADDITIONAL INTERVIEWS

In addition to Monday's media luncheon, WKU student-athletes and coaches will be available for in-person or phone interviews after practice on select days. Contact WKU Athletic Media Relations for those availabilities.

All interview requests must be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations office. Student-athlete's phone number will not be given out.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

The WKU locker room is closed to the media. Head coach Willie Taggart and select players will be available in the media work room after postgame radio shows, which is done on the field outside the Topper locker room.

The visitors' dressing room is located under the east side of the stadium. Contact the visiting SID for post-game locker room policies.

On the road, the Hilltopper locker room will remain closed — WKU will adhere to the home team's postgame interview policies whenever possible.

SUN BELT TELECONFERENCE

WKU head coach Willie Taggart will participate in the Sun Belt Conference's weekly teleconference. The teleconferences will be conducted each Monday beginning Aug. 30 from 10:30-11:30 a.m. CT. Taggart's scheduled time is 11:20 a.m. CT each Monday. Media representatives wishing to participate in the teleconference should contact the league communications staff for further details.

WILLIE TAGGART

**Head Coach

Willie Taggart was named head football coach at Western Kentucky University on November 23, 2009. In his first season as head coach, he helped lead WKU to road wins at Louisiana-Lafayette and Arkansas State and running back Bobby Rainey was named Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year after ranking third in the nation in rushing (137.4 yards per game/1,649 total rushing yards). Rainey also led the nation in rushing attempts (340) and was named Honorable Mention All-American by SI.com, while Willie McNeal was named Freshman All-American as a kick-off returner. Each of Taggart's first two recruiting classes has been named No. 1 in the Sun Belt Conference by Rivals.com.

Before joining the Hilltoppers, Taggart served as running backs coach at Stanford from 2007-09. He previously spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at WKU from 1999-2006 and served as co-offensive coordinator for WKU's 2002 I-AA National Championship team. A standout player at quarterback who set 11 school records for the Hilltoppers from 1995-98, Taggart is one of only four players in WKU's 92-year football history to have his jersey retired. He became WKU's 17th head football coach, but only the seventh since 1948.

Taggart, who joined the Stanford coaching staff following a 1-11 season in 2006, was instrumental in the development of the Cardinal offense and running game. Stanford, ranked as high as 14th in the nation by the Associated Press in 2009, posted an 8-4 regular season record with wins over nationally ranked Southern Cal and Oregon. Stanford led the Pac 10 in total offense (441.4 ypg.) while ranking second in the conference and 11th in the nation in rushing offense (224.3 ypg.). Stanford's 2,692 rushing yards in 2009 broke the school's single-season rushing yardage mark that has stood since 1949 (2,481).

The Cardinal were led by senior running back Toby Gerhart, who under Taggart's tutelage ranked second in the nation in rushing (144.7 ypg.) and earned the Doak Walker Award given to the nation's top running back. Gerhart carried a cumulative 3.25 grade point average as a management, science and technology major. He also rushed for a Stanford single-season record 1,736 yards and 26 touchdowns in 12 games in 2009, breaking his own single-season rushing record of 1,136 yards set in 2008, and was one of only five players invited to New York City for the 2009 Heisman Trophy Award presentation. He finished second in the final balloting in the closest race in the award's 75-year history. Gerhart, who was also named the Pac 10 Offensive Player of the Year, was one of only two Pac 10 players named to the first team on both the All-Pac-10 Team and the Pac-10 All-Academic Football Team. The Cardinal's Sun Bowl appearance in 2009 marked the school's first bowl game since 2001.

Taggart was at the helm of the Cardinal running game that finished second in the Pac-10 Conference in rushing offense in 2008, averaging 199.6 yards a game on the ground. Stanford's season rushing total of 2,395 yards was the third-highest mark in school history. In addition, Taggart's work with Gerhart helped the junior rush for a then single-season school record of 1,136 yards, as Gerhart became just the fifth running back in school history to go over the 1,000-yard mark. Gerhart had one career start prior to the 2008 season. A tireless recruiter, Taggart was responsible for recruiting Florida, Georgia and Kentucky for the Cardinal along with Riverside County, California.

