

2010-11 Duke Athletics Review

A mainstay among the elite Division I athletic programs, Duke University once again ranked near the top during the 2010-11 athletic year. Duke finished the year fifth overall (second among private institutions) in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings. The Blue Devils had 17 teams ranked in the top-25 of the national rankings during the season. Duke also had significant success in NCAA Tournament action as men's golf claimed medalist honors at the NCAA East Regional for the first time in program history and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Match Play Championship, both the men's and women's lacrosse programs reached the NCAA semifinals and volleyball made its deepest NCAA Tournament run with a quarterfinal finish. In addition, four Blue Devils — Juliet Bortorff (outdoor track & field), Abby Johnston (women's diving), Nick McCrory (men's diving) and Becca Ward (women's fencing) — collected NCAA Individual Championships, while 14 teams competed in NCAA Tournament action.

Listed below are some facts from the 2010-11 athletic year:

ATHLETIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- Duke had 10 teams ranked in the top-10 nationally throughout the year — men's basketball, women's basketball, fencing, field hockey, women's golf, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, men's tennis and women's tennis — and 17 teams ranked in the top-25 — the aforementioned teams plus women's soccer, volleyball, men's cross country, women's cross country, men's swimming, women's swimming and men's golf.
- Five Blue Devil squads captured ACC Championships with the women's basketball team winning both the tournament and regular season league titles, the men's basketball squad winning the conference tournament crown and the volleyball, women's tennis and men's lacrosse teams earning ACC regular season championships.
- Seven Blue Devils were named ACC Player of the Year — Kelli Catanach (volleyball), Lindy Duncan (women's golf), Ryan Finley (men's soccer - offensive), Abby Johnston (diving), Nick McCrory (diving), Nolan Smith (men's basketball) and Andrew Wenger (men's soccer - defensive).
- Four Blue Devils captured individual NCAA Championships — Juliet Bortorff (outdoor track & field), Nick McCrory (men's diving), Abby Johnston (women's diving) and Becca Ward (women's fencing).
- Thirty-six Blue Devils earned 40 All-America honors, while Duke also boasted 39 all-region or all-district picks and 65 All-ACC selections in 2010-11.
- Twenty-nine different Blue Devils (37 total appearances) participated in the NCAA Tournament as individuals, and 11 Duke student-athletes captured ACC Championships.
- Laetitia Beck (women's golf) and Rachel Kahan (women's tennis) earned ACC Rookie of the Year accolades, while Jolene Nagel (volleyball) was named ACC Coach of the Year.
- Tom Montelli (men's lacrosse), Kyle Singler (men's basketball) and Jasmine Thomas (women's basketball) were all finalists for the Lowe's Senior Class Award, an honor which identifies personal qualities that define a complete student-athlete with criteria including excellence in the 'four Cs' of classroom, community, character and competition.

- Duke finished fifth in the final 2010-11 Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Standings, released by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics on July 1. The Directors' Cup rankings measure an athletic program's comprehensive sports success by totaling points based on a team's finish in national competition. Overall, Duke ranks second among private institutions behind Stanford. Duke's 1171.50 points is the highest figure in school history. Additionally, the Blue Devils' posted the fifth top-10 finish (1999, 2005, 2006 & 2010) and second top finish in the ACC in school history.

ACADEMIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Senior Dorian Cohen (men's fencing) received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship (one of 26 awarded nationally), while Allie Speidel (women's swimming & diving) was awarded one of 31 Marshall Scholarships in the U.S.
- 151 Blue Devils have been named to 2010-11 All-ACC Academic teams in their respective sport. (outdoor track & field teams not yet released).
- Three Blue Devils have been named ACC Scholar Athletes of the year, an award based on 60% academic achievement and 40% athletic accomplishment — Sophia Dunworth (volleyball), Bo Waggoner (men's cross country) and Jasmine Thomas (women's basketball).
- Duke boasted a 97 percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) as 14 teams achieved a 100 percent GSR and all 26 teams earned at least a 83 percent GSR. Duke led the ACC in each of these three categories, while the 95 percent rate posted by the Blue Devils' football team was the second highest among FBS teams in the nation.

- During the 2010 fall semester, 24 of Duke's 26 varsity teams posted a 3.0 or higher team GPA with that mark moving to 25 squads during the 2011 spring semester.

- Fifteen of Duke's 26 teams were ranked in the top-10 percent of their respective sport in the most recent multi-year Academic Performance Rate (APR) Report. Duke was one of only three ACC football programs to qualify for this recognition. Fifteen of Duke's 26 teams achieved a perfect 1000 APR report for the 2009-10 academic year.

- Three Duke student-athletes were selected CoSIDA Academic All-America, while 16 others received National Scholar-Athlete or Scholar All-America accolades.

IN THE COMMUNITY

Modeling the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills program commitment to service learning projects and outreach, over 500 Duke student-athletes across all Duke Athletic teams participated in approximately 2,000 hours of service and leadership across various organizations of the Duke and Durham community during the 2010-2011 year (based only on activities and events coordinated through and reported to Student-Athlete Development). The following is a summary of highlights and projects Duke student-athletes and coaches participated in last year.

