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
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

ATHLETIC YEAR IN REVIEW





Highlights of the 2010-11 Athletic Year

FSU Volleyball earned consecutive NCAA postseason appearances for the first time since 1997-98

Football became ACC Atlantic Division champions and defeated South Carolina in the Chick-fil-A Bowl to cap a double-digit win season for the first time since 2003

Men's basketball finished with a 23-11 overall record and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time since 1993

Ngoni Makusha was named NCAA Division I National Men's Track Athlete of the Year while leading the outdoor men's track & field team to a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships

Behind the arm of pitcher Sarah Hamilton, softball clinched its first ACC championship since 2004 and preserved the two-year streak of every FSU sport making the NCAA postseason

Both the men's and women's cross country programs finished second at the NCAA Championships

Women's soccer ended another outstanding season with its sixth straight NCAA Elite Eight appearance

Seminole Athletics Touts ...

- » Former football standout Myron Rolle became the second Florida State student-athlete in the past five years to earn the Rhodes Scholarship one of the oldest and most prestigious awards for international study. Rolle was the first prominent college football to earn the Rhodes Scholarship in nearly 25 years
- » Over the past 17 years over \$500,000 in postgraduate money has been awarded to FSU student-athletes, as well as numerous other academic honors and awards

- » In the spring 2011 semester, 228 Seminole student-athletes achieved a 3.0 grade point average or better. In all, nine of 17 FSU athletic teams posted a 3.0 GPA or better
- » A total of 14 student-athletes posted a perfect 4.0 GPA, while 126 student-athletes earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher.
- » The Athletic Department posted a cumulative GPA of 2.91 following the 2010-11 athletic year.

STUDENT SERVICE



Giving back to the community is more than a high priority at Florida State University. It is an integral part of the whole development of the student-athlete. Through the athletic Department's Office of Student Services, student athletes are encouraged to serve the community and participate in a program that focuses on life skills as well as personal, career and leadership development.

For the 2010-2011 academic school year, Florida State athletic teams combined to serve almost 5,600 hours of Community Service in many of our local schools and organizations. Nine athletic teams completed over 200 hours each. Altogether, 469 of our 572 student-athletes volunteered their time and service to a variety of events, activities and organizations this past academic school year.

WHAT IS NCAA COMPLIANCE?

Florida State University is committed and obligated to the principle of institutional control in operating its athletics program in a manner that is consistent with the letter and the spirit of the NCAA, ACC and University rules and regulations. The maintaining of institutional control is imperative to the continued growth and success of Seminole Athletics. Proper rules compliance is the concern of everyone associated with Florida State University, and everyone plays a role. Keeping our student-athletes, administrators, coaching staffs and alumni/boosters abreast of NCAA and ACC rules is the key to ensuring proper rules compliance.

The FSU Compliance Team coordinates, monitors and verifies compliance with all NCAA requirements and educates the various constituencies of the University and the community regarding NCAA/ACC regulations. Our office is dedicated to providing educational programs and interpretive support to ensure that all individuals involved with the athletics program understand and adhere to the University's compliance expectations. It is the goal of the compliance program to place the University in a proactive position by educating, overseeing and monitoring the intercollegiate athletics program and maintaining a positive compliance environment. Some of the areas that the office is responsible for are Amateurism, Coaching Limits, Eligibility, Recruiting, Financial Aid, Awards and Benefits and Playing and Practice Seasons.

The Compliance Office is located on the Fourth Floor of the Moore Athletic Center and is staffed by the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance, two Assistant Athletic Directors, two Directors of Compliance and two Graduate Assistants. We welcome any questions or concerns that you may have regarding the NCAA or ACC regulations in relation to FSU student-athletes or athletics programs.

FSU FACILITIES

The Dave Middleton Golf Complex boasts private technologically advanced Wi-Fi classrooms, study and teaching labs, an internship library, a fully equipped club repair room, a pro shop, locker rooms and the Renegade Grill. The \$7 million facility is a two-building complex, which also includes a multi-directional driving range, a video analysis instructional center with hitting bays for inclement weather, chipping and putting greens, as well as locker rooms, a team lounge, auditorium and a fitness facility.

The golf course was renovated in 2004 with the reconstruction of al 18 greens complexes, tee boxes and the state-of-the-art TiffEagle Turf was installed on all the putting surfaces. Each year the facility hosts over 60,000 rounds of golf. The golf course was recently recognized as one of the top 10 golf courses in the country by the National Golf Foundation for customer loyalty and satisfaction.



AMY BOND, HEAD WOMEN'S COACH

- » Amy Bond is in her second season as Florida State's head coach as she returned to her alma mater in 2010 to continue the proud Seminole women's golf tradition which includes the 1981 A.I.A.W national championship and 18 appearances in the last 21 years in the NCAA Championship tournament.
- » Bond not only helped the Seminoles return to the NCAA Tournament in her first season but she continued the tradition of individual success as senior Maria Salinas earned All-American and All-ACC honors.

LINDSAY KOTH, ASSISTANT COACH

- » Lindsay Koth, who helped both the Seminole men's & women's golf team advance to the NCAA Championship in 2011, is in her second season as an assistant coach at Florida State.
- » She is the recruiting coordinator for both teams, who she works with on a daily basis, as well as Director of Golf Trey Jones, and Head Women's Coach Amy Bond.
- » During her first season in Tallahassee, the Seminole men played in the NCAA Central Regional championship and the women played in the NCAA East Regional championship.

Duck, who helped lead Augusta State to three NCAA Championship