Prior to his arrival at Stanford, Taggart spent the previous eight seasons on the WKU coaching staff (1999-2006) and helped guide the Hilltoppers to eight consecutive winning campaigns during the stretch. He worked with current Stanford head coach Jim Harbaugh in his first three seasons of coaching from 1999-2001. Taggart started his coaching career as WKU's wide receivers coach in 1999 before working with the quarterbacks from

2000-06. He was also the co-offensive coordinator in 2001 and 2002, helping lead the Hilltoppers to the Division I-AA national championship in 2002, and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2003.

Under Taggart's guidance from 2003-06, quarterback Justin Haddix set school career records with 8,890 yards of total offense, a 57.1 completion percentage, 50 touchdowns and a 137.28 pass efficiency rating. Haddix also finished his career ranked second all-time on the Hill with 541 completions and 7,929 yards passing.

Taggart helped coach an offensive unit that set school records for points (432), total yards (5,479) and first downs (263) en route to the 2002 NCAA Division I-AA national championship. The Hilltoppers ranked second in the nation in pass efficiency and sixth in rushing, and averaged 38.8 points per contest in four playoff victories.

In Taggart's first year calling plays in 2000, WKU ran for 293.4 yards per contest, leading the Gateway Football Conference and ranking second in the country in the category as WKU claimed the league title and advanced to the quarterfinals of the I-AA playoffs. In his first season in 1999, WKU ranked eighth in the nation and first in the conference in rushing.

Taggart's efforts helped WKU quarterbacks earn all-conference mention in three consecutive seasons - Jason Johnson (2000), Donte Pimplepton (2001) and Jason Michael (2002).

Taggart also spent his collegiate playing days at WKU (1995-98) and was only the third WKU athlete in the past half-century to hold down the quarterback slot for the Hilltoppers for four straight years. Taggart - who set 11 WKU school records - had his jersey retired on October 23, 1999. He currently is WKU's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns (47), ranks second in scoring (286 points), pass efficiency rating (127.71) and rushing yards (3,997), is tied for third in most 100-yard rushing games (17), and is tied for fourth in touchdown passes (30). His rushing yards were the most in NCAA Division I history at the time for a quarterback.

In each of his last two collegiate seasons, he was a finalist for the prestigious Walter Payton Award which is an honor given annually to the top offensive player in I-AA football. Taggart finished fourth in the balloting in 1997 and seventh as a senior the following year. An All-American as a senior, he was also the 1998 I-AA Independents' Offensive Player of the Year. Taggart was recruited to WKU by Jim Harbaugh to play for his father, Jack.

Taggart graduated from WKU with a bachelor's degree in social sciences in 1998.

As a prep standout at Manatee (Fla.) High School, he was a first team all-state and all-conference selection as a senior after guiding the Hurricanes to the state 5A Championship game. He led MHS to the state title his junior season and helped the school post a 26-4 record during that two-year span while recording more than 3,000 yards passing and 975 yards on the ground.

Zach Azzanni begins his first season on the WKU coaching staff in 2011. He will serve as the Hilltoppers' offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach.

Azzanni comes to the Hill from the University of Florida, where he spent the 2010 season coaching the Gator wide receivers. Prior to going to Gainesville, he spent three seasons as the assistant head coach and receivers coach at his alma mater, Central Michigan.

Azzanni's 2009 wide receiver unit was one of the most prolific in the college football. Bryan Anderson established an NCAA mark with a catch in 53 consecutive games, while teammate Antonio Brown has a streak of 40 straight games with a catch. Anderson and Brown combined for 49 career touchdown receptions, tied for the top active duo in the country for scoring receptions. Anderson has totaled more than 3,500 yards receiving in his career and Brown eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark for the second time and surpassed 3,000-yard receiving for his career. Two of his receivers at CMU went on to sign NFL contracts, including Antonio Brown who started for the Pittsburgh Steelers in Super Bowl XLV.

Prior to joining the Central Michigan Staff, Azzanni spent the previous six seasons at Bowling Green. He coached the wide receivers from 2003-06, leading a group that broke nearly every school receiving record. He coached Charles Sharon; the school's all-time leader in receptions (232), receiving yards (3,450) and touchdown catches (34). In 2004 he coached a group that produced four receivers with 1,000 yards receiving. Five of his receivers at Bowling Green went on to sign professional contracts.

