2013 SEASON PREVIEW

Super signing classes set table for Seminoles' future success

As the Florida State men's and women's teams dive head-long into the outdoor season, they do so with eyes fixed on immediate ACC and NCAA success, yet fully aware that the pieces are in place to expand and continue their successful histories at the highest level.

Track and Field News, long considered the bible for those who follow the sport, anointed the 2012 Florida State men's signing class as the top class in the country. It marks the first time the Seminoles have appeared in the annual signing class rankings by the magazine since 2007, when the program was in the midst of bringing home three consecutive NCAA Outdoor Championship trophies.

Led by high school All-American sprinter Marvin Bracy, the Seminoles' class scored highest according to TFN's experts, who weighed multiple factors, most significantly whether they are likely to have an immediate impact at the collegiate level. Bracy is one of two football signees, joining sprinter Ronald Darby, who bring All-American credentials to the program.

The class also takes into account transfers and athletes returning from injury. Dentarius Locke, an All-American sprinter at Tennessee in 2011, and former Mississippi State star James Harris, are joined by Maryland-Eastern Shore transfer Owen Cain. Harris is a potential national scorer in the high jump and 400. Cain will add immediate help in the horizontal jumps. Junior college transfer Alonzo Russell gives the 'Noles yet another quality 400-meter specialist.

Joining freshmen classmates Bracy and Darby are budding steeplechase star Zak Seddon from Great Britain, Chilean high jumper Hurtado Arteaga and his U.S. counterpart Nick Medich, as well as 400-meter runner Ricardo Roy. Junior college All-American shot putter Stargell Williams fills a much-needed void.

The return of hurdler Tremaine Grant from injury factored into the ranking, but the January addition of South African javelin star Morne Moolman came too late to be counted toward FSU's class. So to did the January arrival of junior Josh Mance, a one-time FSU recruit who arrived in January after transferring from USC, where he twice earned All-American honors in the 400 as well as the 4x400 relay. Mance was also a member of the USA silver medal 4x400 relay team at the London Olympics.

The FSU women's signing class is expected to provide the depth of talent to help the team get back into the national championship discussion. Belgium 100-meter hurdler Anne Zagre, an Olympic semifinalist at London, is a key component to that group. So is freshman heptathlete Grete Sadeiko from Estonia, who has All-American credentials.

Fellow freshman Sage Watson, who has represented Canada on the junior world stage, has a 400 hurdle personal-best which should earn her an NCAA qualifying spot and 400-meter speed that will be pivotal on the 4x400 relay. Sweden's Ewa Marcinkiewicz is a potential NCAA qualifier in the triple jump and is versatile enough to compete in the 400m hurdles or multi-events.

The 'Noles have already benefitted from the arrival of freshman middle distance star Georgia Peel from Great Britain. Peel earned All-ACC and All-NCAA South Region honors for coach Karen Harvey's top-ranked cross country team in the fall. Newcomer Kellion Knibb is Jamaica's junior national record-holder in the discus and a formidable shot putter.

Swedish triple jumper Izehie Ileso and sprinter Marecia Pemberton return from injury.

Additional incoming freshmen Hannah Acton (pole vault), Maryke Brits (long jump, 100 hurdles), Der'Renae Freeman (long jump), Natalie Concepcion (800), Stacey Drilling (high jump) and Carly Thomas (10,000) give the class balance and depth across the board.

Men's Preview: New faces will step into big shoes

Florida State's senior-heavy 2012 squad left some sizeable voids for head coach Bob Braman to fill. The Seminoles have tried to do that with an infusion of both young talent and well-placed transfers who will try and carry the squad back to the podium at the NCAA Outdoor Championships for the eighth time in nine years.

Sprints: Arguably no team in the nation lost more talent on the sprint side than the Seminoles, who must replace All-Americans Maurice Mitchell, Kemar Hyman and Horatio Williams. That trio combined for 25 individual points and had a direct hand in 33 of FSU's 38 total points in a fourth-place team finish at the 2012 national championship meet.

Bracy, the nation's most coveted high school sprinter a year ago, has the potential to become one of FSU's all-time greats. With five sub-10.2 wind-aided times - including three better than 10.1 - in the 100 meters, the Orlando native is national title contender as a freshman. If there was any question about his shear speed, Bracy laid that to rest during his freshman indoor season when he motored to a nation-leading and FSU-record 60-meter time of 6.54.

Locke, a redshirt junior who is competing in only his second season collegiately, brings All-American chops to the 'Noles as well. As a redshirt freshman at Tennessee, the Tampa native placed eighth at the 2011 NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 200. After sitting out a year following his transfer to FSU, Locke unleashed his all-time indoor best 60 of 6.56, which ranked second nationally in the regular season; substantial evidence that he can be a scoring force in both the 100 and 200.

From there the 'Noles must lean on a blend of veterans to fortify their 4x100 relay team. Sophomore Stephen Newbold, who has two ACC indoor titles (400 and 200) on his resume, anchored FSU's school-record 4x100 relay team at the NCAA Championship meet a year ago. He earned 2013 ACC Indoor Championship Track MVP honors by winning the 200 and placing second in the 400. He was also a member of the Seminoles' third-place and school record-setting 4x400 relay at the 2013 NCAA Indoor Championships.


Seminoles set tone with solid indoor campaign

The Florida State men's and women's indoor track & field teams set seven school records, including two at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championship meet, highlighting a productive season. Senior Amanda Winslow broke Susan Kuijken's school mark in the mile early in the season, then lowered it again in the season finale, where she finished second in 4:31.08. That mark makes her one of the 10 fastest milers in collegiate history.

