## NOLE NOTABLES

- FSU enters the NCAA Tournament as a national seed for the ninth time since 1999. This marks the first time the Noles are the No. 7 seed.
- Florida State is making its 51st appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 36th in a row.
- The Seminoles have advanced to the Super Regionals for the 13th time in 15 years and in six straight seasons - the longest active streak nationally.
- The Seminoles are the all-time leader in NCAA Regional/Super Regional games (220) & wins (149).
- FSU set the school record for hit-by-pitches in a season with 98 surpassing the previous record of 97 set in 2001.
- Luke Weaver was named the NCAA Tallahassee Regional Most Outstanding Player after recording a career-high 14 strikeouts in a career-high 8.0 shutout innings against Troy.
- The Seminoles clinched the ACC Atlantic Division title after taking 2-of-3 from Clemson. It marks FSU's seventh straight Atlantic Division title.
- Florida State is 15-8 in games decided by two runs or less including 7-5 in one-run games and 8-3 in two-run games this year.

## NOTING FSU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

\* This is the 36th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament for the Seminoles and the 51st appearance overall - both stand as the second most all-time.

\* Head Coach Mike Martin has led his team to the NCAA's in each of his 34 years on the bench at Florida State. He has also led FSU to 15 College World Series appearances including three trips in the last five years (2008, 10, 12).

\* Florida State will play in a Super Regional for the 13th time in school history. The Seminoles are 5-7 in series victories during super regional action defeating Auburn (2-0) in 1999, Miami (2-1) in 2000, Wichita State (2-1) in 2008, Vanderbilt (2-1) in 2010 and Stanford (2-0) in 2012.

\* The Seminoles own a record of 4-8 all-time in the opening round of the NCAA Super Regionals. The only opening series victories that FSU has recorded have come against Auburn (1999), Miami (2000), Vanderbilt (2010) & Stanford (2012).

\* FSU is playing in a Super Regional for a nation-best 13th time in 15 years since the best 2-of-3 format began in 1999. The six straight Super Regional appearances is the longest active streak in the nation with South Carolina in second with four and LSU, NC State, Oklahoma and UCLA all tied for third with two straight appearances.

\* The Seminoles have posted a record of 99-35 (.739) while playing at home during NCAA Regional and Super Regional action including a mark of 47-17 in the 21st century.

\* Thirteen of FSU's 21 trips to the College World Series have started in a regional played in its back yard including 2012 when the Seminoles posted a perfect 5-0 record through the first two rounds of the tournament. In 2008, the Seminoles went 6-2 during both regional and super regional competition. FSU advanced to the CWS in 2010 after sweeping through the Norwich, Conn., Regional and then defeating Vanderbilt in the Super Regionals in Tallahassee.

\* Florida State trails only Texas for the most NCAA Tournament appearances. The Longhorns have made 55 appearances all-time to lead the nation followed by FSU with 51.

\* Since the NCAA began selecting 16 host sites in 1999, the home team has won the Regional 169 times in 240 opportunities (70.4%) including 14 of the 16 host sites in 2013.

\* Florida State ranks first all-time in wins in NCAA Regional and Super Regional play with 149, six ahead of Texas who sits second with 143 all-time wins.

\* No team has played more NCAA Tournament games than FSU with 220 in program history.

\* Since the bracket expanded to 64 teams in 1999, the top eight national seeds have advanced to the College World Series 69 times out of 112 opportunities. Seven of the last nine CWS champions have (2004-08, 2010, 2012) been unseeded in the tournament. South Carolina (2011) was the last seeded school to win the title. The four seeded teams to reach Omaha last year were #1 Florida, #2 UCLA, #3 Florida State and #8 South Carolina. In 2013, seven of the eight national seeds advanced to Super Regional action.

\* Florida State enters the 2013 NCAA Tournament as a top eight national seed for the ninth time since 1999. The Seminoles earned the No. 7 national seed this year for the first time in school history. FSU has advanced to the CWS as a national seed in 1999 (#2), 2000 (#6), 2008 (#4) and 2012 (#3). The Seminoles were unseeded when advancing for the CWS in 2010.

\* FSU's all-time national seeds include:

- #1 - 2 (2002 - Super Regionals; 2003 - Super Regionals)
- #2 - 1 (1999 - CWS)
- #3 - 1 (2012 - CWS)
- #4 - 1 (2008 - CWS)
- #5 - 1 (2011 - Super Regionals)
- #6 - 2 (2000 - CWS; 2007 - Regionals)

\* All eight top seeds have never advanced to the CWS. Seven of the eight top seeds have advanced twice in 1999 and 2001. Six national seeds advanced to the CWS in 2011.

\* Florida State has faced 11 schools that were selected to this year's field of 64. The Seminoles posted a 15-14 record claiming five series victories. FSU played four No. 1 seeds - NC State (2-1), Virginia Tech (1-3), Virginia (0-4) and North Carolina (0-1); four No. 2 seeds - Miami (2-1), Georgia Tech (2-2), Clemson (2-1) and South Alabama (1-0); two No. 3 seeds Florida (2-1) and Troy (2-0) and one No. 4 seed Savannah State (1-0).

\* FSU and Indiana will square-off in the Tallahassee Super Regional beginning Saturday at 12 noon marking the first time these two schools will meet in the postseason.

\* FSU last faced Indiana in 2007 during a three-game regular season series in Tallahassee. The Seminoles swept the series outscoring the Hoosiers 23-2.

\* The Hoosiers, champions of the Big Ten, come to Tallahassee winners of four in a row and eight of their last nine. Indiana enters the Super Regional with the sixth best ERA (2.56) in the nation, while the team ranks 21st in hitting with a .306 average.

\* Florida State is no stranger to playing Big Ten schools in the postseason facing five other schools in the past. The Seminoles are 4-3 all-time against the Big Ten in the NCAA Tournament with all three losses coming at the CWS. FSU has faced Illinois (1-0), Michigan (0-1), Minnesota (1-0), Ohio State (2-1) and Penn State (0-1).

## NCAA TOURNAMENT NOTABLES

### FSU IN THE SUPER REGIONALS

- FSU boasts an all-time record of 13-17 (.433) in the Super Regionals including a mark of 12-11 on their home turf.
- The Seminoles are 5-7 all-time in the best-of-three format collecting series victories against Auburn (2-0) in 1999, Miami (2-1) in 2000, Wichita State (2-1) in 2008, Vanderbilt (2-1) in 2010 & Stanford (2-0) in 2012 all at home.
- The 2008 series against Wichita State marked the first time since the Super Regional format began in 1999 that Florida State lost the opening round game to only come back and win the series.
- FSU will host a super regional for the 10th time in 13 all-time appearances since the NCAA Tournament moved to Super Regional play in 1999. The Seminoles have advanced to the CWS as a host of a Super Regional five times (1999, 2000, 2008, 2010 & 2012).

