■ ■Yes, we discussed some similar expressions in Vol. 25, so why don't we talk about them more in this lesson? The first expression "me ga tobideru kurai," means "That's an exorbitant price," while "me o utagatta" means, "unable to believe one's eyes," and the last phrase, "me ga nai," means "to be very fond of." By the way, Mr. Pole! Lately, it seems like the language of teenagers and young adults in their 20s has started to deteriorate, and many of them are no longer using such expressions.