The Seminole men's team endured some early disappointment at the championship meet, but closed out the two-day affair at Arkansas' Randal Tyson Track Complex with a new school record in the 4x400

relay. The quartet of Alonzo Russell, James Harris, Dentarius Locke and Stephen Newbold brought home the baton in 3:05.13, good enough for third place, and displaced the previous school mark set by the 2009 team which featured a pair of Olympians. The women's distance medley team of Jessica Parry, Sage Watson, Georgia Peel and Colleen Quigley raced to a fourth-place finish.

In all, 13 Seminoles - seven men and six women - qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships. Combined, they earned 11 first-team All-American honors. In addition to Winslow and the relay teams, Stefan Brits placed sixth in the long jump, while Phillip Young was seventh in the triple jump.

Two weeks prior to the NCAA meet, the 'Noles posted a pair of runner-up team finishes at the ACC Championship meet in Blacksburg, Va. Newbold earned ACC Track Performer of the Meet honors after claiming the 200-meter title and finishing second in the 400, establishing a pair of new personal-bests in the process. Young was tabbed as the ACC Field Performer of the Meet after placing second in the triple jump and third in the long jump.

James Harris matched the ACC Championship (and FSU) record with his victory in the high jump, soaring 7-3.75 (2.23 meters). Freshman Marvin Bracy extended his unbeaten streak to three meets with his 60-meter dash title, with Locke fast on his heels for second. Earlier in the year, Bracy broke Maurice Mitchell's school record in the 60 (6.54).

The 'Noles also earned a title from the women's distance medley relay team of Winslow, Watson, Peel and Quigely in 10:57.4, which established a new ACC Championship and conference record. Winslow also successfully defended her 3000-meter title, leading a 1-2-3 sweep by the 'Noles.

Among the Seminole record-setters, redshirt sophomore Briana Cherry-Bronson established a new standard in the weight throw with an early-season toss of 19.06 meters. Harris followed up his ACC high jump with by setting the school mark - 2.26 meters (7-5) - at the Alex Wilson Invitational.

The search for a fourth member of the 4x100 relay team could include senior David Ambler, who has been on two of the 10 fastest relay squads in school history. Sophomore Kieran Showler-Davis anchored the Seminoles' 4x100 team in the semifinals at the NCAA meet last spring in 38.81.

Ken Harnden, FSU's Director of Sprints, Hurdles & Relays - and the USTFCCCA's National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2012 - could also turn to a pair of his long sprinters for assistance.

James Harris, a transfer from Mississippi State who could well qualify individually in the 400, has the speed and power to home the baton. Former junior college 400 national champion Alonzo Russell - whose frame is better-suited for running a curve - would also be a viable option.

Regardless, both men will be key components when the 'Noles opt to field their best 4x400 relay unit. They teamed with Newbold and Locke on the third-place NCAA Indoor Championships squad.

Tremaine Grant, who missed all of last season with an injury, gives the 'Noles an ACC-level scorer in both the 110- and 400-meter hurdles.

Jumps & Vaults: Under the guidance of Dennis Nobles, FSU's Director of Field Events, the Seminoles have a long-standing tradition of collecting major points in the jumps at the ACC and NCAA level. That trend figures to continue in 2013.

Sophomore long jump specialist Stefan Brits has seemingly put a lengthy hamstring recovery period behind him. After earning his second ACC Indoor Championships long jump silver, Brits broke out a lifetime-best mark of 7.80 meters (25-7.50) to place sixth at

the NCAA Indoor Championships.

Junior transfer Owen Cain provides the Seminoles with a versatile performer who can score in both horizontal jumps at the conference level and earn an NCAA berth in the triple jump.

For the first time since 2011, Nobles will be able to look for points from the high jump. Harris has a lifetime outdoor best mark of 2.27m (7-5.25) and has already made his mark indoors with the Seminoles, leaping 2.76 (7-5) for a new school record. The 2013 ACC Indoor champion was also an NCAA Indoor qualifier.

Two freshmen newcomers, Cristobal Hurtado and Nick Medich, provide depth and promise in the high jump as well. Hurtado is the Chilean national champion.

Senior co-captain Andrew LaHaye is a seasoned NCAA qualifier in the pole vault and poised for a big finish. In 2012, LaHaye cleared 5.40 meters (17-8.75) at the NCAA Outdoor Champions; the same bar cleared by a five men. Unfortunately, LaHaye was saddled with a ninth-place finish - one spot out of scoring and first-team All-American honors - based on misses. LaHaye is joined

by redshirt junior Drew Marcello, who has a life-time best mark of 5.11 meters (16-9.25), and will challenge for a spot in the NCAA postseason for the first time in his career.

Throws: First-year throws coach Dorian Scott is no stranger to success or the Seminoles. The former All-American in the shot put, who made the finals at the 2012 London Olympic Games, has already seen significant gains from his charges indoors.

Faced with replacing multi-time All-American shot put and discus performer Michael Putman, Scott is working with a small group of newcomers, all of whom have recorded personal-best marks in the throws during the indoor season.

Junior college transfer Stargell Williams and graduate school newcomer Jeff Pelage, each scored in the shot put at the ACC Indoor Championships. They will try and duplicate or better those finishes outdoors, while adding the discus to their repetoire.

Redshirt sophomore Markindey Sineus is the most experienced member of the throws group. After establishing a pair of new PR's indoors in the weight throw, where he also scored at the ACC meet, Sineus will focuse his efforts on the hammer outdoors.

The most likely national scorer from the throws group is freshman Morne Moolman, who was the bronze medalist at the 2012 World Junior Championships in the javelin. Sophomore Garrett Singletary's continued development in the javelin could provide the 'Noles with a second ACC scorer.

Women's Preview: Distance crew leads

Cross country and distance coach Karen Harvey's athletes have carried the lion's share of the scoring load on the track in recent years and the 2013 outdoor season promises more of the same. Senior Amanda Winslow and sophomore Colleen Quigley are the lone returning scorers on the squad from last season's NCAA Outdoor Championship and after outstanding indoor seasons, should be even better this time around.