ACTIVE TEENS First Year Action/Saturday Sessions with Duke Athletic Teams

- The Duke ACTION Program teamed up with the Duke Children's Hospital Healthy Lifestyle's Program during the third meeting of the 2010-11 First Year Action Program to focus on service and leadership. One hundred and fifty first year student-athletes and 50 upperclassmen student-athlete mentors teamed up with 24 participants from the Duke Children's Hospital Healthy Lifestyles Program for a night of fun activities in Cameron Indoor Stadium. Additionally, the women's cross country and men's soccer teams participated in physical activity workshops with the group this fall and spring.

BounceBack Kids Game Day Events

- Duke Athletics started a new partnership this year with the BounceBack Kids Organization. The mission of BounceBack Kids is to enrich the lives of children with serious medical conditions and their families through free year-round social, athletic and recreational activities and support services. This year Duke Athletics and BounceBack Kids partnered up and created a new community service event. Duke student-athletes paired with families from BounceBack Kids at four Duke Athletic home competitions. In the fall, the group attended a men's soccer game and volleyball match and in the spring the group attended two women's basketball games and the ACC Outdoor Track Championship. Marcus Wright, a sophomore on the men's track and field team, played an influential role organizing and recruiting fellow student-athletes to participate. Duke Athletics and BounceBack Kids plan to continue their partnership in the 2011-2012 school year and provide additional BounceBack Kids Game Day Events.

Duke Children's Retinoblastoma Family Day/Girls on the Run/ Reindeer Romp

• For the second consecutive year, Duke participated in the Duke Children's Hospital Retinoblastoma Family Day with student-athletes from women's basketball, women's cross country and women's track and field volunteering at this event. Additionally Duke student-athletes volunteered with Triangle's Girls on the Run, a life-changing character development program for girls between the ages of 8-12. Through a combination of running, lessons and community service projects, girls are taught values that lead to a confident sense of self. The 12-week program culminates with the girls' participation in a non-competitive one or 3.1 mile walk/run event.

Duke EMAC's Community Service Award

• The Duke football program was honored with the annual Community Service award from the school's Environmental Management Action Committee. The EMAC's accolade for community service is presented annually in recognition of ongoing dedication to both environmental stewardship and community activism, and demonstrated efforts to encourage others to do the same. Under head coach David Cutcliffe's guidance, the football program holds an annual campus clean-up drive and introduced a beautification initiative for the Yoh Football Center last year.

The Great Human Race

• Members of the Duke volleyball team volunteered their time with the 15th Annual Great Human Race, assisting with runner registration, site preparation, refreshments and race stations. This annual event is a unique opportunity for individuals, families, students and businesses to work together to help many non-profit agencies in the Durham area raise both funds and community awareness.

Habitat for Humanity/Cascade

• This year, Duke Athletics continued its partnership with Habitat for Humanity as members of the fencing, rowing and baseball teams participated in a build project this past fall. Additionally, Nancy McKinstry, a junior on the rowing team, runs a weekly savings skills workshop at CASCADE, a women's shelter in Durham.

Kids Day at Bull Durham Park/Duke Hospital Call-a-Thon

• All first year student-athletes on the football team assisted head coach David Cutcliffe with the Duke Hospital Call-a-Thon this year. In addition, the entire football squad participated in Kids Day at Bull Durham Park.

Martin Luther King Jr. Million Dollar Meals

• Members of the baseball and men's soccer squads participated in the MLK "Million Meals" Event this January. Students from Duke University joined students from N.C. Central to package meals that would be shipped to impoverished nations around the world. Over 64,000 meals, consisting of a dehydrated and fortified rice-soy mixture containing over 20 vitamins and minerals specially formulated for the undernourished, were packaged. The event is an initiative created by the "Stop Hunger Now" organization, which is a Raleigh-based international hunger relief agency that has worked to end world hunger for the past 10 years. Since 2007, the event has produced at least 3.5 million meals each year.

Miracle League of the Triangle

• This past fall, the fencing, baseball and men's lacrosse teams volunteered with the Miracle League of the Triangle, an organization founded in 1997 by the Rockdale Youth Baseball Association (RYBA) which has since expanded across the country. The primary goals of the Miracle League include providing opportunities to all children with special needs to play baseball, regardless of their abilities, and to increase community awareness and support for those children.

Nursing Home Visit/TROSA

• The Duke volleyball team held seated volleyball events this year at the Forest at Duke. Several Saturdays this year, the team went over to the Forest at Duke to help instruct and participate in their seated volleyball activities with the senior citizens. The team also visited the local TROSA facility this year. The local TROSA residents attended most of the volleyball home competitions and received complimentary admission to the NCAA home match. The team spent a morning at the TROSA facility to learn more about the residents, the benefits of the organization and how TROSA affects our Durham community.

The Oxford Housing Authority

• Duke Athletics continued its partnership with the Oxford Housing Authority as Blue Devil student-athletes served as hosts for children from the program. The hosts met the Oxford Housing children prior to the start of a Duke home football contest in order to tour campus and the athletic facilities, watch pre-game warm-ups on the field and accompany the children to their seats. This event provided a special opportunity for local Durham youth and Duke student-athletes to interact and enjoy the Duke football season together.

