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1. Welcome & Introduction

1.1 Welcome to the 2010 Wales Rally Great Britain

This year our event reaches another milestone.

It was 50 years ago that this rally included its first timed 'special stage' - a narrow and rough two mile track over Monument Hill in Scotland. The only crew to complete it without any time penalty was Sweden's Erik Carlsson, navigated by Britain's Stuart Turner. They went on to win the Rally in their SAAB and for Erik it was the first of three consecutive victories.

The introduction of 'special stages' was to dramatically increase interest from overseas competitors; no longer did the event favour British drivers and the map reading skills of their navigators.

So much so, it was not until 1972 that a British driver reclaimed the winners' trophy; Roger Clark, partnered by Tony Mason. And to this day the rally retains its international appeal; last year drivers from 23 countries participated.

A look at this year's competitive route reveals that there is a special stage named 'Monument Hill' - a tribute to the event's pioneering history - a return to Radnor forest which was last used in 1999 and an all-new spectator stage in Cardiff Bay.

Run over the Barrage on both Thursday and Saturday, the Cardiff stage will again bring world class rallying action to the Welsh capital and provide easy access for families and those new to motor sport. This double-run special stage, combined with the main Service Area, Start and Finish all surrounding Rally HQ in the Wales Millennium Centre will make this year's Rally one of the most accessible ever.

Friday and Saturday features an undercover Service Area at the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society Showground in Builth Wells, thereby reducing the time gap between each competitive run through the popular mid Wales forests and military roads.

Saturday will have a new look and feel. There is a new format to the asphalt and forest stages around Epynt to provide a new challenge to regular competitors and variety for returning spectators.

On Sunday there are two visits to a revised 30 kilometre Resolfen stage and a short eight kilometre Margam Park - the latter ideal for live television and, potentially, the venue to decide the outcome of this year's FIA World Rally Championship for Drivers and Manufacturers.

Amateur drivers with 1400cc cars in classes N1 and A5 will again benefit from a reduced entry fee and there will be National Rallies on both Friday and Saturday for drivers with modern and historic cars approved by the MSA. And for the fourth consecutive year there is a four day event exclusively for members of the armed forces in their Regimental Land Rovers, covering all 20 special stages.

This year marks the 66th running of Rally GB since it was conceived in 1932 and - along with Finland - Great Britain has always been a qualifying round since the FIA World Rally Championship was introduced in 1973.

We are proud to be the 12th and once again the final round of this year's FIA World Rally Championship and to host the final rounds of the FIA Production and Junior Championships as well as the International Fiesta Sporting Trophy.

On behalf of the organisers, International Motor Sports and the Motor Sports Association, I extend my gratitude to the Welsh Assembly Government, our officials, volunteer marshals, the host City of Cardiff, local authorities, companies and individuals without whom Rally GB would be impossible to run.

I wish everyone involved an enjoyable, safe and successful Wales Rally Great Britain.

1.2 Introduction

Route changes for 2010

Day 1

There will be a short spectator stage on asphalt roads in the Cardiff Bay area on Thursday evening. On Friday the special stages will be exactly the same as last year.

Day 2

All the special stages on this day will be new or revised except for Halfway which follows the same route as last year.

Radnor Forest will be used for the first time since 1999 and the Monument Hill stage will run in the area last used by the Epynt stage in 2007.

The Four Ways Crychan stage will use 11 kms of asphalt roads before joining the gravel road route used by the Crychan stage last year.

The Cardiff Bay spectator stage will be used for a second time before the end of day service.

The Resolfen and Margam Park stages will use revised routes from the stages run in these forests in recent years.

4.2 Criteria for Acceptance of Entries

The maximum number of entrants will be 80 cars. If more than 80 entries are received the acceptance of entries will be at the discretion of the organisers. A reserve list of a maximum of 10 cars will be created.

To enable amateur crews to have the maximum time to prepare for the event, the first 30 eligible amateur entries received will automatically be accepted. The full entry fee must accompany the entry and this can be paid by credit card, cheque or bank transfer.

