**SERIES NOTES**

In their last meeting (on Feb.22), Chicago defeated Milwaukee 110-91 at the United Center ... the Bulls are currently on a seven game winning streak against the Bucks (have won three streak at the Bradley Center) ... in Chicago's 113-90 win at the Bradley Center on Feb. 4, the Bulls outrebounded the Bucks 53-39 ... the Bulls also shot .533 from the field, and limited the Bucks to just .398 from the field ... in their first meeting this year on Jan. 27, Chicago defeated Milwaukee 107-100; Derrick Rose led the way with 34 points, while Carlos Boozer (20 points and 13 boards) and Joakim Noah (15 points and 16 boards) both recorded double-doubles ... last year, the Bulls went 4-0 versus Milwaukee, sweeping the season series for the first time since 2006-07, and just the third time since 1998-99 ... since the 2003-04 season, Chicago has gone a combined 25-10 against Milwaukee (15-3 at the UC) ... the Bulls are 72-37 all-time in the Windy City, including 30-8 at the United Center ... the Bulls are 11-4 versus the Bucks

since Scott Skiles was named Milwaukee's Head Coach prior to the 2008-09 campaign; over the parts of five seasons with the Bulls (2003-07), Skiles went 165-172 with the Bulls, and guided Chicago to the postseason three times (10-12).

The Bulls defeated the Magic 97-83 in their first meeting this season ... both Derrick Rose and Luol Deng posted 21 points, while Dwight Howard tallied 28 points and 15 boards for the Magic ... Chicago won last year's season series 3-1, which marked the first time Chicago had won a season series over the Magic since the 2005-06 campaign ... in Chicago's three victories last season, Derrick Rose averaged 25.0 ppg, 6.3 apg and 3.3 mpg ... in their final game last season, Rose recorded a game-high 39 points to go along with his five assists and three boards, his performance helped Chicago defeat Orlando 102-99 ... last season, with their win over the Magic on Jan. 28, 2011 the Bulls snapped a five-game losing streak to Orlando ... over the last five seasons against the Magic, Chicago is 12-14 (.462) ... the Bulls are 24-18 versus the Magic in Chicago and 17-23 against the Magic in Orlando ... the Magic outscored the Bulls last year 94.3 ppg to 92.0 ... in three games versus the Bulls last season, Dwight

Howard averaged 24.3 ppg, 12.3 rpg and 3.00 bpg in 40.0 mpg .... Chicago is 2-4 versus Orlando in overtime games.

## NOTE-A-BULLS



With its 92-72 win over Indiana on Monday, Chicago has won a season-high seven games in a row. On the year, the Bulls have strung together win streaks of five or more games a league-high four times.



The Bulls outrebounded the Pacers 60-32 in their victory Monday night. That's the largest positive rebound margin the Bulls have had in a game since they pulled down 34 more rebounds than the 76ers in a game on April 7, 1997 (66-32). The Bulls had six player with least seven rebounds in that game, led by Luc Longley (11) and Jud Buechler (10) (*Elias Sports Bureau*).



As of games played through March 5, Chicago has won 10 games this season by 20 or more points (tied with Philadelphia for most in the NBA).



Since the All-Star break, Derrick Rose has posted three games with 20 or more points (including a season-high 35 point game). Over that span (five games), he's averaging 25.6 ppg, 7.8 apg, 2.4 rpg and 1.00 bpg, while shooting .456 from the field and .750 from the line. Rose was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played from Feb. 27 through March 4.



Through Chicago's game at Washington on Jan. 30, Joakim Noah was averaging 9.3 rpg (17<sup>th</sup> in the NBA). Since that time, Noah has averaged 11.9 rpg (202 rebounds in 17 games), and increased his rebounds per game average to 10.4 (eighth).



With a record of 32-8 (.800), the Bulls are on pace to finish with a record of 53-13). During an 82-game regular season, Chicago's current winning percentage would translate to a record of 66-16.



On the season, Chicago ranks second in assists per game (23.2), second in points allowed (87.8), first in rebounds per game (46.0), second in opponent rebounds per game (40.1), second in offensive rebounds per game (13.3), second in assists to turnover ratio (1.64), fourth in turnovers per game (14.1), fourth in field goal percentage (.460), third in three-point field goal percentage (.389), fifth in blocks per game (5.70), eighth in points per game (97.6), fifth in opponent field goal percentage (.422).



On Friday versus Cleveland, Luol Deng scored 24 points and went 4-for-4 from three-point range to help the Bulls defeat the Cavs. It is the first time that Deng has shot 4-for-4 or better from three-point range in a game in his career (*Elias Sports Bureau*).