Known for developing talent, Azzanni's 2004 receiving corp at Bowling Green was ranked third best in the nation by *Athlon Sports*. His 2009 group was ranked ninth in the nation by the same publication, and helped him to be named college football's wide receiver coach of the year.

No stranger to success on the field as both a player and a coach, Azzanni has been part of nine that have either won conference championships or played in bowl games. As a player, he was part of the 1994 Central Michigan squad that won the Mid American Conference championship and played in the Las Vegas Bowl. He also coached in the 2003 Motor City Bowl and 2004 GMAC Bowl at Bowling Green. He coached in two more Motor City Bowls at CMU in 2007 and 2008, and was part of the staffs at Florida for the 2010 Allstate Sugar Bowl and 2011 Outback Bowl. Additionally, he coached conference championship teams at Valparaiso, BGSU and CMU.

He graduated with a degree in Sports Management in 1999 from Central Michigan. Azzanni and his wife, Julia, have two daughters: Ava and Lyla.

Lance Guidry, who coached defensive backs at Miami (Ohio) the last two seasons and served as interim head coach for the RedHawks' 35-21 win over Middle Tennessee in the 2011 GoDaddy.com Bowl, was named WKU's defensive coordinator on Feb. 4, 2011.

The bowl win enabled Miami to become the first school in Football Bowl Subdivision history to go from double-digit losses to double-digit wins in consecutive seasons as Miami posted a 10-4 record in 2010 after going 1-11 in 2009. Guidry received national acclaim for his passionate pre-game locker room speech prior to the GoDaddy.com Bowl.

Miami finished 30th in the nation in the final 2010 Associated Press poll while leading the Mid-American Conference in pass efficiency defense, ranking second in rushing defense and sacks, and finishing third in total defense and scoring defense. The RedHawks also ranked 29th in the nation in total defense.

Miami won the Mid-American Conference East Division in 2010 with a 7-1 record, then went on to win the MAC Championship on Dec. 3 over 23rd-ranked Northern Illinois, 26-21, at Detroit's Ford Field. Just one year before, in 2009, the RedHawks finished 1-7 in MAC play. The only other time a MAC team went from "worst to first" occurred in 1971 and '72 when last-place Kent State (0-5) captured the league title the following season (4-1).

The RedHawks nine-game improvement from 2009 to 2010 tied Hawaii (0-12 in 1998 to 9-4 in 1999) and Stanford (1-7-1 in 1939 to 10-0 in 1940) for the greatest one-season improvement in wins in NCAA history.

Guidry, a 1995 graduate of McNeese State (La.), joined the Miami staff after serving as the defensive secondary coach at McNeese State in 2008. A veteran coach in Louisiana football's high school ranks, Guidry served as secondary coach at Leesville High School in 1995 and 1996, helping lead the Wampus Cats to the state championship game in 1995. He also coached defensive backs at Carencro (La.) High School for three seasons (1997-99), then returned years later to serve as the Golden Bears' head coach (2005-07).

In between his stints at Carencro, Guidry served as defensive coordinator and coached the secondary at McNeese State (2000-04). The Cowboys reached the Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA) playoffs in four consecutive seasons (2000-03), won three straight Southland Conference championships (2001, 2002, 2003) during that stretch, and lost to WKU in the 2002 FCS National Championship Game.

Guidry was also a team captain, four-year letterman (1990-93) and all-conference defensive back at McNeese State. He and his wife, Starlet, have four children: Janzen, Madison, Alexis and Kaitlyn. His son, Janzen, was rated as the nation's No. 2 cornerback by Rivals.com in 2009 and is a junior at the University of Tennessee. Janzen earned second-team All-SEC honors at free safety in 2010.

Alonzo Hampton is set to begin his first season as WKU's defensive backs coach in 2011.

Hampton joins the Hilltopper staff after spending five seasons at Arkansas-Pine Bluff — including serving as defensive coordinator in 2009 and 2010. Hampton joined the UAPB football staff in 2006 as cornerbacks coach — a position he held for two seasons. In 2008 he took over the entire secondary unit as he was named defensive backs coach before serving as coordinator his last two years in Pine Bluff. Hampton's secondary unit garnered national attention in 2008 as the Golden Lions ranked in the Top 30 in the NCAA FCS Division in Pass Efficiency Defense (8th), Pass Defense (17th), and Passes Intercepted (29th). Additionally, UAPB ranked 1st in the Southwestern Athletic Conference in Passing Defense allowing just 160.9 yards per game.

