

Little Dragonflies Soap Sock

cotton



Description: This simple pattern is terrific for “knitting decompression” and makes a terrific gift with a bar of handmade soap.

Gauge: Not really relevant - average approximately 5.5 stitches and 7 stitches in 1” over pattern.

Needles: Size 6 double point needles with sport weight yarn.

Yarn:

Any sport weight or light worsted cotton. Knit One Crochet Too Recycled Cotton was used in the models.

Begin:

CO 36 sts. Divide evenly onto 3 dpns. Join being careful not to twist sts.

K 1 round.

Work 3 rounds in k1p1 rib.

Eyelet round: *k1, yo, k2tog, rep from *

Pattern:

Round 1 & 2: k

Round 3: *k3, p3, rep from *

Round 4: *k3, p1, k into the stitch below, p1, rep from *

Round 5 & 6: k

Round 7: *p3, k3, rep from *

Round 8: *p1, k into the stitch below, p1, k3, rep from *

Work these 8 rounds a total of 3 times.

K 2 rounds even.

Arrange sts onto 2 dpns evenly and bind off using kitchener stitch. *(Not interested in doing kitchener? That's okay. Simple bind off the sts and sew a seam.)*

NOTE: the pattern is worked in increments of 6 stitches. To adjust the size of the finished piece, simply add or subtract stitches in increments of 6.

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