## NCAA TALLAHASSEE REGIONAL NOTABLES

- Florida State went a perfect 3-0 in the 2013 Tallahassee Regional to extend its regional win streak to 19 victories in a row. The Seminoles' last loss in regional play dates back to the opening game of the 2008 Tallahassee Regional as Bucknell defeated FSU 7-0.
- During FSU's 19-game regional win streak, the Seminoles have outscored the competition 230-76 reaching double-digit runs 11 times and winning by nine or more runs eight times, while holding the opposition under six runs over the last 12 games.
- The Seminoles claimed their 29th Regional (or District) title in 51 all-time appearances with last Sunday's 11-4 victory over Troy in Tallahassee.
- FSU allowed just four runs in its three tournament victories for the second straight year tying the mark for the fewest runs allowed in any Seminole postseason tournament (Regional/Super Regional/CWS).
- Florida State posted back-to-back shutout victories in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1970 when the Seminoles shutout Arizona (4-0) and Dartmouth (6-0) in the first two games of the College World Series.
- FSU has registered 15 all-time shutouts in the NCAA Tournament - 11 in regional play and four at the College World Series.
- Florida State registered double digit runs in all three games en route to a sweep of the Tallahassee Regional. It marked the first the 'Noles performed that feat since scoring in double figures in four straight games in 2008.
- Since the inception of Super Regional play in 1999, Florida State has advanced to the regional final every year - a streak that spans 15 years.
- Since 1999, Florida State is 16-4 in the regional championship game and with the victory over Troy became the only school in the nation to advance to the Super Regionals the last six years in a row.

### OPENING NCAA TOURNAMENT PLAY

\* Florida State improved to 40-11 all-time in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament following the Seminoles' 10-0 victory over Savannah State. The Seminoles have won their last five regional openers.

\* Under head coach Mike Martin, FSU is 30-4 in the opening game of a regional. Prior to Martin's arrival, the Seminoles were 10-7.

## NCAA TALLAHASSEE REGIONAL NOTABLES

### WEAVER HONORED AS REGIONAL MOP

- Florida State's Luke Weaver was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2013 Tallahassee Regional after his outstanding performance on the mound against Troy sent the Seminoles to the regional championship game.
- Weaver scattered just four hits over a career-high 8.0 shutout innings en route to striking out a career-high 14 batters. It marked the most strikeouts in a game by a Seminole pitcher since 2006 when Tyler Chambliss struck out 15 against Maryland.
- The sophomore right hander has pitched 7.0 or more innings in six of his last eight starts while striking out at least eight batters in nine of his 14 starts including six in a row. Weaver also did not issue a walk in a start for the fourth this year.

### TALLAHASSEE REGIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

- FSU placed five student-athletes on the Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament team including Jose Brizuela (3B - .400), DJ Stewart (OF - .636), Seth Miller (OF - .500), Luke Weaver (P - 1-0, 0.00 ERA, 14 K) and Scott Sitz (P - 1-0, 0.00 ERA, 8 K).

### STEWART CONTINUES TORRID PACE

- DJ Stewart finished his first taste of the postseason hitting .636 (7-for-11) during FSU's three-game sweep of the Tallahassee Regional.
- Stewart enters the Super Regional against Indiana with a team-best 15 game hitting streak, while reaching base in 25 straight games.
- Over the last eight games, Stewart has reached base in 27 of his last 37 plate appearances, while hitting .621 (18-for-29) with four doubles, one triple and one home run.

### HOME RUNS OF NOTE

- John Nogowski connected on his first home run of the season to lead-off the top of the eighth in the first meeting against Troy. It was his third career home run and first since April 7, 2012 at Georgia Tech.
- Brett Knief's fourth inning grand slam in the regional championship game against Troy marked his first home run as a Seminole and first at the Division I level. Knief's home run broke open a two-run FSU advantage to give the 'Noles a 9-3 lead.
- Stephen McGee connected on a two-run home run in the regional opener against Savannah State - his ninth of the season - to move him in a tie with Marcus Davis for the team lead.

### REGIONAL WRAP-UP

- Florida State concluded the Tallahassee Regional hitting .330 as a team with 13 doubles, two triples and five home runs.
- FSU finished the weekend with the highest slugging % (.632), on-base % (.471) and most doubles (13) hit during regional play. FSU also finished in the top five in batting average (.330 - 5th), run scored (32 - t-2nd), RBI (31 - 2nd), home runs (5 - 2nd), total bases (67 - 4th) and walks (25 - 2nd).
- Florida State's four earned runs and 1.33 ERA over its three-game sweep tied for the third fewest runs allowed and tied for the third lowest ERA in regional play.
- Following regional action, DJ Stewart posted the highest batting average among players that made at least three starts. Stewart hit .636 with seven hits in 11 at-bats as he recorded three doubles, one home run, six runs and five RBI.



## FSU BY THE NUMBERS

- **1** - Brandon Leibrandt's complete game at Virginia was the first by a Seminole pitcher this year and the first since 2011.
- **4** - Florida State placed four student-athletes on the All-ACC first and second teams. The Seminoles have placed at least one member on the first team in 20 straight seasons (1994-2013).
- **5** - A Florida State student-athlete was honored as the ACC Player/Pitcher of the Week five times this year including DJ Stewart who has been named Player of the Week twice.
- **6** - Five former Seminoles are currently on MLB rosters (St. Louis - Randy Choate, Shane Robinson, John Gast; SF Giants - Buster Posey; Boston - Stephen Drew; Miami - Matt Diaz).
- **7** - FSU clinched its seventh straight ACC Atlantic Division title after finishing the 2013 season with a 20-10 league mark.
- **8** - FSU finished the regular season with an RPI of No. 8 released by the NCAA.
- **10** - Senior Seth Miller has a team-high 10 outfield assists on the year with five of those assists coming on outs at the plate. The Seminoles have 17 outfield assists as a team.
- **13** - Brandon Leibrandt has registered a team-best 13 pick-offs in 2013 - the most in a single-season dating back to 1996.
- **14** - Luke Weaver struck out a career-high 14 batters against Troy in the NCAA Regional. It marked the most strikeouts by a Seminole pitcher since Tyler Chambliss' 15 strikeouts in 2005.
- **16** - The Seminoles opened the 2013 campaign winning its first 16 games marking the second best start in school history.
- **20** - FSU reached 20 wins in the ACC for the sixth time since joining the league in 1992.
- **21** - FSU has won 21 straight games when wearing the Sunday gold uniforms.
- **35** - Florida State's starting pitchers have been responsible for 35 of the 47 victories in 2013.
- **36** - FSU is making its 36th consecutive regional appearance - the second longest streak in the nation (behind Miami - 41).
- **40** - The Seminoles reached the 40-win plateau for the 36th year in a row.
- **51** - FSU is making its 51st NCAA Tournament appearance in 2013. The Seminoles join the Texas Longhorns as the only two schools with 50 or more postseason appearances all-time.
- **66** - Florida State has put together 66 consecutive winning seasons - no Seminole baseball team has ever suffered a losing season.
- **98** - Florida State set the school record for hit-by-pitches in a season with 98 this year.
- **145** - The Seminoles have registered an ACC leading 145 doubles on the year - good for an average of 2.34 doubles per game.
- **345** - Florida State once again ranks among the nation's leaders in walks with 345 on the year - good for second in the ACC and third nationally.
- **400** - Mike Martin recorded career win No. 400 in the ACC following FSU's 8-6 victory over Wake Forest (4/27). Martin has the most league wins of any coach in the ACC.

