

### COMMUNITY SERVICE AND SUPPORT

Giving back to the community is a priority for all of Florida State University's student-athletes. The Seminole softball team makes a strong effort throughout the year to perform countless hours of community service in the Big Bend area.

In the 2009-10 academic year, the softball squad completed an astounding 303 hours of community service, equaling roughly 14 hours per person. The team also had a 100 percent participation rate, finishing in third place for the Golden Community Service Award.

FSU Softball was honored at the 17th annual Golden Nole banquet on April 21, 2011, as senior shortstop Ashley Stager earned the Golden Nole Award for softball while Robin Ahrberg won the Doc Fauls Award after making an inspiring comeback from shoulder surgery. Stager, a shortstop at FSU from 2008-11, also was an ACC Top Six for Service recipient.

The Seminoles followed with another year of outstanding community service in the 2010-11 year, and continue to give back at an incredible

rate in the present academic year.

Fourth-year head coach Lonni Alameda and the rest of the charitable Seminoles never see such fulfilling work as a mere chore. Instead, they relish the opportunity of impacting lives throughout the region and see themselves as not only FSU student-athletes, but active members who are ready to give back.

It is just one of the many reasons why FSU has one of the most accomplished, well-rounded softball programs throughout the country.

## 2012 SEASON OUTLOOK

Going for Lucky 13

The 2012 Florida State Softball team is gunning for its 13th consecutive trip to the NCAA Championship, a streak that is unrivaled in

program history.

Last season, the Seminoles earned their 12th straight trip to the postseason following a 4-1 victory over North Carolina in the ACC Championship Game. The streak broke the previous school record of consecutive NCAA trips, which was 11 from 1986-1996.

Since the 1986 season, FSU has failed to make the NCAA postseason just twice - in 1997 and 1999.

The Offensive Replacements

In the 2012 season, Florida State will be without four key offensive players in graduates Jén Lapicki (C), Robin Ahrberg (C/DP), Kristie McConn (2B) and Ashley Stager (SS). The foursome accounted for 60 percent of the team's home run production as well as nearly 45 percent of FSU's RBI total in 2011.

While their talents will be sorely missed, the Seminoles have some exceptional student-athletes who are ready to take their spots. At catcher, sophomore Celeste Gomez will battle heralded freshman Erika Leonard for the starting position.

At second base, fifth-year senior Mallory Borden returns following a season-ending injury early last season. Stager's departure leaves a gap at shortstop, but redshirt freshman Maddie O'Brien is one to keep an eye on at the position.

Alameda Searching for 300

Fourth-year FSU softball head coach Lonni Alameda is searching for another milestone victory in her career as she looks to amass 300

Alameda, who played both softball and volleyball at Oklahoma, holds a career record of 277-220-1 in stints that include five years at UNLV. In all three seasons of coaching at FSU, she has led the Seminoles to an appearance in the ACC Championship Game, including a conference title in 2011.

**Heading to Hawaii** 

In a season-long schedule that features several entertaining tournaments and matchups, one of the most exciting trips occurs March 2-6 when FSU heads to the Hawaii Classic in Honolulu.

In the Aloha State, the Seminoles face three opponents in UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii twice and Radford for a total of five games. The trip to Honolulu also offers a homecoming for sophomore centerfielder Courtney Senas, who hails from Wahiawa which is located on the island of Oahu.

**FSU Exposure** 

As part of the ACC's enhanced Olympic sports package with ESPN, FSU softball will be hosting a pair of Monday night games that will air on ESPNU at JoAnne Graf Field.

The first broadcast features the Seminoles and conference rival North Carolina on April 2 at 7 p.m. Although UNC swept FSU in Chapel Hill last season, the Seminoles responded by earning a 4-1 victory in the conference championship game over the Tar Heels in Atlanta for the school's 11th ACC title.

Another ACC foe in Georgia Tech comes to Tallahassee and will battle the Seminoles on April 16 in front of an ESPNU audience. Last season, the Seminoles took one of three versus the nationally-ranked Yellow Jackets on the road. In 2009 and 2010, Georgia Tech defeated FSU in consecutive ACC Championship Games.

In addition, the Sunday doubleheaders for the North Carolina and Georgia Tech series will be streamed on ESPN3.com, giving FSU softball at least six games this season affiliated with ESPN.

ESPNU reaches nearly 73 million households worldwide. ESPN3.com is a streaming service that offers games worldwide and is compatible with many cable providers.

Tournament Tested

On this year's schedule for FSU, there are six opponents who qualified for last season's NCAA Championship.

Included in that bunch is Women's College World Series participant Florida, which comes to Tallahassee on April 4 for a 6 p.m. tilt.

FSU's five other reigning NCAA postseason opponents did not get past the opening regional round. Southeastern Conference opponent LSU will host FSU early in the year on Feb. 15 at 7 p.m. ÉT. The other road opponent includes Maryland (May 5-6), while FSU hosts North Dakota State (Feb. 18) Tennessee-Chattanooga (March 13) and Georgia Tech (April 15-16).