Park Clean Up Day

• Duke Chapel, Duke University Office of Community Affairs, and Burch Avenue Neighborhood Association hosted a work day in Burch Avenue's neighborhood park in November. Burch Avenue is a historic neighborhood located close to campus and is walking distance from Campus Drive. Duke student athletes from the baseball team, rowing, and women's golf team signed up to participate in this event. The event ran from 11am to 2pm and the group stained and sealed woodwork and spread mulch.

Pennies for Points/Dig for the Cure/Pink Game

The volleyball squad held a Pennies for Points fundraiser at each home competition this year to collect donations for the MS Society. The team also held a Dig for the Cure/Pink Game during its contest against UNC where fans could purchase shirts and wristbands with proceeds going to the Susan G. Komen foundation.

Project Homeless

• Members of the Duke men's lacrosse team participated in the Project Homeless Connect event, a function hosted by the City and County of Durham to serve as a one-stop shop aimed to fulfill the needs of homeless families. Many county agencies and services were onsite and provided food stamps, social security, Medicaid, unemployment benefits, employment, health and vision screenings, haircuts and other services.

Project SHARE/Holiday Giving

• Each fall, in cooperation with the Volunteer Center of Durham and Durham's Department of Social Services, the Duke Engagement Center sponsors a program called Project Share. Through this holiday giving program, members of the Duke community provide gifts to Durham individuals and families in need during the holiday season. Duke Athletics participated in the Volunteer Center of Durham's Project SHARE event by adopting three families. Each member of the Student Athlete Advisory Council collected money from their teammates to raise \$1,600 to assist SAAC in buying gifts for the families.

Read Across America/ Bright Horizons Child Center

• This past year, student-athletes from the women's soccer, track and field, football and rowing teams attended New Hope Elementary School's Read Across America event in March. Duke student-athletes were invited to the school to celebrate Dr. Seuss and literacy as well as inspire the elementary students to continue reading. In addition, Duke student-athletes also volunteered to read to youngsters at the Bright Horizons Child Center, located on central campus.

Read with the Blue Devils

• In its 19th year, the Read with the Blue Devils (RWBD) program expanded its scope and partnered with the Durham Sheriff's Office. Through this partnership, the RWBD program aimed to address health and safety habits, in addition to the program's original focus of increasing literacy and stimulating elementary students' love for learning. The RWBD program is composed of two primary components: providing various reading level incentive prizes to Durham Elementary Schools and student-athlete visits to each school. This year, a member of the Durham Sheriff's Office attended each visit with the Duke student-athletes. Each visit, Duke student-athletes reading stories, sharing the importance of literacy, and engaged in a question and answer session. In addition to the annual men's basketball team visits to kick off the program, the majority of the Duke's 26 athletic teams also participated in the program during the 2010-2011 school year.

Ronald McDonald House Dinners

• The Duke football and women's lacrosse teams cooked dinners at the Ronald McDonald House on Duke University's central campus this school year. Additionally, Molly Mackler, a junior on the women's lacrosse team, ran and organized a cook-off event for the house. Mackler raised \$2,700 for the Ronald McDonald House through this event. In addition, Rory Erickson-Kulas, a junior on the rowing team, volunteers five hours a week at the house.

Row for the Cure

• The Duke rowing team held its annual Row for the Cure this year from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Oct. 21, raising over \$18,000 to benefit Susan G. Komen for the Cure, an organization dedicated to the fight against breast cancer. The Ergathon was setup on the main quad of Duke's West Campus and the day featured activities such as Race-A-Rower and a prize raffle.

School Days/Make a Difference Day

• Over 300 Durham middle school students visited the university this past October as part of the School Days program, an initiative which aims to inspire local youth to attend college. Duke student-athletes volunteered in the program, serving as guides on campus and giving the participants a glimpse into college life. Duke also visited Shepard Middle School in Durham for the National Make a Difference Day with volunteers reading to students and participating in afternoon recreation sessions.

Southwest Elementary Day at Duke

• Over 250 students from Southwest Elementary School visited Duke in May to see the university's campus and learn about the college experience. Led by Miles Plumlee, a junior on the men's basketball squad, student-athletes from men's basketball, women's swimming and diving, women's soccer, rowing and men's and women's track & field provided campus tours, played outdoor sports and read to the students.

Sport Clinics/Annual Royal Blue Pro-Am

• This past year, men's golf, volleyball and men's and women's tennis each held clinics designed to benefit the greater Durham community. The men's golf team partnered with both N.C. State and UNC to host a clinic for the First Tee of the Triangle. The mission of the First Tee of the Triangle is to impact the local youth by providing education programs, aiming to build character and instill life-enhancing values. The volleyball team held a free skills clinic for aspiring athletes during the fall, which was open to all middle school students. Lastly, Duke tennis held its Annual Royal Blue Pro-Am event, a two-hour event featuring doubles matches between the men's and women's squads and their biggest supporters in the community, in May.

Swim with the Blue Devils

• Swim with the Blue Devils is a unique service event, created by former Duke student-athlete Lauren Gonzales in 2006. Members of the Duke swimming and diving teams as well as Blue Devil graduate students offer one-hour clinics to teach swimming techniques and safety lessons to local youth. Originally featuring volunteers from the athletic department, this service has now spread across campus. The program not only does involve the local Durham youth, but also brings together undergraduate and graduate students, athletic administration and campus administration.