The good news for the Florida State women is help is on the way. An outstanding signing class, which addressed a number of event areas, will boost the Seminoles' ACC Outdoor Championship aspirations and position the team for their best NCAA finish since 2009.

Sprints & Hurdles: The addition of junior transfer and London Olympian Anne Zagre in the 100-meter hurdles, and redshirt junior sprinter Marecia Pemberton's return fron injury, give the Seminoles a big lift in areas where they are most needed.

Zagre, who represented Belgium and reached the semifinals in London, has a lifetime-best mark (12.79) well under the school record held by Kim Batten since 1991 (13.06). A third-place finish at the ACC Indoor Championships in the 60-meter hurdles, and a trip to the NCAA Indoor Championships, were positive late-season steps. Zagre's speed will also boost FSU's scoring efforts in the 4x100 relay at the conference level.

Pemberton is trying to regain the form she brought to FSU from St. Kitts & Nevis in 2010, when she ran 11.29 in the 100 and won the ACC outdoor title. Her fourth-place finish in the 60-meter dash at the 2013 ACC Indoor Championships was a positive step for the veteran, who will also be a key relay member.

FSU's real strength comes with the depth of talent at 400 meters, which bodes well for a competitive 4x400 relay. Freshman Sage Watson is an elite 400-meter hurdler on the world junior stage and one of the top two Seminoles in the open 400.

Junior Elizabeth Ichite is in the midst of a breakthrough year in the 400, whacking nearly two seconds off her sophomore season PR indoors. Ichite will try and ride that momentum to a second consecutive NCAA East Preliminary appearance.

Sophomore Sarah Chandler and junior Marsha Ariol, both of whom also compete in the 400-meter hurdles, are valuable relay assets. If sophomore Jande Pierce returns to form after missing the indoor season, the 'Noles will have ample relay depth and additional scoring potential in the 200.

Distance: Winslow was nothing short of sensational in her final indoor season, setting FSU and ACC records in the mile (4:31.08) while also leading off the Seminoles record-setting ACC Champion-ship distance medley relay. She enters her senior outdoor season poised to improve on her seventh-place NCAA finish in the 1500 a year ago.

Quigley's freshman season was nothing short of sensational, and

like Winslow, she has built on that early success. Her fifth-place NCAA Outdoor finish in the 3000-meter steeplechase is the highest among returning 'Noles, while here PR in that event (10:02.53) also ranks among the nation's best.

Beyond the proven national scorers, redshirt junior Kayleigh Tyerman returns after advancing to last year's NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 5000-meter run with a personal-best (16:06.28) to her credit.

Touted freshman Georgia Peel narrowly missed qualifying for the NCAA Indoor Championships in the mile, but will surely contend for a place in the 1500 outdoors based on a career-best 4:16.24 and could also factor in the 800.

FSU's chase for an ACC Championship will require additional distance contributions from the likes of veterans Linden Hall (1500), Jennifer Dunn (10,000) and Chelsi Woodruff (steeplechase). Freshmen Natalie Concepcion (800) and Carly Thomas (10,000) could also contribute to the ACC scoring cause.

Jumps, Vaults & Multis: A host of new faces will have to carry the load with the departure of All-Americans Michelle Jenije and Amy Harris. Freshmen Maryke Brits and Der'Renae Freeman are promising long jumpers who are coming off scoring performances at the ACC Indoor Championships, will be asked to duplicate or improve on those efforts outdoors. They will also contribute to the sprints and hurdles groups.

The 'Noles will need junior Izehi lleso to fill the void in the triple jump created by Jenije's departure. The one-time junior college national champion is trying to return to form after missing the entire 2012 season with a knee injury.

Another pair of freshmen, Hannah Acton and Karly Jackson, are being counted on to deliver some scoring in the pole vault at the ACC level. Acton placed fifth at the indoor conference meet and is knocking at the 13-foot barrier, while Jackson was one bar clearance away from scoring indoors

Freshman Grete Sadeiko, a proven heptathlete on the junior world stage with a career-best score of 5,705 points, has her sights set on an NCAA Championship berth. Sadeiko is also capable of scoring at the conference level in both the high jump and javelin. Classmate Ewa Marcinkiewicz was eighth in the pentathlon at the ACC Indoor Championships, but could also be a conference-level scorer in the triple jump.

Throws: Versatile junior co-captain Chelsea Whalen leads a fast-improving throws group. A first-time NCAA qualifier outdoors in the javelin last season, where she reached the finals, Whalen is also closing in on the school record in the shot put.

Redshirt sophomore Briana Cherry-Bronson is coming off an indoor school-record performance in the weight throw and makes the transition to the hammer outdoors, where she should be a conference scorer. Classmate Lakitta Johnson should also challenge for ACC points in the shot put.

The gem of the incoming throws class is freshman Kellion Knibb, who is the Jamaica junior record holder in the discus (51.02 meters/167-5) and a promising shot putter as well. Throws coach Dorian Scott will also try and coax conference points in the discus from improving senior Brittany Linder and sophomore BreeAnne Campbell.



2012 SEASON RECAP

FSU men return to podium outdoors; women's distance leads banner year

With 24 points on the final day at the 2012 NCAA Outdoor Championships, the Florida State men's track & field team raced to the top of the team leaderboard at Drake University. The men actually led the field with 38 points and only two events remaining, but could only watch as they settled for a fourth-place finish.

After settling for a runner-up finish at the ACC Outdoor Championships, the Seminole men claimed their seventh podium finish in eight years at the NCAA finale. Sprinters Maurice Mitchell, Kemar Hyman and Horatio Williams combined for four individual All-American honors and contributed to a fifth, with Stephen Newbold on the school record 4x100 relay. Gonzalo Barroilhet contributed an All-American performance in the decathlon to round out the scoring.

