ROCKETS 112 SUNS 119 Regular Season Game 81 US Airways Center	PHOENIX – The Suns won for the second time in their last three games with a solid 119-112 win over the Houston Rockets at US Airways Center. Phoenix snapped a seven-game home losing streak thanks to four 20-point scorers in a single game for the first time since the 2009-10 season. Luis Scola scored a game-high 26 points with 15 rebounds, Goran Dragic added 21 points, 14 assists and three steals, PJ Tucker added a career-high 21 points, and Markieff Morris finished with 20 points. Kieff actually added seven rebounds, five steals and six blocks, the first player with at least those numbers since Suns forward Antonio McDyess in 1998. The Suns jumped out early, scoring 39 first-quarter points and building an early 12-point lead. Houston stormed back to take a five-point lead but Phoenix closed the second quarter on a 17-6 run and never trailed in the second half. The Suns split the four-game season series with the Rockets, with one of the losses on a three-pointer at the buzzer. Phoenix improved to 5-0 at home under Lindsey Hunter against the Rockets, Lakers and Clippers, all Western Conference playoff teams. The Suns limited James Harden to 16 points on 5-of-18 shooting, 0-of-7 from three-point range.

SUNS 93 WOLVES 105 Regular Season Game 80 Target Center	MINNEAPOLIS – The Suns built an early double-digit lead and shot better than 50 percent for the game, but dropped a 105-93 decision to the Timberwolves in Minnesota. After a 53-point first half, the Suns mustered just 40 after halftime and lost to a Minnesota team with Kevin Love and Nickola Pekovic . Ricky Rubio led the way for Minnesota, tallying 24 points, 10 assists and five steals, one of six double-digit scorers for the Timberwolves. Minnesota overcame a 20-point night from Suns forward Markieff Morris , 16 points off the bench from Jared Dudley , and 10 points, 14 assists and four steals from Goran Dragic . Wes Johnson also added 15 for Phoenix. The Suns were outscored 44-30 in the paint, mostly thanks to the work of Rubio and JJ Barea off the dribble; Barea finished with 16 points on 7-of-9 shooting. Phoenix mustered 28 assists on 37 made field goals and shot 45.0 percent from three-point range (9-of-20). The Suns offense, which was so successful early, was derailed by 17 Minnesota steals, and 28 turnovers overall that led to 33 points for the Timberwolves, a huge advantage over the 11 points Phoenix scored off Minnesota miscues.

SUNS 102 MAVS 91 Regular Season Game 79 American Airlines Center	DALLAS – The Suns played very well for a second consecutive night, this time getting a big win in Big D, snapping a season-long 10-game losing streak overall and series-long 10-game road losing streak in Dallas, in a 102-91 win over the Mavericks. Phoenix led by as many as 14 in the game and fought off a late Dallas charge thanks five starters who scored in double figures, led by 21 points, 13 assists and two steals from Goran Dragic . Wes Johnson added 17 points, PJ Tucker had 17 points and a career-high tying 10 rebounds, Luis Scola recorded 11 points and a season-high 15 boards, and Markieff Morris had 12 points and seven rebounds. Add that to the 18 points scored off the bench by Jared Dudley and Phoenix reached 100 points for the fifth time in seven games. The Suns defense held Dallas to 40.0 percent shooting, including just 35.3 percent from three, and just 40 second-half points overall. Shawn Marion led the Mavericks with 22 points and nine rebounds, as Dallas missed a chance to climb back to .500 for the first time in months and shave the beards they have been growing in the interim.

TONIGHT'S OPPONENT (Game 82 – April 17) DENVER NUGGETS (56-25)