**Pitching Prowess** 

It is fully expected that the Seminoles will regain their swagger in the circle in 2012 thanks to some talented arms that provide the

group with great depth.

Set to make her Seminole debut is redshirt junior Monica Perry (Whitesburg, Ga.), a quality transfer from the University of Illinois. In two years for the Illini, Perry went 49-22 with a 3.25 ERA and 394 strikeouts as the team's ace. She was forced to sit out last season at FSU due to late transfer rules.

Redshirt sophomore Jessica Nori (Weston, Fla.) gained tremendous experience last season by finishing 8-5 with a 2.84 ERA. She should form a quality tandem with Perry to help carry the Seminoles.

Playing an enormous role in 2012 will be freshman pitcher Lacey Waldrop (Colonial Heights, Va.), one of the nation's best pitchers in the 2011 recruiting class who has pitched extremely well in the offseason. Aside from earning time in key weekend series, Waldrop could develop into a strong starter for mid-week games.

Fellow freshman Bailey Schinella (Valrico, Fla.) will also look for time in the circle as she continues to develop. Junior Morgan Bullock (Dacula, Ga.) is also an option for FSU as she finished 5-4 last year in

19 appearances.



## 2012 SERSON OUTLOOK

Nori's Glory

Redshirt sophomore pitcher Jessica Nori expects to bolster this year's pitching staff again in what will be her second year of actual playing experience. However, her path to the circle is very unique.

As a true freshman walk-on in 2010. Nori did not make the roster due to the team's surplus of pitchers. However, head coach Lonni Alameda decided to keep her on as a team manager to keep her within the program and allow her to de-

velop her game.

In 2011, Nori officially made the team and even earned a spot in the rotation. She made the most of her opportunity, showing off her blazing speed after working arduously to prove she belonged on the squad. The crowning moment came when she delivered both of FSU's victories in last year's NCAA Tournament, allowing just one run in 9.1 innings pitched versus Georgia State and UAB.

Shayla's Senior Year

Consistency is the proper term to highlight senior outfielder Shayla Jackson's first three years at FSU.

The Pembroke Pines, Fla., native has been consistently good as a member of the Garnet and Gold. As a left-handed slap hitter, she shows a .332 career batting average and has struck out just 37 times in 589 plate appearances, an average of once every 16 times she

steps to the dish.

Jackson joins teammates Mallory Borden and Tiffani Brown as the team's three captains this year. She is coming off a season in which she was named to the All-ACC Team and was the 18th hardest player to strike out in the nation. Entering her senior year, the criminology major is within reasonable striking distance of placing in the Top 10 in career base hits, doubles and triples at FSU.

**Modish Maddie** 

Redshirt freshman shortstop Maddie O'Brien is a very interesting figure. She came to FSU as a heralded recruit in the 2010 recruiting class, being named an ESPN Rise First Team All-American and a MaxPreps/Gatorade First Team All-American.

While she came in as a possible contributor right away, her first season was taken away after suffering a nagging ankle injury in the fall 2010 that wouldn't go away. This season, O'Brien looks to fulfill her hype as she enjoyed a productive offseason at shortstop and maintained her smooth hitting

stroke at the plate.

In addition to what could be her breakthrough season, O'Brien has an incredible fashion sense that makes her a very interesting player. She is a major in retail merchandising at FSU and hopes to design her own clothing line someday. While her commitment level is incredibly high to the game she is so talented at, you can always find her keeping up on everything involving the wide world of glitz and glamour.

#### Tireless Tiffani Brown

One of the ACC's most exciting student-athletes to watch is junior infielder Tiffani Brown. The Tallahassee resident possesses an incredibly vibrant personality and is one of the team's most energetic players with a constant motor.

Brown, who was a cheerleaderturned-softball player at Godby High School, is a skilled base stealer and extremely fast down the baselines. As a sophomore, she led FSU in five categories in what was another strong season for the criminology major and computer science minor.

During the offseason, the FSU softball program took in two new assistant coaches who will be making their debuts this season in Craig Snider and Travis Wilson.

Both coaches have a tremendous background, and have already helped several student-athletes

improve their individual game

Snider is an offensive guru from Franklin, Ky., who has worked for Lindsey Wilson College, Centenary, Oklahoma and most recently Stephen F. Austin. In four seasons, he helped increase the Ladyjacks' team batting average from .229 in 2007 to .274 in 2008, .275 in 2009 and .278 in 2010.

Wilson also has an interesting background, serving as a baseball, softball and cricket veteran. The New Zealand native will help benefit FSU at the plate and in the field through his teachings learned in seven seasons with the Atlanta Braves and Cincinnati Reds organizations. He also was a former standout in New Zealand for the Black Sox.

It has always been said that recruiting is the lifeblood for your program. With such being the case, the Seminole Softball program appears to be in great hands for years to come.