## ALL-AMERICAN MUSTACHE

- Florida State's Scott Sitz was named a third team Louisville Slugger All-American by Collegiate Baseball newspaper for the first time in his career.
- The right hander is in the midst of a career year posting single-season highs for wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
- Sitz has also been named a finalist for the inaugural Gregg Olson Award presented to college baseball's 'Breakout' Player of the Year.

## 10-WIN SEASON

- A pair of Florida State pitchers reached the 10-win plateau following the Seminoles' three-game sweep at the NCAA Tallahassee Regional.
- Scott Sitz and Brandon Leibrandt both recorded their 10th win of the season after beating Savannah State and Troy, respectively.
- The last time FSU had two 10-win pitchers in the same season was 2008 when Matt Fairle (12-2) and Ryan Strauss (10-1) performed the feat.

## 14K PERFORMANCE

- Luke Weaver struck out a career-high 14 batters in Florida State's 11-0 win over Troy in the winner's bracket game of the Tallahassee Regional.
- It marked the most strikeouts in his career and the most by a Seminole pitcher since Tyler Chambliss struck out 15 against Maryland on March 11, 2006.
- Weaver became just the second pitcher to record 10 or more strikeouts in a game this year joining Brandon Leibrandt who struck out 10 against Duke back on April 13.

## DJ'S LATE SEASON PUSH

- Freshman DJ Stewart's late season offensive surge as seen the Seminole outfielder climb into the ACC's top 10 in several offensive categories.
- Stewart currently sits fourth in the league in hitting with a .363 average.
- He also ranks second in doubles (25), fifth in on-base percentage (.467), sixth in slugging percentage (.578), tied for eighth in RBI (56) and 10th in total bases with 122.
- Stewart was recently honored as a Louisville Slugger Freshmen All-American.

## STEWART HONORED AT ACC TOURNAMENT

- Freshman DJ Stewart swung a hot bat during the ACC Tournament in Durham finishing the three-game span hitting .667 (8-for-12) with a double, triple and three runs scored.
- Stewart opened the tournament against Georgia Tech going 3-for-3 as he was a home run shy of hitting for the cycle.
- He reached base in seven of his first eight plate appearances and finished the tournament recording multiple hits in all three games.
- For his efforts, Stewart was named to the ACC All-Tournament team.

## DIVISIONAL CROWN

- For the seventh year in a row, Florida State finished atop the ACC Atlantic Division claiming at least a share of the division title.
- Since the move to divisional play in 2006, FSU has captured at least a share of the division title in seven of the eight years.
- Florida State has won the division title outright six times (2007-09, 2011-13), while sharing the title with Clemson in 2010.

- The Seminoles finished the 2013 season at 20-10 reaching 20 wins in league play for the sixth time since joining the ACC in 1992.
- FSU tied a league record for victories in ACC play after going 24-6 in 2012.
- The 2012 Seminoles joined the 2006 Clemson Tigers and 2008 Florida State Seminoles for the most wins in league history.
- FSU is the only school in the league to register 24 wins in ACC play on multiple occasions.

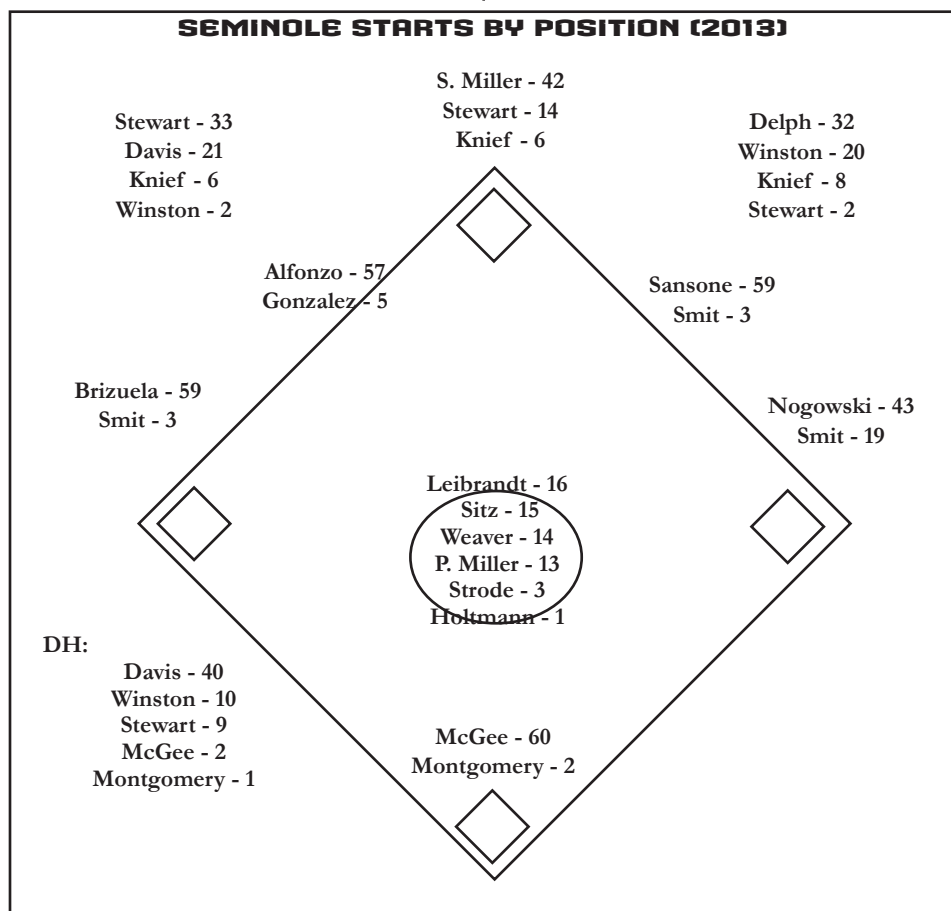
## 66 & COUNTING

- Florida State first fielded an intercollegiate baseball program in 1948.
- Since that very first team took the field, no Seminole baseball team has ever posted a losing record.
- The streak of consecutive winning seasons improved to 66 years in row following FSU's victory over South Alabama on Tuesday April 16.

## STARTERS ROLLING

- FSU continues to receive outstanding performances from its starting pitching including the quartet of Peter Miller, Luke Weaver, Brandon Leibrandt and Scott Sitz.
- These starter have allowed just 31 runs, 30 earned, in 131.0 innings of work holding the opposition to 121 hits and 26 walks while striking out 134.
- FSU's starting pitcher ERA during this past 22-game stretch is 2.06 (this includes a 2.0 inning controlled start by Bryant Holtmann).
- Seminole pitchers have worked 7.0 innings in

12 of those 22 starts with Weaver working at least 7.0 innings and striking out nine in five of his last six starts.

