Arab American Population Highlights

It is estimated that at least three and a half million Americans trace their heritage to the Arab world. The U.S. Census identifies a portion of this population through a question on "ancestry" from the census long form. Because it is believed that census figures undercount the Arab American population, Zogby International estimates are also included below.

The second group is the Assyrian/Chaldean/Syriac. The third groups are those from the Sub-Saharan category: the Somalian and Sudanese.