- This is the third and final meeting this season between the Suns and Nuggets, first March 11 at US Airways Center.
- In the first meeting this season, the Suns snapped Denver's six-game series win streak, which had been the club's longest in the series since March 17, 1982-March 22, 1983.
- The Suns will look to win the season series against the Nuggets for the first time since 2009-10.
- Phoenix has won 13 of their last 16 home games against Denver. The Suns' had won 12-straight home games in the series, but the Nuggets snapped that streak in the season series finale in 2010-11 (March 10), their first win in Phoenix since April 2004.
- Denver won all three meetings against the Suns in 2011-12, sweeping the season series for the first time 2003-04. The Suns have dropped two-straight season series against the Nuggets.
- The Suns have won 18 of the last 31 matchups and 38 of the last 60 meetings against Denver.
- Phoenix overcame a 22-point deficit on Mar. 31, 2008, tied for the third-largest in franchise history.
- April 1, 2003: Phoenix held Denver to 65 points, tied for the fewest in Suns franchise history, setting a US Airways Center low. The Nuggets also shot 26.3 percent from the field to set a Suns opponent low, a Denver franchise low, and a USAC mark for lowest field goal percentage in a game.

LAST REGULAR SEASON MEETING

Nuggets 108, Suns 93

03/11/13 at US Airways Center

PHOENIX – The Denver Nuggets extended their win streak to nine games with a 108-93 victory over the Suns. Phoenix had won four of six entering the game but a Nuggets team that leads the league in points in the paint dominated Phoenix inside, scoring an opponent season-high 74 points in the paint. The league's top fastbreak team ran to 22 points, most created off of 19 Suns turnovers that turned into 28 easy Denver points. **Kosta Koufos** led the Nuggets' domination inside; Koufos, who averages just over eight points on the year, scored Denver's first 13 points in the game en route to a career-high 22 points. **Corey Brewer** added 20 points off the bench for the Nuggets. Phoenix was led by a trio of contributors who were not playing at all for the Suns just one month ago; **Wes Johnson** scored a team-high 18 points, his second effort of 18 or more in three games as a starter. **Marcus Morris** added 16 points, matching his highest scoring output as a Sun, and **Hamed Haddadi** scored a career-high 13 points, grabbed eight boards and blocked two shots, his third-straight game with multiple blocks. Denver led by as many as 18 points in the game.

