





The Chicago Bears and Bears Care, a fund of the Robert R. McCormick Tribune Foundation, recently concluded the 8<sup>th</sup> annual Hunt for Food and Shelter fundraiser. We are pleased to announce that this year's fundraiser raised nearly \$100,000 to benefit food pantries and shelters throughout Chicagoland. These proceeds were matched by 50% through the partnership with the McCormick Tribune Foundation bringing the total to almost \$150,000, which allows disadvantaged families the resources and opportunities needed to improve their quality of life.
