





#### School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 70% entered as freshmen, while 30% transferred in at a higher class level. 88% of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 12% graduated from private high schools or were home schooled. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (93%); over a quarter of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (28%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (3%), the California State University system (1%), and other 4-year colleges (2%).







# **Major Disciplines of UCSB Students**






