

The year 2010 brought a new record high for the Vienna tourist industry. The total number of overnight stays was about 10.9 million, surpassing 2008 – the best year so far – by an impressive 6.1%. The increase proves just how attractive Vienna remains for tourists. At the same time, the city is one of the most popular congress venues worldwide.

But Vienna is not only a great tourist destination; it is also an excellent place to live, as has been confirmed by many international studies. For instance, Vienna has again been ranked first in the W.M. Mercer study on quality of living in major cities worldwide, and according to the European Green City Index, it is among the „greenest“ of all cities assessed. The local urban infrastructure reached equally outstanding results last year: Vienna’s public transport operator, Wiener Linien, counted an unprecedented 839 million passengers from January to December 2010.

At the same time, Vienna is a thriving business hub known for its high economic stability and social cohesion. During the crisis, targeted measures were taken to stabilise and promote the economy. As a business location, Vienna offers a highly qualified workforce, scientific know-how and above-average labour productivity.

These and numerous other facts and figures on Vienna’s population, urban area, labour market, economic structure and public administration are contained in the present brochure. The public transport plan is a useful feature that will help you get around Vienna during your stay.

I am confident that the current issue of “Vienna in Figures” will make interesting and enjoyable reading.






Air temperature | in °C ►


Duration of sunshine | in hours ►


Quality of Living Index 2010 | Index: New York = 100 ►

Population pyramid 2011 | absolute ►






Population Development 2002/2011 | in % ►



Compatibility of child care with full-time work * | care year 2009/10 ►




Level of education of labour force 2010 | in % ►

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



Gross value added by economic sector 2008 | in % ►

Labour productivity * 2008 | in EUR at 2000 prices ►





Public transport prices * 2009 | in EUR ▶







It provides key data illustrating the geographic, demographic, social and economic situation in Vienna, as well as current structures and development trends. Tables and figures are supplemented by useful comments, explanations and analyses. The Statistical Yearbook also includes portraits of Vienna's 23 municipal districts, which provide interesting information for local residents. The design of the 2010 issue has been modernised without compromising content continuity.

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