- Weaver, Leibrandt & Sitz all picked up wins during the Tallahassee Regional marking the sixth time that all three pitchers in the weekend rotation earned a win.
- All of this coming one week after all three starting pitchers did not factor into the decision at the ACC Tournament in Durham.
- Seminole starters have gone 16-2 during the current 22-game stretch.

#### **WEAVER RACKING UP THE K'S**

- With a nine strikeout performance against Virginia Tech at the ACC Tournament in Durham, Luke Weaver reached the 100-strikeout plateau for the season.
- The sophomore right hander is one of four pitchers in the ACC with 100 strikeouts on the year as his total sits as the third most in 2013.
- Weaver set a career-high in strikeouts with 14 against Troy in a winner's bracket game at the 2013 NCAA Tallahassee Regional.
- He has recorded at least nine strikeouts in a game seven times this year including in five of his last six starts.
- The Deland, Fla., product is the seventh Seminole since 2003 to record 100 strikeouts in a season:
  - Sean Gilmartin (2011) ..... 130
  - Bryan Henry (2007) & Tyler Chambliss (2006) ... 117
  - **Luke Weaver (2013)** ..... **114**
  - Trent Peterson (2003) ..... 113

#### **PITCHING UNDER MARTIN**

- Heading into the ACC Tournament, the 2013 Seminole pitching staff is making a push to become one of the best throwing units Florida State has seen since Mike Martin became head coach in 1980.
- FSU's 2.73 ERA currently sits as the second lowest in the Martin era, one point higher than the current record of 2.72 set in 1995.
- In his 34 years of serving as head coach at Florida State, Martin has had three previous pitching

staffs finish a season with an ERA below 3.00.

#### **SHUTOUTS ON THE YEAR**

- Florida State registered its sixth and seventh shutouts of the season during the NCAA Tallahassee Regional blanking Savannah State (10-0) and Troy (11-0) in back-to-back games.
- FSU has posted shutouts against USF, Villanova, Boston College, South Alabama, Jacksonville, Savannah State and Troy in 2013.
- The Seminoles also recorded seven shutouts in 2012, the most since equaling that total in 2006.

### **2013 ACC PRESEASON POLL**

If the Florida State baseball team wants to capture their seventh consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference Atlantic Division title in 2013 they will have to do so as the underdog for the second time in as many years. In 2013, the Seminoles are tabbed to finish second in the ACC Atlantic Division as voted on by the league's 12 head coaches.

Florida State tallied 60 total points and received one first-place vote to win the Atlantic Division. NC State received the nod as the favorite to win the division with 69 total points and 10 first-place votes. Since the league moved to divisional play in 2006, Florida State has either won the title outright or claimed a share of the top spot the last six years (2007-12).

**MARTIN MOVING UP THE CHARTS**

- Head coach Mike Martin became the ACC's all-time leader for conference wins following FSU's 6-1 victory over Miami back on April 21, 2012.
- Martin surpassed Clemson's Bill Wilhelm, who established the record with 378 victories after he retired in 1993, on the all-time list. Martin currently sits with an all-time record of 405-165 against league foes.
- Martin needs one win in ACC Tournament play to tie Wilhelm for the league record (64) and is 57 wins shy of tying Clemson's Hall of Fame coach (1,161) for the most overall wins by a coach as a member of the ACC.
- Since joining the league in 1992, Martin has posted an overall record of 1104-391-1 (.738).
- Martin is already the league's all-time winningest coach in terms of NCAA Tournament victories with 98 since 1992.

**PICKIN' PARTY**

- Brandon Leibrandt added to his season pick-off total against Troy during the NCAA Tournament recording one at first base in the top of the first inning.
- Leibrandt now has 13 pick-offs on the year - the most in a single-season dating to 1996.

- The sophomore southpaw's 17 career pick-offs are the most by a Seminole pitcher dating back to 1996. Tony Richie, who caught for two seasons (2002-03), tallied 14 career pick-offs.

- Seth Miller came through with two of the biggest outfield assists of the season in game two of a doubleheader against Georgia Tech.
- The senior centerfielder threw out not one, but two Yellow Jacket runners at the plate in back-to-back innings to help FSU to an 11-3 victory.
- Miller picked up two more assists in the series win at Miami and then one more on an inning ending double play on a fly out in the seventh inning of game one against Wake Forest.
- He added to his team leading total with another one in the winner's bracket game of the NCAA

- Miller has 10 outfield assists in 2013 and 13 for his career.
- Five of his assists this year have been outs at the plate, four have been direct throws to home and three have resulted in double plays.
- Miller has posted a perfect fielding percent on the year converting on all 108 chances in 60 games.
- As a team, FSU has tallied 17 outfield assists in 2013. DJ Stewart is second on the team with three followed by Jameis Winston with two. Marcus Davis and Josh Delph each have one.
- Seth Miller's 10 outfield assists are the third most nationally behind Missouri's Dane Opel (15) and Saint Louis's Michael Bozarth (12). Miller also leads the ACC with Duke's Jeff Kremer and Clemson's Steven Duggar in second with 9.

#### STELLAR PITCHING PERFORMANCE

- A big reason for FSU's spectacular season and a seventh straight ACC Atlantic Division title is due in large part to the success of the Seminole pitching staff through 62 games.
- FSU enters Super Regional play ranked 10th nationally in ERA, 19th in strikeout-to-walk ratio, 20th in strikeouts per nine innings, 27th in hits allowed per nine innings and 29th in WHIP.
- Of the 14 pitchers who have seen action this year, seven have an ERA below 3.00 including three pitchers with at least three starts.
- FSU's starting pitchers are 35-9 with a 2.58 ERA this year allowing 98 earned runs in 341.1 innings of work with 321 strikeouts. The starters have allowed 319 hits and only 91 walks.
- In terms of turning in a quality start, Seminole starters have gone at least 5.0 innings in 46 of the 62 games. Sophomore Luke Weaver has pitched at least 6.0 innings in 12 of his 14 starts in 2013. Brandon Leibrandt has worked 8.0 innings in a start three times this year, while Scott Sitz has performed the feat twice.
- Leibrandt is the first pitcher to reach double-digits in strikeouts when he fanned 10 against Duke in game one of a doubleheader on April 13 and the first to record a complete game.

• Weaver struck out a season-best 14 batters in the winner's bracket game against Troy in the 2013 NCAA Tallahassee Regional.

#### WEAVER MAKES FRIDAY NIGHT DEBUT

- Luke Weaver made his debut as the Seminoles' Friday night pitcher when Florida State visited Miami on April 5.
- It marked the first pitcher other than Brandon Leibrandt to start a Friday night game since Sean Gilmartin held the spot for the entire 2011 season.
- Leibrandt had served in the Friday night role since opening day last year - a span of 21 straight starts.
- Weaver did not factor into the decision against the Hurricanes working 5.0 innings allowing two runs on eight hits as he walked one and struck out six. All eight hits he allowed came on two outs.
- He picked up his first win as a Friday night starter against Duke (April 12) as he allowed a run on six hits in 7.0 innings with six strikeouts.
- Weaver made his return to the weekend rotation for the first time since May 14, 2012 when the right hander went 4.0 innings in a start at Clemson.
- The DeLand, Fla., product is 4-2 with a 2.71 ERA (20 ER in 66.1 IP) in 11 career weekend starts.