The organisers are offering eligible amateur entries competing in an A5 or N1 car, a reduced entry fee of £1,585 including VAT @ 17.5%.

To be eligible for the amateur category neither crew member may be entered on any priority list by the FIA or MSA for rallies in 2010. The vehicle is not the property of a motor manufacturer or importer. The entrant does not receive support from a motor manufacturer or importer or related sponsor. The vehicle must be entered by one of the crew members. The organiser's decision on eligibility for this category will be final.

5. Service Park

5.1 Location

The Service Park is located in the Cardiff Bay area around the Wales Millennium Centre.

The postcode for this location is CF10 5AL; the GPS reference is N51 27.902 W03 09.800.

The Service Park will be open from the following times;

09.00 Monday 8 November for Manufacturers and Priority 3 drivers.

09.00 Wednesday 10 November for all other competitors.

The service park has a surface of tarmac and level gravel. Security will be provided on site from Monday 8 November until Monday 15 November. If you require any additional private security on site please contact the Rally Office.

6. Two-way Radio

6.1 Application Procedure

Ofcom is the regulator for the UK communications industries, with responsibilities across television, radio, telecommunications and wireless communications services.

Any radio equipment used by a competitor and/or the associated support teams in the UK, must be covered by a licence issued by Ofcom.

Its operation must be strictly within the terms and conditions of the licence. The installation or use of equipment without a licence, or outside the terms, renders the operator/installer liable to prosecution. Upon conviction the equipment is liable to forfeiture together with fines and/or imprisonment.

6.2 Scrutineering

To ensure that illegal equipment (or unauthorised frequencies) are not used during the rally, Ofcom staff will be inspecting competitors' radio equipment at the pre-event scrutineering and will also be present throughout the event itself to monitor and check radio equipment in the rally cars and service vehicles.

6.3 Airborne and Other Requirements

If your requirements are not met by the above, particularly if you require airborne use, exclusive channels or continuous carrier, you should contact JFMG Ltd who distribute Programme Making and Special Events licences on behalf of the Secretary of State. 7.1 Tyres

7.1.1 Tyre Supplier

Pirelli has been nominated by the FIA as the single tyre supplier to distribute the tyres for all rallies in the World Rally Championship.

- All Competitors in 4WD cars MUST use Pirelli Tyres as specified for the WRC.
- The tyres are leased from Pirelli and must be returned after the event. Only used tyres will be billed to the competitor.
- · Other than Manufacturer or WRC Teams competitors may also purchase tyres from an official







agent of Pirelli. To use these tyres on the event, they must be:

- new (unused on the road)
- presented to Pirelli at and before the rally for bar-code checking.

These tyres remain the property of the competitor.

- Competitors must enter into either a Season or an Event Supply Agreement. They also have the option to enter into a Promotional Agreement. These agreements have been approved by the FIA.
- Before the rally week begins, competitors must provide to Pirelli their company details that Pirelli will use for Invoicing and Agreements.
- All tyres to be used by a Manufacturer or WRC Team during an event must be collected from Pirelli during that event in compliance with the supply agreement concluded between the competitor and Pirelli.
- At the time of collecting tyres the competitor must provide credit card details in order to arrange a deposit that needs to be confirmed at the end of the event (Maestro, Diners cards or Debit cards are not accepted). No tyres can be fitted before the deposit has been paid. This is the sole method of payment available.
- The cost of the Tyres is Gravel and Asphalt €240 (fitted on rim) (VAT may be added, this being different for each country and will be confirmed by Pirelli with the competitor). Pirelli can render an invoice addressed to a third party if required.
- Pre ordering is not required as Pirelli will bring sufficient tyres in accordance with the entry list
- Pirelli will fit and remove the tyres from the competitors' rims. This can either be in bulk before the event or during the event.
- In the case of remote service Pirelli will transport the tyres to the location at the competitor's risk. The competitor can transport the wheels themselves.
- Pirelli will be set up in the event Service Park on Tuesday before the rally and ready to commence fitting tyres on the Wednesday prior to the event. They will be available to provide technical assistance throughout the event.
- All tyres must be returned to Pirelli's location in the Service Park immediately at the conclusion of the event just after the last Service.
- Tyres for testing can only be obtained from the Pirelli warehouse in Italy. The competitor is responsible for all transportation and fitting costs.

