NAVY RELEASES NEW ECONOMIC IMPACT REPORT FOR HAMPTON ROADS AREA

Norfolk, Va. – Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic has released the fiscal year 2010 (Oct. 1, 2009 through Sept. 30, 2010) Department of the Navy impact statistical data for the Hampton Roads area.

Total direct economic impact to the region saw a decrease of approximately \$1.4 billion, from \$14.9 billion in fiscal year 2009 to \$13.5 billion in fiscal year 2010. Total annual payroll (military and civilian) remained steady at \$8.2 billion. However, procurement expenditures decreased from approximately \$6.7 billion in FY09 to \$5.3 billion in FY10.

Operationally, the number of ships homeported in Hampton Roads increased from 83 to 84, and the number of aircraft squadrons also increased by one from 35 to 36.

NAVY'S ECONOMIC IMPACT TO HAMPTON ROADS AREA REMAINS STRONG

Norfolk, Va. – Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic has released an update to the fiscal year 2009 (Oct. 1, 2008 through Sept. 30, 2009) Department of the Navy impact statistical data for the Hampton Roads area.

Total direct economic impact to the region saw an increase of \$165 million in fiscal year 2009. Total annual payroll (military and civilian) also saw an increase from \$7.5 billion to \$8.2 billion. However, procurement expenditures decreased from approximately \$7.1 billion in FY08 to \$6.7 billion in FY09.

Operationally, the number of ships homeported in Hampton Roads decreased by one, from 84 to 83 with the decommissioning of the USNS Saturn (T-AFS-10) in April 2009. The number of aircraft squadrons increased by one, from 34 to 35 with the move of Helicopter Mine Counter Measures Squadron FIFTEEN (HM-15) from Naval Air Station Corpus Christi to Naval Station Norfolk, in accordance with the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) recommendations.

NAVY'S ECONOMIC IMPACT TO HAMPTON ROADS AREA RISES

Norfolk, Va. – Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic has released an update to the fiscal year 2008 (Oct. 1, 2007 through Sept. 30, 2008) Department of the Navy impact statistical data for the Hampton Roads area. The previous report released yesterday had a calculation error.

Total direct economic impact to the region rose by more than \$765 million, from approximately \$13.9 billion in fiscal year 2007 to more than \$14.6 billion in fiscal year 2008. Total annual payroll (military and civilian) saw a slight decrease, however FY08 procurement expenditures increased from approximately \$6 billion in FY07 to slightly over \$7.1 billion in FY08.

Operationally, the number of ships homeported in Hampton Roads decreased from 94 to 84. The reduction is the result of the USS George Washington (CVN-73) change of homeport from Norfolk to Japan; one (1) Military Sealift Command (MSC) ship decommissioned, six (6) MSC ships that were homeported in Norfolk and are now part of the prepositioned MSC force and therefore do not have a homeport assignment; and two (2) submarines changing homeports out of area.

NAVY'S ECONOMIC IMPACT TO HAMPTON ROADS AREA RISES

Norfolk, Va. – Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic has released the fiscal year 2007 (Oct. 1, 2006 through Sept. 30, 2007) Department of the Navy impact statistical data for the Hampton Roads area.

Total direct economic impact to the region rose by more than \$1.3 billion, from approximately \$12.6 billion in fiscal year 2006 to almost \$13.6 billion in fiscal year 2007. Total annual payroll (military and civilian) rose by \$604 million.

Navy civilian employment figures for the Hampton Roads area increased by approximately 3,100 people, and the number of active duty military decreased by approximately 3,500.

Operationally, the number of ships homeported in Hampton Roads increased from 93 to 94, and the number of aircraft squadrons remained the same at 34.
