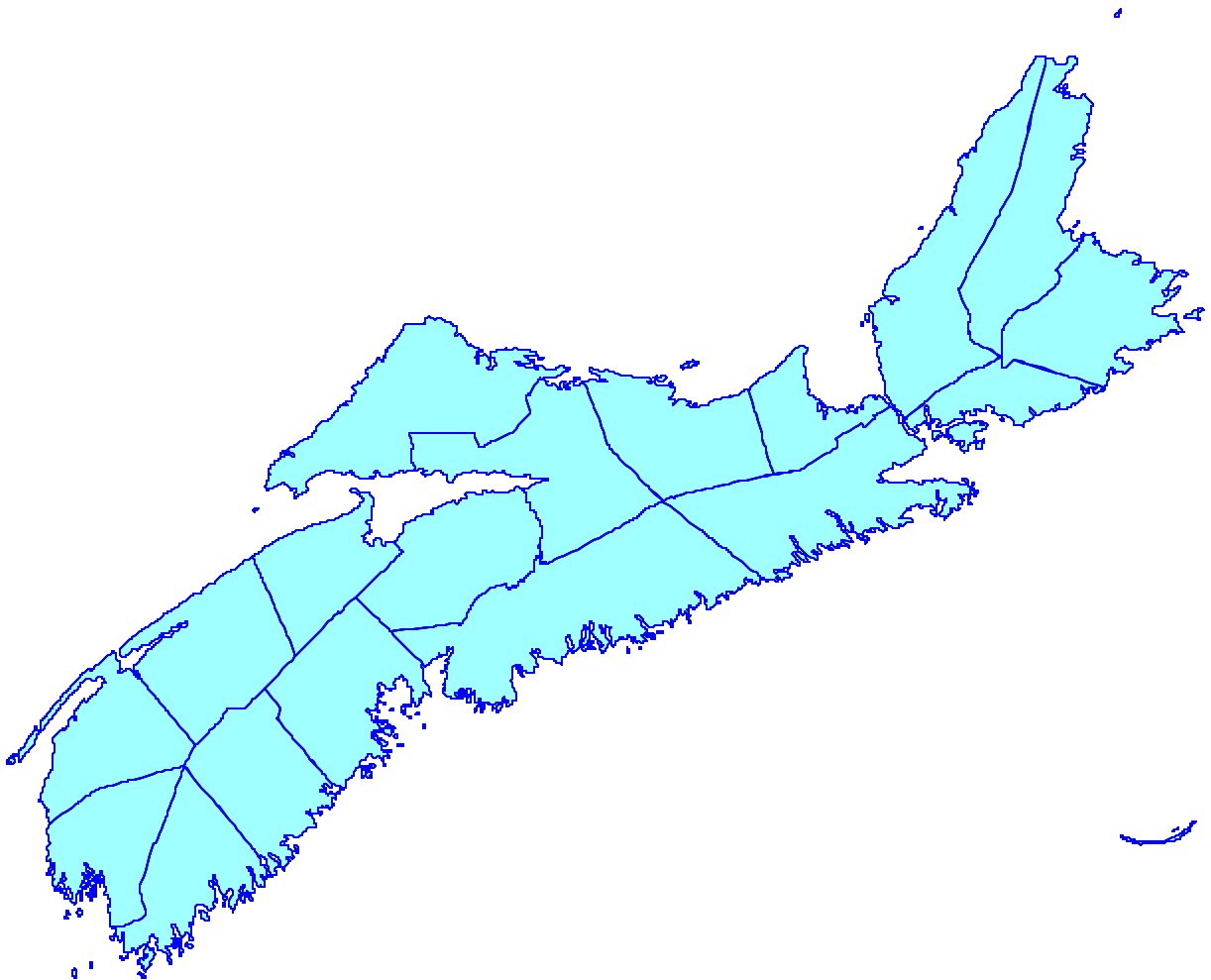

NOVA SCOTIA HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 2001 CENSUS OF CANADA

