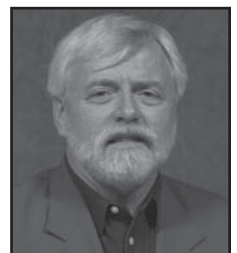

Jason Neidell  
Head Coach  
11th Season • 115-64-17 Record

Jason Neidell is entering his 11th season as the head coach of the Western Kentucky University soccer program after enjoying unprecedented success in the last four seasons. The 2009 team set a school record for conference victories, and the 2007 Lady Toppers earned their best record in program history and won their first regular-season Sun Belt Conference championship. WKU has also reached the semifinals in SBC Tournament twice and the 2008 tournament final during this span.

Neidell has guided the Lady Toppers program since its inception in 2001 and continues to bring the program more recognition on the national stage. Nine of Neidell's first ten teams have recorded winning records. Of those nine teams, eight won at least 10 matches. WKU has also finished in the top half of the Sun Belt Conference standings in each of his first 10 seasons. In 2010, the Lady Toppers went 9-8-3 and reached the semifinals of the SBC Tournament after defeating third-seeded North Texas 3-0.

Since 2001, WKU has recorded 115 wins. At home, the Lady Toppers are 64-19-4 for a .759 winning percentage. In addition, 29 student-athletes have earned all-SBC honors, with 13 named to the league's all-tournament team. Excelling in the classroom is also important to Neidell and the Lady Toppers, and 10 players have been named Academic All-District under his watch. WKU has also had three ESPN Academic All-American and two NSCAA Academic All-American selections.

In 2009, the Lady Toppers set a school record with nine Sun Belt Conference wins and finished tied for second in the conference standings. WKU captured the University of Kentucky Tournament championship with a win over Marshall and a tie against Kentucky, and WKU earned major Sun Belt Conference wins over North Texas and Middle Tennessee. Neidell picked up his 100th career victory on October 4 at Troy, needing just 167 games to reach the milestone. Also in 2009, Kellie Walker set the new single-season and career assists records and was named the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year, and six Lady Toppers were named to All-Sun Belt Conference teams.

Under Neidell's guidance the 2008 squad finished the season with a record of 15-2-4, which is the best record in school history. The Lady Toppers finished with a 7-1-3 mark in SBC play, good for third in the conference. Following the season, four players were named to the All-Sun Belt Conference First Team. Rachel Friedman and reigning SBC Player of the Year Morgan Thomas were recognized for their efforts on the defensive side of the ball, and Kellie Walker's offensive output earned her a spot on the team. Freshman goalkeeper Libby Stout had one of the finest seasons in WKU soccer history in 2008. She was named the program's first-ever freshman All-American, as well as getting a nod on the All-SBC First Team. Stout was tremendous in goal for the Lady Toppers, allowing just nine goals the entire season. She recorded 14 shutouts in 20 matches on the season, which is a school and conference record. Her save percentage of 0.924 was second-highest in the nation, and her goals-against average of 0.426 was good for fourth-best in the country. Stout worked back-to-back shutout matches in the SBC Tournament to help the Lady Toppers reach the tournament finals for the first time in program history.

Neidell earned SBC Coach of the Year honors for leading the 2007 team to a SBC regular-season championship and a 14-3-3 overall record. Newcomers Mallory Outerbridge - the first international player for the Lady Toppers - and Amanda Buechel helped lead the squad to the top spot in the SBC. Outerbridge tied Kristin Cocchiarella for the team's lead in goals (8), while Buechel and Alicia Dalby each recorded hat-tricks on the year. Meredith Goodson led the league as the top goalkeeper, stopping 87 shots and allowing only 14 goals for a 0.73 goals-against average.

In 2001 Neidell was named the First-Year Program Coach of the Year by Soccer Buzz after WKU's 14-5 finish in its inaugural year. The 2002 squad produced the first all-Sun Belt picks in school history, as three players were named to the second team.

Neidell has made a name for himself on the international coaching scene, as well as in collegiate coaching. He piloted the United States open squad to a gold medal in the 2009 Maccabiah World Games in Israel. His team, which included former Lady Toppers soccer player Catie Chase, defeated the host Israeli team 4-0 in the finals to earn the gold. In January 2004 he guided the United States junior national teams at the Pan American Maccabiah Games in Santiago, Chile, where his Under-17 club captured the gold medal and the Under-20 team brought home the silver. He also coached the junior national team in the 2005 World Maccabiah Games and the open national squad at the 2008 Maccabiah Games in Argentina, earning gold medals at both competitions.

A 1994 graduate of Yale, Neidell helped lead the Bulldogs to a NCAA Final Eight appearance and the New England and Ivy League titles in 1991. He was an Academic All-Ivy League selection in 1993 and won the school's Walter Leeman Award, presented to the student-athlete who best exemplifies leadership, sportsmanship and team play.

