## **Foreword**

**This Report contains detailed data and information on various economic activities for the period (2003- 2007). The report includes GDP by type of economic activity and expenditure, GNI and GNDI at current and constant prices.**

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## Terms and Definition

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### Producer's Prices

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The producer's price is the amount receivable by the producer from the purchaser for a unit of a good or service produced as output, minus any VAT or similar deductible tax, invoiced to the purchaser. It excludes any transport charges invoiced separately by the producer.

### Purchaser's Price

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The purchaser's price is the amount paid by the purchaser, excluding any deductible VAT or similar deductible tax, in order to take delivery of a unit of a good or service at the time and place required by the purchaser; the purchaser's price of a good includes any transport charges paid separately by the purchaser to take delivery at the required time and place.

### Intermediate Consumption

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consists of the value of the goods and services consumed as inputs by a process of production.

### Value added

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The value of output less the value of intermediate consumption and it is a measure of the contribution to GDP made by an individual producer, industry, or sector.

## GDP at market price

The sum of the gross values added of all resident producers at producers' prices, plus taxes less subsidies on imports during accounting period. It is also equal to total final expenditure at purchasers' prices (government final expenditure, private final expenditure, fixed capital formation, exports of goods & services, less the f.o.b. value of imports of goods & services). Income-based gross domestic product is compensation of employees, plus consumption of fixed capital, plus gross operating surplus plus taxes less subsidies on production and imports.

### Gross National Income (GNI)

Equal to GDP less net taxes on production and imports, less compensation of employees less property income payable to the rest of the world plus the corresponding items receivable from the rest of the world (in other words, GDP less primary incomes payable to non-resident units plus primary incomes receivable from non-resident units).

## **Gross National Disposable Income**

## **الدخل القومي المتاح الإجمالي**

Equal to gross national income plus current transfer in cash or in kind receivable by resident institutional units from non-resident units and subtracting all current transfers in cash or in kind payable by resident institutional units to non-resident units.

## **Government Final Consumption**

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Government Final Consumption expenditure consists of expenditure, including imputed expenditure, incurred by general government on both individual consumption goods and services and Collective consumption services.

## **Household Final Consumption**

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Household Final Consumption expenditure consists of Expenditure, including imputed expenditure, incurred by resident households on individual consumption goods and services.



### **Export of Goods and Services**

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**Includes the transfer of ownership of goods from the residents of the country to those residing in other countries and also the transfer of services provided by resident producers to the residents in other countries.**

### **Imports of Goods and Services**

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**Includes the transfer of ownership of goods from those residing abroad to those residing inside the country and also the transfer of the services provided by the producers residing abroad to those residing inside the country.**

### **Compensation of employees**

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**The total remuneration, in cash or in kind, payable by enterprises to employees in return for work done by the latter during the accounting period.**

### **Consumption of Fixed Capital**

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**Represents the reduction in the value of the fixed assets used in production during the accounting period resulting from physical deterioration, normal obsolescence or normal accidental damage.**

### **Gross fixed capital formation**

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**Gross fixed capital formation measures the total value of a producer's acquisition, less disposals, of fixed assets during the accounting period plus certain additions to the value of non-produced assets (such as subsoil assets or major improvements in the quantity, quality or productivity of land) realised by the productive activity of institutional units.**

### **Operating Surplus**

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**The operating surplus measures the surplus or deficit accruing from production before taking in to account of any interest, rent or similar charges payable on financial or tangible non-produced assets borrowed or rented by the enterprise, or any interest, rent or similar receipts receivable on financial or tangible non-produced assets owned by the enterprise.**

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) 2007

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The provisional data for the national accounts indicate that Bahrain's economic growth rate in year 2007 rose by (8.1%) compared with (6.7%) in the year before, where the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at constant prices increased to BD 4440.6 million from BD 4109.1 million during year 2006 . This growth is ascribed to the improvement in most of the non oil sectors and economic activities, particularly financial co-operation, manufacturing, Construction, government services, education and health services and real estate & business activities.

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at current prices increased from BD 5960.3 million in year 2006 to BD 6936.0 million in year 2007 (or 16.4%) due to the rise in world oil prices and a noticeable improvement in performance of the financial co-operation sector, manufacturing and construction, Real estate and business activities.

**Developments of economic sectors and activities (at current prices) during 2007**

As a result of the rise in world oil prices, the value added in the mining activity increased to BD 1709.7 million in year 2007 from BD 1550.3 million in the previous year, thereby accounting for 24.65% of the GDP at current prices in 2007.