- ! Results from the May 15, 2001 Census showed the population of Nova Scotia declined 0.1% since 1996 to 908,007, while Canada's population of 30,007,094 represented growth of 4.0% over the same period.
- ! Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan, Northwest Territories and the Yukon all experienced population declines.
- ! Thirteen of the province's eighteen counties showed population declines. Guysborough County had the largest decline at 10% while Halifax County exhibited the strongest growth at 4.7%.
- ! Bridgetown was the fastest growing town in the province with an increase of 4.1% to 1,035 residents.
- ! Of Canada's 25 census metropolitan areas, Halifax Metro maintained its thirteenth position based on population size. In 2001 there were 359,183 people, 39.6% of the total population of the province, residing in Halifax Metro.

It should be noted that there is a level of under coverage inherent in all censuses. In 1996 the national under coverage was 2.45% and for Nova Scotia it was 2.24%. Next year the population estimates will be adjusted upward to take into account the under coverage. The actual adjustment amount has not been determined.

Population Change of Provinces/Territories

Since the last Census taken on May 14, 2001, the population of Nova Scotia fell by 0.1% to 908,007, a decrease of 1,275 persons. All provinces in Atlantic Canada except Prince Edward Island had negative growth. This contrasts with the 4.0% positive growth seen at the national level. Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan, Yukon and the Northwest Territories all had population declines greater than Nova Scotia. Newfoundland had the steepest decline in the country at -7.0%. Prince Edward Island had the highest growth rate in Atlantic Canada at 0.5% while Alberta had the highest rate of growth in the country at 10.3%. The other provinces/territories that achieved growth higher than the national average were Ontario, British Columbia and Nunavut.

Nova Scotia's share of the national population dropped from 3.2% in 1996 to 3.0% in 2001 while Atlantic Canada's share dropped from 8.0% to 7.6% over the same period. The population decline can be explained by a number of factors.

- < Migration out of the province is relatively high as people move to Ontario and farther west in search of employment opportunities.
- < Immigrants tend to settle in the larger population centers in central and western Canada.
- < Nova Scotia's fertility rate is below the national average.
- < Nova Scotia has a larger proportion of older residents than the national average.

Population Changes for Nova Scotia Counties

Between 1996 and 2001, Halifax County had the largest increase in absolute and percentage terms with the addition of 16,217 persons, a 4.7% increase. Only five of the eighteen counties saw growth over the five year period and they were all located in the central area of the province. The concentration of growth in the central region of the province is partially driven by economics. People are moving closer to the economic hub of Halifax Metro because of the relatively high levels of employment. Hants county had the second highest growth rate in the province at 2.6% followed by Lunenburg, Colchester and Antigonish with rates of 0.1% each. The largest decline of 10.0% occurred in Guysborough County while the largest drop in absolute numbers was in Cape Breton County with a loss of 8,519 persons.

Population Change for Regional Municipalities and Towns

It should be noted that the creation of Cape Breton, Halifax and Queens Regional Municipalities has eliminated seven towns and three cities from the list of incorporated areas.

Among Nova Scotia's 31 incorporated towns only seven had a positive growth rate as the geographic shift of the population is toward suburban areas that are adjacent to towns. The largest absolute increase was the addition of 270 persons to the Town of Bridgewater while the largest percentage increase of 4.1% occurred in Bridgetown. Other towns with positive growth rates were Berwick (4.0%), Windsor (1.4%), Lockeport (1.3%), Kentville (1.1%) and Mulgrave (0.9%). The town of Canso posted the largest decline at -12%.

The Halifax Metropolitan Area grew by 4.7% to 359,183 and remains the thirteenth largest metro area in the country. Areas of growth included Timberlea (12.3%), Herring Cove (8.4%) and Eastern Passage (8.3%).

Cape Breton Regional Municipality declined 7.6% and Queens Regional Municipality declined 5.6%.
