

THE ELDERLY AREN'T JUST IN FLORIDA ANYMORE

When asked to identify where one would find large cities (100,000+) with the highest shares of population aged 65 years and over, common knowledge would say **Florida**, with Arizona a distant second. But what would you say if I told you that you should also look toward Michigan—in the suburbs of Detroit?

An analysis of 2000 Census results indeed gives Florida six spots in the top 10 for large cities with high elderly populations, led by Clearwater at #1 (21.5%), Cape Coral at #2 (19.6%), St. Petersburg at #4 (17.4%) and Hollywood tied for #5 (17.3%). While Honolulu sneaks in at #3 (17.8%), guess who ties with Hollywood? In a tie with Hollywood for #5 is our own southeast Michigan community of Warren, and coming in at #8, with 16.9%, just behind Miami's 17.0%, is our own Livonia. The top 10 is rounded out by Scottsdale, Arizona (16.7%) and Hialeah, Florida (16.6%). Tied with Hialeah for the tenth spot is Pueblo, Colorado, home of the Federal Government's Consumer Information Center.

The next Michigan city to appear in the ranking is Sterling Heights, ranked 87th at 11.8%, followed by Grand Rapids in 95th place with 11.6%.

While Warren and Livonia rank at the top for larger cities, a number of Michigan cities come in with higher shares of elderly. Though most of these tend to be quite small – under 5,000 persons – and located in either the Upper Peninsula or northern Lower Peninsula, there are a number of larger cities with significant shares. Table 2 provides a listing of some of these.

Among the larger cities with shares higher than Warren and Livonia are St. Clair Shores at 21.8 percent, Allen Park at 20.9 percent, Farmington at 20.5 percent, Harper Woods at 19.9 percent, and Dearborn Heights at 18.7 percent.

While the total population 65 years and over showed some growth over the last decade – up 10 percent in Michigan – the change varied among the age cohorts within. The

“65-74 years” group actually experienced a loss, while the “75-84 years” and “85 years and over” cohorts experienced significant gains – 25 and 33 percent, respectively. This trend will continue over the next decade as the small cohorts born in the World War II years turn 65. However, beginning in 2011 and extending for almost two decades, the “baby boom” generation will begin to turn 65 years of age. From that point on, the trends that we have seen in Florida, as well as cities in our own backyard, will become commonplace across the country.