#### SUNSHINE STATE SUCCESS

- FSU wrapped up its regular season schedule against schools from the state of Florida with a two-game mid-week series in DeLand (May 7-8).
- FSU posted series victories over all seven schools they faced (Jacksonville, Miami, FGCU, UF, USF, UCF & Stetson). The Noles finished the regular season 17-2 against schools from the Sunshine State this year.
- Dating back to the start of the 2011 season, FSU is 41-11 against its in-state rivals.
- FSU finished the 2012 regular season with a record of 12-6 against Florida schools posting series victories over FIU, UCF, Miami, Jacksonville and Stetson.

- Senior Justin Gonzalez, who will miss the rest of the 2013 with a hip injury, registered a hit in FSU's first five games to open the 2013 campaign.
- For his efforts, Gonzalez extended his hitting streak, which dates back to the end of the 2012 season, to a career-high 10 games.
- The Miami, Fla., native also extended his streak of reaching base in consecutive games to 12.
- DJ Stewart had the longest hitting streak this year at 11 games until Marcus Davis tied that mark with a single at North Carolina on May 20. Stewart is once again the clubhouse leader with the longest active hitting streak at 15 games.
- John Nogowski held the longest active streak of reaching base at 26 games this year followed by Stephen McGee at 22 games earlier this year. Stewart enters the Super Regional having reached base in a season-high 25 straight games.
- Freshman John Sansone had reached base in every game to start the season until the series finale against Boston College ending his streak at 14 straight games.

#### WALK IT OUT

- Florida State drew 27 walks during its opening weekend series against Rhode Island - two more than they drew against Hofstra in a three-game series to open the 2012 campaign.
- Through 62 games, the Seminoles have drawn 345 walks. A mark that is four shy of North Carolina for the most in the ACC (349).
- Stephen McGee leads the team with 55 walks, followed by DJ Stewart, Josh Delph, Jose Brizuela and John Sansone with 36, 33, 32 and 31, respectively. McGee ranks third in walks in the ACC.
- Brizuela, McGee and Delph have all drawn four walks in a game this year. McGee tied a career-high with four walks in game two against URI,

while Brizuela drew a career-high four walks in the opening game against USF. Delph's first career four-walk game came in game one against Boston College.

- FSU finished the 2012 campaign as the national leader in walks with 386, while three Seminoles ranked in the top five nationally - Sherman Johnson (1st - 69), James Ramsey (3rd - 63) and Stephen McGee (5th - 61).
- McGee currently ranks fifth nationally in walks with 55 and eighth in walks per game (0.89).
- FSU led the nation in base-on-balls the last three years and in four of the last five seasons (2008 - 435; 2010 - 402; 2011 - 381; 2012 - 386).
- In 2009, FSU finished second nationally in walks with 386.
- Florida State has drawn 1990 walks the last five years (2008-12), good for an average of over 398 walks a year.
- The Seminoles enter the Super Regional round ranked third nationally in walks trailing Central Arkansas (363) and North Carolina (349).

#### OUCH! THAT HURTS

- Speaking of picking up where they left off, FSU registered nine hit-by-pitches following its three-game series sweep of Rhode Island.
- The Rams were not afraid to pitch inside last year either as Seminole batters were hit 11 times including a season-high six times in game two.
- As a team, FSU has been hit by a pitch 98 times through 62 games, good for an average of 1.58 HBP per game
- The 98 HBP is a school record eclipsing the previous mark of 97 set in 66 games in 2001.
- The 98 HBP leads the ACC and ranks eighth nationally.
- Fifteen different Seminoles have been hit by at least one pitch this year. That leaves just two players on the current 2013 roster, with at least one at-bat, who have not been hit by a pitch.
- The 'Noles reached base a total of 96 times via a hit-by-pitch in 67 games in 2012 - a mark that ranked second in the ACC behind UVA (98). Last year, FSU averaged 1.4 HBP a game.
- Five Seminoles were hit by a pitch at least nine times last year. Stephen McGee led all Seminoles with 16 followed by Stephen Spradling with 12. Justin Gonzalez and Seth Miller each had 11 and James Ramsey was hit nine times.
- McGee's 16 HBPs ranked as the fourth most in a single-season in school history.
- Ten Seminoles have been hit at least five times in 2013 led by John Sansone with 13. Josh Delph, Stephen McGee and John Nogowski all have been hit 10 times. Seth Miller has been hit nine times, Giovanni Alfonzo and DJ Stewart with eight each, Brett Knief and Marcus Davis with six each and Jameis Winston with five.

#### DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Through the years, FSU has been a consistent doubles hitting machine due in large part to the field configurations inside Dick Howser Stadium.
- The Noles have been so consistent that they

normally rank among the nation's leaders in doubles and doubles per game on an annual basis.

- Dating back to the 2008 season, FSU has ranked in the top five in doubles four times including 2011 when FSU led the nation with 152.
- Since 2002, the Seminoles have ranked in the top 15 in doubles per game six times including second with 2.77 in 2007.
- This year FSU has posted 145 doubles good for a per game average of 2.34.
- The Seminoles hit 13 doubles during NCAA Regional play to lead all teams.
- Florida State enters the Super Regionals ranked third nationally in doubles and sixth in doubles per game.
- Dating back to the start of the 2011 season, FSU leads all schools in doubles with 436, followed by Troy (416) and NC State (394).

#### HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- Florida State wrapped up the regular season with a home record of 32-3.
- The Seminoles added to their win total at home with three more victories following the NCAA Regionals to move their record to 35-3.
- By winning the final two games of the Clemson series, the Seminoles secured their 10th consecutive series win at home against ACC opponents.
- The last conference series loss at home came at the hands of the Tigers in 2011.
- FSU has reached the 30-win plateau at home 28 times since Mike Martin became head coach in 1980 including 11 times since 1999.
- The most home wins in the Martin era came in 1986 when FSU finished the season 45-4.
- In the NCAA Tournament, FSU is 99-35 at home including eight straight wins and 16 straight regional wins inside the friendly confines of Dick Howser Stadium.

#### FSU BASEBALL - AMONG THE ELITE

- Success is synonymous with Florida State Baseball as the program enters its 66th year of existence in 2013.
- In 18 of the last 22 seasons, the Seminoles have claimed the ACC regular season title or finished with the best record in the league, won the ACC Tournament title or advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
- All of this is pretty impressive for a school that has the most wins and the highest winning percentage in Division I since 2000 and the second highest winning percentage all-time in Division I history.
- On top of all that, the most impressive stat is the fact that Florida State baseball has never endured a losing season in 66 years.