Think Pink/For the Love of Meg

• The Duke women's soccer team hosted its first annual "Think Pink" Game with each team member wearing pink uniforms to support the fight against breast cancer. In addition, the women's lacrosse team hosted 'Meg's Game,' an event designed to remember friend of the program Meg Wasley, who passed away due to complications with a brain tumor, and raise funds for the Duke Children's Hospital. The team dedicated its entire season to Wasley, wearing patches emblazoned with her initials on their uniforms. The squad also raised over \$2,000 in Wasley's name and intends to name a room at Duke Children's Hospital in her honor.

True DUKE vs. UNC Night

• 2010-11 was the third year that the Duke Athletics Department participated in the Durham Jaycees Haunted House at the Durham Bulls Stadium. The event used the local Duke versus UNC rivalry in a friendly way to raise money for local charities. Duke student-athletes assisted as ticket takers, haunted house tour guides, concession stand operators and skit actors. Duke Athletics was represented by the men's lacrosse team, who also volunteered for this event last year.

Urban Ministries Soup Kitchen

• Duke Athletics continued its partnership with the Urban Ministries Soup Kitchen this year. Through the organization and efforts of Meghan Dwyer, Student Athlete Advisory Committee Soup Kitchen Coordinator and member of the women's swimming and diving team, Duke student athletes had the opportunity to participate at the Soup Kitchen on the first Sunday of every month during the academic year. Groups of 5-10 Duke student athletes volunteered at the Urban Ministries Soup Kitchen serving meals and helping with pantry stocking and cleaning.

2010-2011 ACC Top Six for Service Awards

• This past year, Duke nominated six student-athletes — Rebecca Allen, Ashley Brasovan, Meghan Dwyer, Miles Plumlee, Robert Shofner and Marcus Wright — for the ACC Top Six for Service Awards. Recipients of this award are recognized for their outstanding commitment, dedication and involvement in service projects locally, nationally and internationally.

Representing the women's soccer squad, Allen was a key participant in the Read with the Blue Devils Program during the 2010-2011 academic year, participating in the most visits out of all Duke student-athletes.

In her second year at Duke, Brasovan, a member of the Duke track & field team, participated in a wide range of community service events including visiting elementary schools with Read with the Blue Devils, serving as a host for the Oxford Housing Authority, packaging meals for the MLK Million Meals Event and aiding in the Healthy Lifestyles/Active Teens Program. Brasovan also played a crucial role in recruiting fellow teammates for multiple community service events.

Dwyer, representing the swimming and diving squad, recruited and organized the monthly participation of student-athletes at the Urban Ministries Soup Kitchen, and also volunteered with Project Share.

As a member of the men's basketball team, Plumlee volunteered at a local elementary school throughout the

school year, serving as a positive role model and mentor and participating in the Read with the Blue Devils Program.

In addition to playing football for the Blue Devils, Shofner delivered presents to the Durham community for SAAC's Project Share event and participated at the local Ronald McDonald House and Habitat for Humanity.

Lastly, Wright, also a member of the Duke track and field team, was a key organizer, recruiter and volunteer for all Fall and Spring BounceBack Kids Game Day Events. Wright assisted with the creation of this new partnership between Duke Athletics and BounceBack Kids.

A LOOK AT DUKE TEAM-BY-TEAM

Baseball

• The Duke baseball team finished the 2011 season on a high note, picking up a 2-0 road win over No. 15 Miami in the final series of the year. Duke (26-30, 7-23 ACC) had the youngest team in Division I baseball with 70 percent of its 27-man roster made up of freshmen and sophomores, including 2011 breakouts Jeff Kremer, Chris Marconcini and Marcus Stroman. Kremer ranked among the top 10 in the ACC in batting average and on base percentage, Marconcini was one of the ACC's top freshmen and led Duke in RBI, runs and extra-base hits, and Stroman ranked third in the country in strikeouts per game. Senior Dennis O'Grady also put together his best season on the mound and finished 6-3 with a 3.65 ERA as the anchor of Duke's pitching staff. The future is bright for the Blue Devils, who return 26 of 27 letterwinners for 2012, including nine of 10 starters and 12 pitchers.

Men's Basketball

• The Duke men's basketball team finished the season with a 32-5 record to become the fifth program in NCAA history to win 30 or more games in three consecutive seasons. The Blue Devils won their 10th ACC Tournament championship in the last 13 years and also captured the 2010 O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic title. Head coach Mike Krzyzewski became the second coach in NCAA history to register 900 career wins in Duke's 73-71 NCAA Tournament victory over Michigan in Charlotte. Senior Nolan Smith had a banner season averaging 20.6 points, 4.5 rebounds and 5.1 assists per game en route to earning consensus first team All-America, ACC Player of the Year and ACC Tournament MVP honors. Smith also became the seventh player under Coach K to average over 20.0 ppg. and the eighth Blue Devil all-time to lead the ACC in scoring. Senior Kyle Singler, a four time All-ACC selection and honorable mention All-America in 2011, also closed out a storied career ranked fourth at Duke in scoring (2,374 points) and sixth in rebounds (1,007). He became the fourth Duke player and ninth player in ACC history with over 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds. Duke went 17-0 at Cameron Indoor Stadium to extend the nation's longest current home win streak to 36 games. In addition to the success on the court, Duke also performed well in the classroom with Singler, Ryan Kelly and Mason Plumlee being named to the Academic All-ACC team. The Blue Devils have now had three or more players on the team seven times in school history.