With their win on Wednesday (at SAS), Chicago finished the month of February with a record of 11-3 (.786). The last time the Bulls won as many as 11 games in February or had a winning percentage this high for the month was February 1996 (team finished with an 11-3 record; the team also finished 10-2 (.833) in February 1997).



To date, Chicago has played in a league-high 40 games. Chicago played its first 40 games in 71 days. With tonight's game against Indiana, Chicago will close out the remainder of the regular season by playing 26 games in 52 days.



On Tuesday (Feb. 28) versus New Orleans, Derrick Rose scored 32 points, while Joakim Noah had 15 points, 16 rebounds and five assists in the Bulls' 99-95 victory over the Hornets. It was the first NBA game this season in which one player scored at least 30 points and his teammates produced a 15-15-5 (points-rebounds-assists) performance (*Elias Sports Bureau*).



Chicago leads the NBA in road wins with 17. The Bulls are 17-6 on the road this season.



Chicago is 16-0 on the road this year when ahead at the half.



Chicago is 19-0 when holding an opponent to less than 90 points.



Chicago is 27-0 this year when leading after the first quarter, including 15-0 when ahead after the first quarter on the road.



Chicago is 14-0 this year when it scores 100 or more points in a game.



Chicago is 13-0 this year when it shoots .500 or better from the floor.



Chicago is 14-0 this year when it holds its opponent to less than 85 points. Last year, the Bulls held their opponent to 85 points or less an NBA-best 29 times (27-2).



22 of Chicago's 32 wins have been by 10 or more points. The Bulls rank first in the NBA in scoring differential (+9.7 points).



Chicago is allowing 87.8 ppg (second in the NBA). The Bulls' team record for opponent scoring in a season is 89.6 ppg (1997-98).



Chicago has held its opponents to less than 100 points in 33 of its first 40 games (the Bulls have held opponents to 75 points or less nine times). The Bulls are 27-6 when holding their opponent under the century mark.



Chicago has started the season 15-2 at home. Dating back to last season, the Bulls are 51-7 (.879) at the United Center.



On Feb. 22 versus Milwaukee, Joakim Noah recorded the first triple-double of his career, as he finished with 13 points, 13 rebounds and a career-high 10 assists. Noah is the first Bulls center since Artis Gilmore on Dec. 20, 1977 (35 points, 15 rebounds and 11 blocks) to post a triple-double.



Bulls Head Coach Tom Thibodeau has used eight different starting lineups this season. The starting five of Derrick Rose, Ronnie Brewer, Luol Deng, Carlos Boozer and Joakim Noah has enjoyed the most success, going 12-1 this year.



Both Luol Deng and C.J. Watson currently ranks 13<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in three-point field goal shooting at .432 from behind the arc. The last Bull to rank in the Top 10 in the NBA in three-point shooting was Ben Gordon in 2005-06 (sixth, .435).

Chicago has not lost consecutive games in the regular season since Feb. 5-7, 2011, a span of 72 games (the longest such active streak in the NBA). The last time the Bulls lost three games in a row, occurred during a 10-game skid Feb. 27-March 19, 2010.



**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR** The Bulls were represented at this year's NBA All-Star Game in Orlando. For the first time since 1997 (Michael Jordan and Scottie Pippen), Chicago had two players (Derrick Rose and Luol Deng) participate in the All-Star Game. Also, for the second straight year, Rose was voted in by the fans to start the 2012 All-Star Game. Rose tallied 1,514,723 votes (the third most in the NBA behind Dwight Howard and Kobe Bryant). It was Rose's third straight All-Star nod (he made the East squad as a reserve during the 2009-10 season). Deng made his first All-Star Game appearance as a reserve. Selected to the East All-Star team by Eastern Conference head coaches, Deng is the 14<sup>th</sup> Bull ever selected to an All-Star Game. Bulls Head Coach Tom Thibodeau and his staff coached the

Eastern Conference All-Stars. Thibodeau joined Phil Jackson (1992, 1996) as the only head coaches in team history to be selected as an NBA All-Star Game head coach. Bulls' Assistant Coach Ron Adams coached the TEAM SHAQ squad in the Rising Stars Challenge.

**BLOOMING AT THE LINE** Since his rookie year in 2008-09, Derrick Rose has seen his free throws made and free throw attempts increase each season. In 2010-11, Rose posted career highs in free throws made (5.9), as well as free throw attempts (6.9). Through the first two months of last season, Rose averaged 4.0 FTM/game and 5.1 FTA/game, compared to 7.0 FTM/game and 7.8 FTA/game from Jan. 1 through the end of the regular season. Here's a look at his numbers from the line over his first three seasons in the NBA.