#### SIZZLIN' SITZ

- Even though his consecutive scoreless innings streak came to an end this year in his fourth start against Boston College, Scott Sitz is still having a fantastic 2013 campaign as the senior right hander is 10-1 with a 1.59 ERA.
- Sitz has allowed 16 earned runs in 90.1 innings of work with 75 strikeouts in 15 starts.
- He is tied for third in the ACC in wins, while his ERA is the second lowest in the league.
- Opponents are hitting .251 through 15 starts as 21 of the 86 hits he has allowed have gone for extra bases.
- The Jacksonville Beach, Fla., tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings in a win over USF and then tied a career-high with nine strikeouts in his next start against Villanova.
- Sitz saw his consecutive scoreless innings streak, which dated back to last year's start against UCLA in the College World Series, come to a close at 22.0 innings after BC scored two unearned runs in the third inning.
- Over his last 17 starts, Sitz has allowed 18 earned runs in 101.1 innings (1.60 ERA).
- With a win at Miami on April 7, Sitz set a career-high for victories in a season surpassing his previous high of five set during his freshman year in 2010.
- Sitz currently ranks in the top 40 nationally in victories (t-24th) and ERA (16th).

#### A WIN SEVEN DAYS A WEEK

- Senior Scott Sitz has a chance to perform a rare feat by a starting pitcher before his time in the Garnet & Gold comes to an end.
- Sitz is one "day" shy of claiming at least one career victory on each day of the week. He needed a Monday night victory and got one at NC State on May 13 in leading FSU to an 8-4 victory.
- Thursday is the only day of the week in which Sitz has not earned a win.
- Of Sitz' 23 career victories, 20 have come as a starter and Sunday's have been his most victorious day to pitch as he has six career wins.
- Tuesday & Saturday are second with four each, followed by Wednesday with three, two on Friday and one on Monday.
- Of the 10 wins by Sitz in 2013, two have been on Friday, four on Saturday, three on Sunday and one more on Monday.

#### CG FOR LEIBRANDT

- Brandon Leibrandt became the first Seminole starter in two years to throw a complete game when the sophomore southpaw went the distance in a 2-0 loss at Virginia.
- The complete game was the first of Leibrandt's career, while the 8.0 innings tied a career-high.
- Leibrandt has now worked 8.0 innings in a start three times in his career (vs. Samford, BC, UVa).
- The last Seminole to throw a complete game was Sean Gilmartin at Virginia Tech on April 15, 2011 in a game FSU lost 2-1.

### SUNDAY GOLD

- There is just something about those Sunday gold uniforms.
- At 9-0 in 2013, FSU has now won 21 straight games when wearing the gold uniforms.
- FSU kept the streak alive thanks in large part to a dramatic come-from-behind, walk-off win in 10 innings over Rhode Island during the opening weekend series.
- And then a nice come-from-behind victory over Georgia Tech which saw the Seminoles erase an early five-run deficit by scoring six runs over the last three innings with the go ahead hit coming in the eighth off the bat of DJ Stewart.
- The streak continues to live following a dramatic three-run ninth inning against UCF (5/5) as Stephen McGee registered a walk-off single to straight away center to give FSU the 5-4 win.
- The streak dates back to the start of the 2012 season as the Seminoles posted a perfect 12-0 record when donning the gold uniforms.
- One of those wins included a rare Sunday road game. But that exception was made in Omaha as the Seminoles sported the gold jerseys in a 12-2 victory over Stony Brook in an elimination game at the College World Series.
- FSU's last five walk-off victories have occurred with the Seminoles wearing the gold uniforms.
- Dating back to the start of the 2009 season, FSU is 45-3 when donning the gold uniforms. The Seminoles were perfect in 2010 (10-0) & 2012 (12-0). - see chart on page 11

### WALK-OFF FASHION

- DJ Stewart connected on a two-run, walk-off home run in the bottom of the 10th inning of the series finale to give FSU an 8-6 victory over Rhode Island and the series sweep.
- It marked the second straight year that FSU needed a walk-off hit to beat the Rams as Jayce Boyd provided the game-winning heroics in 2012 delivering a two-out, two-run double off the screen in right center to give the Seminoles the 6-5 victory.
- Boyd's game-winning hit was the last walk-off hit by the Seminoles before Stewart's dramatic at-bat against Rhode Island.
- The last walk-off victory that resulted in a home run was Mike McGee's solo home run in the bottom of the ninth against Vanderbilt in game one of the Tallahassee Super Regional on June 11, 2010.
- Stephen McGee registered FSU's second walk-off hit of the season as he connected on an RBI single to straight away center with the one out and the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth against UCF (5/5).
- It marked the first career walk-off hit by Stephen and the fifth by the McGee brothers. Mike had four walk-off hits in his four-year career.
- The last five walk-off victories for FSU dating back to the 2011 season have all come on Sunday with the Seminoles wearing their gold uniforms.
- See the chart on page 12 for a list of FSU's walk-off hits dating back to the start of the 2003 season.

### DIVISIONAL CONFERENCE BREAKDOWN

- Since the ACC adopted divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have posted a league record of 161-73 (.688) and have captured at least a share of seven straight Atlantic Division titles.
- Now in its eighth season of playing in divisions, FSU has posted a record of 86-32 against teams in the Atlantic Division including a mark of 45-14 at home and 41-18 on the road.
- Against Coastal Division teams, the Noles are 75-41 overall, 42-17 at home and 33-24 on the road.
- In the seven seasons (2007-13) that FSU has won the divisional crown, the Seminoles are averaging over 20 wins in the ACC. This includes a school record 24 wins in league action in 2008 & 2012 which ties for the most league wins with Clemson, who performed the feat in 2006.

### ACC SERIES VICTORIES

- A big reason for FSU capturing its seventh straight Atlantic Division title is the Seminoles ability to win a series in the league.
- FSU concluded the 2013 regular season claiming eight of 10 series taking 2-of-3 from Maryland, Georgia Tech, Miami, NC State and Clemson, while sweeping Boston College, Duke and Wake Forest. The two series losses have both come in the state of Virginia against the Hokies and the Cavaliers.
- Dating back to the start of the 2011 season, FSU has won 24 of 30 league series including nine of 10 last year.
- The Seminoles have been even better at home in the ACC winning their last 10 league series including a 5-0 mark in 2013 (Duke, BC, GT, WF and Clemson).
- The last time FSU lost an ACC series at home was May 19-21, 2011 against Clemson when the Tigers took games 2 & 3 (7-4 & 8-5).

### WHAT A START

- What a start to the 2013 season for the Florida State baseball team! The Seminoles ran out to a 16-0 record to open the year marking the second best start in school.
- For the fourth time in the last seven years and for the seventh time overall, FSU has started a season with at least 12 straight victories.
- The Seminoles outscored the opposition 138-43 during the 16-game winning streak.
- Since Mike Martin took over as head coach in 1980, FSU has opened the season winning its first 12 games five times.
- In 2007, FSU set the school record for the best start in school history winning its first 23 games.
- Here is a look at FSU's best starts all-time:
  - **2007:** 23-0
  - **2013:** 16-0
  - **1975:** 15-0
  - **2010:** 13-0
  - **1972, 1985, 2008:** 12-0
- Florida State went 23-2 through the first 25 games marking the Seminoles best start since 2007 when FSU opened the year 24-1.