FSU's 2012 recruiting class that officially signed last fall is ready to make an impact in the 2013 season, and points to the positive direction that the program has

maintained for years.

Included in the stellar class is nationally-acclaimed pitcher Jessica Burroughs, a Houston County, Ga., native who could be touted as one of the top freshman pitchers in the country next year. High School All-American outfielder Stephanie Hartness (Niceville, Fla.) is also a heralded signee who will undoubtedly benefit the program.

Another in-state talent in utility player Alex Powers (Melbourne, Fla.) will bring big-time numbers to the college game after leading Eau Gallie High School to a Florida 5A

state championship.

Outfielder Alex Kossoff (Redondo Beach, Calif.) will add another speed threat to the Seminoles as well as an outfield presence. Lastly, infielder Kaitlin Allen (Tulsa, Okla.) will provide quality depth after batting .396 in her final season at Jenks High School.

In just her third season as head coach at Florida State, Lonni Alameda helped the Seminole softball program snap a seven-year ACC title drought to highlight an entertaining 2011 season. Despite making the conference tournament in Atlanta as the No. 4 seed, it was



Alameda's season-long coaching tactics combined with the energy of her motivated group that enabled the Seminoles to storm through the competition and defeat second-seeded North Carolina, 4-1, to clinch an automatic NCAA Regional bid.

Under Alameda's guidance, the 2011 Seminoles created a noteworthy program achievement - for the first time in school history, FSU softball reached 12 consecutive NCAA Regionals. Her group also won two games in the Athens Regional, defeating Georgia State and UAB, to get to the final day of a regional for the first time since 2006.

Alameda came to Florida State prior to the 2009 season and went on to surpass 200 career coaching victories in her first year in Tallahassee. The Seminoles finished the 2009 campaign with a 44-16 record and achieved the best conference record in school history with a 17-4 league mark. In her second season as head coach, Alameda led the Seminoles to a 44-18 record and second-consecutive appearance in not just the ACC Championship game but the NCAA Tournament.

Since Alameda has made Tallahassee her home, she has now led the Seminoles to three ACC Championship game appearances in three seasons.

In 2010, FSU earned a spot in the field of 64 and made its 11th-straight appearance in the NCAA Division I Softball Championship. The Seminoles hit the road for their regional and played in Athens, Ga. before falling to Georgia and Radford.

Before traveling to the Peach State, FSU was on the campus of Virginia Tech for the 2010 ACC Softball Championship. While in Blacksburg, Va., the 'Noles beat Maryland and the host Hokies before losing to Georgia Tech in the title game. At the time, FSU's championship-game appearance marked the 14th time in school history it had the chance to play for a title - a total number that is more than any other school in the conference.

Under Alameda's tutelage, the 2010 Seminoles accomplished a lot of statistical feats. Not only did FSU get off to its best start since 1993 by starting the year 20-2, but the team capped off the year with high marks in a bevy of categories. The Seminoles' .297 batting average was the best since 2003 and the team's 212 total walks were the most since the 2004 season, just to name a few. The 'Noles also posted just 226 strikeouts at the plate; the fewest since the 1998 campaign.

Individually, Alameda coached several FSU student-athletes who earned recognition for their hard work on the field and in the class-room. Carly Wynn was named an All-ACC First Team selection and Terese Gober, Sarah Hamilton and Ashley Stager were each placed on the All-ACC Second Team. Robin Ahrberg, Tiffani Brown and Hamilton each got the nod on the ACC's All-Tournament team, too. Wynn and Hamilton also captured Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-Southeast Region Second Team honors. Wynn was even named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Third Team.

Adding to Alameda's on and off-field influence, Hamilton became just one of two conference players in 2011 to be named to the All-ACC Team on three different occasions. Shayla Jackson and Jen Lapicki joined Hamilton on the 2011 all-conference squad.

Hamilton ended her illustrious career as one of the best pitchers in school history, with Alameda playing a large role as the team's pitching coach. Among her noteworthy feats, Hamilton became the first hurler in FSU history to finish with at least 1,000 career strikeouts, ending her four-year stay with 1,005 K's.

For her team's exploits on the field in 2009, Alameda and the Seminoles had the opportunity to host a regional in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2004 season. Alameda coached several Seminoles that garnered postseason awards as Hamilton was named a Third Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-American as a sophomore. Hamilton was also named ACC Pitcher of the Year, an ACC First Team member and to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Southeast Region Team. Then-senior catcher Kaleigh Rafter was also named to the team and was an All-ACC First Team member. Wynn and Gober (both second team) were also student-athletes coached by Alameda who were recognized as All-ACC players.

An All-Big Eight selection as a player at Oklahoma, Alameda came to FSU from UNLV, where she spent five seasons reviving the Rebels' program. She replaced Dr. JoAnne Graf, who retired after 30 seasons with the Seminoles.

