

# The Auraria Campus the Democratic $\mathcal{N}_{\mathsf{ational}}$ Convention

he Auraria Campus recently served as next-door neighbor to the Democratic National Convention, which was held from August 25th-29th, While classes were cancelled due to the significant impact of this historic event on the normal operations on the campus, a limited number of AHEC staff continued to protect and maintain the campus around the clock. Staff from all divisions of AHEC performed a variety of support functions, from serving as building monitors in the nearly-empty classroom buildings, to parking cars of delegates and media, all the way to preparing meals for overnight staff. Auraria also activated its Emergency Operations Center (EOC) during the DNC, which allowed for integration between Auraria Campus Police, Facilities Management, and other external entities, such as Denver's Emergency Operations Center. The EOC also provided a communications link with critical staff of the three institutions.

Ultimately, the goal of AHEC staff during the DNC was to make sure the campus was able to fully commence normal operations on Saturday, August 30th, when classes resumed. In a period of less than 24 hours, a flurry of activity occurred. For example, barricades and fencing were removed, and garbage cans, picnic tables, and benches were all relocated to their original homes. The year-long planning effort paid off when students returned to the classroom, and found the campus exactly as they had left it.

### **SCIENCE BUILDING ADDITION AND RENNOVATION PROJECT**

The Auraria Higher Education Center's (AHEC) Science Building Addition and Renovation Project includes the construction of a 197,00 square foot addition to the existing Science Building, renovation of 116,000 square feet of the existing Science Building, as well as the renovation of approximately 26,000 square feet to the North and South Classroom buildings combined. The entire project cost is

committed to sustainable design and construction guided by the State of Colorado's High Performance Building Certification Program and the United States Green Building Council's (USGBC) LEED Program. LEED stands for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, and through the use of environmentally conscience and energy efficient designs and strategies, buildings are awarded points based on their achievements in areas such as reducing electrical consumption, heating and cooling demands and improving the indoor air quality of a building. Through the program, a building can achieve certification, Silver, Gold or Platinum ratings. In the Science Building, all fume hoods in labs are equipped with variable air volume control, reducing the amount of air exhausted from the building and thereby reducing energy consumption. The Science Building Addition is projected to attain LEED Gold Certification, and the Existing Science Building Renovation is anticipating LEED Silver Certification.

The construction and renovations facilitates Math and Science needs for a variety of departments for the Community College of Denver (CCD), Metropolitan State College of Denver (MSCD) and the University of Colorado - Denver, Downtown Campus (UCD). These institutions identified their needs in a Program Plan updated in January, 2007. It is expected that building changes completed during this project will meet the needs of each institution until 2015. The project has

been designed by Anderson Mason Dale (AMD) Architects and is being constructed by a joint venture between Haselden and Barton/Mallow Construction companies. The entire project is being managed for AHEC by

The Project Schedule overcame an early setback, with the discovery of asbestos containing materials in the soil. After

a three month delay and a \$3 million cost to remediate the soil, the Construction Schedule has proceeded as planned, with every major milestone being achieved. Currently, concrete is being poured to establish the four levels of the addition for the north half of the building addition, with basement utilities and under drain system installation ongoing for the south half of the building addition.

Ellipse, the move management company contracted by AHEC has developed a move plan to assist in the transition from occupying the existing building to the addition. This plan was developed in collaboration with representatives from each institution, Jacobs, Haselden/Barton Mallow and AMD. They are in the process of refining the move plan to identify which departments are moving into the new addition, the temporary location some of these departments are moving to, and determining when the move will take place.

As the structure of the addition continues to progress and rise above the construction fence, the public will be able to watch the progress throughout the coming months. When finished, the Science Building of the Auraria Campus will be a prominent structure along Speer Boulevard.

### **Bobby Forrest**



### **Auraria Early Learning Center Involved in City Programs**

The Auraria Early Learning Center (AELC) is excited to be an active partner in the new Denver Preschool Program and part of the Mayor's Office for Education and Children.

