Role of the USSR NOC

The USSR Olympic Committee is an independent public body, which seeks:

- to develop physical education and amateur sport,
- to promote the Olympic ideal,
- to encourage and develop the international relations of Soviet sportsmen in the interest of strengthening international sports cooperation, and friendship and peace among nations,
- to represent Soviet sportsmen in the international sports movement and provide for their participation in the Olympic Games,
- to coordinate the activities of the USSR sports federations within the international organisations,
- to publicise abroad the achievement of USSR physical education and sport.

Origin

Russia was one of the twelve countries whose representatives initiated the renovation of the Olympic Games and founded the International Olympic Committee at the International Congress in Paris in 1894. Among the 14 IOC members elected at the Congress was Russian representative General A.D. de Boutowsky.




Organisation of the USSR NOC

Composition

In addition to the IOC members for the USSR, the NOC comprises the Presidents of the national sports federations, the Soviet representatives of the International Sports Federations, delegates of sports organisations of all Soviet Republics and the City of Leningrad, specialists in physical education and sport, scientists and journalists. Outstanding sportsmen such as Vassili Alexeiev, Valery Borzov, Michel Voronin, Boris Lagutin, Lev Yachin, etc. are among the members of the USSR NOC.

The NOC comprises 122 members.

- The Plenary Session constitutes the supreme authority of the NOC. It is convened at least once a year. It lays down the general guidelines for the activity of the USSR Olympic Committee, and ratifies changes in the NOC's composition and charter.
- The Executive Committee, responsible for managing the NOC between plenary sessions, is made up of a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary General and 21 members, all of whom are elected for four years by the Plenary Session. It meets at least once a month. Its duties consists of:
- keeping in touch with the IOC, National Olympic Committees and other national and international sports organisations;
- working out recommendations for Soviet sports organisations on different problems of the Olympic movement in accordance with decisions of the Olympic Congresses, Sessions and meetings of the IOC;
- nominating the USSR Olympic Committee's representatives to the Organising Committees for the Olympic Games;

- resolving problems with regard to the preparation for the Olympic Games, deciding on the composition of Olympic delegations and sending the entry forms for the participation of Soviet sportsmen to the Organising Committees for the Olympic Games;
- studying problems connected with the activities of the USSR sports federations and of their representa-

tives within the International Sports Federations, and organising conferences with the representatives of USSR sports federations with regard to their work within the international organisations;

- setting up commissions from among the USSR Olympic Committee members and voluntary personalities, to work out different problems of the Olympic movement.

Financing of the USSR NOC

Financing of the USSR NOC is ensured by Soviet public organisations and a sports lottery.

Olympic Awards obtained

Olympic Diploma

By Mr. Nikolai Romanov*, 37th recipient in 1962, chief of USSR physical education and sport at that time.

Bonacossa Trophy

In 1955, attributed to the USSR Olympic Committee for its magnificent demonstration of physical education at the Moscow Sports Parade in 1954. It was the first time that this cup was donated.

Olympic Day

The All-Union Day of Sportsmen has been celebrated annually since 1939, on the second Saturday of August. During the holiday and its preparation, considerable attention is paid to propagating Olympic ideas.

Protection of the Olympic emblems

The Soviet economic system excludes any possibility of using the Olympic emblems for commercial purposes. The Olympic emblems can be used in the Soviet Union with the permission of the USSR NOC solely for spreading the Olympic movement and its ideas.

International Olympic Academy

Delegations of the USSR NOC have taken part in the Academy's work since 1973.

Publications of the USSR NOC

Olympic information takes up a large part of Soviet press space. More than 30 sports publications are produced at present in the Soviet Union. Their total circulation exceeds 8,000,000 copies, the most important being the "Sovietski Sport" newspaper. The monthly magazine "Sport in the USSR" is published in six editions: French, English, German, Hungarian, Russian and Spanish.

Articles on the results of the Sessions and Executive Board meetings, on the preparation for the Olympic Games and on the activities of the USSR NOC's Praesidium appear regularly in the publications mentioned above.

USSR Olympic Bibliography

More than 700 books on sport are published annually in the USSR. The entire circulation of all the works exceeds 14,000,000 copies. Of course, many of them have an Olympic theme. Among the authors we would mention the Olympic champions Vladimir Kuts, Yevgeni Grishin, Leonid Jabotinski, Vsevolod Bobrov and others.

A special Olympic Encyclopaedia was edited in 1970, with 352 pages, written to give the readers all the necessary information about the modern Olympic movement. Besides, a series of articles on the Olympic movement was included in the 3rd edition of the Big Soviet Encyclopaedia. Its total circulation is about 650 thousand copies.