The Seminole women tied for 14th place at the NCAA Championship meet, with the bulk of their 16 team points coming from the women's distance squad of steeplechase finalists Astrid Leutert (fourth) and Colleen Quigley (fifth) and the 1500 tandem of Amanda Winslow (seventh) and Violah Lagat (eighth). Michelle Jenije's fifth-place triple jump finish accounted for FSU's final points. FSU placed third at the ACC meet.

FSU men repeat as nation's top program

As consolation prizes go, being selected as the nation's most outstanding men's cross country and track & field program for a second consecutive year is a pretty big deal. It's a title Florida State coach Bob Braman's programs proudly tout for a second consecutive year after the Seminoles were honored as the 2012 John McDonnell Program of the Year by the United States Track & Field Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA).

FSU joins Oregon as the second repeat winner of the McDonnell Award, presented to the most outstanding comprehensive program, based on the scoring performances at the NCAA cross country, indoor and outdoor track & field championships. Only schools that qualify for all three championship meets are eligible for the honor.


The Florida State women finished fourth in the 2012 Program of the Year rankings with 40 points, trailing Oregon (8 points), which won its fourth consecutive Terry Crawford Program of the Year Trophy. Stanford (29.5) and Washington (35) were second and third, respectively.

The Seminole men secured the bookend to their 2011 trophy with a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championship. FSU edged Indiana by one point - 25-26 - for the crown. The `Noles were 12th at the NCAA Cross Country Championship (12 points), tied for eighth at the Indoor Championship (9 points) and fourth (4 points), accounting for their total.

All-Americans on the track and in the classroom

Hannah Brooks, Gonzalo Barroilhet and Michelle Jenije were certifiable stars on the track for the Seminoles, earning All-American honors as they closed out their career in the spring of 2012. They also set themselves apart in the classroom, earning Capital One Academic All-America Team honors as well from the College Sports Information Directors Association (CoSIDA).

Brooks, the ACC Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year, was an All-American in cross country, indoor track (mile) and outdoors (1500) while completing her graduate degree with a perfect 4.00 GPA. Barroilhet, who placed fourth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, is a rare three-time CoSIDA selection. He also earned ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors on the track while earning his MBA. Jenije was a first-team All-American honoree in the triple jump – indoors and outdoors – while claiming ACC Scholar-Athlete on the year distinction on the track as well.

FSU men reclaim ACC Indoor Championship crown

Authoring one of the most memorable comebacks in ACC Championship history, the 2012 Florida State men's team reclaimed the conference indoor title which has eluded them just a year earlier with a final-day rally past Virginia Tech at Boston's Reggie Lewis Center. The Seminole men trailed the defending champion Hokies by 20 points entering the final day and were down 30 at one point before romaing to the crown

The 'Noles finished 27.5 points in front of the Hokies to leave the building with their ninth ACC Indoor Championship Trophy in 10 years. Seniors Maurice Mitchell (200), Gonzalo Barroilhet (pole vault), Michael Putman (shot put) and Kemar Hyman (60), each scored final-day victories and were joined by freshman Stephen Newbold (400). The meet turned on Barroilhet's pole vault win and a 1-2-3 sweep of the 200, led by Mitchell, who became the first indoor athlete in league history to claim meet MVP honors three times. Horatio Williams (200), Darrin Gibson (800) and David Forrester (3000) posted pivotal runner-up finishes on the final day.

The FSU women used a victory from Amanda Winslow in the 3000 and top-three finishes from Chelsea Whalen (third, shot put), Michelle Jenije (second, triple jump) - plus a wide range of top-eight scoring performances - to hold on for a runner-up team finish. The highlight for the women came in the distance medley, where Winslow, Jande Pierce, Aubree Worden and Hannah Brooks, set school and ACC records.

Two weeks later at the NCAA Indoor Championships in Nampa, Idaho, the FSU men tied for eighth, thanks to a trio of All-American performances by sprinters Mitchell, Hyman and Williams. The women placed 20th.

Mitchell placed third in the 200 and was sixth in the 60, while Hyman placed third in the 60. Williams was fifth in the 200. On the women's side, Jenije turned a lifetime-best mark in the triple jump into a silver medal finish. Brooks continued FSU's All-American tradition in the mile, placing sixth, while Amy Harris was seventh in the long jump.

Florida State was well-represented at the 2012 London Games with a total of 13 past, present and current Seminoles competing in the quadrennial event which brings together the world's very best. FSU's contingent included first-year throws coach

Dorian Scott (Jamaica), who reached the finals in the shot put, and volunteer assistant coach Gonzalo Barroilhet (Chile), who made his second Olympic appearance in the decathlon.

Current junior Anne Zagre (Belgium) reached the semfinals in the 100-meter hurdles, while junior transfer Josh Mance won a silver medal on the User Country (1997).

transfer Josh Mance won a silver medal on the USA 4x400 relay team.

Two All-American sprinters from the 2012 Seminole squad - Maurice Mitchell (USA) and Kemar Hyman (Cayman Islands) - made their first Olympic appearances, as did 2011 grad Kimberly Williams (Jamaica), who reached the finals of the triple jump.

Host Great Britain's team included former FSU women's distance standouts Barbara Parker and Hannah England, while Ciaran O'Lionaird (Ireland) also made his Olympic debut in the 1500 meters.

Belgium 400-meter twins Jonathan and Kevin Borlee reached the finals individually and also as members of the 4x400 relay team. Pole vaulter Lacy Janson (USA) rounded out the FSU Olympians.

Bob Braman Head Coach & Men's Distance

13th season at FSU 30th season overall

Under the direction of head coach Bob Braman, Florida State track & field has become synonymous with success on the national level, winning and contending for NCAA championships with a regularity that defines comprehensive excellence.

The Florida State men's team has won a pair of NCAA Outdoor Championships and has finished fourth or better in seven of the last eight championship meets; fifth or better in five of the last seven indoor championships. Still there's more evidence of the all-around excellence which few can match.