Alameda carries an impressive coaching résumé on the international level and, since 2004, has helped in the development of Canada's National Team. She aided Canada up until the 2004 Summer Olympics and resumed as an assistant following the Rebels' 2005 season. In the summer of 2006, Canada qualified for the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China, after its strong showing in the World Championships. Alameda spent the summer of 2008 with the Canadian team which ended its quest for the gold with a fourth-place finish at the Beijing Olympic Games.

Prior to Alameda's arrival at UNLV, the Rebels had seven straight seasons below .500 and hadn't participated in NCAA Regional play

since 1996. In 2005, just her second season at the helm of the program, Alameda guided UNLV to a 44-19 record, including a program-best 17 Mountain West Conference wins, and a trip to Los Angeles for NCAA Regionals. Alameda was named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 and again in 2007 and the entire staff garnered NFCA West Regional Coaching Staff of the Year in 2005.


After a second place finish in the Mountain West in 2007 and an overall 37-27 record, Alameda and UNLV had high hopes for 2008 and had the Rebels ranked in the ESPN. com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll for the first time in program history. After starting the season 9-1-1, the Rebels moved up to No. 18 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, but injuries to four starters proved costly as the season progressed.

Alameda went 25-35 in her first season at UNLV, which was a four-game improvement over 2003's final tally. She then posted a staggering 44-19 mark in 2005 and the program's first trip to NCAA Regionals since 1996. In 2006, the squad was set back by injuries and fell to 26-37, but saw a 180-degree turnaround in 2007.

The 2005 season featured the Rebels' assault on the program's record book, appearances in the national rankings and the introduction of several conference and national award winners. The 44 wins were the third-most in the program's history, while the 17 Mountain West Conference wins were the most-ever since joining the league in 1999. After being predicted to finish last in the league, UNLV excelled, placing second in the league in both the regular season and Mountain West Conference tournament.

Under Alameda's direction, the Rebels enjoyed recognition at the conference and regional level. Five Rebels have

garnered Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Regional honors while 13 players have earned all-Mountain West Conference accolades, including two pitchers of the year and one freshman of the year awards.



During her tenure at UNLV, Alameda also stressed the importance of community service and had players volunteer their time at the Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation and Child Haven while participating in breast cancer walks and blood drives. Her emphasis has not changed since arriving at FSU, with the 2011 Seminole Squad earning honors such as the SemiGnome Award for community service and routinely producing standout student-athletes who are honored for their charitable ways.

Alameda came to Las Vegas after eight seasons as the assistant coach at Stanford University, where she helped guide the Cardinal to a 320-179-1 record and six straight NCAA Regional appearances. She oversaw the pitching staff there and produced three All-Americans: Becky Blevins, Marcy Crouch and Dana Sorenson.

Prior to her stint at Stanford, Alameda spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Barry University (Miami Shores, Fla.). She helped the Buccaneers to a fifth-place NCAA Division II finish in her first year. She also spent some time on the international stage, serving as an instructor for both the Aruba (1995) and Spanish (2000) national teams.

An all-around great athlete, Alameda began her collegiate career as a pitcher at St. Mary's University (San Antonio, Texas) where she led the Rattlers to the NAIA Tournament in her only season. She later transferred to Oklahoma in 1989 and played softball and volleyball for the Sooners. She was a two-time All-Big Eight selection as a first and third baseman, while hitting .359 as a senior in 1992.

Alameda earned her bachelor's degree in communications from Oklahoma in 1993 and played softball professionally in Europe for a season before beginning her coaching career.





## **ASSISTANT COACH CRAIG SNIDER**

Florida State softball assistant coach Craig Snider enters his first season as a member of the Seminole softball family. The Franklin, Ky. native has built a reputation for being a difference maker everywhere he has been, which includes Stephen F. Austin, Oklahoma, Centenary and Lindsey Wilson College. Over the last decade, Snider has propelled each of his teams toward tremendous improvement at the plate, and looks to continue his history of success as FSU's hitting coach.



In his most recent stint at Stephen F. Austin as an assistant coach, Snider helped turn the Southland Conference program around right away. He took over as hitting coach in 2007 following a season in which the Ladyjacks finished with a .229 batting average. Over the next three seasons, SFA batted .274 (2008), .275 (2009) and .278 (2010). He also led the team to sharp spikes in home runs, on-base percentage and slugging percentage, as SFA recorded 43 round-trippers in Snider's first season after hitting just 16 the season before.

At Stephen F. Austin, Snider took on several roles in guiding the program toward its recent success. He devised hitting and defensive workouts during the fall, directed all aspects of camps, developed team-building exercises, served as a fundraising arm, handled much of the recruiting and recruiting databases and oversaw his student-athlete's academic progress.

"I'm extremely impressed with Craig's character," FSU head coach Lonni Alameda said. "He is a genuine person who works hard and loves the game. He has

been a part of bigger programs as well as mid majors and I

believe that makes him a tremendous coach as you have to be very creative in your coaching as you relate to different styles of athletes. Craig also brings a wealth of recruiting connections. He is very good with people and respected by many and he will now embrace those relationships as a Seminole."