Women's Basketball

• The women's basketball team posted a 32-4 overall and 12-2 league mark in 2010-11 under head coach Joanne P. McCallie. The Blue Devils won their second straight ACC Championship and ACC regular season title. The ACC Championship was their seventh overall title in school history. Duke advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight for the second consecutive year and reached regional action for the 12th time out of the last 14 years. Senior Jasmine Thomas was named ACC Tournament MVP for the second straight year, earned Associated Press second team All-America and All-ACC Defensive Team accolades. The Blue Devils produced a school record 17-0 record at home this season, marking just the third undefeated season in Cameron Indoor Stadium in school history. Duke now owns a school-record 24-game winning streak at home. Thomas became the first Blue Devil to be named Academic All-America on two occasions

and also won the Kay Yow Award for the second straight year. Senior Krystal Thomas was selected All-ACC third team and Chelsea Gray earned All-ACC Freshman team honors.

Men's Cross Country

• The Duke men's cross country team completed a stellar season in 2010, including the program's 11th NCAA Championship appearance and third back-to-back appearances and the first since the 1970-71 seasons. The Blue Devils posted team victories at the Roy Griak Invitational, the Panorama Farms Invitational and the Pack Invitational before claiming their third consecutive IC4A Championship on November 20, which propelled men's head coach Norm Ogilvie over the 1,000 career wins mark at Duke. In addition, Duke placed second at the NCAA Southeast Regional and received the programs first automatic bid into the NCAA Championship.

Women's Cross Country

• The Duke women's cross country team completed the 2010 campaign with an overall record of 106-23-1 and 22-6 in the ACC. The Blue Devils earned team victories at the Wake Forest Dual, the Blue Ridge Mountain Open and the Pack Invitational, while also posting third place finishes at the ACC Championships and the NCAA Southeast Regional. In addition, Duke received an at-large bid to compete in its third consecutive NCAA Championships and the 10th in program history.

Fencing

• Junior Becca Ward became the first Duke fencer to repeat as NCAA Champion when she won the 2010 NCAA Women's Saber Championship. Ward was one of a school-record four Duke fencers to earn All-America honors and one of a program-best six that advanced to the national championships. Ward led the women's team to a 17-6 overall record and her saber squad to a 22-1 finish, both of which were school records. On the men's side, junior epee Jonathan Parker took seventh at the NCAA Championships, and senior Dorian Cohen placed 11th to help the Blue Devils place ninth overall at the national championship. Duke had five men's fencers win at least 40 bouts during the regular season, including Cohen who finished 50-10 to help the team post a 16-7 overall record.

Field Hockey

• The Duke field hockey team posted an 8-11 overall record in 2010. Despite inconsistent play on offense, the Blue Devil defense thrived, holding opponents to 1.32 goals per game. Goalkeeper Samantha Nelson ranked second in the Atlantic Coast Conference in shutouts (5), saves per game (3.84) and save percentage (.723), while defender Rhian Jones garnered All-America, All-South and All-ACC honors for her outstanding play. Freshman standout Emmie Le Marchand led the offense with 19 points on eight goals and three assists as Duke recorded wins over five ranked teams during the year (No. 13 Louisville, No. 12 James Madison, No. 13 Drexel, No. 11 Boston University and No. 19 Old Dominion). In addition, midfielder Tara Jennings joined Jones, a second team All-America pick, in All-South Region first team and All-ACC honors, while Le Marchand, Nelson and Susan Ferger earned a nod to the All-South Region second team as well.

Football

• In 2010, Duke posted an overall record of 3-9 with an ACC ledger of 1-7 in head coach David Cutcliffe's third season at the helm of the program. The Blue Devil offense averaged 381.3 yards per game – the program's highest total since 1989 – as quarterback Sean Renfree became just the fourth player in school history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a single season. Wide receiver Conner Vernon, a second team All-ACC selection, led the conference in pass receptions with 73, one catch shy of the school single-season record set by Wes Chesson in 1970. Tight end Cooper Helfet was an honorable mention all-league pick after catching 34 passes for 380 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Abraham Kromah paced the squad with 129 tackles en route to receiving honorable mention All-ACC accolades. Placekicker Will Snyderwine enjoyed an outstanding season by booting 21-of-24 field goals and all 32 of his PAT attempts for 95 total points, and received first team All-America honors from the AFCA. Duke led all league schools with 13 total selections to the Academic All-ACC team. In addition, Duke established a school record for total home attendance with 201,248 fans and twice reached capacity in Wallace Wade Stadium in games against Elon (33,941) and then top-ranked and reigning national champion Alabama (39,042).