SUNS 2012-13 QUICKNOTES

OVERALL TEAM QUICKNOTES

- The Suns have won **SEVEN** of their last **24** games.
- In that stretch, the Suns are **5-7 (.417)** against winning teams, including victories over **San Antonio, Atlanta, Houston** and the **LA Lakers**. Phoenix is **2-10 (.167)** against sub-.500 teams in that span.
- Phoenix had won **THREE**-straight games and **FOUR** of **SEVEN** immediately before **Marcin Gortat** was lost to injury on **March 6**. The Suns are **4-16 (.200)** since losing Gortat to injury.
- The Suns were **8-12 (.400)** in games started by **Marcin Gortat** under interim head coach **Lindsey Hunter**. The club is **4-16 (.200)** without him.
- The Suns own **NINE** wins over Western Conference teams who would qualify for the playoffs if the season ended today. Phoenix has defeated **San Antonio, LA Clippers, Denver** and **Houston**, and owns multiple wins over **Memphis** and the **LA Lakers**.
- The Suns are **8-20 (.286)** overall since the All-Star break. Phoenix is **7-13 (.350)** against the Western Conference since the break.
- The Suns are **3-9 (.250)** on the road in the season's second half.
- The Suns are **12-28 (.300)** since their Jan. 20 coaching change. Phoenix's **40** games during interim head coach **LINDSEY HUNTER's** tenure include **14** games against the West's top six teams, **20** games that were part of a back-to-back set, and **20** road games.
- **SEVEN** of the Suns' **12** wins under **HUNTER** have come against a team with **39 victories** or more. Of Phoenix's **40** games during **LINDSEY HUNTER's** tenure, Phoenix has played **21** against a 30-win team (at the time of the game). Phoenix owns a **7-14 (.333)** record in those contests.
- Phoenix's **12** wins under Hunter are against teams with a combined record of **519-443 (.540)** and include the **Spurs, Clippers, Grizzlies, Hawks, Rockets (2), Lakers (2), Blazers, Kings, Timberwolves** and **Mavericks**.
- That's **12** wins in **40** games for the Suns, who had won **SIX** times in **26** games prior to their coaching change (**TWICE** in the **15** games immediately preceding the change).
- The Suns are **5-15 (.250)** on the road under Hunter. Phoenix was **3-17 (.150)** on the road before the coaching change.
- Phoenix is **5-13 (.278)** on the road against the Western Conference under Hunter. Phoenix was **0-7** in those contests before the coaching change.
- The Suns have won **THREE** road games when trailing after three quarters under Hunter. The Suns had an **0-15** mark in those instances before Jan. 20.
- **EIGHT** of the first **NINE** games, **10** of the first **14**, and **20** of the Suns' first **40** contests of the Hunter era have been played as part of a **back-to-back set** (Jan. 23-24, Jan. 26-27, Feb. 1-2, Feb. 5-6, Feb. 19-20, Feb. 26-27, March 8-9, March 15-16, March 27-28, April 9-10). So far under Hunter, the Suns are **4-6 (.400)** on the first night of a back-to-back and **4-6 (.400)** on the second night.
- The Suns have won **FIVE** of their last **14** home games overall.
- **Hunter's** Suns are **7-13 (.350)** at home. Phoenix has defeated the **Clippers, Lakers, Hawks, Rockets** and **Timberwolves**.
- **Hunter's** Suns are **5-0** combined at home against the Lakers, Rockets and Clippers.
- **Hunter's** Suns are **4-7 (.364)** overall against the Pacific Division, including a **3-2 (.600)** home record in divisional games under Hunter.
- **Hunter** joined **Alvin Gentry, Scott Skiles** and **Jerry Colangelo** (1969-70) as the only coaches in franchise history to begin their respective tenures **2-0**. All four were midseason replacements.
- Hunter became the **NINTH** head coach (out of 15) in franchise history to win his debut with Phoenix. Hunter joined **Kerr, Colangelo, Fitzsimmons, MacLeod, Westphal, Skiles, Porter** and **Gentry**.
- Hunter joined **Terry Porter** (2008-09 at San Antonio) as the only Suns head coaches to win a debut game played on the road.
- **13** of the Suns' **25** wins this season are over teams who owned a .500 record or better at the time of the game.
- **The Suns collected the 2,000th win in franchise history on Jan. 12 at Chicago, becoming the fourth-fastest franchise to reach the plateau in NBA history, trailing only Boston, the Lakers and Philadelphia. Phoenix owns the FOURTH-best win percentage (.556) in league history and was also the FOURTH-fastest franchise to earn victory 1,900 when they did so March 6, 2010 vs. Indiana.**
- **WHAT DOES THIS MEAN TO YOU?** The Suns have trailed by double digits in **57** of **81** games this season, but have been in **13** games decided by **THREE** points or fewer this season, **and that doesn't include TWO of the Suns' FOUR overtime games this season that wound up larger than a three-point margin.**
- Of the Suns' **25** victories this season, **NINE** have come in games in which Phoenix trailed by 10 or more points (**SEVEN** at home, **TWO** on the road).
- Of the Suns' **17** home victories this season, **SEVEN** have come in games in which Phoenix trailed by 10 or more points.
- The Suns have trailed by double figures in **29** of **41** home games this season.
- **10** of Phoenix's **41** home games have been decided by three points or fewer, and that doesn't include one of the Suns' home overtime contests.
- **THREE** of the Suns' comebacks are from deficits of **19 or more points**.

PLAYER QUICKNOTES

- **GORAN DRAGIĆ**, at the All-Star break, was one of two NBA players leading his team in points, assists, steals and free throw attempts. The other player: **LeBron James**.
- **DRAGIĆ** is one of only **FOUR** NBA players averaging better than **14.0** points, **7.0** assists and **1.50** steals (**LEBRON JAMES, RUSSELL WESTBROOK, JRUE HOLIDAY**) and is on pace to become only the **THIRD** Sun in franchise history to do so for an entire season (**KEVIN JOHNSON, JASON KIDD**).
- **DRAGIĆ** leads the Suns in double-digit scoring games, 20-point games and 30-point games this season.
- **DRAGIĆ** has at least one steal in **60** of **77** games this season and multiple steals in **38** of **77** contests, the most multiple-steal games by a Sun since **Shawn Marion** in **2006-07**, and most by a Suns guard since **PENNY HARDAWAY** in **2001-02**.
- **DRAGIĆ** is averaging a team-high **4.2** free throw attempts this season. That's the highest average by a Suns guard, and the first Phoenix guard to lead the Suns in attempts, since **Stephon Marbury** in **2003-04**. He has **FIVE** games of 10 or more free-throw attempts, most by a Suns guard in a single season since **Marbury** in **2002-03**.