- The Seminoles have opened a season winning at least 23 of their first 25 games nine times in the program's 66-year history including six times under head coach Mike Martin.
- FSU's best 25-game start happened twice in school history, all under a different coach, with the Seminoles going 24-1 in 1968 (Fred Hatfield) and 2007 (Martin).

### SEMINOLE GRAND SLAMS

- After hitting seven grand slams as a team a season ago, Florida State has registered four in 2013 as Jose Brizuela hit one on opening day against Rhode Island, DJ Stewart connected on his first career slam in game two of a doubleheader against Georgia Tech, Stephen McGee added his first career slam to propel FSU past Florida Gulf Coast and Brett Knief unloaded on one against Troy in the NCAA Regional championship game for his first home run as a Seminole and first home run at the Division I level.
- Brizuela connected on a sixth inning grand slam, the second of his career, to give FSU a commanding 11-4 lead.
- The home run was the third of his career and second round tripper hit on opening day.
- Stewart gave the Noles a commanding lead in the fifth inning taking a 2-0 pitch from GT's Alex Cruz over the screen in right center for his first career slam.
- McGee went deep to cap FSU's five-run sixth inning which gave the Seminoles the lead for good en route to a 12-9 victory over FGCU.
- Knief broke open a two-run lead for the Seminoles in the Tallahassee Regional blasting his slam off the scoreboard in left against the Trojans to give FSU a commanding 9-3 lead.
- Seth Miller led the Seminoles with three grand slams in 2012.

### CONSECUTIVE HITS

- Giovanni Alfonzo and Jose Brizuela put together consecutive hit streaks of seven and six respectively, in as many at-bats this year.
- Alfonzo's came over a three-game span to end the month of March as all seven hits were singles.
- Alfonzo registered the game-winning hit in the bottom of the eighth inning against Florida in Jacksonville, went 3-for-3 in the first game against Virginia Tech and then added hits in his first three AB's in game 1 of a doubleheader against the Hokies.
- It marked the longest streak by a Seminole since 2009 when Tyler Holt registered a hit in six straight at-bats against Auburn. Against the Tigers, Holt recorded three singles and three doubles.
- Brizuela had six straight hits over two games against Duke with four singles, a double and a home run.
- Alfonzo finished three shy of the school record held by Brian Cox, who established the mark with 10 consecutive hits during the 1998 Tallahassee Regional (May 21-23).

## **6 RBI FOR STEWART**

- Freshman DJ Stewart drove in a career-high six runs in game two of a doubleheader in leading FSU to an 11-3 victory over Georgia Tech.
- Four RBI came in the fifth when Stewart connected on his first career grand slam to break open what was a 3-0 lead for FSU.
- It marked the most RBI by a Seminole this year and the most since Devon Travis drove in six against Stanford in the NCAA Super Regional back on June 8, 2012.
- Stewart has registered FSU's two largest RBI games following his 6-RBI performance by driving in five in front of the hometown crowd in a 9-0 victory at Jacksonville on April 23.

## **GIO MAKES STATEMENT**

- Giovanni Alfonzo got his first taste of the Florida State/Miami rivalry during the Seminoles' dramatic walk-off victory in Tallahassee a season ago.
- Alfonzo replaced the injured Justin Gonzalez in the top of the second of that game at shortstop and played a flawless game converting on all six fielding opportunities.
- The Port St. Lucie, Fla., native sparked the victory by leading off the 10th inning with a single to right center off E.J. Encinosa for his first collegiate hit. Alfonzo moved into scoring position after swiping his first career stolen base and then scored on Sherman Johnson's walk-off single.
- This year Alfonzo registered the game-winning RBIs against Florida twice and in game one of a three-game series against Miami.
- Alfonzo's game-winning heroics include:
  - Two-run single to RF top 4th to give FSU a 3-0 lead in Gainesville en route to a 401 win over UF.
  - Broke a 1-1 tie against the Gators in Jacksonville legging out an infield single to short with two outs in the bottom eighth.
  - Gave FSU its first lead of the evening at Miami with an RBI double down the line in right to break a 2-2 tie in the top of the ninth inning.

## **FSU TAKES GAME 1 FROM UF**

- Florida State passed its first road test of the season on Tuesday, March 12 defeating Florida 4-1 inside McKethan Stadium.
- The win snapped a three-game losing streak to the Gators, while it marked the Seminoles first win in Gainesville since 2007.
- FSU out-hit UF 7-5 as only one of the five hits registered by the Gators left the infield.
- Luke Weaver earned his first career win over the Gators as he held UF to just three hits and an unearned run in 6.1 innings of work.
- Giovanni Alfonzo paced the offense with two hits and two RBI.

## **NOLES TAKE SEASON SERIES FROM GATORS**

- Thanks to a 2-1 victory over Florida at the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville on March 26, FSU clinched the season series from its intra-state rival.
- The Seminoles have won the season series

from the Gators in four of the last six seasons.

- FSU improved to 5-2 all-time against Florida in Jacksonville.
- The three combined runs scored by both teams in Jacksonville were the fewest runs put up by both teams since a 2-1 victory by FSU in Tallahassee back on March 10, 1995.
- Luke Weaver was once again outstanding on the mound holding the Gators to just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings. He tied a career-high with nine strikeouts despite not factoring into the decision.
- Gio Alfonzo has three hits in the series, all singles, and has driven in three of FSU's six runs.
- On Tuesday in Tallahassee, the Seminoles will look to sweep the regular-season series from the Gators for the first time since winning both meetings in 2002 (W, 5-4 & 9-4).

## **ONE-HIT SHUTOUT**

- FSU opened ACC play in fine fashion as sophomore southpaw Brandon Leibrandt worked 8.0 shutout innings of one-hit baseball as the Seminoles defeated the Eagles 4-0.
- Leibrandt carried a no-hitter into the eighth and with one out BC's John Hennessy broke up the bid with a single through the left side for the only Eagle hit of the evening.
- Robby Coles worked the ninth to close out the game as the combined one-hitter was the first for the Seminoles since March 8, 2010 when Mike McGee, Tyler Everett and Daniel Bennett one-hit the Jacksonville Dolphins in Jacksonville.
- In the game against JU, the Seminoles took a no-hitter into the ninth inning when Alex Martinez led off the bottom of the inning with a single up the middle.

## **GOING YARD FOR THE FIRST TIME**

- Over a span of less than 24 hours during FSU's mid-week match-up against Presbyterian, a pair of Seminoles went yard for the first time in their collegiate careers.
- Stephen McGee launched his first career home run in the fifth inning of FSU's 9-2 victory over the Blue Hose. The junior catcher connected on a 2-2 pitch off the scoreboard in left for a two-run home run.
- In game two against PC, Josh Delph would leave the yard for the first time lofting a 1-0 delivery over the screen in right. The home run by Delph was also a two-run shot.
- The home run came on McGee's 368th career plate appearance, while Delph's came on his 199th career plate appearance.