Men's Golf

• The Duke men's golf team has one of the top seasons in program history winning three tournament titles and advancing to the match play semifinals of the 2011 NCAA Championship. The Blue Devils won the prestigious Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship in March and also claimed team titles at the Irish Creek Collegiate and NCAA East Regional. Head coach Jamie Green led the squad to an eighth place finish in stroke play at the NCAA Championships and 3-1-1 win over top-seeded UCLA in the quarterfinals of match play. Duke fell, 3-2, to Georgia in the semifinals to end the season with a 6-1 match play record. Sophomore Brinson Paolini earned All-ACC and honorable mention All-America honors while leading the team in top 5 finishes (3), top 10s (4), top 20s (7), stroke average (72.2) and even-par or better rounds (16). He finished tied for 13th at the NCAA Championship with a two-over 218. Senior Wes Roach and sophomore Tim Gornik also recorded seven top 20 finishes, while sophomore Julian Suri has four top 10 finishes and placed tied for third at the ACC Championship.

Women's Golf

• Sophomore Lindy Duncan advanced to the NCAA Championship and turned in a tied for eighth place finish. With her solid season, Duncan earned NGCA First Team All-America for the second straight year. Her stroke average of 72.62 was the eighth-best in Duke history. As a team, the Blue Devils failed to advance to the NCAA Championship, which broke a 13-year streak. Duncan was selected the ACC Player of the Year, while freshman Laetitia Beck was named ACC Rookie of the Year. With her victory at the LSU Tiger Golf Classic, Duncan won her second collegiate event in only two years with the Blue Devils.

Men's Lacrosse

• The Duke men's lacrosse team had another outstanding season, compiling a 14-6 overall record and advancing to the NCAA Semifinals for the fifth consecutive season. The Blue Devils captured the ACC regular season title with a 3-0 record and finished as the runner-up in the ACC Tournament. Duke finished ranked third in the Inside Lrosse media poll after falling to Maryland in the NCAA semifinal. Redshirt junior Justin Turri captured USILA All-America second team recognition, while seniors Zach Howell and Tom Montelli and junior CJ Costabile picked up third team honors. Robert Rotanz and Jordan Wolf were named to the honorable mention squad. The Blue Devils posted a 7-5 record against top 10 opponents in 2011 en route to winning 14-plus games for the fifth straight season and for the sixth time in the past seven seasons. Duke earned two spots on the All-ACC team

with Costabile and Wolf picking up the accolades. Head Coach John Danowski pushed his career record to 299-158 overall and to 80-19 at Duke in 2011. He is just one win shy of becoming the fifth Division I coach to reach the 300-win plateau.

Women's Lacrosse

• The Duke women's lacrosse team enjoyed another successful campaign in 2011 with a 15-5 overall record and a 4-1 mark in league play. The Blue Devils reached the NCAA Tournament for the 14th consecutive season, and advanced to the national semifinals for the sixth time in program history with wins over ninth-ranked Penn and fourth-ranked Florida, respectively, in the opening and quarterfinal rounds. Tewaaronon finalist Emma Hamm led the Blue Devils with 51 goals and a Duke single-season record 70 draw controls as the redshirt junior was awarded All-America, all-region and All-ACC honors. Senior Christie Kaestner, who established a new school single-season mark with 47 assists on the year, joined Hamm in first team All-America honors, while junior midfielders Kat Thomas and Kim Wenger earned second team distinction.

Rowing

• The Duke University rowing team finished the season breaking into the top 25 in the CRCA Coaches Poll for the first time in program history. The Blue Devils finished third in the ACC, clinching a top three finish in ten of the last 11 ACC Championships. Senior Alex Japhet was a second team CRCA All-America and All-ACC selection, while sophomore Emily Theys was named to the All-ACC Rowing Team. Japhet and Theys were also among 24 rowers selected to participate in the 2011 USRowing Women's U23 National Team Camp this summer. Japhet was selected to the first team All-South Region, while Theys collected second-team All-South Region honors. The team also raised over \$12,000 in the fourth annual "Row for the Cure" Ergathon back in October, marking the largest earning to date. Tori Arendt, Joline Doedens, Rorry Erickson-Kulas and Alex Japhet represented the Blue Devils on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Men's Soccer

• The Duke men's soccer finished the season with a 10-6-4 overall record and a 3-3-2 mark in ACC competition to finish fourth in the powerful league. The Blue Devils advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 24th year and for the seventh straight season. The team climbed to as high as eighth nationally and dominated the ACC postseason awards, with sophomores Andrew Wenger and Ryan Finley winning the ACC Defensive and ACC Offensive Players of the Year awards. Duke placed three players on the All-ACC first team and one other on the second team. Finley tied the Duke single season scoring record with 17 goals, while his 37 overall points rank tied for ninth in Blue Devils single season history.

Women's Soccer

• The women's soccer team registered an 11-8-4 overall and 4-5-1 league mark in 2010 as the Blue Devils featured a very young squad. Duke advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the third time out of the last four years with upset victories over California and fifth-ranked Florida. Freshmen Laura Weinberg (10 goals and two assists) and Mollie Pathman (eight goals and five assists) led Duke on the season in scoring, while sophomore Tara Campbell started all 23 games in goal, while posting a 1.05 goals-against average. Both Weinberg and Pathman were named All-ACC and Freshman All-America.