Snider, who has been involved as a coach in softball since 2001, previously assisted in producing three All-Americans at Oklahoma from 2005-06, and played a large role in creating scouting reports as a graduate assistant coach for the Sooners. At his alma mater of Centenary, he helped lead the school to two Mid-Con Tournament championships while providing analysis for recruiting, hitting, fielding and putting together chart systems. His versatility also included field maintenance and even putting together the team's highlight videos in 2004 and 2005.

At Lindsey Wilson College from 2001-03, Snider guided the team to batting averages above .300 every season. He was heavily involved in the recruiting process as an assistant coach and oversaw all summer camps.

"I'm thrilled to help coach at such an established program that is coming off another conference championship and has great

things going for it," Snider added. "FSU's history of softball success was such a motivating factor for me to come here, and I have no doubt that through the hard work of this current coaching staff and our student-athletes, we can take this program to the next level."

Snider is married to his wife, Lauren, who is a native of Bellville, Texas. The two have one daughter, Riley (1).





## **ASSISTANT COACH TRAVIS WILSON**

With one of the most well-versed and unique backgrounds in collegiate softball, Travis Wilson is prepared to make his first season as an assistant softball coach at Florida State a memorable one.

Wilson is a native of New Zealand who will take on an important role with recruiting. The baseball, softball and cricket veteran serves as the Seminoles' hitting and fielding coach, looking to enhance the defensive approach to a unit that brings back several position players in 2012.



"Travis is from both professional baseball and the New Zealand National Program," head coach Lonni Alameda said. "From the first time I met Travis I knew he would be a great fit for our program. It is not often you come across someone that has played the same game that the girls do and yet has 10 years of Major League Baseball experience. He is personable and he has won at the highest level of this game from the men's side. He has played every position you can on the field and has been among some of the world's best in men's fastpitch. I believe Travis will be able to relate to the players on a unique level as he stills plays the game. He is excited about this opportunity and can help our program get to the next level."

From 1996-2004, Wilson played seven seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization covering all stops from Rookie Ball to Triple-A. He enjoyed much success

in his professional stint, being named an All-Star for the Appalachian

League (1998), South Atlantic League (1999) and the Carolina League (2000). He was named Carolina League Player of the Year for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans, and led the Grapefruit League in hitting for the Braves during spring training in 2001.

Wilson ended his professional career in 2004 with the Cincinnati Reds' organization in Chattanooga, Tenn. As a softball player in New Zealand for the Black Sox, he made his debut as a 16-year old in 1994 and was named both the New Zealand Softballer of the Year and the Canterbury Softballer



of the Year after posting a team-best .396 batting average in 1996. He would earn the Canterbury Player of the Year honor multiple times and become one of his country's biggest softball ambassadors. He continues to play today.

Wilson's most recent baseball stint was as an instructor for the Idaho Falls, a Rookie League team of the Kansas City Royals. His tasks included scouting the Pioneer League, writing reports and utilizing video while communicating with the Royals organization on several prospects. His efforts have helped the Royals claim their status of having the best farm system in Major League Baseball, as asserted by several minor-league publications. On the field, he helped his players develop their infield/outfield skills, base running and hitting mechanics. Wilson also served as expert commentator for the ISF Men's World Softball Series, and was fielding coach and video analyst for the Black Caps of the New Zealand Cricket Association.

Wilson is married to his wife, Jill. The two have a son named Tyler.



### **VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH CARLY WYNN**

Known as one of the top softball student-athletes to ever don the Garnet and Gold, second-year Volunteer Assistant Coach Carly Wynn brings an incredible amount of knowledge to the Florida State softball staff after being one of the most accomplished players in school history.

Wynn joined the Florida State softball staff as a volunteer coach in 2010 after a very successful playing career at FSU. Her primary duties include being in charge of defensive drills for the outfielders, assisting with the team's



short game, handling some administrative work within the office and coordinating and scouting game day video. Wynn also organizes and assists the team's motivational exercises and plays a big role in FSU's alumni relations and community service events.

Through four seasons at FSU from 2007-10, Wynn asserted herself as one of the most talented players in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Sharpsburg, Ga., native held career marks of a .355 batting average, 20 home runs, 101

RBIs, 45 doubles, 13 triples and 247 base hits. Wynn also scored 165 runs and posted a remarkable on-base percentage of .441, which includes a .496 on-base percentage in her senior season.

Altogether, Wynn is in the Top 10 in school history in eight career categories. She is second in doubles, third in slugging percentage, fifth in

walks, sixth in runs scored and home runs, seventh in batting average, eighth in base hits and ninth in stolen bases.

Wynn's versatility on the field was also apparent between the bases - she swiped 65 stolen bases in 74 attempts. She picked up numerous accolades in her illustrious career, being named a two-time all-region performer, a three-time All-ACC selection, a two-time CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American and an All-ACC Academic member. The fleet-footed outfielder was also on the ACC Champion-ship All-Tournament Team in 2009, and was awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship in 2010.

