
Congratulations to Bobby Wade for being the Chicago Bears 2005 nominee for the NFL Walter Payton "Man of the Year" Award!


Tommie Harris and Tank Johnson speak with students following a Youth For Life assembly at Marshall High School.

SUPER BOWL SWEEPS