Swimming & Diving

• Junior Abby Johnston became the first female Duke diver to claim a national title, capturing gold on the three-meter springboard. She was one of three Duke swimmers and divers to earn All-America honors. Senior distance swimmer Ashley Twichell ended her collegiate career finishing fifth in the 1650

yard freestyle at the 2011 NCAA Championships. Freshman Haley Ishimatsu became only the third freshman in program history to compete in the NCAAs, finishing 11th overall on the platform. The women broke 12 school records and six pool records over the course of the year, and broke into the top 20 at the NCAA Championships for the first time in program history. Sophomore Nick McCrory became the first Duke diver to repeat as an NCAA Champion when he set a new NCAA Championship record on the men's platform. Finishing fourth in both the one- and three-meter events as well, he collected All-America honors for all three events once again. In only their second appearance at the NCAA Championships, the Duke men broke into the top 20 at the NCAA Championships once again, and broke 21 records (16 school and five pool), including 15 individuals and six relays over the course of the season.

Men's Tennis

• The Duke men's tennis team finished the year with a 22-10 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Championships Round of 16 for the second straight season. The 22 wins were the most for the Blue Devils since 2006 when Duke was 22-7. The Blue Devils were 9-2 in ACC play to finish tied for second in the regular season. They advanced to the ACC Tournament finals for the second straight season before falling to Virginia. Two players competed in the NCAA Individual Championships with Henrique Cunha making the quarterfinals in singles and Reid Carleton falling in the first round. Carleton and Cunha teamed up in doubles, advancing to the quarterfinals. Both players earned All-America honors for the second straight season. Carleton and Cunha broke the school career record for doubles wins by one duo, finishing with 79 career wins. Three players hit at least 30 singles wins, including Cunha (37), Carleton (35) and freshman Chris Mengel (33). Mengel tied for the fourth most wins by a freshman at Duke and also set a freshman record with a 10-1 ACC record.

Women's Tennis

• The Duke women's tennis team capped off a stellar season with its 16th quarterfinal appearance in the NCAA Tournament after finishing the regular season with an overall record of 25-5 and a 10-1 mark in the ACC. The Blue Devils ACC record gave them their 18th regular season ACC championship. Head coach Jamie Ashworth earned his fourth ITA Carolina Regional Head Coach of the Year award after leading Duke to its 11th 20-win season. Senior Reka Zsilinszka and sophomore Mary Clayton led all Blue Devils with 32 singles wins this season, while freshman Rachel Kahan, the 2011 ACC Freshman of the Year, finished her first season with 31 wins and just one loss. Kahan posted an undefeated dual match season record of 28-0 and will carry a 30-match win streak into her sophomore campaign. Kahan and Zsilinszka were selected to the All-ACC team for their on-court accomplishments along with seniors Ellah Nze and Nadine Fahoum. Zsilinszka and Nze were selected for the fourth straight season, while Kahan and Fahoum earned their first All-ACC selection. Zsilinszka was tabbed as the 2011 ITA Carolina Regional Senior of the Year while Kahan received the ITA Carolina Regional Rookie of the Year.

Indoor Track & Field

• The Duke track and field team had one its most successful indoor season in its history. Kate Van Buskirk set a new collegiate record in the women's 1,000m in 2:41.00 and Tanner Anderson became the first Blue Devil to ever clear 7' in the high jump at the Virginia Tech Invitational. The next week saw Curtis Beach as the only collegiate athlete competing in the Millrose Multi Challenge, a three-event competition between several Olympic, world and NCAA champions. Beach ran alongside Domenick DeMatteo, Bo Waggoner and Josh Lund at the Armory Collegiate Invitational to capture Duke's second straight Armory DMR championship. At the ACC Championships, seven Duke athletes received All-ACC honors and 17 were named to the All-ACC Academic team. Nine athletes ended the indoor season at the NCAA Indoor

Championships, a program record. Amy Fryt, Cydney Ross, Devotia Moore, Rebecca Craigie, Juliet Bottorff, Beach and Van Buskirk were all named USTFCCCA All-Americans with Van Buskirk taking the top honor of finishing second in the women's mile.

Outdoor Track & Field

- The Duke outdoor track and field had arguably its strongest season in the program history in 2011. Regarded as one of the strongest conferences in track and field, the men's and women's teams led after day one at the ACC Championships before scoring program records with 86.5 and 81.5 points to finish fifth and fourth, respectively, Senior Ryan McDermott winning his third consecutive ACC 3,000m steeplechase championship. The success of ACC's rolled into the next week when the team of Esther Vermeer, Devotia Moore, Cydney Ross and Kate Van Buskirk ran a school record 8:25.95 to victory at the Penn Relays, winning the coveted Penn Relay's Wheel. Two weeks later, both the men and women captured the IC4A/ECAC championships held at Princeton University. A program first, the weekend saw 10 athletes named IC4A/ECAC champions and 31 receive All-East Honors. The season was capped off with an impressive showing at the NCAA Championships, highlighted by sophomore Juliet Bottorff being crowned NCAA Champion when she outkicked a competitive 10k field, running the last 400 in 67 seconds. Also having a great weekend was Curtis Beach in the men's decathlon. Beach ran a collegiate record, and second all time in the decathlon 1,500, 3:59.13 to take second, with a score of 8084, at the national championships. Kate Van Buskirk ran a school record 4:15.37 and was only .04 second away from taking national runner-up honors in an amazing 1,500 race. Rounding out the first team All-America, junior Cydney Ross ran the last 300 of her 800m race with one shoe to finish eighth in 2:06.83. Notching second team All-America honors were seniors John Austin and Ryan McDermott.