The Seminoles' trophy cases provide substantial evidence and one - actually, two - pieces of hardware are confirmation. The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association's John McDonnell Award, presented to the program that posts the highest average NCAA Championships finish from cross country, indoor and outdoor seasons, has taken up residence in Tallahassee. The Florida State men have claimed each of the last two McDonell Awards and are poised to make a run at a third in succession after a fifth-place cross country finish in the fall of 2012.

Under Braman's watch the 2012 outdoor season saw the FSU men finish fourth in the team scoring, aided by senior Maurice Mitchell's successful title defense in the 200-meter dash. Mitchell was one of three 'Noles to capture individual titles in 2011, joining Ngoni Makusha, who set the NCAA Championship record in the 100-meter dash and captured the long jump, en route to claiming the prestigious Bowerman Award - college track & field's equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. In addition to Mitchell's 200-meter win, he teamed with Makusha, Kemar Hyman and Brandon Byram to win the 4x100-meter relay.

Over the course of Braman's first 12 seasons, FSU ripped off a string of seven consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference outdoor team titles, and most recently claimed the 2012 ACC indoor crown. Braman earned the 2011 ACC Outdoor Coach of the Year and 2012 ACC Indoor Coach of the Year awards, after claiming the 2010 award for men's cross country. He also pulled off a clean sweep during the 2011-2012 academic year as the USTFCCCA's South Region cross country, indoor and outdoor coach of the year. Collectively, he has won 33 combined national, regional, district and conference coach of the year awards in his career at FSU.

On his watch, the Seminoles have brought home 201 All-American honors between the track & field and cross country programs and produced 34 national champions on the track, compared to 21 titles by the men and women - combined - prior to his arrival. Those marks are also a credit to Braman's ability to maintain continuity within his outstanding coaching staff, led by veterans Ken Harnden, Dennis Nobles and Karen Harvey.

The Florida State brand extends well beyond the borders. Twelve student-athletes who competed collegiately for the Seminoles participated in the 2012 London Olympics. It marked the second consecutive Summer Olympic Games the 'Noles were represented by a dozen Olympians. The Games were an extension of FSU's representation on the world stage at the 2011 World Championships in Daegu, Korea, as well as the PanAm Games in Mexico, precursors to the London Games.

Braman joined the FSU staff as a track & field assistant to Terry Long in 2000 and the head men's and women's cross country coach. He retained those cross country duties when he succeeded Long for the 2004 track & field season, before turning the women's cross country duties over to Harvey in 2007. He continues to coach the men's distance runners and cross country team, which finished 12th at the 2011 NCAA Championships.

Before joining the Florida State family, Braman enjoyed 17 years of national success at the University of South Florida where he began his coaching career as a men's cross country assistant in 1983. He was promoted to head coach in 1985 and initiated the women's cross country program in 1987. When USF began its track program in 1991, Braman assumed head coaching duties for that sport as well. Under Braman's guidance, the USF men's cross country team won three Conference USA titles (1997, 1998, 2000) while the women's team was also the Conference USA champion (1998-99).

While at USF, Braman's men's cross country teams also won six consecutive conference titles (1988 and 1993). Braman was honored as Coach of the Year 14 times. His men's cross country teams earned national rankings in 10 of his last 12 years, including a No. 5

national ranking in 1991, while the women's teams were ranked four of his last six years. Braman coached 41 national qualifiers on the track, including two-time NCAA champion Jon Dennis (5000m, 1992 and 1993).

Braman, who graduated from the University of Florida in 1980 with a degree in broadcasting, is married to the former Debbie Turner. They have two sons, Steven and Tyler. He was a three-year captain of the cross country team and earned All-SEC honors in cross country (1979-80) and indoor track (1979), while setting the school record in the indoor three-mile

Ken Harnden Associate Head Coach/ **Director of Sprints, Hurdles** & Relays

14th season at FSU

One of the premier sprints coaches in the world, Ken Harnden was promoted to Associate Head Coach in August of 2012 and continues his duties as FSU's Director of Sprints, Hurdles & Relays. The former Olympian, whose sprinters have been the cornerstone of the Seminoles' National Championship runs on the men's side, has oversight of both the men's and women's programs in his speciality areas, while taking on added administrative responsibilities in his new role.

In 2012, Harnden collected his third men's National Assistant Coach of the Year honor from the USTFCCCA after the Seminoles advanced a trio of individual sprinters and a 4x100 relay team to the NCAA Outdoor Championships. From that group, Maurice Mitchell claimed his second consecutive 200-meter title and teamed with Kemar Hyman, Horatio Williams and Stephen Newbold for a school-record run of 38.57 in the 4x100. Collectively, that foursome produced 33 of FSU's 38 points, which was good for a fourth-place team finish.

In 2011 the 'Noles came within one point of the national title as Ngoni Makusha, who had already made a name for himself as a national champion long jumper, won the men's 100m dash in an NCAA Championship meet and collegiate record time of 9.89. Maurice Mitchell won the 200 title, then teamed with Makusha on FSU's victorious 4x100 relay team. Makusha would go on to claim the program's first Bowerman Award, presented to the nation's top collegiate track & field athlete.

Sprint dominance has been a familiar refrain with the Seminoles under Harnden's watchful eye, dating to Brian Dzingai, his first All-American in 2004. Walter Dix developed into the

collegiate record-holder in the 200-meter dash and has worked with world- and nationalclass stars like Ricardo Chambers, twins Kevin and Jonathan Borlee, Charles Clark, Drew Brunson, Michael Ray Garvin and Brandon Byram, whose exploits range from the 110-meter hurdles to the 400-meter dash.

In Dix, Harnden was there every step of the way from arriving as the top high school sprinter in Florida, through multiple NCAA titles and on to a U.S. national championship and a pair of Olympic bronze medals in the 2008 Games. At the 2012 Olympic Games in London, sprinters Mitchell, Hyman and the Borlee twins made up two-thirds of the Seminole men who competed.

