





292. KATE'S SEASON TWO BACKPACK. Primary backpack used by Kate throughout Season Two on the Island. \$200 - \$300

295. Hurley's Season Two Backpack. Primary backpack (brown and tan nylon) used by Hurley throughout Season Two on the Island. \$200 - \$300



293. KATE'S PERSONAL BELONGINGS. Kate's personal belongings including wallet with NM driver's license and one-way bus ticket to Tallahassee, FL with bus route/schedule printouts and insurance papers for her parent's house when she kills her dad seen in the episode, "What Kate Did." \$200 - \$300



294. KATE'S SMITH & WESSON S.W.A.T. POCKET KNIFE. Kate's metal folding Smith & Wesson S.W.A.T. pocket knife from the episode, "Adrift." When Locke and Kate entered the Hatch for the first time, they were held captive by Desmond, who was unaware of the Oceanic crash. Kate uses the pocket knife to free herself from her binds. \$200 - \$300





**296. COLLECTION OF "DRIVE SHAFT" CD CASES.** Collection of "Drive Shaft" CD jewel cases, first and second albums, seen prominently in the episode, "Everybody Hates Hugo." Hurley is seen listening to "Drive Shaft" from a \$2 bargain bin in a local music store. **\$200 – \$300** 








**297.** MR. CLUCK'S CHICKEN SHACK EMPLOYEE NAME TAGS, BUCKETS, CUPS AND OTHER RELATED MATERIAL. Includes numerous employee name tags (3 for "Hugo"), 15+ large fried chicken buckets, new and used paper bags, key fobs and other related items with the familiar Mr. Cluck's chicken head logo. The franchise is owned by Hurley, who worked there when he won the Mega Lotto Jackpot. \$200 - \$300

299. "WALT MISSING" MILK CARTON FROM HURLEY'S DREAM SEQUENCE. Half-gallon empty milk carton featuring a black & white photo of Walt and "MISSING" printed in bold above the image along with Walt's gender, date of birth, weight, height, eye & hair color, and the location that he was last seen: "Middle of nowhere." This milk carton appears in Hurley's dream sequence in which Hurley holds onto the carton while speaking to Jin. \$200 - \$300




**298.** FIVE GARDEN GNOMES HURLEY USED TO SPELL "CLUCK YOU" ON EX-BOSS' LAWN. After quitting his job at Mr. Cluck's Chicken Shack, Hurley drives around the neighborhood stealing garden gnomes to spell out "CLUCK YOU" on his ex-boss, Randy's lawn. Includes three ceramic, one plastic, and one rubber gnome ranging in sizes from 8 in. x 9 in. to 17 in. x 12 in. Seen in the episode, "Everybody Hates Hugo." **\$200 - \$300** 









301. SAWYER'S BOOKS. Collection of books including Greg H. Bilson's, "Lust & Found," Ayn Rand's, "The Fountainhead," and Walker Percy's, "Lancelot," which can be seen in the episodes, "Par Avion" and "Maternity Leave." \$200 -\$300









302. SAWYER'S BACKPACK. Sawyer's olive drab backpack. \$200 - \$300



303. Collection of Sawyer's "Gold Chains" used in con job. Collection of ten (10) gold chains, snapped in a velvet jewelry roll chain, used by Sawyer during one of his con jobs in the episode, "The Long Con." Later, the same con was used by Cassidy in, "Left Behind." \$200 - \$300





**304. PEARL STATION HATCH.** Large octagonal Pearl station hatch door constructed from wood and metal (very heavy) measuring approximately 7 ft. square and 10 in. deep. First seen in the episode, "?" when Locke and Eko discover it. Later used in Season Three episodes, "The Cost of Living" and Exposé." \*Special shipping arrangements will apply. \$200 - \$300



305. Locke's Master Bowie knife with no serrated edge and tape repair on handle. Metal knife being Locke's Master Bowie with no serrated edge and exhibiting green tape repair in two areas on handle. Used by Locke in Seasons One and Two. \$800 - \$1,200




**306.** Various renditions of Locke's blast doors. Map. Originated from the Lockdown incident where Locke saw the map on the blast doors. While trapped under one of the blast doors during the lock-down incident in the Swan station, Locke saw a huge hand-drawn map on the surface of one of the blast doors. Locke later tries to recreate the map by memory in order to locate this mystery station in the episode, "S.O.S." Includes Locke's rough sketch of the map seen in the episode, "?" \$200 - \$300