## **2011 SEASON REVIEW**

### MISSION ACC-OMPLISHED

The 2011 Florida State softball team had a whirlwind campaign, ranging from tough early-season injuries, difficult one-run losses as well as some gratifying regular-season wins. But what the Seminoles showed last season boils down to their biggest accomplishment of all -winning their first Atlantic Coast Conference championship in seven years.

For all the 40, 50 and even 60-win seasons that the FSU softball program has churned out over the years, the 2011 squad was never about the numbers. The Seminoles finished the season with a 32-28 overall record, which included a school-record 12th straight NCAA

Regional appearance as they reached the final day in Athens, Ga. The crowning achievement of the season came in just a three-day stint in mid-May, where the team rallied around the head coaching of Lonni Alameda and the superb pitching of Sarah Hamilton to emerge victorious in postseason conference play.

On May 13, the Seminoles began their postseason quest with the ACC Tournament hosted by top-seeded Georgia Tech in Atlanta. The single-elimination field put pressure on FSU to add more quality wins and enhance its NCAA Tournament résumé. In the opening contest against fifth-seeded Virginia Tech, it was leadoff batter Tiffani Brown's solo home run down the right field line that would not only set the tone for the first-round matchup, but foreshadow the offensive explosion by the `Noles during the three-day tournament.

FSU defeated Virginia Tech in that first game, winning by a 9-2 score. The Seminoles dealt with some slight adversity in the contest, as its early 2-0 lead was relinquished by a tying two-run home run from Betty Rose in the top of the fifth. The situation of surrendering leads had happened before for FSU, but this time Hamilton and her potent offense made sure they'd keep the opponents at bay. Senior second baseman Kristie McConn stepped to the plate in the bottom half of the fifth against fast-throwing reliever Jasmin Harrell and hit an absolute moon shot over the left field wall. The big play sparked seven unanswered runs for FSU as it cruised to a surprising second-round

matchup with No. 8 seeded Virginia, which upset the nationally-ranked Yellow Jackets in the first round.

Playing a team with some dangerous momentum, the Seminoles got behind early against the Cavaliers but didn't flinch. A bevy of errors by FSU helped Virginia take a 5-2 lead through two innings, but FSU responded with four runs in the third inning that in turn was aided by some Cavalier miscues. Freshmen Celeste Gomez and Courtney Senas as well as senior Jen Lapicki got the offense going with tape-measure home runs, as FSU's 12-hit attack helped power Hamilton to her second win in as many days. The 12-5 win by FSU clouded the fact that Hamilton allowed only one earned run in five innings pitched, while redshirt freshman Jessica Nori pitched the final two scoreless frames.

The Seminoles marched on to the ACC Championship Game, and with the NCAA bubble shrinking even more due to some unexpected conference tournament wins elsewhere, it was a near certainty that FSU's season was on the line. They were slated to face No. 2 seed North Carolina, which swept the Seminoles in Chapel Hill earlier in the season in what were three extremely close ball games.

The matchup pitted two of the ACC's top pitchers in UNC freshman Lori Spingola and Hamilton of FSU. The Seminoles, with their hot bats, managed to get the best of the youthful pitcher as fifth-year senior Robin Ahrberg started the scoring with a leadoff home run to left field to make it 1-0. From there, it was the hitting of Senas and the pitching of Hamilton that propelled FSU to its most climactic win of the year. Senas finished 2-for-3 with three RBIs, none bigger than her two-run home run down the left field line in the sixth inning that gave FSU a 4-0 lead. Hamilton, the tournament MVP, allowed one earned run on three hits in seven innings pitched, striking out Kelsey Green on a high fastball to end the game and send the Seminoles into a jubilant celebration.

Indeed, FSU seemed to persevere when it mattered most, and in the process it knocked out its ACC counterpart (UNC) from the NCAA Tournament due to the slim-sized bubble. Hamilton, Lapicki, Gomez and Senas represented the Seminoles on the ACC All-Tournament Team, and it was revealed on the NCAA Softball Selection Show that FSU would have a date in the Athens Regional as the No. 2 seed against nationally-ranked Georgia, UAB and Georgia State.

FSU finished the season with a respectable showing in the NCAA Regional. The Seminoles got off to a tough start in game one when they fell to UAB, 2-0. However, FSU bounced back the following day by getting past Georgia State, 6-1, and getting revenge on the Blazers with a 13-1 win in six innings. In those two games combined, Nori earned both victories by allowing just one run in 9.1 innings pitched on seven hits.

It was that never-say-die demeanor that allowed FSU to reach the final day of an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2006. Its season

ended against Georgia, and effectively ended the careers of senior standouts Hamilton, Lapicki, Ashley Stager, McConn, Lauren Varsalona and Ahrberg.