Hampton began his coaching career as the defensive coordinator at Warren High School, where he helped the squad to back-to-back Arkansas AAA state championships in 2001 and 2002.

In addition to his high school and collegiate coaching experience, Hampton also served a minority internship with the Philadelphia Eagles in 2006. It was that summer that he met Willie Taggart, who was interning in a similar capacity with the Eagles' offensive staff.

Hampton played collegiality at Louisiana-Monroe where he was a member of the football and track and field team. While at ULM he was named team captain in 1996 and was chosen to the All-Louisiana Defensive Back Team in 1996.

His professional career includes training camp stints with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks (1997) and Jacksonville Jaguars (1999) and the NFL Europe's Frankfurt Galaxy where he started at cornerback in the World Bowl in 1998 and 1999 — winning the championship in 1999. He also spent the 2000 season playing for the New England Seawolves of the Arena Football League, helping the franchise to its first-ever playoff berth.

Hampton holds a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from ULM and a Master's Degree in Teaching from the University of Arkansas-Monticello.

He and his wife Yolanda have two children, Ashton and Alonzo Jr.

Stu Holt returns to the Hilltopper staff in 2011 as the tackles and tight ends coach.

After spending six seasons on the Hill, Holt served as the running backs coach at Tennessee State in 2010. Under his watch, the Tigers ranked 24th in the nation in rushing offense, averaging 190 yards per game. Preston Brown also earned second-team all-Ohio Valley Conference honors.

In his first stint at WKU, Holt spent six years working with the running backs, and was the special teams coordinator in 2005 and 2009. Holt coached a pair of 1,000 yard rushers on the Hill (Tyrell Hayden, Lerron Moore). Moore finished his career as the Hilltoppers' career leader in rushing yardage (4,396) and Hayden's 1,134 yards in 2007 marked the tenth-best single season total in school history.

In his first season with the program, Holt's unit helped the Toppers rush for an average of 226.17 yards per contest (a figure that ranked 14th in the nation) while compiling 35 touchdowns. Moore was a second-team all-Gateway Conference selection and Brian Porter was a member of the league's All-Newcomer Team under his direction. He also was instrumental in the signing of Jake Gaebler, who finished his career as WKU's all-time leader in receptions.

As coordinator of the special teams in 2005, Holt helped the Hilltoppers rank fourth in the nation in punt returns (16.1 avg.). His direction helped placekicker Chris James to be named first-team I-AA.org All-Star and all-Gateway after pacing the league with 1.36 field goals and 7.91 points per contest, and Dennis Mitchell was a second-team all-conference choice as a return specialist after finishing sixth in the country with an average of 16.13 yards per punt return. The Toppers were fourth nationally as a team in punt returns.

In 2009, he coached four players that ranked in the top five of Sun Belt Conference statistical categories, including Jeremy Moore and Bobby Rainey who led the league in punting and all-purpose yardage, respectively. The Hilltopper kickoff return unit also ranked second in the league and 53rd nationally.

In all, Holt has coached 18 WKU individual and team record holders. That includes three players — Moore, James and Gaebler — that account for six different Hilltopper career records. He has also coached two players that spent time in the NFL in Brian Claybourn (WKU) and Steve Justice (New Smyrna Beach HS). He also coached a pair of All-Americans on the Hill in Claybourn and James, and has coached 12 all-conference performers.

Holt was the head coach at New Smyrna Beach (Fla.) High School two seasons (2002-03) prior to coming to WKU, earning regional coach-of-the-year honors in 2002.

He has prior collegiate experience as well. He was the inside linebackers and specialists coach at Bethune-Cookman in 2001. In 2000, Holt worked with the defensive line and special teams at Cumberland (Tenn.). Holt was a graduate assistant - working with the defensive line and adding recruiting coordinator duties - at Western Carolina during the 1998 and '99 seasons, where he earned his master's in education administration in 2000.

He started in the coaching ranks at Norwich (Vt.) University coaching linebackers and specialists in 1996, and also worked at Mainland (Fla.) High during the 1997 season as running backs coach. He also taught English at Mainland and New Smyrna Beach.