309. Locke's engagement ring and apartment key. The engagement ring and apartment key in gold gift box that Locke gives Helen. Seen in the episodes, "Orientation" and "Lockdown." \$200 - \$300

307. Locke's Australian "walkabout" book and tour-ISM POSTERS. Locke's "Melbourne Walkabout Tours" brochure and three Australian tourism posters, measuring approx. 25 in. x 37 in. each. These items were seen while Locke was preparing for his Australian walkabout, following the suggestion of mysterious Charles Widmore agent, Matthew Abaddon, which ultimately led him to the Island aboard Oceanic Airlines Flight 815. \$200 - \$300



308. Locke's "Welcome Home" Business materials. Locke's bag containing materials from "Welcome Home," the home inspection company he owned prior to losing his ability to walk. Includes notepads, flashlight, invoice book, manuals and other related items. Seen in the episode, "Lockdown." \$200 - \$300



311. LOCKE'S FOLDING POCKET KNIVES. Three folding metal knives usually seen clipped to Locke's utility vest. Seen throughout the season. \$300 - \$500




312. Locke's Master Bowie knife with split handle and tape repair. Metal knife, Locke's Master Bowie with partial serrated edge with split wooden handle exhibiting repair by green and black tape. Used by Locke in Seasons One and Two. \$800 - \$1,200



313. SAYID'S REPUBLICAN GUARD TORTURE TOOLS AND OTHER IRAQI ITEMS. Sayid'S Iraqi Republican Guard torture tools including gloves, knives, pliers, etc. Accompanied by Iraqi flags, Koran, Iraqi documents and cans of Iraqi cola, seen in the episode, "One of Them." \$200 - \$300

314. DESMOND'S BOOKS FROM THE SWAN STATION LIBRARY. Collection of books from the Swan station library. Includes a copy of Charles Dickens', "Our Mutual Friend," Flann O'Brien's, "The Third Policeman," Henry James', "The Turn of the Screw," and a Bible. Seen throughout Season Two. \$200 - \$300







316. CHARLIE'S ACOUSTIC GUITAR. An Ovation acoustic guitar with Lycrachord body, bowl-shaped back and high pressure laminate neck and top. Charlie can be seen playing this guitar on the Island on several occasions following its discovery in the episode, "House of the Rising Sun." The guitar has one broken string. \$600 - \$800





317. CHARLIE'S PIANO. Charlie's piano was given to him as a Christmas present by his mother when he was a child. It remained with him throughout his time in the band, "Drive Shaft," being used when Charlie was composing new songs. Seen prominently in the episode, "Fire + Water." Missing white veneer on one of the keys and exhibits overall distress from the rigors of shooting. This is untested as a musical instrument. Comes with bench. \* Special shipping arrangements will apply. \$400 - \$600






318. Ben's personal belongings as "Henry Gale." Leather tri-fold wallet belonging to Henry Gale, founder and CEO of Minnesota Metallurgy, and containing Gale's MN driver's license, credit cards, other various cards and cash. Sometime in 2003, before Oceanic Airlines Flight 815, Henry Gale crashes onto the Island via a hot-air balloon and dies of a broken neck. Ben buries Gale in a grave near the balloon crash site and assumes Gale's identity to infiltrate the Survivors' camp site. However, Sayid does not believe Ben and proceeds to dig up Gale's corpse. Sayid finds this wallet and spoils Ben's ruse. Includes Henry Gale's letters to Jennifer and Ben's TSA ID card as "Henry Gale" seen in the episode, "Lockdown." Includes six (6) copies of "The Brothers Karamazov" that Locke gives the captive Ben Linus (as "Henry Gale") to read from the Swan station library and multiple hand-drawn copies of the map Ben drafted to locate for Sayid and Charlie to locate the crashed hot air balloon. \$200 - \$300
















324. Desmond's letters to Penny from Prison. Box full of letters that Desmond wrote to Penny while he was incarcerated at Southway Garrison military prison. These were all intercepted by Charles Widmore before they reached Penelope. Seen in the episode, "Live Together, Die Alone, Part 1." \$200 - \$300



325. Penny's Letter to Desmond. Penny's handwritten letter, as left by Penny for Desmond to find in his hardbound copy of Charles Dickens', "Our Mutual Friend." The letter serves as a source of hope and inspiration for Desmond, who after spending years living in the Swan Station begins to despair. Penny knows that the book holds special significance to Desmond, so she hides her letter in the book, knowing that Desmond will discover it in his deepest moment of despair. It is not until much later that Desmond discovers the letter while in the Swan station when he is contemplating suicide. It is also at this moment of crisis when Locke blows open the Hatch door. The combination of the letter's discovery and Locke's appearance convinces Desmond to reject the idea of taking his own life. \$400 - \$600