## HEAD COACH TOM THIBODEAU



### Second Season in Chicago: 94-28 (.770) / Playoffs: 9-7 (.563)

A veteran of 21 years along the NBA sidelines, Tom Thibodeau (pronounced Thib-uh-DOE) was named the 18<sup>th</sup> head coach in franchise history on June 23, 2010 ... earned Eastern Conference Coach of the Month honors for games played in December and January 2012, as the Bulls went 18-5 ... in his first season as head coach, Thibodeau guided the Bulls to the Eastern Conference Finals, the team's first appearance in the Conference Finals since the 1997-98 season ... the Bulls also won the Central Division title, en route to the franchise's sixth 60-win season in team history with a record of 62-20 (.756) ... his 62 wins in 2010-11 broke Phil Jackson's franchise mark (55 in 1989-90) for most wins by a first-year Bulls head coach ... he is just one of three coaches (along with Paul Westphal and Bill Russell) in NBA history to win 60 or more games in his first year as a head coach, and his 62 victories tie Westphal for the most wins by a first-year head coach in league history ... was named the 2010-2011 NBA Coach of the Year ... he was named NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month on three occasions (January 12-4, March 13-3 and April 8-0) ... he is the first Bulls head coach to win the award three times in a season ... Chicago finished the 2010-11 regular season with the best record in the NBA, and also claimed the top seed in the Eastern Conference ... his 62 wins in his first season with the Bulls marked a 21-game improvement from the team's record of 41-41 in 2009-10, the third-best single-season turnaround in team history ... Chicago went 36-5 (.878) at the United Center, good for the best home record in the NBA ... during the 2010-11 season, Chicago was 16-4 following a loss ... the Bulls posted an NBA-best record of 27-10 (.730) against teams with a winning record ... in his first season with the Bulls, Chicago finished the year ranked first in the NBA in opponent field goal percentage (.430), first in opponent three-point field goal percentage (.326), first in opponent rebounds per game (38.4), first in rebound margin (plus-5.7), second in point differential (plus-7.3), second in opponent points per game (91.3), second in opponent assists per game (19.0), second in the NBA in rebounds per game (44.2) and fifth in blocks per game (5.71) ... Thibodeau served as the Associate Head Coach of the Boston Celtics from 2007-10, where the Celtics made two trips to the NBA Finals and won the 2008 NBA Championship ... prior to joining the Bulls, his teams won .530 of their games (896-794) in the regular season and .527 of their postseason contests (88-79) ... including his year in Chicago, his teams have advanced to the NBA postseason 15 times, including three trips to the NBA Finals (1999, 2008 and 2010) ... he implemented and oversaw Boston's defensive principles during his time on Doc Rivers' staff ... in 2007-08, his first year with the Celtics, Boston held its opponents to 90.3 ppg, an improvement of 8.9 ppg from the previous season, and limited its foes to an NBA-low .419 field goal shooting, down from .468 the year before ... during Boston's 2008 playoff run that culminated in the franchise's NBA-record 17<sup>th</sup> world championship, the Celtics held the Los Angeles Lakers to 93.8 ppg and .441 field-goal shooting in the NBA Finals (L.A. averaged 102.4 ppg and shot .468 from the field in the 2008 playoffs) ... he has helped his teams rank in the NBA's top 10 in team defense 17 times, including finishing in the top two in opponent field goal percentage 11 times ... his teams have ranked in the top two in opponent scoring seven times ... he has also coached for the Minnesota Timberwolves (1989-91), the San Antonio Spurs (1992-94), the Philadelphia 76ers (1994-96), the New York Knicks (1996-2003) and the Houston Rockets (2003-07) ... he spent the 1991-92 season as an advance scout with the Seattle SuperSonics ... while serving as an assistant coach in the NBA, he worked under Bill Musselman, Jerry Tarkanian, John Lucas, Jeff Van Gundy, Don Chaney and Doc Rivers ... in 2000-01 with New York, the Knicks established a then-NBA record when they held 33 consecutive opponents to under 100 points ... he was a four-year letter winner in basketball at Salem State University (Salem, Mass.) ... he was team captain his senior season, and a member of back-to-back MASCAC Conference Champion squads in 1980 and 1981 (the first two basketball teams in school history to qualify for the Division III NCAA Tournament) ... in 1981, upon completion of his collegiate career, he took his first coaching job as an assistant on the Vikings staff ... following three years as an assistant, he was promoted to head coach at Salem State University, a position he held for one season ... in 1985, he was hired as an assistant coach at Harvard University, where he spent four seasons on campus, before accepting a spot on Bill Musselman's coaching staff with the expansion Minnesota Timberwolves in 1989 ... Thibodeau, 54, was born in New Britain, Conn., on Jan. 17, 1958 ... he holds bachelor's and master's degrees in counseling from Salem State University ... he was inducted into the New Britain Sports Hall of Fame in 1998.