After graduation, Neidell played professionally for two seasons with the Tulsa Roughnecks of the United States Professional Soccer League, and one season with the Harrisburg Heat of the National Professional Soccer League. An injury with the Heat led him into the coaching ranks.

From 1996-98 he served as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Tulsa.

He earned his bachelor's degree in history from Yale and a master's degree in Public Administration from WKU.

He and his wife, Kara, were married on May 9, 2009.

Chris Tinius  
Assistant Coach  
5th Season

The 2011 campaign marks Chris Tinius' fifth season on the coaching staff of the Lady Toppers soccer program. His role with the Lady Toppers includes recruiting, video analysis, on-field coaching and camp coordination.

Tinius earned his bachelor's degree in broadcasting from WKU in 2003 before completing his master's in sport and fitness management at Troy in December, 2006.

Tinius is originally from Bowling Green, where he played on the WKU men's soccer team from 1999-2002 and led the Bowling Green High School soccer team to two state runner-up finishes. In 2005, he was an assistant coach at Troy, where he helped the squad qualify for its first-ever conference tournament berth in school history.

After coaching at Troy he moved on to Georgia Southern in 2006, where he was responsible for recruiting, monitoring academics and on-field coaching. He helped the Eagles more than double their win total from 2005 and qualify for the conference tournament for the first time since 2002.

GSU upset No. 2 seed Davidson in the first round of the Southern Conference Tournament, advancing to the semifinals for the first time since 2001.

He was introduced as a member of the Lady Topper coaching staff on March 27, 2007.

"As a Bowling Green native with a long-time passion for Hilltopper athletics, I couldn't be more pleased with the opportunity to continue to grow as a coach in an environment that is so special to me," stated Tinius.

Tinius holds a USSF National "C" License, National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Advanced National Diploma and NSCAA Regional Goalkeeping Diploma.

"Chris' knowledge and experience, as well as his impeccable character, are fantastic assets to the continued growth and success of our program," said Lady Toppers head coach Jason Neidell. "Above all else, the pride and passion that he shows for this university and WKU athletics is incredible and is exactly what we want our players to feel every time they put on their Lady Topper jerseys."

Hilltopper red runs deep with the Tinius family - Chris is one of six family members to play sports as a Hilltopper. His mother, Katy, is in the WKU Athletic Hall of Fame for tennis; his father, Joe, ran track and cross country and was a member of the national runner-up cross country team; his uncle, Jim, played and coached football; his sister, Kelly, was on the inaugural women's soccer team at WKU; and his brother, Casey, is a senior on the Topper football team.



Will Beddingfield  
Assistant Coach  
3rd Season

Will Beddingfield begins his third season as an assistant coach for the Lady Toppers soccer squad in 2011 after joining the staff in early 2009. Beddingfield is tasked with the training and supervision of the team's goalkeepers, as well as on-field coaching and recruiting.

Beddingfield arrived on The Hill after spending two seasons at Big South Conference power High Point University as the first assistant, recruiting coordinator and goalkeeping coach. While with the Panthers, HPU experienced tremendous growth both on and off the field. In 2007, two of his keepers were recognized as all-conference and all-tournament, respectively. He has also trained several other all-conference performers on the field.

"We feel fortunate to attract a coach of Will's expertise and talent," said Lady Toppers head coach Jason Neidell. "He is well qualified to lead our goalkeepers. He will be a great addition to our staff and it is a feather in our program's cap to attract a coach of Will's experience and character."

No stranger to collegiate soccer, Beddingfield brings 18 years of coaching experience to WKU, including head coaching stops at Carson-Newman College (Tenn.), Greensboro College (N.C.), Lenoir-Rhyne College (N.C.) and also a three-year stint with the Carolina Dynamo professional team as an assistant and goalkeeping coach.

Beddingfield served a seven-year tenure (2000-06) as the head coach for the Lenoir-Rhyne women's team, finishing his career as the winningest coach in the 16-year history of the program. He ranked second among active South Atlantic Conference coaches for wins when he left and also was the only Lenoir-Rhyne coach to lead the program to a pair of conference tournament finals. He produced 12 All-Conference honorees, two All-Region and two additional All-American nominees while guiding the Bears program.

Beddingfield is fully-licensed by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA), with a Premier Diploma and a NSCAA Goalkeeping Diploma.

He was introduced as a WKU assistant on March 5, 2009.

"I am excited to join the Lady Toppers and Coach Neidell's staff," said Beddingfield. "WKU is a tremendous institution academically, and the women's soccer program is one of the up-and-coming programs in the nation. I will enjoy bringing my experience to the table for the program as they continue their rise in the Sun Belt Conference and national stage."

Beddingfield resides in Bowling Green with his wife, Jo-Anna, and 4-year old son, Ian.