Volleyball

- The volleyball team put together the most successful season in school history in 2010, winning the ACC Championship and advancing all the way to the NCAA Regional Final in University Park, Pa. After reaching the Elite Eight, the Blue Devils fell 3-1 to eventual national champion Penn State, but earned recognition as the only team in the entire tournament to win a set against the four-time defending NCAA Champion Nittany Lions. Led by a school-record five All-ACC selections, including ACC Player of the Year Kellie Catanach, Duke finished 27-7 overall and 16-4 in the ACC for the program's fifth straight 25-win season and third ACC Championship in the last five years. Under ACC and East Region Coach of the Year Jolene Nagel, the team also excelled academically and received the AVCA Team Academic Award while placing two student-athletes – junior Sophia Dunworth and sophomore Christiana Gray – on the ESPN Academic All-America Team. Dunworth was also named ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and four others received All-ACC Academic Volleyball Team recognition.

Wrestling

- The Duke University wrestling team finished the season with a 2-6-1 overall record. The Blue Devils posted wins over Davidson and Campbell and battled to a tie with Gardner Webb. Redshirt sophomore Diego Bencomo became the 32nd Blue Devil wrestler to earn a berth in the NCAA Wrestling Tournament after taking runner-up honors at the ACC Championships. Bencomo advanced to the quarterfinal round that included an upset over the No. 6 seed in the 184-pound division. Senior Mike Bell and freshman Ryan Harding both represented the Blue Devils on the All-ACC Academic Team.

SEASON SUMMARY

The Blue Devils posted team victories at the Roy Griak Invitational, the Panorama Farms Invitational and the Pack Invitational before claiming their third consecutive IC4A Championship on November 20, which propelled men's head coach Norm Ogilvie over the 1,000 career wins mark at Duke. In addition, Duke placed second at the NCAA Southeast Regional and received the programs first automatic bid into the NCAA Championships.

Women: The Duke women's cross country team completed the 2010 campaign with an overall record of 106-23-1 and 22-6 in the ACC. The Blue Devils earned team victories at the Wake Forest Dual, the Blue Ridge Mountain Open and the Pack Invitational, including a third place finishes at the ACC Championships and the NCAA Southeast Regional. In addition, Duke received an at-large bid to compete in its third consecutive NCAA Championships and the 10th in the programs history.

The Duke men's lacrosse team had another outstanding season, compiling a 14-6 overall record and advancing to the NCAA Semifinals for the fifth consecutive season. The Blue Devils captured the ACC regular season title with a 3-0 record and finished as the runner-up in the ACC Tournament. Duke was ranked as high as No. 3 during the season and finished ranked third in the Inside Lacrosse media poll after falling to NCAA runner-up Maryland in the NCAA semifinal. Redshirt junior Justin Turri captured USILA All-America second team recognition, while seniors Zach Howell and Tom Montelli and junior CJ Costabile picked up third team honors. Robert Rotanz and Jordan Wolf were named to the honorable mention squad. The Blue Devils posted a 7-5 record against top 10 opponents in 2011 en route to winning 14-plus games for the fifth straight season and for the sixth time in the previous seven seasons. Duke earned two spots on the All-ACC team with Costabile and Wolf picking up the accolades. Wolf was voted as the ACC Offensive Player of the Week twice in his rookie season and Rotanz earned it once. SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Duke advanced to the round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament before losing to No. 6 Georgia, 4-1. It was the school's 21st overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 20th straight season.
- The Blue Devils made the finals of the ACC Tournament for the second straight year and finished tied for second in the final ACC regular season standings with a 9-2 record.
- Two Duke players competed in the NCAA Individual Championships. Sophomore Henrique Cunha advanced to the quarterfinals while senior Reid Carleton lost in the first round. Carleton and Cunha also competed in doubles, making the quarterfinals for the second straight year.
- Carleton became just the third player in school history to join the 100-win club in singles and doubles. He finished his career ranked ninth with 102 singles wins and second with 117 doubles victories.
- In doubles, Carleton and Cunha set the school record for career wins by one duo (79-13), breaking the previous mark of 75 held by Peter Ayers and Rob Chess. Freshman Chris Mengel broke the freshman record and tied the school record with a 10-1 ACC singles record.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Duke advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the 16th time in program history after earning the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Blue Devils defeated ACC foe Georgia Tech in the round of 16 to move into the quarterfinal round. The team finished with a 25-5 overall record and a 10-1 mark in the ACC, and captured its 18th ACC regular season title.
- Seniors Ellah Nze and Reka Zsilinszka garnered their fourth straight All-ACC selection and were joined by teammates Nadine Fahoum and Rachel Kahan.
- Freshman Rachel Kahan was named the 2011 ACC Freshman of the Year and the ITA Carolina Regional Rookie of the Year after posting an undefeated dual match record of 22-0 during the regular season. Kahan finished her freshman campaign with an overall record of 31-1 and a 28-0 mark in dual matches. She will also carry a 30-match win streak into the 2011-12 season.
- Senior Reka Zsilinszka earned the 32nd ACC singles victory of her career, surpassing Melissa Mang's previous school record of 31. She finished her career with a record of 38-3 in ACC singles action.
- Senior Ellah Nze captured her 100th career singles victory this season to become the 20th Blue Devil to reach that mark.
