

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR—ACTIVITIES

Eligibility will be on a weekly basis, from Monday to Monday. If you were absent Monday eligibility must be turned in by the end of the day the student returns to school.

For Curriculum Related Activities (Examples: Mini Courses, CTE Week, YIK Days, Thematic Units) the Attendance and Behavior Sections will apply.

For Extracurricular Activities (Examples: Dances, Sports, School Sponsored Open Gym) Grades, & Behavior sections will apply.

For School Hosted Community Invited Activities (Examples: Thanksgiving Feast, Attend Sport's Event, Watch Mini Iditarod, Christmas Program, Toys for Tots) a student may not participate if they are ineligible because of out of school suspension.

For Non-School Hosted Community Activities (Examples: Shoppers Fair, SCF Health Fair etc.) held in the school a student may not participate if they are ineligible because of out of school suspension.

### Grades

1. For Grades 3-12: Passing grades in all current subject areas.  
For Grades K-2: Must have a minimum of 70% of assignments submitted for the week.

### Attendance

1. A student must be in attendance the full day of any scheduled event, unless they had an excused absence or excused tardy.
2. A student, who has 3 or more unexcused tardies in the eligibility week will be ineligible to practice, compete, participate, or travel in activities.
3. A student who has one or more unexcused absences in the eligibility week will be ineligible to practice, compete, participate, or travel for activities.-Refer to Tardies and Absences.

### Behavior

1. Students must display good attitudes and behavior in front of classmates and school staff. Please reference the Progressive Discipline Plan.
2. Students who have an in-school suspension (ISS) or out of school suspension (OSS) will be ineligible to practice, compete, participate, or travel. An ISS or OSS offense means an immediate loss of eligibility, which will carry over for the following eligibility week.

## TARDIES

It is the responsibility of the student's legal guardian to inform the school that their child will be tardy. When a guardian does not notify the school that their child will be tardy, the tardy will be considered "unexcused." Unexcused Tardies occur when any student is less than 10 minutes late for the first class of the day. Tardies also occur when a student is less than 5 minutes late for subsequent periods. After these designated times unexcused tardies will be marked as an unexcused absences. They may still complete the schoolwork for credit if they are in.

## ABSENCES

It is the responsibility of the student's legal guardian to inform the school that their child will be absent. When a guardian does not notify the school that their child will be absent, the absence will be considered "unexcused." If the school has not heard from the parent on the morning of the absence, the school secretary or designee shall call the home to verify the nature of the student's absence. Absences at the parent's request such as family travel, subsistence, sickness, or absences otherwise requested by the parents/guardians are considered "excused." Because an "unexcused absence" occurs when the guardian has not signed out or called the school to explain the student's absence, schoolwork cannot be made up from an "unexcused absence."

## Make up Work:

Students may make up all work missed during an excused absence. It is up to the student and/or his/her parent or guardian to contact the teacher(s) for this makeup work before the absence (when it is known in advance), or immediately upon the student's return to school. All makeup work shall be completed in the following timeframe:

Students will be given two (2) days for the first day missed and one (1) day for each succeeding day missed, not to exceed 10 days. (This requirement may be modified at the discretion of the Site Administrator in the case of an unusual circumstance or hardship.)

Students failing to make up work missed for a class during the prescribed period shall be given 0's for those assignments. The teacher shall determine how these grades will impact the student's final grade in the class in accordance with their grading policy.