Holt earned his bachelor's degree from North Carolina in 1995, where he lettered in football each of his final two seasons in Chapel Hill. During his four years with the Tarheels, Holt played in four bowl games — the Peach Bowl (1992), Gator Bowl (1993), Sun Bowl (1994) and Carquest Bowl (1995). Prior to his years at UNC, Holt played for his father, B.W. Holt, at Starmount High School. The elder Holt ranks fourth all-time in wins in North Carolina high school football.

Karl Maslowski, a former WKU standout linebacker, begins his second season as the linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at his alma mater.

Maslowski was a four-year letterman for the Hilltoppers (2000-03) who started the final nine games for the 2002 I-AA National Championship team and ranked third on the team in both total tackles (95) and solo tackles (60) while tying for team-high honors with five forced fumbles. In the national title game, he had an interception on McNeese State's first drive that led to WKU's first touchdown and a lead they would never relinquish.

He was named team Most Valuable Player as a senior in 2003 after starting all 13 games and leading the team in sacks (9) while ranking second in total tackles (127) and solo tackles (82). Maslowski also was named third-team All-American by the Sports Network and Football Gazette and first-team All-Gateway Conference in addition to earning honorable mention conference all-academic honors.

Maslowski worked two seasons at Miami (Ohio) as a graduate assistant before returning to Hill. He worked primarily with the defensive backs in 2009 and helped the RedHawks rank second in the Mid-American Conference and 27th nationally in passing defense (190.4 ypg.).

Prior to coming to Oxford, Maslowski coached outside linebackers and defensive ends from 2006-07 at the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Massachusetts. In 2007, the Holy Cross defense ranked first in the Patriot League in four statistical categories. In 2005, Maslowski spent time in Australia coaching a semi-pro team and a high-school-aged squad in Melbourne and also assisted with the Junior National Team in Brisbane.

Maslowski was a student assistant coach at WKU in 2004. As a prep, his Lincoln-Way High School team in New Lenox, Illinois won the Illinois High School Association's 6-A state championship.

Eric Mathies is in his second season as WKU's recruiting coordinator and defensive tackles coach. Now in his seventh season with the program, Mathies served as defensive line coach for his first five seasons on the Hill.

Since being named recruiting coordinator by head coach Willie Taggart in December of 2009, Mathies has helped to produce the top recruiting class in the Sun Belt Conference each of the past two years according to *Rivals.com*. Rivals also recognized Mathies as one of the top recruiters in the nation following the 2010 season.

Under his tutelage in 2009, sophomore Jared Clendenin had 40 total tackles while tying for third on the team in tackles for loss (3.5). In 2008 under Mathies' direction, Dan Cline posted 33 total tackles while ranking second on the team with eight tackles for loss, while Robert Dark had 32 total tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss.

In 2007, seven of his players contributed at least an assisted sack towards the team total of 24 with two more recording tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Chris Walker tied for third on the team with 50 tackles, surpassing his previous career best, and Cline added 29, while Cline (five-and-a-half), Walker (four) and Jon Belcher (three-and-a-half) all accounted for multiple stops for loss. Thanks to the efforts of the line, the Hilltoppers surrendered 135 yards per game on the ground while allowing less than four yards per carry.

One season after having two-thirds of his starting front honored by the Gateway Football Conference - Daniel Williams was a second-team all-league selection and Charlie Phillips earned honorable mention all-conference accolades - he helped Dusty Bear earn recognition for the first time in his career as he was a second-team all-GFC choice in 2006 following his junior season.

In his first year with WKU, Mathies worked with a group that ended the season accounting for 17 of the Toppers' 30 sacks as well as 35½ stops behind the line of scrimmage. In the fall of 2006, not only did Bear lead the team in sacks, Walker tied for second on the squad in the category.

Mathies' efforts helped the Hilltoppers rank 11th in the nation in 2005 allowing 113.1 yards per game on the ground, a figure that led the conference as well, while they paced the league in pass, pass efficiency and total defense a year later.

Mathies coached at two schools on the collegiate level over the six seasons prior to coming to the Hill, the last two at Tennessee State where he worked with defensive tackles in addition to handling recruiting responsibilities. He helped the Tigers to a 7-5 finish in 2003 as the defense recorded 28 sacks.