The Denver Preschool Program is a tax initiative that passed in 2006 and helps Denver residents with the cost of child care tuition. By providing more reimbursement to those centers with a high quality rating, parents are encouraged to choose high quality programs for their preschooler. AELC received a 3 Star Rating by Qualistar in 2007. This is considered high quality and gives families a great value. The Denver Preschool Program is available for all income levels. The Center currently has 15 families that benefit from this program. The Center also receives mini grants from the tax initiative. AELC uses this funding for ongoing professional development of staff and for purchasing educational and outdoor play equipment. These grants ensure that the Center maintains high quality to better serve

AELC has also been awarded a separate grant from the Mayor's Office from their Quality Improvement Project. This grant has allowed AELC to hire a Family Outreach Coordinator, who helps families' access resources, navigate the systems and help them to know if they qualify for the Child Care Assistance Program and the Denver Preschool Program as well as offering additional assistance.

### **CAMPUS POLICE IS HERE FOR YOU!**

The Auraria Campus Police Department is in charge of the Safety and Security for the Auraria Campus, serving the University of Colorado Denver downtown Denver Campus, Metropolitan State College of Denver, and the Community College of Denver. Responsibilities of the Department include the protection of life and property, detection of crime, enforcement of laws and regulations, investigations, traffic control and building security.

The Campus Police Department employs full-time fully certified, State of Colorado Peace Officers, full-time Dispatchers, full-time Security Officers and Hourly Student Guards

All of our Officers respond to calls for service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. These calls range from serious felonies to parking problems. Officers are also involved in crime prevention programs, investigations, self-defense programs and special events. In addition, the Auraria Campus Police Department provides police and security services to retailers and off campus users at the 250,000 sq. ft. Historic Tivoli Brewery which also houses the Student Union. As of September 1, 2008, the Auraria Campus Police Department now provides Police Services for two UC Denver Buildings across Speer Boulevard including 1380 Lawrence Street and the Cu/Dravo Building at 1250 14th St.

Officers conduct foot patrols, bike patrols, directed patrol assignments, and other proactive efforts to be highly visible in the campus community. ### **AURARIA CAMPUS SECURITY REPORT AVAILABLE**

The Clery Act requires that a copy of the Auraria Higher Education Center Campus Annual Security Report be available to all currently enrolled students and employees prior to October 1st of each year. This report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus, in certain off campus buildings or property owned or controlled by any of the institutions (includes Auraria Higher Education Center, Community College of Denver, Metropolitan State College of Denver and University of Colorado Denver Downtown Denver Campus) and on public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning sexual assault and other matters. ### **Auraria Campus Snow Closure Procedures**

As the first snowflakes of the year are beginning to fly, it is time again to be aware of the Auraria Campus snow closure procedures.

When inclement weather or emergency conditions require the campus to be closed, the decision will be made through the AHEC Executive Vice President for Administration's (EVPA) office with the Campus Presidents/Chancellor on the advice of the Auraria Campus Police Chief. The decision to close the campus will be made only under those extreme weather conditions which pose an immediate health or safety hazard to the campus constituents.

The decision to close the campus will affect the entire campus—all campus institutions, departments and buildings (except the Tivoli Student Union). No individual department may announce an independent closure decision. The branch campuses for CCD and Metro State will also close when the Auraria Campus closes. The University of Colorado will determine whether off campus or branch campuses are to be closed. The Auraria Higher Education Center is exempt from the State Inclement Weather Policy as established for state employees, and neither the Governor nor the mayor of Denver is involved in the decision to close the Auraria Campus. Only persons formally designated by the EVPA are authorized to notify the media of closures. The decision to close the campus will be made on a day-to-day basis.

The primary criterion for the decision to close the Auraria Campus is the condition of the campus and its immediate surrounding areas. Weather closure decisions will be made as early as possible to permit adequate communications to faculty, staff and students. Each institution will implement the closure decision through its own internal communication procedures. Students, faculty and staff are instructed to call the

24 hour emergency information hotline at 303-556-2401, watch local television broadcasts for campus closure information, and view the AHEC website for updated information at www.ahec.edu. Voice mail broadcast messages will be placed on individual campus extension prefixes 556 and 352 when possible.