- **DRAGIC** is averaging a team-high **1.61** steals, the highest by a Suns since **Shawn Marion** in **2006-07**, and highest by a Phoenix guard since **Jason Kidd** in **2000-01**.
- **DRAGIC** has **20** double-digit assist efforts overall this season after tallying **15** in his first **three** NBA seasons combined.
- **DRAGIC** is averaging **16.1 points**, **9.5 assists** and **2.03 steals** since the All-Star break.
- **DRAGIC** has dished double-digit assists in an **NBA-best 15** of **26** games since the break after doing so **FIVE** times in his first **51** games this season.
- **DRAGIC's 246** total assists since the All-Star break are the **SECOND-MOST** in the NBA.
- **Feb. 19: DRAGIC** dished a career-high **18** assists, joining **Rajon Rondo** (twice) and **Jose Calderon** as the only NBA players this season with at least **18** assists in a game, and the **ONLY** player in the NBA this season with at least **16 points** and **18 assists** in a game
- **WES JOHNSON** has scored in double figures **16** times as a Sun, all since the All-Star break.
- **JOHNSON** has scored **18** or more points **SIX** times in **20** games since moving into the starting lineup on March 8 at Sacramento.
- **JOHNSON** has scored **14** or more points **14** times (all in last **28 games**) after doing so **TWICE** in 2011-12 with Minnesota (**65** games).
- **MORRIS TWINS:** With the acquisition of **MARCUS MORRIS** on Feb. 21, the Suns now have just the **SECOND** pair of twins to be teammates in NBA history, joining the **DICK** and **TOM VAN ARSDALE**, who played for this very same organization in **1976-77**. Would you believe that when Marcus and **MARKIEFF** made their Suns debut as teammates, it was on **Feb. 22, 2013**---the 70th birthday of the Van Arsdale twins?
- **MORRIS TWINS:** On March 8 at Sacramento, the twins became the first pair of twin brother teammates to start an NBA game in league history. **DICK** and **TOM VAN ARSDALE**, the only other twin teammates in NBA history, did not do so in the 1976-77 season.
- **MARKIEFF** has scored **EIGHT** or more points in **18** of **26** games since the Suns' acquisition of **MARCUS**. He had done so **TWICE** in the **12** contests before the trade. He has **14** double-digit scoring games in his last **26**, after tallying **FOUR** in the previous **28**.
- **MARCUS** has scored in double figures in **SIX** of his last **19** games, including **TWO** games of 16 or more points. He has recorded a **FOUR**-game double-digit scoring streak as a Sun, the **SECOND**-longest of his career.
- Before sustaining a Lisfranc (midfoot) sprain in his right foot on March 6, **MARCIN GORTAT** had started **138 consecutive games** and had appeared in **182 consecutive games** since being acquired by the Suns. Gortat had not missed a single game as a member of the Suns (since being acquired Dec. 18, 2010). **Gortat was the only Suns player to start every game this season before the injury.**
- **MARCIN GORTAT** has **FIVE** games of **FIVE** or more blocks this season. The last time the Suns had a player with more than **FOUR** such games in an *entire season* was **OLIVER MILLER** in **1993-94**. He has **12** three-block games this season after totaling a career-high **13** in all of 2011-12.
- **PJ TUCKER** has played in **78** of **81** games this season, a single-season career high after Tucker made **17** appearances as a rookie with the Toronto Raptors in 2006-07. Tucker has missed **TWO** games due to injury (and **ONE** DNP).
- **TUCKER** has **22** career double-digit scoring efforts, **21** of which have come this season as a member of the Suns. Tucker has **FIVE** efforts of 15 or more points, including a career-high 21-point scoring effort on April 15 vs. Houston, after never having scored 15 points in his career prior to Phoenix.
- **TUCKER** has **FOUR** double-digit rebounding efforts this season, the first **FOUR** of his career.
