Brides and Wedding Photographers

The Providence Journal welcomes the submission of digital bridal photographs provided they have been prepared to our technical specifications by a professional photographer or commercial film lab.

Digital submissions may be black and white or color. The photo should show the couple, or bride, from the waistline up. No shots from a distance; no crops that show only the head and shoulders. No pictures that include pets or children, please.

Scanned pictures must be in JPEG format only, 200 dpi at 100%. The photo should be named with the bride's first initial and her full last (premarital) name, followed by the suffix .jpg (for example, MSMITH.JPG). The JPEG file should be scanned by a photo professional to assure its reproduction quality.

Digital pictures should be saved on a floppy disk or CD and mailed in the same envelope as the completed, signed Wedding Announcement Form. We will not return floppy disks or CDs.

The Providence Journal also welcomes submission of color or black and white prints. We prefer not to return photographs, but will return one-of-a-kind prints if submitted with a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Prints should be submitted in the same envelope as the completed, signed Wedding Announcement Form. Please follow the cropping guidelines outlined above.

The Providence Journal does not accept pictures on computer paper or video frame grabs. Photographs should not have special effects, such as blurred edges, soft focus or textured finishes.