326. Desmond's Photograph with Penny at the Marina. A slightly distressed and folded version of Desmond's color photograph of himself and Penny taken in London, with a backdrop screen of the Ala Wai Yacht Harbor in Honolulu. It is this photograph along with Penny's letter that Desmond desperately clutches for inspiration--to survive his ordeals both on and off the Island--and for the hope of one day reuniting with Penny. Penny also has a copy of the same photo. \$300 - \$500



328. Desmond's fail-safe key with "Joe Inman" dog tag. Embossed with the DHARMA Initiative/Swan logo, the fail-safe key is kept by Kelvin Joe Inman until the day of the system failure and the crash of Oceanic Flight 815 when Desmond accidentally kills him and takes the key, which he then hides inside his copy of Charles Dickens', "Our Mutual Friend." After Locke causes another system failure by destroying the computer, Desmond retrieves the key and triggers the fail-safe mechanism, finally terminating the electromagnetic anomaly (and preventing a global catastrophe) and resulting in the destruction of the Swan station. \$600 - \$800





**329. SHANNON'S BAG.** Seen during the flashback sequence in the episode, "Abandoned." Bag includes a pair of ballet shoes, teddy bear, journal, pants and two empty CD cases. \$200 - \$300









**331. ANA LUCIA'S PERSONAL BELONGINGS.** Laminated LAPD ID card and interdepartmental police file for Ana Lucia, who, prior to Oceanic Airlines Flight 815, was a police officer. Also includes a similarly laminated L.A.P.D. ID card for Theresa Cortez (Ana Lucia's mother and police captain), Ana Lucia's TSA badge and name tag, as well as target silhouettes from LAPD shooting range from the episode, "Collision." **\$200 - \$300** 



330. Rose and Bernard's personal belongings. Prop "Breitling" chronograph replica watch with metal band, one diamond ring and three gold wedding bands (one Rose's and two Bernard's) worn throughout the series. \$200 - \$300



332. Eko's Machete, cross Necklace, Personal Belongings and Hollowed-out Bible. Discovered by Eko, the Bible is hollowed-out to store a small 16mm film strip that turns out to be the missing portion from the original Swan station orientation film, in the episode, "What Kate Did." Also includes Eko's prop machete, photograph of Eko and Yemi as children, cross necklace, canteen, passport, Oceanic Flight 815 boarding pass and Nigerian currency seen throughout the season. \$600 - \$800




333. Eko's SIGNATURE STAFF WITH BIBLE SCRIPTURE CARVINGS. Eko's signature prop, nicknamed the "Jesus stick" by Charlie and called a "prayer stick" by Locke. Eko makes his staff from a branch he broke off on the beach, carving into it various Bible scriptures (book, chapter, and sometimes verse), a small cross, and the Numbers. When asked by Claire what he was carving, Eko answers, "Things I need to remember." After Eko's death, Locke retrieves it, intending to use the stick as a marker for Eko's grave. As he is pounding the stick into the ground, he notices an inscription: "Lift up your eyes and look north John 3:05." Locke interprets "305" as a northward compass bearing, which leads John, Kate, and Sayid to the Flame station. \$1,000 - \$1,500



335. LIGHTWEIGHT STUNT VERSION OF EKO'S STICK. Light and hollow stunt version of Eko's stick, nicknamed the "Jesus stick" by Charlie and called a "prayer stick" by Locke. Like the hero staff, this stunt staff also contains carvings of various Bible scriptures. \$600 - \$800

336. PAIR OF ROUSSEAU'S CROSSBOWS, KUKRI KNIFE, BABY DOLL USED TO TRAP JACK AND KATE AND OTHER BELONGINGS. Two identical wooden crossbows (one in cocked configuration) used by Rousseau to shoot Ben (as Henry Gale) in the back in the episode, "One of Them." In the episode, "S.O.S.," Jack and Kate trek through the jungle and Kate sees a doll on the ground, and before Jack can stop her, Kate touches it, springing a trap and they are both pulled from the ground in a net. Includes Rousseau's kukri knife with 12 in. blade (overall length 18 in.), as well as Rousseau's distressed sweater, bag, and two canteens covered with animal skins. \$300 - \$500



