BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (May 5) – No. 12/10 Loyola beat No. 2/2 Syracuse 13-7 in the title game of the 2012 BIG EAST women's lacrosse championship held at the Carrier Dome. Loyola senior goalkeeper Kerry Stoothoff anchored a strong defensive effort with 11 saves and was named the tournament's Most



Outstanding Player. It was the second straight year the Greyhounds (13-5) have won the tournament, who also snapped Syracuse's school-record 15-game winning streak.

Loyola sophomore and BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year Marlee Paton had four points, including three goals and the Greyhounds' defense held Syracuse to just seven goals in the second half. Syracuse entered the game as the league's top scoring offense averaging 15.3 goals per game.

Greyhounds freshman Kara Burke registered her first career hat trick and totaled five points, including a team-high four goals. Freshman Annie Thomas also pumped in five points, including a pair of goals. Loyola scored a short-handed goal as Thomas netted her 22nd of the year with 27:28 remaining in the first half. Junior Joanna Dalton had a team-high six draw controls, while BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and senior Kellye Gallagher scooped up a game-high six ground balls.

The Orange faced their largest halftime deficit of the year as Loyola held a 7-3 lead at the intermission. BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year and Syracuse junior Michelle Tumolo led the Orange offense with three points, including two goals. Sophomore Alyssa Costantino had nine saves in 51:38 of game action. Syracuse finished with just two caused turnovers, while Loyola had eight.

THE INSIDE SCOOP

THREE NCAA SELECTIONS – Three BIG EAST teams were selected for the 2012 NCAA Championship, tournament winner **Loyola**, at-large selection **Syracuse** and at-large selection **Notre Dame**. It was the fifth time in league history the conference had three teams picked (2012, 2010, 2009, 2008, 2002). The Orange advanced to the title game of the NCAA Championship for the first time in school history.

QUARTERFINAL SUCCESS – Once again the BIG EAST was well-represented in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship. The Conference began sponsoring women's lacrosse in 2001 and has seen a team advance to the NCAA quarterfinals each year.

TITLE TIME – In its 12 years of existence, the BIG EAST has seen seven teams advance to the semifinals of the NCAA Championship. Prior to 2012, the last time a BIG EAST team played for the women's lacrosse national title was in 2002 (Georgetown). The BIG EAST was looking for its first in women's lacrosse.

IWLCA ALL-AMERICANS — Ten BIG EAST stars earned All-America honors, including five first team selections. Syracuse standouts Becca Block, Alyssa Murray and Michelle Tumolo each were named to the first team, along with Loyola standouts Kellye Gallagher and Marlee Paton.

WE'RE DANCING – The BIG EAST has had 13 teams selected to the NCAA tournament over the last five years, including three teams picked in four of the last five seasons.

Cincinnati (3-13)

0-8 BIG EAST

NOTES:

- The Bearcats closed out the year with a 14-11 loss at Detroit on April 30.
- Senior Laura Simanski led the team with 44 points, including 38 goals.
- Head coach Lellie Swords announced her resignation on May 1 after leading the program for its first five seasons.

"I've really enjoyed my five years at UC and believe we have left the program better than we found it," Swords said. "I'm excited about the next chapter in my life as my family pursues other opportunities outside of Ohio. I'm proud of the girls' accomplishments on and off the field and I will always hold a special place in my heart for the UC lacrosse program. I look forward to following their successes in the future."

Swords became UC's first intercollegiate women's lacrosse coach on Feb. 16, 2007, and led the Bearcats to the first win in school history on March 7, 2008, against Saint Mary's.

BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES

Connecticut (10-6)

3-5 BIG EAST

NOTES:

- UConn won three of its last four games and four of its last six to close out the year.
- The 10 wins are the team's highest win total since 2007.
- The Huskies were led offensively by senior M.E. Lapham who totaled 62 points, including 48 goals and 14 assists. She also had 29 draw controls and 26 ground balls.
- Lapham finished her career ranked first at UConn with 169 goals, second with 204 points. She also set a UConn record with a goal in 55 straight contests.
- Sophomore Lauren Kahn ranked second on the team with 30 goals. She also had 11 assists and totaled 41 points. Kahn recorded a team-high 40 draw controls, along with 28 ground balls.