Check out the following bullet points for some other highlights of FSU's fulfilling season:

- The Florida State softball team highlighted its season with the program's 11th ACC Championship in a 4-1 victory over North Carolina. The win was significant in many ways, giving coach Alameda her first ACC championship, marking FSU's first postseason crown since 2004, and perhaps most importantly, making it two straight years that all of FSU's athletic programs made the NCAA postseason.
- The ACC Championship victory as a No. 4 seed was the lowest by any FSU softball team that had won a postseason conference title.
- For the first time since 2007, FSU had two different players record multiple-home run games in one season. On March 20, Robin Ahrberg did her best Kirk Gibson impression by hitting two bombs against N.C. State on what looked to be a gimpy leg. Ashley Stager accomplished the same feat on May 8 at Georgia Tech when she went deep twice. Coincidentally, one of those players who recorded a two home-run game in 2007 was current volunteer assistant Carly Wynn against Georgia State
- How resilient were the 2011 Seminoles? FSU battled another difficult schedule and lost several close games that could have gone either way during the regular season. Its record in one-run ball games was 3-13, but no matter how difficult each of those losses were, the team managed to fight, scrap and claw their way to another conference championship.
- There were also some extraordinary individual performances in 2011:

o Freshman Kelly Hensley hit a huge pinch-hit home run to help FSU break away from FAMU on Feb. 15.

o Tiffani Brown earned her first-ever ACC Player of the Week award after a great performance against Kentucky. Sarah Hamilton also earned Pitcher of the Week at the same time, and won three more as the season went on.

o Ashley Stager exploded at the Cathedral City Classic in Palm Springs, Calif. She went 6-for-13 (.462) with three home runs, five RBIs, three runs scored and a 1.154 slugging percentage in five games.

o Sarah Hamilton threw her first of three one-hitters in a win over Wisconsin in early March. Later on, she would throw her sixth career no-hitter in a win against Virginia and had seven double-digit strikeout games last season.

o Jen Lapicki had a nine-game stretch from March 5-13 where she batted .630 (17-for-27) with two home runs and seven RBIs in games that included Alabama, Auburn and Mississippi State from the SEC.

o On April 12, FSU recorded its only walk-off victory of the season on a Shayla Jackson RBI double that scored Tiffani Brown - who made a nifty slide around the catcher to give the Seminoles a 5-4 win.

- o Two personal feats were established in FSU's doubleheader sweep at Boston College on April 16. Sarah Hamilton recorded her school record 940th strikeout and Shayla Jackson won ACC Player of the Week honors in part because she finished 7-for-8 with eight RBIs against the Eagles. Jackson finished 15-for-23 for that entire week and Hamilton finished her entire career with 1,005 K's.
- o Seniors Sarah Hamilton, Ashley Stager, Kristie McConn, Jen Lapicki, Robin Ahrberg and Lauren Varsalona walked off winners on senior day against NCAA regional participant Maryland on April 24. Each player either recorded a base hit or induced an out to contribute to the victory.
- o Jessica Nori improved so much as the season progressed and lifted FSU to a much-needed 9-4 win over nationally-ranked Georgia Tech on May 8. In that game, Nori came in relief and allowed just two hits in the final 4.1 innings to get a big win.
- o Shayla Jackson, Sarah Hamilton and Jen Lapicki all represented FSU on the All-ACC Second Team.





# SEMINOLE SOFTBALL



# 1981 & 1982 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Before the games were televised on ESPN and before there were professional leagues, the main goal of collegiate softball was to go out, give your best and try to win, but mainly the student-athletes were there because they loved the game and they wanted to have fun. For two years in the early 1980's, the Florida State softball team not only had fun, but also dominated the competition and brought home a pair of national championships.

There was plenty of reason for optimism going into the 1981 season after FSU won 13 of its last 15 games the year before and was one game away from advancing to the AIAW National Tournament. Countering the momentum from 1980 was the inexperience of the 1981 roster which featured only six returnees but a host of talented

newcomers.

"It was a lot of fun," former head coach Dr. JoAnne Graf said. "They had known each other from summer league ball so I think there was a lot of respect right away. Anytime you win it's a whole lot of fun. That team was in every game, they won, obviously, most of them, but it's always fun to coach people who win and they worked hard. They just had that confidence, that air that they were going to have to lose the game; no one was going to beat them."

Any concerns about the 1981 season were quickly erased as the Seminoles ran out to a 19-2 start with a trio of tournament titles. The only hiccup during the year came at the South Florida Invitational as FSU lost three of four but that also served as a wake up call as the Seminoles won 16-straight games to push their record to 38-5.

Just when the Seminoles had everything going in their favor, another bump in the road came. Winners of its last 16 games, FSU dropped a pair of games to East Carolina to finish second at the North Carolina State Invitational. But just like the losses at South Florida, the setback refocused the Seminoles when they needed it the most.

Few would have guessed that the 5-2 loss to the Pirates would be the Seminoles' last of the season. FSU took four-straight heading into the FAIAW State Tournament where it breezed to the state title with four more wins to match the most wins in school history. Up next was the AIAW Region III Tournament where the Seminoles took the next step, sweeping four more games to advance to the National Tournament.