337. ROUSSEAU'S DISTRESSED MUSIC BOX. Rousseau's music box is an ornate mechanical musical box with a hinge lid that, when opened, plays the song, "Intermezzo" from Carmen (Georges Bizet, 1875) from the episode, "Solitary." There is a small dancing pair that twirls around in the center. The box is given to Danielle Rousseau by her lover, Robert, Alex's biological father. This music box was studio-distressed to show its age and wear and tear from being on the Island since 1988, exhibiting overall scuffing to the wood and the lid is off the hinge. \$400 - \$600



339. Scope used by Desmond in the Swan station to observe the Hatch tunnel entrance. In the episode, "Man of Science, Man of Faith," Desmond is able to use this improvised security system made up of a scope and series of mirrors to look up the tunnel entrance to the Hatch. Includes a metal scope and security camera. \$200 - \$300

340. Swan station film projector and screen. A Graflex 16mm portable film projector and retractable screen, each with DHARMA Swan station logo, used by Jack and Locke, with Desmond's urging, to view the Swan station DHARMA Initiative film. Comes with one roll of film and a retractable projector screen, measuring 64 in. x 40 in. \$400 - \$600



341. SET OF THREE (3) DHARMA INITIATIVE ORIENTATION FILMS FROM THE SWAN STATION. Set of three (3) DHARMA Initiative orientation films with cans featuring DHARMA Swan station logo. The 16mm films are created for the occupants of the various stations throughout the Island, most of them featuring Pierre Chang under various aliases. They are first introduced when Jack, Locke and Kate enter the Swan station. After the confrontation with Desmond, they are directed to watch a short film narrated by a scientist named Dr. Marvin Candle. It is then that the Survivors initially learn about the existence of the DHARMA Initiative. \$300 - \$500




342. DHARMA INITIATION VIDEOS AND NOTEPADS. Includes Two Orientation U-matic video cassette tapes, two observation study diaries and six notepads from Station 5 - The Pearl which was constructed to observe the Others station and record how the subjects performed actions, which they believe to be of great importance. Each features the DHARMA logo. \$200 - \$300





343. DHARMA INITIATIVE ORIENTATION KIT. DHARMA Initiative orientation kit: three-ring binder full of various CDs, floppy disks and printed materials, complete with subject tabs. \$200 - \$300








**344.** DIGITAL SWAN STATION/HATCH WALL COUNTDOWN CLOCK. This working LED digital countdown clock features glass face display with programming options in the back. Measures 25 in. long and operates on 120v. This is the original counter for the Swan station before it was decided by the production to utilize CGI to create the needed effects. \$200 - \$300



345. Swan station computer. This configuration is an Apple-II Plus system running an Apple-III monitor, with a Disk II floppy drive, each featuring DHARMA logo. This prop computer was used at the Swan station and by Desmond, Locke and other cast members to enter "The Numbers" every 108 minutes. It is the destruction of the Swan station computer that prevented "The Numbers" from being entered, leading Desmond to trigger the fail safe mechanism, causing the Swan station to implode. (Of trivial interest is a 1980s film, entitled "The Self," employed in some psychology classes today, which features an Apple-III computer monitor that is used to test the effect of positive personalities. Incidentally, the numbers 4, 8, 16, and 23 appear frequently in these tests.) The monitor currently exhibits the DHARMA Tempest station logo, indicating its subsequent use in the Season Four episode, "The Other Woman." 1,000 - 1,500



**346. PEARL STATION DOT MATRIX PRINTER AND "SYSTEM FAILURE" LOG PRINTOUT.** Apple ImageWriter II dot matrix printer with "System Failure" log printout, discovered by Locke and Eko inside the Pearl station. The printer is connected to a computer (not included in this lot) that monitors the activity at the Swan station. The printout is a log of the Swan computer operator entering "The Numbers" every 108 minutes. This printout shows the entry "922044:16," followed by "SYSTEM FAILURE," marking the date and time when Desmond failed to push the button and thereby causing the crash of Oceanic Airlines Flight 815 (9=September, 22= day, 04=2004, 4:16). **\$300 - \$500** 







347. Swan station record player. A Technics Quartz D.D. Automatic Turntable SL-Q3 used in the Swan station. First seen in the Season Two premiere episode, "Man of Science, Man of Faith." The episode begins with Desmond getting out of bed and putting on, "Make Your Own Kind of Music," by "Mama" Cass Elliot. It is interrupted when Locke blasts the Hatch door open and knocks the needle off the record. Includes a vinyl record of, "The Original Soundtrack to the Motion Picture FAME." Some scuffing at the front of the machine and a small crack on the top left corner of the plastic case. \$300 - \$500



