CONGRATULATIONS PHILLIP AND ALEX!

Defensive linemen Phillip Daniels and Alex Brown were recently named winners of the "Brian Piccolo Award" for the 2002 football season. Since 1970, Chicago Bears veterans have voted and awarded the "Brian Piccolo Award" to the Bears rookie who best exemplifies the courage, loyalty, teamwork, dedication and sense of humor of the late Brian Piccolo. In 1992, this award was expanded to include a veteran who possesses the same qualities.

Daniels and Brown accepted their awards during a ceremony at Halas Hall on April 24, 2003. The mood of this typically celebratory occasion was understandably somber because of the recent passing of Bears owner, Edward McCaskey. Mr. McCaskey had helped establish the Brian Piccolo Cancer Research Fund in 1970 and always took great pride in presiding over the awards ceremony in previous years. Proceeds from the Brian Piccolo Cancer Research Fund benefit breast cancer research at Rush Presbyterian-St. Luke's Hospital and the Clearbrook Center for the developmentally disabled in Rolling Meadows.

LIFE GOES ON: ORGAN AND TISSUE DONATION

The "Life Goes On" initiative was introduced by Secretary of State Jesse White to increase awareness of the critical need for organ/tissue donors. The Secretary of State's Organ/Tissue Donor Registry is a confidential, 24-hour computerized database that documents your wishes regarding donation. Signing your driver's license or ID card is one way to indicate that you are willing to be an organ or tissue donor. However, listing your name in the registry is a helpful recourse in case you are separated from your license or ID card. (Note: If you have a Y under DONOR on the front of your license or ID, you are already enrolled in the registry). You can join the registry at a Driver Services facility or by calling (800) 210-2106. Most important, remember to notify your family members and loved ones of your intentions regarding organ and tissue donation.

When people think of the Chicago Bears, they undoubtedly also think of Walter Payton. Walter was a champion on and off the football field during the 13 years that he played for the Bears. After his retirement, he remained dedicated to the Bears organization and to his numerous philanthropic endeavors and initiatives.

When Walter lost his battle with cholangial cancer in 1999, thousands of people across the country mourned the tragic loss of this extraordinary individual. Understandably, Connie Payton was devastated by the ravaging effects cancer had on Walter and was determined to do something about it. 