The value added in the financial co-operation sector rose to BD 1576.4 million in year 2007, against BD 1361.0 million in year 2006, i.e. a growth of 15.8% compared with 12.7% the year before. This increase resulted from the rise in the net interest income, dealing in foreign currencies, investment in fund, the sale of corporate banking and retail banking services, and share of profit in associated companies. The relative importance of this sector in the GDP at current price stand at 22.73% in 2007 .

The contribution of the government services sector in the GDP accounts for BD 811.14 million in year 2007 against BD 702.7 million in year 2006, i.e. growth by (15.4%) This growth is ascribed to the increase in the wages and salaries item by 15.5%. From a structural stand point , this sector contributes about 11.69% of GDP 2007.

The value added of private and government education reached BD 268.7 million in year 2007, up from BD 239.3 million in 2006 i.e. growth of 12.29%. This increase resulted from the rise in wages and salaries at the Ministry of Education, increase in number of private universities and educational institutions.

Health services activity (private and public) witnessed a remarkable improvement of (13%), as the value added reached BD 137.5 million in year 2007 compared to BD 121.7 million in the pervious year. This growth resulted essentially from the increase in wages and salaries at the Ministry of Health and the increase in the number of private hospitals and clinics .

The value added in manufacturing rose by 28.8% to BD 1062.8 million in year 2007 against BD 825.3 million in the year before. This growth was essentially due to the increase in value added in Aluminium, Refinery, petrochemical, gas liquidation, Metal Industries, Building Materials and Food Industries .The relative contribution of this activity to GDP increased from 13.85% in year 2006 to 15.32% in year 2007.

With regards to real-estate and business, the value added in these activities grew by 9.7% to BD 516.1 million in year 2007 compared with BD 470.5 million during the year 2006 . This growth is attributed to the increase in the number of residential and commercial buildings as well as the relative increase in rents.

In the same direction, the value added in the transport and communications, rose 11.9% to BD 413.9 million in the year 2007 from BD 369.9 million in the pervious year as a result of the increase in value added of wireless communications and land transportation activities.

The value added in the wholesale & retail trade sector increased to BD 631.8 million in 2007 compared to BD 571.3 million in the year 2006 i.e growth of 10.6%.

Meanwhile, the value added in the rest of non oil sector recorded an increase in 2007, as the value added in construction increased by 22.2% to BD 347.6 million during that year against BD 284.5 million in year 2006. Also the value added in other social and personal services increased by 14.9% to BD 219.3 million in 2007 against BD 190.9 million in 2006. Similarly, the value added in electricity and water increased by 61.6% to BD 85.6 million during the year 2007 against BD 53.0 million in 2006.

### Secondly: Expenditure on GDP

Regarding items of expenditure on GDP, provisional data indicate that the final government expenditure in year 2007 increased by 17.4% to BD 994.5 million from BD 847.1 million in the year 2006.

Private consumption expenditure reached BD 2344.0 million in 2007 compared to BD 2116.2 million in 2006. Also, its ratio to the GDP slightly decreased from 35.5% in year 2006 to 33.7% in 2007.

Government expenditure on gross capital formation reached BD 504.8 million during 2007, i.e decreased by BD 33.2 million or 7% .

Meanwhile, the private expenditure on gross capital formation (Public, Joint and private investment) increased by 15.5% to BD 1233.3 million during 2007, compared to BD 1068.2 million in the previous year, representing 17.8/% of GDP in 2007.

The value of exports of goods and services rose by BD 621.2 or 10.5% to BD 6510.20 million in 2007 against BD 5889.0 million in 2006. This was a result of the increase in the value of oil exports from BD 3465.8 million in year 2006 to BD 4059.3 in year 2007 .

The value of imports of goods and services registered an increase of 9.2% to BD 4747.5 million in 2007 compared with BD 4346.2 million in 2006. This rise is essentially attributed to the increase in value of oil imports from BD 1843.0 million in year 2006 to BD 2204.9 in year 2007.