7.2 Fuel

7.2.1 FIA Fuel - Supply and Dispensing

All FIA Priority drivers must use the FIA fuel. The supplier appointed by the FIA for 2010 is Petrochem Carless, which has authorised Vital Equipment Ltd to carry out fuel ordering, supply and refuel services.

All competitors using FIA fuel must place their fuel order directly with Vital Equipment Ltd no later than Wednesday 20 October.

The cost of the fuel including taxes and refuel services is €4.63 per litre, dispensed into rally

cars.

It is a condition of supply that payment must be received in full before delivery can be made.

The balance of non-used fuel will be credited after the rally.

Cars of priority drivers must be fitted with FIA fuel sample couplings, although the FIA reserves the right to check the fuel of any competitor. All competitors are required to fit re-fuel couplings, except non-priority drivers using a car which retains the standard tank.

7.2.2 Fuel for Non-priority Drivers

For non-priority drivers the use of FIA fuel is not obligatory and, as an alternative, they will be able to use commercially available pump fuel dispensed from pumps at designated petrol filling stations on the route; these locations will be marked in the road book. Competitors should note that the distances between petrol filling stations are different from those shown between refuelling zones in the published itinerary.

7.2.3 Refuelling

For environmental and safety reasons **NO** refuelling is permitted by any competitor within the Service Park (no refuelling from cans, drums or similar).

7.2.4 Supplementary Refuel Points

Supplementary refuel locations, for drivers using FIA fuel, are located at St. Harmon (Day 1), Sennybridge Training Area (Day 2) and Resolfen (Day 3).

8. Import of vehicles and spare parts

8.1 Competitors from the European Union

Competitors coming from the European Union do not need to make any special customs clearance. They may use any vehicle in Great Britain for up to 6 months, provided that the vehicle is not brought with the intention of selling it. All vehicles need to have valid traffic insurance. Tyres and spare parts can also be imported without clearance.

8.2 Competitors from outside the European Union

Competitors coming from outside the European Union will have to report to customs on their arrival in Great Britain. Please prepare a list of all the tools and equipment you are bringing with you.

12. Reconnaissance

12.1 Registration

A reconnaissance record card will be supplied which must be carried in the car for the duration of the reconnaissance. This card will be stamped appropriately recording every run on each special stage. Failure to produce this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance. Competitors will be issued with 3 reconnaissance numbers that must be fixed to the rear windscreen and rear side windows.

12.2 Number of passages

Competitors are permitted a maximum of two passages over each special stage venue during reconnaissance.

12.3 Speed Limit and Direction of travel

The maximum speed limit will be 80kph. The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment during reconnaissance is not permitted. Competitors are reminded that the roads are not closed during reconnaissance and vehicles may be travelling in the opposite direction to rally traffic. Under no circumstances may competitors drive in the opposite direction of rally traffic unless instructed by an official of the event.

12.4 FIA tracking

The FIA will require a certain number of competitors to install a tracking system to their vehicles during the reconnaissance. Further details will be given in Rally Guide 2.

12.5 Sanctions

For all infringements of the reconnaissance regulations the penalties are at the discretion of the Stewards. In any case, the Organisers must forward to the FIA the names of each competitor and driver committing an offence, in order to monitor regular offenders.

13.2 Accreditation Procedure and Criteria

Wales Rally GB, the final round of the 2010 FIA World Rally Championship, has to apply strict criteria for media accreditation set out by the FIA, the international governing body of motor sport. Please read the following guidelines carefully and make sure all the information requested is supplied with your accreditation application and it is sent to the appropriate address. Failure to supply the requested information, or to sign the disclaimer, will delay the processing of your application.




2.1 Day 1 Map







2.2 Day 2 Map








2.3 Day 3 Map