Prior to working at TSU, he was the defensive line coach at Midwestern (Texas) State, where he was also the strength and conditioning coach in addition to handling recruiting duties. The Indians finished 7-4 in each of his final three years on the staff, posting a cumulative 11-5 mark in the Lone Star Conference - they won the league's North Division title in 2001 after going 4-1 in league action.

He got his start in coaching at Murray High School in 1998, helping the Tigers to a 7-4 mark as they advanced to the second round of the Kentucky state playoffs.

Mathies was a four-year letter winner in football, beginning his career at Kansas - the Jayhawks were 6-5 in his only season of action in 1994 - before transferring to Murray State. A defensive lineman, he helped the Racers to a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships as MSU qualified for the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in both 1995 and '96, advancing to the second round in their second appearance. The Racers went 29-7 in his three years with a 21-2 league record during that span.

Mathies, who earned his bachelor's degree from Murray State in 1998, also served an internship with the Dallas Cowboys.

Terry Obee, who spent his first season at WKU coaching the wide receivers, will serve as running backs coach in his second year on the Hill in 2011.

Obee came to WKU from Stanford, where he worked as an offensive and strength and conditioning assistant. With the Cardinal staff, he was also responsible for developing and implementing a comprehensive off-season program for Stanford's wide receivers, running backs, and tight ends.

Following an eight-year career in the National Football League, Obee went into private business from 1998-2008. He owned and operated Go Pro Fitness, a training center for athletes and non-athletes.

Obee spent eight years in the National Football League as a wide receiver with the Seattle Seahawks (1990-91), Minnesota Vikings (1991-93) and Chicago Bears (1993-97). While with the Seahawks, he played under Chuck Knox. As a member of the Vikings, he played under Dennis Green and played with standout receiver Cris Carter. As a Chicago Bear, he started under head coach Dave Wannstedt on a receiving unit that also included Wendell Davis and Tom Waddle. He saw action in all 16 games for the Bears in 1993, totaling 26-351, three TDs receiving while also returning 35 punts for 289 yards and nine kickoffs for 159 yards. A dislocated ankle limited his playing time and shortened his career.

Obee was a standout receiver and punt returner at Oregon from 1986-89 while playing under head coach Rich Brooks and still ranks among the Ducks all-time leaders in numerous categories. His career totals rank second all-time in punt return yardage (1,182), seventh in receiving yards (2,233), eighth in receiving touchdowns (16), ninth in receptions (122) and ninth in all-purpose yards (3,530). He helped the Ducks to an 8-4 record and Independence Bowl win over Tulsa as a senior and earned a bachelor of arts degree in marketing/management in 1990.

Walt Wells is in his ninth season on the Hill working with the offensive linemen, and his second working specifically with the centers and guards. Wells will also again serve as WKU's running-game coordinator — a position he also held in 2007 and 2008.

Four Hilltopper offensive linemen have earned All-America honors under Wells' direction, and the 2009 Hilltoppers' ranked 4th in the Sun Belt Conference, 40th in the nation, in rushing yards per game (172.8 ypg.).

Under the guidance of Wells, WKU offensive lineman Greg Ryan earned a free agent contract with the Baltimore Ravens in 2009. Ryan started all 12 games on the WKU offensive line in 2008, seeing time at multiple positions in an effort to help younger players develop. The 2007 WKU offense set a school record for first downs in a season (266) and pass completion percentage (62.8), posted the fifth-highest totals in school history in total yards (4,906), total touchdowns (51) and points (398) and ranked in the top 10 in several other categories. That included posting 49 points in the opening quarter of an 87-0 victory over West Virginia Tech, which tied an NCAA I-A (Football Bowl Subdivision) record for points in a period as well as setting new WKU standards for points and scoring margin in a game.

Not only did he have two players, Ryan and Chris Sullivan, earn All-America honors in 2006, but those two, Joe Dolchan and Zach Thuney combined to claim Offensive Lineman-of-the-Week accolades from Hansen's Football Gazette on seven occasions. His line helped the Topper offense collect more than 4,000 yards as WKU ranked in the top 25 nationally in a pair of statistical categories.

In 2005, Wells' unit helped pave the way as the Hilltoppers averaged 30.82 points and 405.73 yards of total offense per contest, both figures that ranked among the top 30 in the nation. That included a Gateway Football Conference-best 228.55 yards per game on the ground, which was 14th in the country.