SPORT IN THE USSR

As a part of its functions, the USSR Olympic Committee collaborates with other organisations which are concerned with the problems of physical culture and sport.

Other sports governing bodies

- The USSR State Committee for physical culture and sport under the Council of Ministers of, the USSR;
- Committees for physical culture and sport of Union Republics and Moscow and Leningrad;
- The all-union council of tradesunion voluntary sports societies:
- The sports committee of the USSR Ministry of Defence;
- Voluntary sports societies: "Bourevestnik", "Vodnik", "Dinamo", "Zenit", "Lokomotiv", "Spartak", "Troudovye Rezervy", "Trud";
- The all-union scientific research institute of physical culture;
- "Fizkultura i Sport" publishing house;
- The newspaper "Sovietski Sport", etc.

Delegates of these organisations are members of the USSR NOC's Plenary Sessions.

The formation of sports leaders

247,875 coaches or sports teachers can be accounted for in the USSR. Every year about 20,000 newly qualified specialists come to work in USSR sports organisations. 23 institutes of physical

education, 3 institutes of scientific research, 84 physical education faculties, 10 coaches' schools, 4 physical education teaching schools and 74 departments of physical education in teaching schools were established for their preparation. Sports competitions are served by 3,484,000 judges or referees.

Sport at school

Teaching programmes in schools envisage 2 hours a week for lessons of physical culture and sport, and in the institutes and universities—4 hours a week. While learning theory of physical culture and sport students acquire knowledge on the history and development of the modern Olympic movement.

Sports which draw the biggest crowds

Football and ice hockey.

According to the most recent figures, we enumerate the following:

3,126 stadia for more than 1,500 spectators.

55,596 gymnasia.

1,179 swimming pools, including 596 indoor (61 of 50 m.).

Sports experiencing the greatest developments

Athletics, volleyball, skiing, football and basketball. 45,967,000 sportsmen practise a sport of one sort or another in 214,405 sports clubs in the country.

THE USSR AND THE IFS

The Soviet delegates take an active part in the functions of the IFs and thus many of them are elected to the executive bodies. The following hold at present the office of Vice-President: A. Sawine (volleyball), Y. Kabanov (rowing), A. Golianitski (fencing), A. Kouprianov (cycling), N. Nikiforov-Denisov (boxing), V. Andreyev (skiing), N. Kisselev (sports press).

Stop press: Mr. Nikiforov — Denisov was elected President of the AIBA on 25th September 1974.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Constantin Andrianov

IOC member for the USSR since 1951. since when he has also presided over the USSR NOC. Born on 16th February 1910 in Moscow, Graduated from the University of Moscow (History Faculty). He headed various youth organisations, and was elected several times as Deputy of the Moscow City Soviet. He took an active part in the sports movement as leader of the Moscow City Committee for physical culture and sport and President of the USSR Football Federation. From 1941 to 1958 he worked as Deputy Chairman of the USSR Sports Committee. In 1951 he was one of the creators of the USSR NOC and was elected to the IOC after the recognition of the NOC which he presided. He has been a member of the Executive Board since 1962 and assumed the duties of Vice-President between 1966 and 1970. He has published a considerable number of articles on the problems of the Olympic movement. He has 8 awards of the USSR Government and 4 awards of foreign States.

Alexei Romanov

IOC member for the USSR from 1952 to 1971 and since then honorary member.

Born on 16th October 1904 in Kabarda (Caucausus). From 1920 onwards. he constantly practised sport, physical education, riding, luge and all sorts of sports. For a long time he was classed among the best athletes of his country. Professor of physical education, he headed towards teaching and naturally towards the leadership of clubs of which he was a member. His career after that time became exceptional in several fields. Mr. Romanov was the holder of a professorship in physical education in several of the Soviet Union's Institutes, President of the State Committee of Soviet Russia, Deputy Minister for Russian Health, Vice-President of the Council for the Sports Union's duties, editor-in-chief of a magazine on the practical theory of physical culture.

Vitaly Smirnov

IOC member for the USSR since 1971. Born on 14th February 1935 in Khabarovsk. Graduated with honours from the Central Institute of Physical Culture as a teacher of physical education and from the University of Social Sciences in Moscow. He headed various youth and sports organisations, and was repeatedly elected Deputy of the Moscow City Soviet. Since 1970 he has been Deputy Chairman of the USSR Sports Committee. Practised swimming, water polo, tennis, and was USSR water polo champion. He was elected member of the national swimming federation and President of the water polo federation. Since 1969 he has been Vice-President of the USSR NOC. Member of the IOC Commission on the Olympic programme. Has 3 awards of the USSR Government. Has published a number of articles on the problems of physical education, sport and the Olympic movement.
