



PHIL HÁLL: It's probably the best season we've had since '96, so that's 13 years ago. So, yeah, no, things are going very nicely.

JAMES BENNETT: His 2,000 hectare property had only 28 millimeters of rain during September last year. This time a time when that sort of rain would not have been remarkable, but after years of drought it came as a surprise to many, with most climate models predicting Victoria's chances of even average winter and spring rainfall were looking slim.