Georgetown (9-8)

5-3 BIG EAST

LAST GAME: Lost at No. 2/2 Syracuse 7-6 in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship on May 3. The game was televised on the CBS Sports Network.

NOTES:

 Georgetown qualified for the BIG EAST tournament in all six years the Championship has been held.

Louisville (3-12)

1-7 BIG EAST

NOTES:

• Sophomore Nikki Boltja led the team with 55 points, including 53 goals and two assits. She also had 15 ground balls and seven draw controls.

Loyola (14-6)

7-1 BIG EAST

NOTES:

- Loyola earned the No. 6 seed in the NCAA Championship. The Greyhounds earned an automatic bid to the tournament after winning the BIG EAST title for a second-straight year.
- The Greyhounds hold an all-time record of 13-15 in the tournament, including an 9-6 mark in first round games.
- The Greyhounds have advanced to the Final Four seven times, including the national championship game in 1997. The last time Loyola made it to the Final Four was in 2003.
- Sophomore Marlee Paton stretched her point streak to 26-straight games.
- Head coach Jen Adams has been announced as one of eight inductees into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. This year's class will be inducted in a ceremony on Oct. 20, at The Grand Lodge in Hunt Valley, Md. Adams joins Roy Colsey, Brian Dougherty, Missy Foote, Kelly Amonte Hiller, Jesse Hubbard, Tim Nelson and her former collegiate coach, Cindy Timchal, as the 2012 induction class.

Notre Dame (13-5)

6-2 BIG EAST

LAST GAME: Lost at No. 2/2 Northwestern 12-7 in the first round of the NCAA Championship on May 12.

NOTES:

- Notre Dame faced the Wildcats for the second time in three weeks and for the fourth time in Notre Dame's seven trips to the NCAAs. Notre Dame also played at Northwestern in the first round of the 2004, 2008 and 2010 NCAA Tournaments.
- In its tournament history, Notre Dame is 4-7 with three quarterfinal appearances, including a Final Four berth in 2006.
- The Irish began the year 8-0, their best start to a season since 2004 and the second-best start in program history. Notre Dame is under the direction of first-year head coach Christine Halfpenny.





Rutgers (9-7)

4-4 BIG EAST

NOTES:

- Senior Ali Steinberg led the team with 48 points, including 32 goals and 16 assists. She also recorded 38 draw controls and 21 ground balls.
- Junior Stephanie Anderson had 46 points and a team-high 41 goals. She also recorded 19 ground balls.

BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES

Syracuse (19-4)

8-0 BIG EAST

NOTES:

- The 14-13 (20t) win over No. 1/1 Florida in the semifinals marked the first time SU beat the No. 1 team in the country in 16 tries. Syracuse also set a single-season record with 19 wins on the year.
- Syracuse earned a program-best No. 4 seed in the NCAA tournament and made its first appearance in the title game.
- The Orange made their 10th appearance in the national tournament and are 9-10 all-time.
- Earlier this year, the Orange earned a programbest No. 2 ranking in the national polls and won a school-record 15 consecutive games. SU posted two wins against teams ranked in the top five and four against top 10 teams. In addition, Syracuse went undefeated in BIG EAST play (8-0) for the second time since joining the league in 2001.
- SU has advanced to the Final Four on three occasions: 2008, 2010 and 2012. Notre Dame advanced to the semifinals in 2006 making a BIG EAST team present every recent even year.

Villanova (4-12)

2-6 BIG EAST

NOTES:

- Senior Justine Donodeo led the team with 44 points, including 36 goals. She also had eight assists.
- In their third-year of BIG EAST play, the Wildcats had their highest number of conference wins (two). Entering the season, VU had two combined in the previous two years (2010 and 2011).