348. Collection of 40+ records from the Swan Station. 40+ LP albums including The Mama's and Papa's, "Make Your Own Kind of Music," and Patsy Cline's, "Walking After Midnight," among others. Both are prominently heard throughout the show. \$200 - \$300



349. GERONIMO JACKSON LP, CASSETTE AND POSTER. A Geronimo Jackson LP, home-recorded audio cassette handwritten, "G. Jackson" and psychedelic Geronimo Jackson poster measuring 27 in. x 31 ½ in. Seen throughout Season 2. \$200 - \$300





DOLLHOUSE FROM SHANNON'S FATHER'S FUNERAL. the flashback sequence of Shannon's father's funeral in the episode, "Abandoned." Measures 48 in. x 34 in. x 21 in. \$200 - \$300





**351. HUGE ASSORTMENT OF DHARMA-BRANDED FOODS.** Huge cache of DHARMA-branded food. Includes: Granola bars, orange juice, chocolate cream cookies, lasagna, macaroni and cheese, Dharmalars, powdered eggs, cereal, fish crackers, fig bars, potato chips, tuna, tomato sauce, corn, chili, beef broth, ketchup, spinach, peanut butter, A-1 steak sauce, beans, soup, veggies, coffee, vinegar and more. \$400 - \$600





**352. DHARMA-BRANDED PLAYING CARDS USED BY SAWYER & JACK.** Deck of DHARMA-branded playing cards featuring the Swan station logo. Used by Sawyer and Jack while playing poker in the episode, "Lockdown." Two extra DHARMA decks are included, plus a "practice deck" of regular cards with a personal note to actor, Josh Holloway, to "practice shuffling cards for EP. 217." \$200 - \$300



**353. DHARMA** NOTEPADS AND PNEUMATIC TUBE CANISTERS FROM THE PEARL STATION. Collection of DHARMA notepads and plastic pneumatic tube canisters from Station 5 - The Pearl, the underground facility constructed to observe and record the subjects at the Swan station and record how they performed actions they believed to be of great importance. The notepads were then placed in the pneumatic canisters to be sent off for archiving and seen in the episode, "Live Together, Die Alone, Part II." **\$200 - \$300** 

**354.** Six (6) APOLLO CHOCOLATE BARS. Six Apollo chocolate bars, which were one of the many foods that were first found in the pantry within the Swan station by Kate. Several Survivors had scenes involving the Apollo bars, including Locke, Boone, Rose, Ben, Kate and, of course, Hurley. \$200 - \$300





355. COLLECTION OF ANA LUCIA'S WEAPONS AND BOMBER JACKET. Ana Lucia's machete, pocket knife, club, Island-improvised machete, bomber jacket and burlap bags. Seen throughout the season. \$400 - \$600



356. Emma's TEDDY BEAR. Brown Teddy bear belonging to Emma, one of the Survivors from the tail section of Oceanic Airlines Flight 815. Along with her brother, Zach, Emma is one of three children Survivors. On Day 12, Emma and Zach are among the nine "tailies" kidnapped by the Others. The Teddy bear is possibly seen being carried by a young Other when Eko and Jin are searching for Michael. It is also seen in Eko's dream with Ana Lucia. It appears again on Hydra Island, shared once more between Emma and Zach. \$300 - \$500




357. Improvised wooden weapons used by the Tailies. Various crude wooden weapons used by the Tailies. Includes a tomahawk, spears and an unlit torch seen throughout Season Two. \$200 - \$300





**358. SEASON TWO PRODUCTION ARTWORK.** Season Two production art. Includes original pencil sketches and production blueprints (about 50% hand-drawn/50% photocopy) of various sets, vehicles and shoot locations of iconic places like: The interior of the Swan station, statue of Tawaret, "Others" camp, Pearl station, Sawyer's stash, Eko's church, Tailie's beach camp and bunker and much more! 361. Swan station hatch door with the "QUARANTINE" sign following the discharge/implosion. When Locke and Desmond decide not to enter The Numbers and push the button on the Swan station computer, it causes a system failure and the destruction of the station. The blown-off hatch door can be seen in the episode, "Live Together, Die Alone." Constructed of rigid polyfoam and painted to resemble steel. Measures 27 in. wide x 37 in. long. \$1,000 - \$1,500



362. DHARMA INITIATIVE SIGN. Octagonal DHARMA sign constructed of wood and measuring 16 in. square. \$200 - \$300