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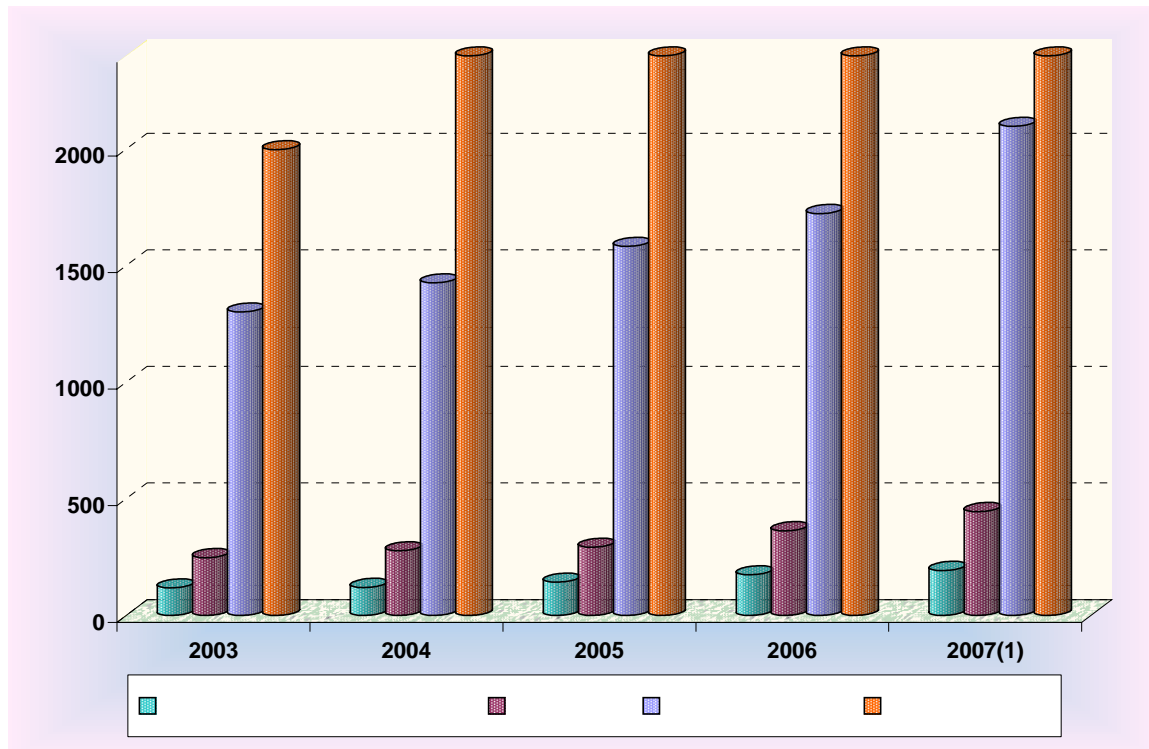