Proving its versatility, FSU won every way possible, outscoring Western Carolina 13-9 in the first game before winning a defensive triumph 4-3 over North Carolina State. FSU disposed of the Pirates 12-3 then beat North Carolina 4-1 to capture the school's first national championship in women's athletics.

Postseason accolades came in for Darby Cottle as the shortstop collected All-America honors after hitting .428. Joining her on the All-America squad was second

baseman Jan Sikes as she hit .477.

"Those teams were so full of life, heart, we had great camaraderie," former player Susan Painter said. "It started at the top with JoAnne. We had a great group of players, but she was the main component. She kept us on top and kept fighting for us and for the title. Every great team has a fit and that one certainly did. It was quite a group. We still keep in touch, but I miss that."

The pieces were in place for another run in 1982 and the Seminoles wasted no time as they won their first 12 games, highlighted by the title at the Florida Invitational - including eight shutouts. Ironically the "low point" of the season came at the Lady Seminole Invitational where FSU

lost three in a row.

But just like they had done the previous year, the Seminoles bounced back to win 10-straight, including titles at the Friendly City and South Florida Invitationals. Twice during the middle half of the season the Seminoles scored 30 runs or more, including a 39-5 drubbing of Georgia Southern.

Despite all of FSU's success that year - the Seminoles won four of six regular season tournaments - there was one team it could not get past: rival Florida. Of the 10 losses that season, six came to the Gators, including backto-back losses at the Montgomery Invitational where FSU finished second.

Similar to 1981, the losses refocused the Seminoles as they won their next 12 going into the FAIAW tournament. UF got the Tribe again 2-1 in the third game, but



the Seminoles won a pair to claim the state title. Florida State had relatively little trouble in the regional tournament, only dropping a 2-1 decision to South Florida before

beating the Bulls for the trophy.

The stage was set for a repeat and the Seminoles were on a mission having won 21 of their last 23 games. The first three games were a breeze as FSU outscored its opponents 46-6 with wins over Georgia Southern, South Florida and UNC-Charlotte. All that stood between FSU and its second national championships were the Florida Gators.

While Florida State held an 8-6 lead in the season series, Florida was the only team that had been close to FSU over the last five years and handed the Seminoles their worst loss in school history at the time, a 14-0 defeat during the middle of the season. With the championship on the line the Seminoles were at their best and they prevailed 9-4 to claim their second-straight national championship.

The accolades poured in for the Seminoles again, headed by Cottle who was named the Broderick Award winner as the AIAW Player of the Year. She was joined on the All-America squad by Natalie Drouin, Painter, Toni

Robinette and Sikes.

"We were like a big family, I don't even remember anyone not getting along," Drouin said. "We had two great teams and I don't know which one was better. They were pretty equal. At the time none of us really knew what we had accomplished, we just wanted to do our best and have

fun, but afterwards it was thrilling."

The Seminoles won 110 games those two years with a 54-7 record in 1981 and a 56-10 mark the year after. Florida State was an offensive juggernaut those two seasons, scoring an average of 9.2 runs per game. What might be even more impressive was the Seminoles' pitching and defense. Behind Painter, the team's lone pitcher, FSU gave up only 2.7 runs per game, a number that is unfathomable in slow pitch.

"I remember a lot of team unity and enthusiasm," Cottle said. "We were a group of winners, that's for sure, and we were a team that was willing to do whatever it took to get to the top. I'm just proud to have been part of the

teams that started a tradition of winning."

While the AIAW was disbanded one year later and FSU went to NCAA competition in 1984, the players on those teams were the founders of a legacy that continues today.



# DR. JOANNE GRAF

Dr. JoAnne Graf spent 30 successful seasons at the helm of the Florida State softball program. With 1,437 victories under her belt, Graf retired on June 15, 2008, with more wins than any other head coach in collegiate softball.

The first collegiate softball coach to earn 1,400 victories, Graf's numerous achievements with Florida State softball include AIAW slowpitch national championships in 1981 and 1982, seven trips to the Women's College World Series, with the first coming in 1986 (just four years after FSU went to NCAA fastpitch softball), 21 NCAA Regional appearances and 10 Atlantic Coast Conference titles.

On April 2, 2005, then-Florida State University President Dr. T.K. Wetherell officially renamed the softball stadium "JoAnne Graf Field at the Seminole





Softball Complex," making her among only two active softball coaches with fields named after them.

One of the most prolific coaches in collegiate softball, Graf concluded her career having won 75 percent of her games (1,437-478-6), including a 1,218-425-6 (.740) mark in NCAA Division I play. Her NCAA career win total is currently second all-time. Florida State averaged 50.75 wins per year under her guidance since beginning NCAA play ranked No. 1 all-time.

Graf is a 1975 graduate of Florida State. In 1992, she earned her doctorate degree in athletic administration at FSU, and continues to teach at her alma mater today.