### **CAMPUS RECYCLING UPDATE**

The Auraria Higher Education Center recently announced a new recycling program for the Auraria Campus. In April of 2008, a pilot program called Single Stream Recycling was introduced as a part of Auraria's Sustainable Campus Program. Offices and common areas in the Administration Building, Plaza Building, and the Tivoli Student Union were supplied with new, blue single stream collection bins. Since its inception, this program has really taken off! Due to the success of this program, the collection containers are now larger and the frequency of pickups has increased. The Tivoli Student Union alone is reaching close to a 60% diversion rate, which means a lot less trash is headed to the landfill.

Recently, the program has expanded to include all Facilities Management Buildings and all of the modular classrooms and offices. By October 1, the Central Classroom Building and Ninth Street Park Houses will be added to the program. In addition, the Sustainable Campus project has just approved the purchase of enough containers to expand the program to all buildings on the Auraria Campus including the campus grounds, with an anticipated completion date of January 20, 2009 to coincide with the start of the spring semester.

Single stream recycling takes advantage of the fact that recyclable materials can be commingled when collected and then separated later at the recycling center. Now items such as aluminum cans, steel containers, metals, newspaper, glass, corrugated cardboard, and telephone books can be included by using the same recycle container. Wet trash and food items are not allowed.

### **SCOOTERS ON THE AURARIA CAMPUS**

Chances are you've seen the scooters parked around various campus bike racks. In response to requests and to help provide a cheap parking alternative, the Auraria Campus is now treating scooters with an engine 50cc's and below like bicycles. State law allows these types of scooters, since with the smaller motor they are meant for local driving only, to be registered but not require a license plate. The City of Denver has permitted these scooters to park at bike racks (you'll see them all over downtown Denver). In an effort to promote an efficient means of transportation and let scooters park like they do in the rest of the City, they Campus made the decision to allow scooters starting fall of 2008.

Currently, the campus is requesting scooters to park at four locations on campus. These locations were selected so that the scooter rider could easily access a rack without driving in pedestrian only areas. The campus will be reviewing these locations and possibly adding more scooter parking locations, along with more bike racks through the campus, likely by spring 2009.

Campus Police can ticket any scooter that is not parked at one the specified locations or that is locked to a tree or railing as this causes accessibility problems for those walking through campus. Scooters must comply with the Bikes, Scooters, Blades 'n' Boards Regulations (posted on **www.ahec.edu**). Following are the locations where scooters can park for free on the Auraria Campus. Any future revisions to these locations will be posted on the AHEC website (www.ahec.edu).

- a. At the bike racks on the north side of Tivoli near the Tivoli Auraria Parking Structure
- b. At the bike rack in front of the PTC off Lawrence Way
- c. At the bike rack on the north side of the dministration Building
- d. At the bike rack at the turnaround of Curtis Street adjacent to Arts/West Classroom

If your scooter has an engine larger than 50cc's, you are still required to pay for parking in the various lots on campus. If you park in spots designated for motorcycle parking (Lots E. ### PEDESTRIAN CROSSING IMPROVEMENTS

Have you heard the chirping along 7th Street (at Lawrence and Walnut) and looked for the rather annoying bird? It's actually not a bird, just part of the pedestrian improvements happening around the campus. AHEC, in partnership with the Disability Service Offices for each of the institutions, was successful in requesting pedestrian improvements along 7th Street from the City of Denver. The pedestrian signals at Lawrence and Walnut Streets were improved over the summer 2008. Eventually these improvements will be found at the campus crossings along Colfax and Speer Boulevard. Pedestrian countdown heads (telling you how much time is left to cross an intersection) are already in place at 9th Street & Auraria Parkway, as well as Speer and Larimer (campus side only).

While these improvements do not lengthen the amount of time pedestrians have to cross intersections (timing is set by a national standard and cannot be changed at certain intersections), the campus does believe that these help pedestrians know when and when not to cross. Additionally, with the Auraria West Light Rail Station located west of 7th Street, the Disability Services Offices felt it important that the campus' blind students be able to safely cross the road.

We hope the campus population finds these improvements help them get across the campus more safely.