Harnden's work has not gone unnoticed at the regional and national levels. He has earned two NCAA Division I National Assistant Coach of the Year awards, both of which came with Dix anchoring his stable of stars.

Dix may go down as one of the greatest collegiate sprinters of all time. He finished his career with eight NCAA Championships and 18 All-American honors. In 2007, he won four NCAA titles to up his tally to seven on his way to NCAA Division I Track Athlete of the Year and ACC Male Athlete of the Year. His victories in the 100, 200 and 4x100 relay made him the first sprinter since John Carols in 1969 to accomplish the feat. In addition, he shattered the NCAA 200m outdoor record at the East Regional with a mark of 19.69 and qualified for the World Championships.

His first FSU protege was Dzingai, who broke the Zimbabwe national record in the 200m and met the Olympic `A' standard to secure his trip to 2004 Olympic Games in Athens. Chambers, the 2007 Indoor and Outdoor NCAA champion in the 400, turned professional after the 2007 season after breaking the school record set by Olympic gold medalist Walter McCoy. Both Dzingai and Chambers made it to the semifinals of the 2007 World Championships in Osaka, Japan and competed in the 2009 World Championships in Berlin, Germany.

Harnden was a two-time Olympian for his native country of Zimbabwe in 1996 and 2000, and a three-time participant - twice a finalist - in the 400-meter hurdles at the World Championships. He also won a bronze medal at the Commonwealth Games in the 400m hurdles in 1998.

A two-year letterwinner at the University of North Carolina, Harnden won the 1995 NCAA Championship in the 400m hurdles and was a member of the winning 4x400m relay team. He still holds the Tar Heel 400m hurdle record as well as the indoor 4x400m record.

In addition to his coaching duties, Harnden serves as FSU's primary recruiter, having developed tremendous resources throughout the world, which have paid dividends for the Seminoles. Track & Field News ranked the 2012 FSU men's signing class as the best in the nation, while the women were also ranked among the top 10.

Dennis NoblesDirector of Field Events/
Jumps, Vault & Multis

29th season at FSU 31st season overall

As the longest tenured coach on the Florida State staff, Dennis Nobles has been instrumental in the rise and sustained success of the Seminoles' jumpers, pole vaulter and multievent athletes. In August, Nobles was promoted to the post as Director of Field Events and will continue to direct both the vertical and horizontal jumps specialists and multi-event personnel, while adding the javelin to his many duties.

The 2012 indoor and outdoor seasons produced yet another flock of championship-caliber performers under Nobles' watch. Decathlete Gonzolo Barroilhet established a new school and ACC Outdoor Championship record, piling up 8,065 points en route to return trip to the Olympics. Senior Michelle Jenije closed her career in style with an NCAA Indoor runner-up finish in the triple jump and two All-American honors, while also earning ACC Scholar-

Athlete of the Year honors

Nobles will forever be linked to the coaching and development of college track's most decorated women's triple jumper, Kim Williams, who reached the finals in her 2012 Olympic debut. He also oversaw the ascent of long jumper Ngoni Makusha, who will be considered one of the top overall athletes to ever come through Tallahassee, capping his career as the 2011 winner of the Bowerman Award. The two multi-time NCAA champions only scratch the surface when it comes to outlining Nobles' impact.

Since joining Terry Long's staff full-time in 1987, Nobles' athletes have combined for 13 individual NCAA and 79 ACC titles. They have also claimed 95 All-American honors. He has coached nine former Seminoles who have gone on to represent their countries at the Olympic Games, including pole vaulter Lacy Janson (USA), who made her Olympic debut in 2012

Florida State's outdoor top 10 lists for the jumps and vaults are littered with Nobles' athletes, particularly on the women's side. His female jumpers and vaulters have 38 of the 40 top-10 marks, while the men have 32 marks. Including the multi events, all 10 of the men's indoor and outdoor records, as well as eight of the nine women's marks, belong to athletes coached by Nobles.

Nobles graduated Cum Laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education while also competing as a pole vaulter and decathlete on the Seminole track team from 1979-81. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in exercise physiology in 1983. In addition to his coaching duties, he is an associate professor at FSU as well.

Nobles began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in Plainview, Texas. While at Wayland, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the school to a national championship and two runner-up finishes. He returned to FSU in 1985 and spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach.

Karen Harvey Assistant Coach -Women's Distance

6th season at FSU 13th season overall

Passionate in her pursuit of perfection, Florida State women's cross country coach Karen Harvey has transformed the Seminoles into a perennial national championship contender in short order.

Harvey guided the 'Noles to their sixth consecutive podium finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championships in 2012, a run which included back-to-back runner-up finishes in 2009 and 2010. An incredible run on its own merit, the streak is even more impressive when considering the Seminoles had made just three NCAA appearances prior to her arrival in 2007 and had not finished better that 18th.

Excellence, however, has become the norm at FSU, which has rattled off five consecutive ACC titles and five NCAA South Regional crowns. Beyond developing teams capable of producing championships at the highest level, Harvey's FSU women have collected 16 All-American honors and five regional athletes of the year, in addition to four individual ACC champions, most recently 2012 champ Violah Lagat. Not surprisingly, she has won six consecutive ACC Coach of the Year and five NCAA South Region Coach of the Year honors.

In addition to her cross country honors, Harvey has oversight of the Florida State track & field women's distance team, which has enjoyed similar success. On the track the `Noles have collected 15 All-America honors between the indoor and outdoor seasons, including four at the 2012 NCAA Outdoor Championships. The `Noles have enjoyed similar success within the ACC ranks. Her runners established a new ACC Indoor Championship record in the distance medley relay and also got a title from Amanda Winslow in the 3000m at the 2012 meet. Outdoors, Hannah Brooks added a 5000m title. Since taking over the helm, Harvey's charges have excelled from 800-10k on the track.