Erik Losey earned first-team All-America honors from the American Football Coaches Association under Wells' direction in 2005, while Ryan was an honorable mention all-conference selection. Two of his linemen - Andrew Campbell and Chris McConnell - were named to the league's All-Newcomer Team.

The previous year his efforts helped Buster Ashley become the first two-time consensus All-American on the Hill, as he also earned the distinction of being one of the first linemen in Gateway Conference history to be selected first-team all-league on three occasions. Both Losey (second-team all-GFC, Gateway All-Newcomer Team) and Ryan Thomas (honorable mention all-conference) were both honored under his direction. Wells' line allowed just nine sacks on 222 pass attempts as the Toppers ranked 14th nationally with 226.17 yards per game on the ground while piling up just under 400 yards of total offense per outing.

In his first season on the Hill, Wells helped Ashley become the second consecutive WKU offensive lineman to earn consensus All-America honors, while Anthony Oakley and Daniel Withrow were voted second-team all-conference. His line helped pave the way for a unit that gained 5,129 total yards and scored 427 points, both figures that rank in the top five in the school record books. The Toppers allowed only 13 sacks in 13 games.

He came to WKU after working with the line and tight ends at Eastern Kentucky the previous six years, where he was a part of three teams that won eight games and earned an Ohio Valley Conference championship, coaching seven all-league players and an All-American. Wells was also responsible for recruiting in the Southeast and was the strength and conditioning coach for two-and-a-half seasons. ECU ranked in the top 10 in the nation in rushing the last two years.

He was the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Cumberland (Tenn.) from 1994-96, leading an offense that topped the NAIA in rushing two years while helping the Bulldogs to a top-15 ranking and eight wins in their best season. Five CU players were selected to the all-conference team, with one collecting All-America honors. He also has two years experience as an assistant at Smyrna (Tenn.) High School.

Wells earned a bachelor's degree in finance from Belmont in 1993 after transferring from Austin Peay, where he was on the football team for four years - he started and lettered twice. He added a master's degree in human relations management in 1995 at Cumberland.

Raymond Woodie, who served as the head football coach at two Tampa area high schools for 13 years, is in his second season as WKU's defensive ends coach. Woodie has been head coach at Palmetto High School since 2006, also serving as the school's Director of Athletics since 2008. He also served as head coach at Bayshore High School from 1997-2006.

Woodie helped Palmetto High School capture a district championship in 2008 after leading Bayshore High School to the district playoffs seven times in his 10 seasons as head coach. He also served as the defensive coordinator at Palmetto in 1996. Woodie was the youngest high school head coach in the state of Florida when he was named Bayshore's head coach in 1997 at the age of 23. Woodie also served as linebacker coach at collegiate football camps at Florida (2004-06), Michigan State (2004-06), Nebraska (2002) and Auburn (2001).

As a high school coach and athletic director, Woodie developed 43 student athletes who signed full athletic scholarships, 10 of whom went to Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) programs. Notable among these is Bayshore's Fabian Washington, who started at cornerback for three seasons at Nebraska (2002-04) before being selected as the 23rd overall player in the first round of the 2005 NFL Draft.

Woodie was also named Defensive Coordinator for Florida's 2009 North-South High School Football All Star Classic. At Palmetto, Woodie directed a Division 3A sports program and designed a multi-million dollar field house for the football team which is scheduled to open in 2010. He also developed a Character Athletics Handbook for all sports and was the winner of the State Farm/Fred E. Rozelle Sportsmanship Award in 2007.

Woodie lettered as an outside linebacker and strong safety at Bethune Cookman from 1992-95. A National Football top Scholar Athlete who received a \$25,000 Scholar Athlete Award from Burger King, Woodie also was named a GTE Academic All-American and earned I-AA All-American and first-team MEAC Conference honors at outside linebacker as a junior and at defensive end as a senior. His 14.5 sacks as a junior set a school record. He also played for the Canadian Football League's British Columbia Lions in 1996.

A native of Palmetto, Fla., and a graduate of Palmetto High School, Woodie holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Bethune Cookman (1996) and a master's degree in education from National St. Louis University.

