IMPORTANT APPLICANT INFORMATION

ABOUT THIS APPLICATION PACKET

- Everything you need to apply to UIC, GPPA, and the Honors College is included in this application packet. You do not need to complete any other application form to be considered for admission to UIC.
- This packet contains a Freshman Application, GPPA Supplemental Application (which also serves as an application to the Honors College), Personal Statement page, and three Letter of Recommendation forms. You must complete and submit all of these forms to be reviewed for admission.
- This is a self-managed application. You, the applicant, are asked to collect, enclose and return all required materials. Please note that letters of recommendation and transcripts will be accepted if mailed by the recommenders or school, but this is not the preferred method and can cause materials to arrive beyond the deadline. It is your responsibility to ensure the arrival of all required application materials by the stated deadline. Once we receive your application you will be sent a letter that contains a Login ID and PIN. You can then check your application status any time at http://www.uic.edu/depts/oar/undergrad_gppa/check_status_gppa.html.
- You may only apply to one GPPA program.
- After you have completed and signed all of the materials and your Letters of Recommendation and transcripts have been returned to
 you, submit all materials, including the appropriate application fee or fee waiver to the Office of Admissions, Special Programs Unit.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

GPPA is only available to freshman applicants. You are a beginning freshman if you are presently attending high school or have graduated but have not completed any college coursework after graduation.

As a beginning freshman applicant to GPPA, you must:

- Be at least 16 years of age
- Be a graduate of an accredited high school
- Satisfy the high school subject pattern recommendations
- Complete the ACT or the SAT
- Have a minimum composite ACT score of 28 or an SAT score of 1240, and a high school rank in the top 15%

Additionally, the following requirements may apply to you:

- If you plan to apply to Medicine or Dentistry, you must be a resident of Illinois and either a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- If you plan to apply to the School of Public Health, you must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.

^{*}Please note: If you do not meet all of these requirements, your application will not be considered by GPPA unless accompanied by a separate letter of petition.

RECOMMENDED HIGH SCHOOL SUBJECTS

All applicants must have successfully completed or have in progress the following high school courses in order to be eligible for admission to UIC.

- Four years of English
- Three years of Mathematics*
- Three years of Science
- Three years of Social Science
- Two years of a Language other than English (recommended)

*Should include algebra, geometry, advanced algebra/trigonometry

*Important Note About the Honors College:

• Honors College membership is required of all GPPA students, with the following exceptions: the programs of Biomedical Visualization, Health Information Management, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy in the College of Applied Health Sciences, all programs in the College of Engineering, and the Urban and Public Affairs program in the College of Urban Planning and Public Affairs. If you will be applying to any of these programs, you do not have to submit the Honors College statement if you do not wish to join the Honors College; although it is not required, membership to the Honors College is strongly encouraged.

Transcripts

Enclose, with your application, two sets of your official high school record as well as two sets of official transcripts from any high school(s) previously attended. Transcripts marked "issued to the student" are considered official if they are received in a sealed, unopened envelope with an official school signature on the flap. Do not open your sealed transcript.

Test Scores

Have your official test scores sent to the Office of Admissions. They are considered official if they are printed on your official high school transcript. If you need to request that they be sent from the testing agency, please use the following codes:

Application Fee

You application will not be processed without your application fee or fee waiver. If mailing your application, please enclose a check or money order made payable to the University of Illinois and include your name and date of birth. The nonrefundable application fee is \$50. Do not send cash through the mail.

Letters of Recommendation

To ensure your Letters of Recommendation are official and reach the Office of Admissions – Special Programs Unit by the stated deadlines, please follow these instructions:

- After you have completed the top portion of each form, remove the Letter of Recommendation forms from the packet.
- Provide each recommender with a form and self-addressed, stamped envelope (if you are requesting that the letter be mailed directly to you).
- Ask that the recommenders seal the envelope, sign across the flap, and return them to you so you may include the letters with your application materials.
- Please remember that you are responsible for ensuring your complete application packet is received by the Office

Non-Refundable \$50 Application Fee

You may send a bank draft or money order in US currency, or personal check drawn on a US bank made payable to the "University of Illinois at Chicago." Your name, as it appears on your application, must be written on the draft, money order, or check. Foreign money orders should include full routing information for processing to the correct account. The application fee cannot be waived or deferred regardless of the currency restrictions imposed by some countries.

Evidence of English Competency

All international applicants are required to submit official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), unless they meet the TOEFL exemptions listed below. The TOEFL must have been taken within the last two years. Minimum score required: paper-based TOEFL = 550, computer based TOEFL = 213, Internet-based TOEFL = 80. Individual UIC colleges may require higher scores. TOEFL contact information: Visit www.toefl.org or write to The Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey 80540. Call 1-800-GO-TOEFL (toll-free within the U.S. only). UIC's test code is 1851. In lieu of TOEFL, you may submit an IELTS score. Minimum score required is 6.5.

TOEFL Exemptions

- 1) Non-native English speakers who have completed two consecutive years of full-time high school in the U.S. or another country where the only official language of the country is English.
- 2) Native English speakers from countries where English is the only official language.

Required Educational Credentials

If you have studied outside the United States, you must submit all required official academic credentials from all high schools attended, including:

- A list of all subjects/courses studied for each year.
- Grades or examination results received (failing as well as passing) in each subject/course.
- Maximum and minimum grades obtainable for each course.
- Degree certificates/diplomas awarded, if applicable.

These credentials should be submitted in the same packet with your application and application fee. If you must submit transcripts or any other documentation separately, be sure to include your name and address as it appears on your application, and your date of birth (and US Social Security Number, if applicable) on each document.

Transcripts: International applicants who have attended high schools that issue official transcripts on request should submit their transcripts. A certified English translation must be attached if the transcript is not in English. Official transcripts bear the seal and/or stamp of the high school as well as the signature of the appropriate official.

English Translations of Academic Credentials

Official English translations must accompany all academic credentials originally issued in a language other than English. ECE/WES not accepted in lieu of transcripts/marksheets. Official credentials should be sent in the original language and accompanied by a verbatim (word for word) English translation, in the identical format of the original credential. Evidence of Financial Support

Evidence of financial support for the first year of study must be submitted before an I-20 for an F-1 visa or DS-2019 for a J-1 visa will be sent to the admitted student.