Throughout her coaching career Harvey has established a reputation for developing cross country stars from outstanding middle-distance runners, including 2011 World Championship track & field medalist Hannah England to Pilar McShine, Parry and Brooks. Her most recent protégé along those lines was Lagat, who capped her collegiate career in the fall by winning the ACC and NCAA South Region cross country titles and All-American honors.

Beyond performance-based results on the course and track, Harvey's teams have flourished academically, earning USTFCCA All-Academic honors both in cross country and track. Hannah Brooks was the ACC Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 2011 and earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors, completing her graduate degree with a cumulative 4.0 GPA. Collectively, the FSU women have never dipped below a cumulative 3.0 team GPA in her tenure.

Prior to joining the Florida State staff, Harvey turned Illinois into one of the finest cross country programs in the nation over a five-year run. In her final two seasons in Champaign, the Illini posted a pair of top 10 finishes at the NCAA Championships. After a 20th-place showing in 2004, Illinois produced the top finish in school history with a fifth-place finish in 2005, then followed up with an eighth-place showing in 2006.

In 2006 Illinois captured the program's first NCAA Midwest Region championship, which earned Harvey the first of her five USTFCCCA Region Cross Country Coach of the Year awards.

Before taking her first full-time position at Illinois, Harvey spent two seasons as a volunteer cross country and track & field assistant coach at her alma mater, Michigan.

Harvey enjoyed an impressive running career, both collegiately and professionally. In 1998 she was ranked No. 1 in the world in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. A native of Brantford, Ontario, Harvey was a nine-time member of the Canadian national team, including three world cross country teams. She is the former Canadian record-holder in the steeplechase (10:14.27) and finished fifth at the 1998 Goodwill Games in the event. In 2000, Harvey was Canada's top 1500-meter runner after clocking a time of 4:16 at the Boston Indoor Games.

Collegiately, Harvey collected All-American honors in both cross country and track at Michigan between 1991-1995. She placed 21st at the 1992 NCAA Cross Country Championships and also earned first-team All-Big Ten honors in 1992 and 1995. On the track, Harvey finished eighth in the mile at the NCAA Indoor Championships and fifth in the 3,000 meters in 1995.

A 1995 Michigan graduate, Harvey received her B.A. in anthropology. She was also a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree, winning the 1995 Scholar Athlete of the Year award.

Harvey returned briefly to competition in 2011, running her first marathon, where she captured the Tallahassee Marathon title in a course record 2:43.

Harvey is married to four-time NCAA champion, three-time Olympian and co-owner of Capital City Runners store Kevin Sullivan. Sullivan also serves as a volunteer assistant for the women's cross country team.

Devin WestAssistant Coach Sprints, Hurdles & Relays

2nd season at FSU 6th season overall

Devin West is in his second year with the Florida State track & field program as an assistant coach, where he works alongside Ken Harnden with the men and women sprinters, hurdlers and relays.

West joined the Seminole staff in the fall of 2011 after a little more than one season as an assistant at Air Force, where he had oversight of the Falcons' sprinters and hurdlers.

Success has followed West throughout the early stages of his coaching career. In his first season with the Seminoles he had an opportunity to work with one of the nation's finest sprint corps, with All-Americans Maurice Mitchell, Kemar Hyman, Horatio Williams and Stephen Newbold combining for 33 of FSU's 38 points in a fourth-place team finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Prior to his arrival in Tallahassee, West's Air Force 4x400-meter relay team captured the first Mountain West Conference indoor championship in program history. He also developed Bryce Bergman, who delivered the squad's first conference championship in the 400-meter hurdles, a spot in the first round of the NCAA Championships and an appearance in the 2011 USATF National Championships. Two Falcon relay teams and two individuals earned all-conference honors, while Anthony Delgado earned All-America honors as the sprinter on the Air Force record-setting distance medley relay team.On the women's side, two of West's athletes broke the Air Force school mark in the 400-meter hurdles a combined four times.

In addition, West coached a 2010 IAAF World Junior Championship qualifier in the men's 110-meter hurdles and a 2009 USATF Junior National qualifier in the 100-meter dash.

West spent three seasons at Kennesaw State University in Georgia, where he was instrumental in guiding the Owls to four Atlantic Sun Conference championships. He coached 19 A-Sun outdoor champions and 81 all-conference performers, including the 2009 Indoor and 2010 Outdoor Freshmen of the Year. Four of his 110-meter hurdlers qualified for the NCAA East Regional and 63 established new school marks. West also assisted in the recruitment of three Nike Outdoor National participants and four state champions to Kennesaw State.

A USATF Level I certified coach, West graduated from Kennesaw State in 2010 with a degree in interdisciplinary studies.

A native of Berkeley, California, West played football and ran track at Saint Mary's College High School, where he was a two-time all-county and all-region sprinter. He initially attended St. Mary's College before transferring to Morehouse in Atlanta, where he was on the track & field and football teams.



Dorian ScottAssistant Coach Throws

1st season at FSU 2nd season overall

Dorian Scott joins the coaching staff of the Florida State track and field program as the Seminoles' throws coach. A two-time Olympian representing Jamaica in the shot put and a former All-American for the Seminoles, Scott returns to Tallahassee after one season as the throws coach at San Diego State.

His appointment came just a month after becoming the first Jamaican thrower to reach the Olympic finals in the shot put, finishing 10th at the 2012 London Games.

Scott returns to his second home - he was raised in New Jersey - after a remarkable first year at San Diego State. The Aztecs' top 10 lists in all throwing events are dotted with Scott's first-year pupils, led by Whitney Ashley, who captured the NCAA Outdoor Championship in the discus. Ashley is the program's first NCAA champion since 1985 in the event.