## **MAKING THE CONNECTION**

- If you're a movie buff and can't get enough 'Six Degrees of Kevin Bacon,' then you're going to love a little 'Six Degrees of Seminole Baseball.'
- So I know you're asking yourself what's the FSU baseball connection between Friday's opening day starter Brandon Leibrandt and his dad, former major leaguer, Charlie Leibrandt...
- No, Charlie did not go to school at Florida

State, but he was managed by former FSU head coach Dick Howser for three years with the Kansas City Royals (1985-86). In fact, Charlie was in the starting rotation the year the Royals defeated the St. Louis Cardinals to capture the 1985 World Series Championship.

- The rest of the connection is pretty easy. Howser was head coach at FSU in 1979 before leaving to take the managerial job with the New York Yankees in 1980. One of Howser's assistants in 1979 was Mike Martin, who succeeded Howser as head coach at FSU. And of course Martin enters his second season coaching Brandon. So there is your 'Six Degrees of Seminole Baseball' or perhaps it should be 'Four Degrees.'

## **GOING YARD ON OPENING DAY**

- Florida State hit two home runs on opening day against Rhode Island courtesy of one each by junior college transfer Marcus Davis and sophomore Jose Brizuela.
- Davis went big for his first hit as a Seminole as the Cincinnati, Ohio native took a 2-1 offering over the fence in right for a two-run home run in the bottom of the first against Rhode Island.
- The long ball marked the second straight year that a Seminole newcomer hit a home run in his first collegiate AB on opening day.
- Brizuela performed the feat last year when he hit a two-run home run to right in the second inning against Hofstra.

## **GONZO TO MISS REMAINDER OF 2013**

- Justin Gonzalez will miss the rest of the 2013 season as the senior shortstop underwent surgery on his right hip.
- A full recovery is expected following six to eight months of rehabilitation.
- Gonzalez made just five starts in 2013 before suffering the season ending injury. He hit .278 with a triple and two home runs, five runs and five RBI and was perfect from the field in 16 fielding chances at shortstop.

## **COMPTON TO MISS 2013 CAMPAIGN**

- After making an immediate impact in FSU's weekend rotation a season ago, sophomore Mike Compton will miss the entire 2013 season after undergoing Tommy John surgery to his right elbow.
- Compton went 12-2 with a 2.87 ERA in 18 starts last year striking out 64 in 91.0 innings of work.
- The Branson, Mo., native led the ACC and tied for second nationally in wins.

#### 2013 HIGHLIGHTS

Now in his 34th season as head coach at Florida State University, Mike Martin continues to redefine success by any standard of measure. With 1,770 career victories, a .744 winning percentage that sits second among active NCAA Division I coaches, 34 consecutive regional tournament appearances and 15 trips to the College World Series, Martin's place in college baseball history is secure.

Martin was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2007. Since then he has eclipsed the 1,500-, 1,600- and 1,700-win milestones and returned to the College World Series three times in the last five seasons, while continuing to turn out All-Americans, Major League Draft choices and postseason participants.

The FSU alum has become the face of Florida State baseball having been associated with the Seminoles for 41 of FSU's 66 seasons. Of the 3,663 baseball games played in program history, Martin has been involved in 2,767 as a player, assistant coach and head coach. What is even more impressive is Martin's involvement in 2,037 of the 2,670 all-time victories at Florida State. In one way or another, Martin has been a part of more than 76.3% of FSU's victories.

Martin has won 16 conference championships since taking over as head coach in 1980 with 11 from the Metro Conference and five in the ACC. Since moving to divisional play in 2006, Martin has led the Seminoles to at least a share of the ACC Atlantic Division title seven years in a row from 2007-2013. Florida State captured the ACC Championship in 2010 defeating NC State in Greensboro, N.C., and has played in the conference title game in three of the last four years. FSU's run to a division title in 2008 was accomplished after Martin led the Noles to a league mark of 24-6, a school record for the most conference wins in team history. Martin and the Seminoles matched that total with 24 wins in 2012. He is a six-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year and has been recognized as the top coach in the ACC seven times.

Eighty-five Florida State players have earned All-America honors under Martin, while 113 players have garnered first and second team All-ACC recognition. He has coached seven players, Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd, J.D. Drew, Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Jr., Buster Posey and James Ramsey, who were named National Players of the Year.

In 2010, Martin was named to Florida State University's list of 100 Distinguished Graduates in celebration of the FSU Alumni Association Centennial.

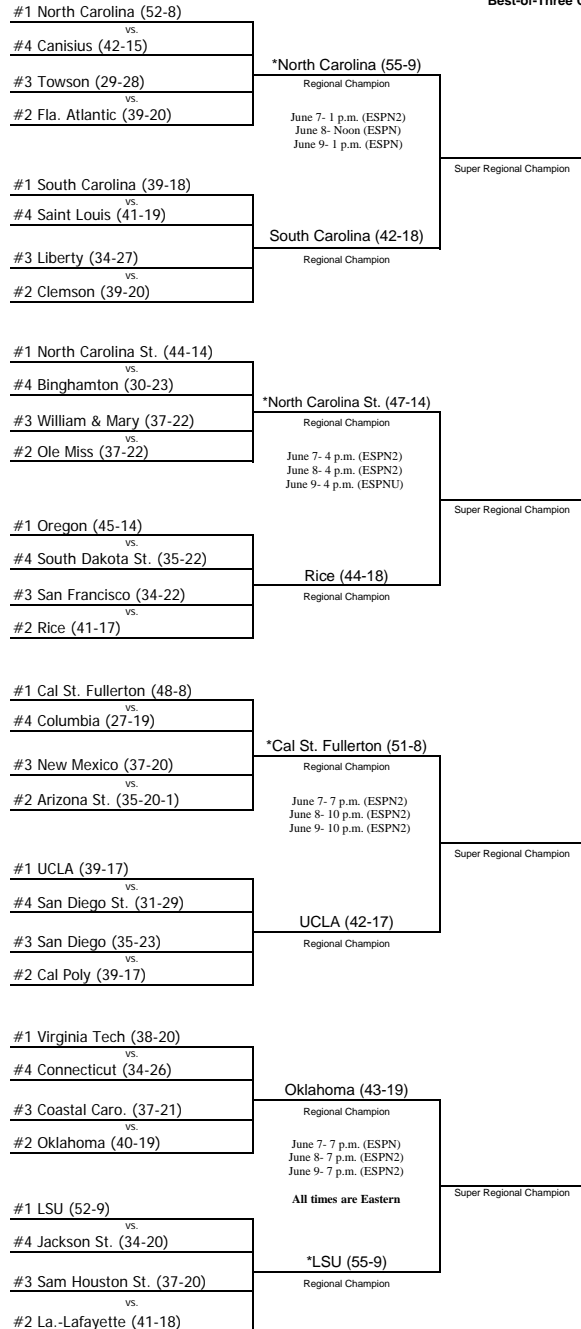
