
CHICAGO BEARS... TACKLING THE NEEDS OF CHICAGO

John Tait Makes New Friends at Mini-Camp Indianapolis Colts vs. Chicago Bears November 21, 2004

Two former high school football players who have become particularly special to the Chicago Bears are Rasul "Rocky" Clark and Rob Komosa. In separate incidents, both of these young men suffered tragic spinal cord injuries while playing high school football. Despite the severity of





Tait, Brian Urlacher, and David Terrell - stopped by to visit with the young men and talk football. The Bears have continually supported Rocky and Rob over the years through monetary donations, player appearances, ticket donations, and fundraising efforts.