His impact was felt immediately by the Seminoles during the 2013 indoor season with each of his top six throwers - Stargell Williams, Jeff Pelage, Markindey Sineus, Chelsea Whalen, Briana Cherry-Bronson and Lakitta Johnson - recording new personal-best marks. Bronson established a new school record in the weight throw in just her second meet of the season.

Scott borrowed a lot of coaching techniques his first season from Harlis Meaders, the man who coached him during his time at Florida State, and added his own touches along the way. He applied the same tireless work ethic and approach to conditioning and preparation that catapulted his own career.

Scott's ascent from a 64-foot high school thrower to the No. 2 shot putter in FSU history (66-4) and a first-team All-American in 2005 was dramatic. He still holds the Mike Long Track record (70-4.50), which he set as a professional in 2009, one year after representing Jamaica in the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

In addition to his Olympic feats, he is a two-time World Championship finalist, finished sixth at the 2008 World Indoor Championships and won a silver medal in the Pan American Games. He captured his eighth Jamaican national championship this past June and holds that country's national and junior national records. Scott also won gold in the shot put at the Central American and Caribbean Games.

While attending Seton Hall Prep in West Orange, New Jersey, he had visions of playing

college football. That changed with a track offer from FSU, where he enrolled in the fall of 2000. At one point he was only throwing the shot put for fun, until his high school track team until his coach showed him boxes of letters from schools with track offers.

Scott graduated from Florida State in 2007 and has previously served as a volunteer assistant with the Seminoles, working directly with Meaders, his predecessor.

Gwendolyn Davis Athletic Trainer, ATC

2nd season at FSU 8th season overall

Gwendolyn Davis is in her second season as the athletic trainer with the Florida State men's and women's track & field teams, and also works with the cross country program in the fall.

A native of Missouri City, Texas, Davis joined the Florida State staff in November 2011 after serving in the same capacity for the nationally-acclaimed Arkansas track & field programs from 2008-2011. In addition to attending to the Razorback student-athletes, Davis supervised two certified graduate assistants and numerous graduate student athletic trainers.

She is no stranger to the Atlantic Coast Conference, having worked with the Clemson cross country and track programs while in graduate school prior to joining the Arkansas staff

She began her collegiate career at Texas State University-San Marcos, where she worked with track & field, women's basketball, football and volleyball, while also serving as a student assistant athletic trainer at San Marcos High School.

Davis graduated Magna Cum Laude from Texas State University in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in exercise and sports science, with a major in athletic training. She eared her master's degree in human resources development from Clemson in May 2008. While at Clemson her duties included daily prevention, recognition, care and rehabilitation on athletic injuries. She was responsible for practice and meet preparation and supervised students.

1st season at FSU

Dan Schaefer joined the Florida State strength and conditioning staff in July 2012 as an assistant strength and speed coach. He is charged with the design and implementation of a strength and conditioning program for the Seminole track & field, cross country and women's tennis teams.

A graduate of the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, where he earned his degree in Exercise and Sport Science, Schaefer is scheduled to complete his Master of Science in Exercise Science in April 2013.

Schaefer arrived at Florida State in May of 2011 and spent two months as a student intern before he was elevated to a graduate assistant with the strength and conditioning staff. Over the course of his time at FSU he has created an Excel-based strength program used by all varsity sports, created the "Seminole Way" exercise and testing database and designed the FSU Strength YouTube channel. He has also worked directly with the women's sand volleyball and men's and women's swimming teams, in addition to assisting in lifting sessions with multiple Seminole teams.

He holds certifications with the NSCA and CSCCa in strength and conditioning, and as a nutritionist. Schaefer is also a USAW Weightlifting Sport Performance Coach.

Florida State's Mike Long Track, where the Seminoles will host three meets in 2013, has a fresh, new look that should provide for fast times, safer training and improved amenities for FSU athletes and fans.

The 400-meter track and its runways have been completely resurfaced with the next generation of the Hobart Texture Synthetic Surface that was installed at Oregon's historic Hayward Field, host site of the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials.

Beynon Sports Surfaces, which includes among its employees FSU Hall of Famer and former track & field coach Dick Roberts, completed the project in 12 weeks and turned it back over to the program in early January. It is the first resurfacing of track, home to the nationally-ranked Seminole men's and women's teams, in 11 years.

In addition to the garnet-toned surface with gold relay exchange zones, the project included a leveling or areas on the track and high jump/javelin apron, to improve drainage. The apron is adorned with a giantsized Seminole head; the hand-painted final piece of the project.

The surface is significantly softer than the one it replaced and should provide student-athletes with a safer environment which lessens the risk of injury during training and competition.

Additional improvements to the facility include a new sound system, as well as hot and cold tubs, located in the training room inside the McIntosh Track & Field Building

The McIntosh Building was initially dedicated on Oct. 28, 2008. The stand-alone facility includes 120 studentathlete lockers, an athletic training room, athletes' lounge, coaches offices, a conference room, graduate assistant work area and a spacious press box befitting a program of Florida State's stature.

"The McIntosh Track & Field Building is one of the finest track-only buildings in the country," Florida State head coach Bob Braman said. "We have all the necessary amenities to compete for national championships as well as provide the best possible student services for our athletes.'

Inside a two-way, vaulted entry to the building, FSU's rich tradition and history in track & field and cross country are on display.

Within the brick and gated entry to Mike Long Track is Legends Plaza, which provides all who enter yet another reminder of the tremendous success the Seminoles have enjoyed in the sport. Record boards provide updated school and facility marks, while FSU's growing number of all-time All-Americans are on display in the courtyard area.

One wall is dedicated to the national championships won both individually in events as well as titles claimed by the men's and women's teams.

Each season Mike Long Track and Florida State play host to the FSU Relays in March, the Seminole Invitational in April and the Seminole Twilight Meet in May, which often serves as a last-chance qualifier for NCAA postseason competition.