BIG EAST

- For the second staight year, seven BIG EAST games were carried on the CBS Sports Network in 2012. This includes four regular-season dates, both semifinal games of the 2012 tournament on May 3, and the title game on May 5.
- The 2012 BIG EAST Championship was held at Syracuse. It was the second time the league championship was held in upstate New York and the first time since the inaugural league title was handed out in 2007.
- The 2013 BIG EAST Championship will be held at Loyola on May 2 and 4. The 6,000 seat Ridley Athletic Complex opened in March of 2010. It will be the first time the facility has hosted the event.
- Temple will join the league in in 2013-14.
- Georgetown's Ricky Fried has been named the head coach of the U.S. Women's National squad by the US Lacrosse. He was been appointed to a four-year term leading up to the 2013 World Cup. In 2010, Fried served as an assistant coach with the team that won the 2009 World Cup in Prague, Czech Republic.

On May 10, Syracuse junior and BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year Michelle Tumolo was named one of five finalists. A member of the 2011-12 U.S. women's national team, she became only the second player in Syracuse history to record 200 points and 100 assists in her career.

Marquette

- On Dec. 16, 2010, Marquette University announced it will add men's and women's lacrosse to its NCAA Division I varsity sports offerings. Both teams will begin competition in spring 2013.
- The Golden Eagles will play as an independent their first season of competition (2013), before becoming a full member of the BIG EAST Conference in men's and women's lacrosse in 2014.
- On Feb. 4, 2011, Marquette announced the hiring of Meredith Simon Black (Notre Dame '04) as its first women's head coach. Joe Amplo will coach the men.
- Simon Black arrives at Marquette after spending the last six years as an assistant coach at Towson, Notre Dame and California. She helped Towson and Notre Dame to a combined four NCAA Championship appearances before spending one season at Cal.

Tumolo was named BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year after totaling 79 points, including 40 goals and 39 assists. The junior also helped her team to a perfect 8-0 record in league play and the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Championship. In conference action, Tumolo

registered 40 points, including 20 goals and 20 assists to average 5.0 points per game. The league's Preseason Player of the Year, Tumolo is just the second Syracuse star to earn BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year honors and the school's third winner overall (joining Katie Rowan 2008 and 2009).

COACH OF THE YEAR

Gary Gait, Sracuse

In his fifth season with Syracuse, Gait earned his second BIG EAST Coach of the Year honor following an undefeated 8-0 mark in league play. The Orange won the BIG EAST regular-season title for the fifth time in



program history, and captured their second outright crown. Syracuse also was the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Championship for just the second time. Under the direction of Gait, junior Michelle Tumolo and sophomore Alyssa Murray were among the 25 nominees for the Tewaaraton Trophy. The Orange were ranked No. 2 in the nation, the highest mark in school history. Syracuse knocked off nine ranked opponents during the regular-season and entered the BIG EAST Championship riding a program-record 14-game winning streak. Gait helped the Orange garner nine all-conference selections, including four first-team picks.

MIDFIELDER OF THE YEAR

Marlee Paton, Loyola, So., M

Paton was named the BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year after leading the Conference with 48 points in league play. The sophomore recorded 28 goals and 20 assists in league action and a team-high 74 points (43 goals, 31 assists) in all games. In addition, Paton had 17

ground balls, 14 caused turnovers and 10 draw controls. She recorded a season-high nine points in a game twice this year and has recorded seven hat tricks. During BIG EAST contests, she helped the Greyhounds lead the league in ground balls per game (18.3) and rank second in scoring (15.5) and caused turnovers (10.9). Paton is the third sophomore to win the award. Paton becomes just the second Loyola player to earn Midfielder of the Year accolades, joining Kate McHarg (2006).

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Kellye Gallagher, Loyola, Sr., D

Gallagher was named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year after leading the league in ground balls (52) and caused turnovers (43). The senior also led the league in those categories in conference play with



23 ground balls and 20 caused turnovers. Defensively, Loyola held its opponents to just 10.2 goals per game, while averaging a league-leading 11.3 caused turnovers and 19.6 ground balls. Gallagher totaled 13 draw controls and started all 16 games for the Greyhounds. She is the first player in school history to earn BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honors.

BIGEAST.tv also will feature highlights of every nationally televised BIG EAST contest posted following the conclusion of every game, complete game replays of televised contests 72 hours post conclusion and other on-demand interviews and features. In addition, fans can access BIGEAST.tv for live streaming of certain conference championships, which was offered free-to-consumers for the first time in 2010-11.