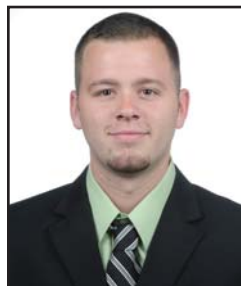

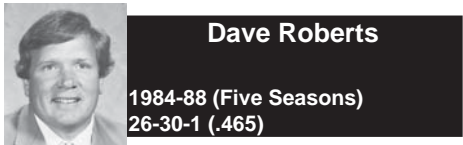

Hilltopper Homecoming History

WKU played its first Homecoming game Nov. 5, 1927, defeating rival Louisville 7-6. In all, the Hilltoppers have played 81 games for the "old grads," posting 51 wins, 27 losses and 3 ties, a .648 success ratio. The longest Homecoming win streak was six, from 1936 through 1941; the longest losing streak currently stands at four, 2007 through 2010. Since moving into Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium in 1968, the Toppers' Homecoming record is 27-15-1 (.640).

Multiple 100-Yard Performers

On 27 occasions on record, two or more WKU runners have teamed up to rush for more than 100 yards each in a single game. The first occurred in 1968 and then, after a 10-year break (1980-90), Hilltopper athletes notched multiple 100s a whopping 16 times in the decade of the '90s.

That recent streak was highlighted by the NCAA I-AA record (for two players in the same game) 471 yards put in the books by QB Eddie Thompson (a national quarterback record 309 yards) and FB Dion Bryant (a career-high 162) against Southern Illinois on Oct. 29, 1992. Thompson and TB Roscoe Echols were each involved in "Multiple 100s" a school record four times.

Ironically, in 1993, when the Hilltoppers led the nation in rushing, no WKU duo teamed up to record a "Multiple 100." The first 18 of those "Multiple 100" performances involved two Hilltopper athletes. Then, believe it or not, in two of the three "Multiple 100" games WKU posted in 1998, three Topper runners each accounted for 100 or more rushing yards — QBs Willie Taggart (177) and Donte Pimpleton (111) along with RB Jammie Kyle (102) at Louisville; and, Kyle (113), Pimpleton (111) and RB DeWayne Gallishaw (108) versus Southern Illinois at home.

The most recent "Multiple 100" in the WKU record books — and the second in as many years — came last season when David Wolke (178) Tyrell Hayden (117) turned the trick against North Texas. WKU runners have accomplished the feat four times against Austin Peay, Murray State and Southern Illinois, the most "Multiple 100s" by the Hilltoppers against one school. Here, in chronological order, is a rundown of those 27 multiple 100-yard games in the WKU record books:

Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium History

The 2011 season will be WKU's 43rd in Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium, and the fourth since the facility underwent a massive renovation.

The renovation of Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium began in April 2006 and featured the construction of a new west side of the stadium while also including a significant renovation of the stadium's existing east side. The stadium's capacity now stands at 22,113. The first phase of the renovation to Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium involved improving the existing east side structure.

Construction began on the West grandstand prior to the start of the 2007 season. The new side of the stadium contains approximately 5,000 seats, including an 832-seat club level, along with new concession stands and restrooms. The building also houses new football offices and a new weight room (10,000 square feet), training room (8,500 square feet), locker room (10,000 square feet) and equipment area. A new berm has been built behind the North end zone, giving Topper fans an opportunity to enjoy the game from a different view. A new 48'x70' scoreboard, installed behind the berm, includes an 18'x31' video board.

Other improvements to the existing structure include locker rooms and offices for women's soccer, and men's and women's track along with the addition of a new academic advising center that includes office space for advisors, tutoring rooms, a large study hall room and a computer laboratory.

The Hilltoppers have put together a .500 or better record in 29 campaigns since the stadium opened in 1968. Originally L.T. Smith Stadium, the name was changed to Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium in July, 2007.

Smith Stadium's Largest Crowds

Since Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium opened in 1968, over 2.6 million fans have watched the Hilltoppers, where WKU has a 149-75-4 record (.662). The stadium topped the 1,000,000-mark in attendance in its 14th season (vs. Tennessee Tech on Oct. 17, 1981, when 11,500 fans pushed the all-time attendance to 1,001,375), and crossed the 2,000,000-mark in 2001 after 9,500 fans witnessed the first Gateway Football Conference game in the facility's history — a 23-7 victory over Missouri State on Sept. 22.