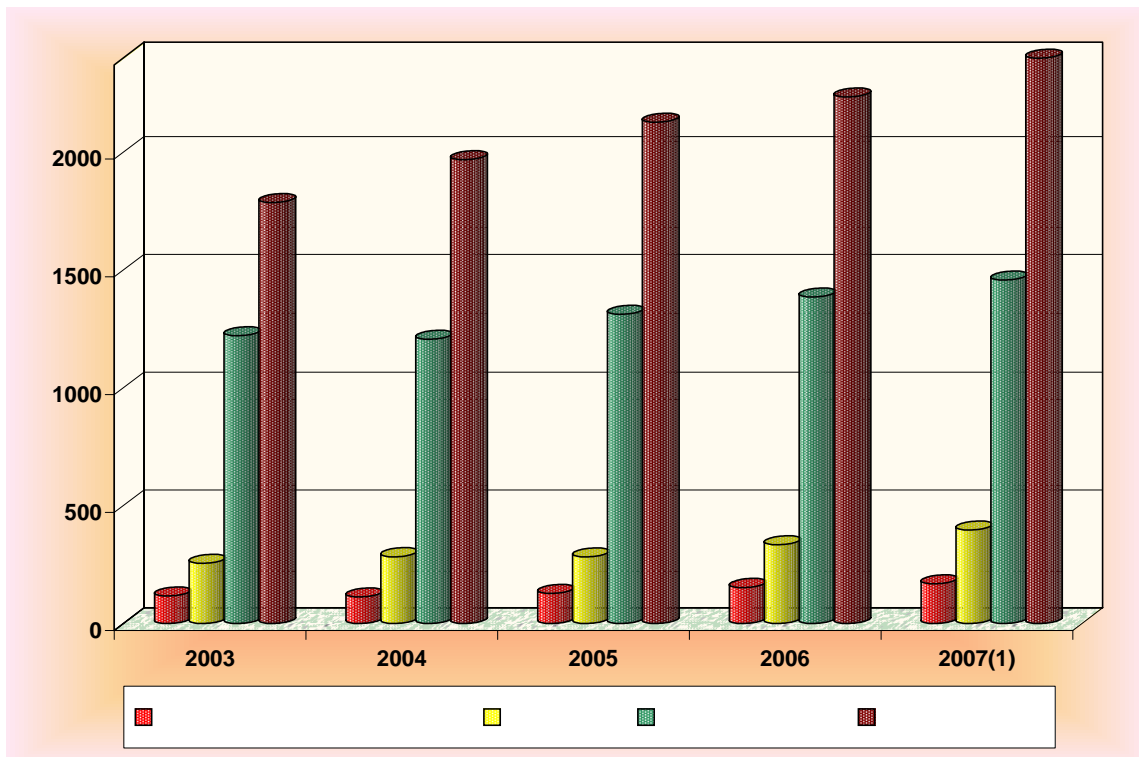

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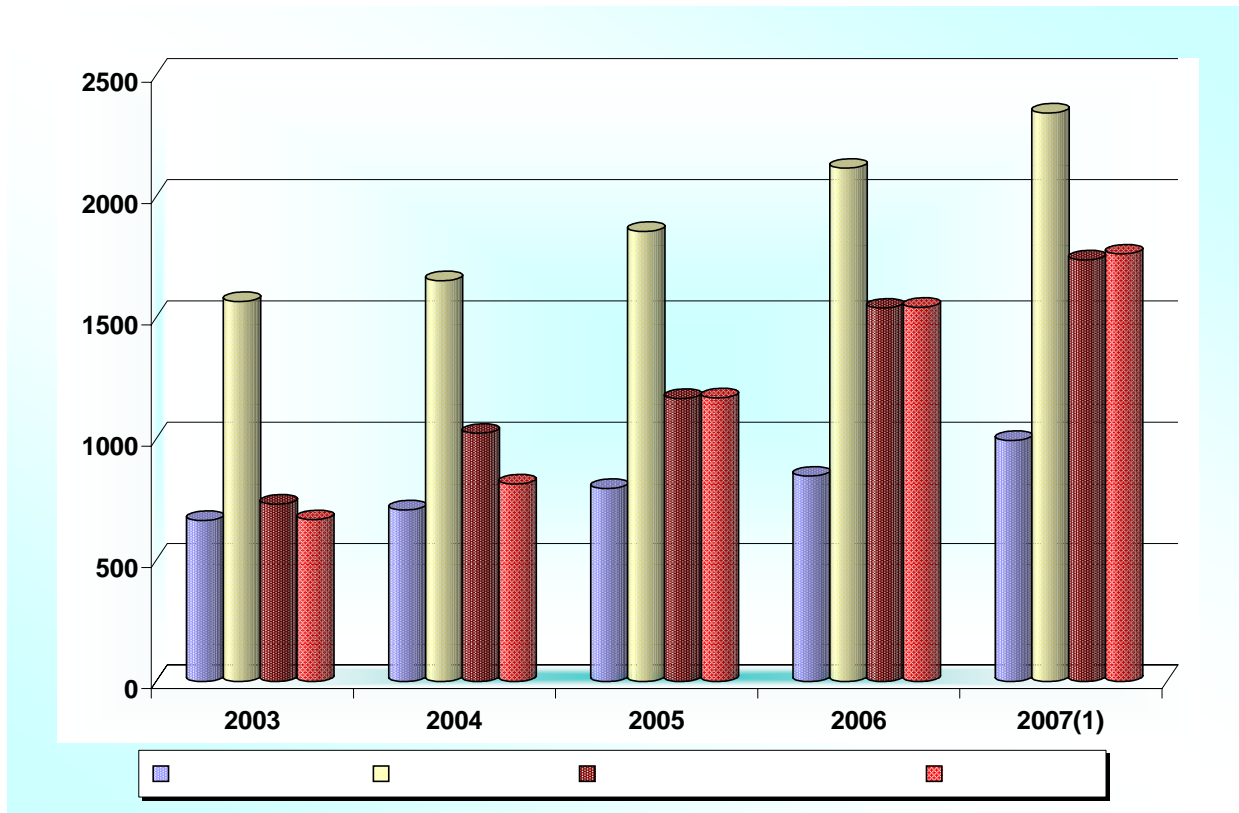

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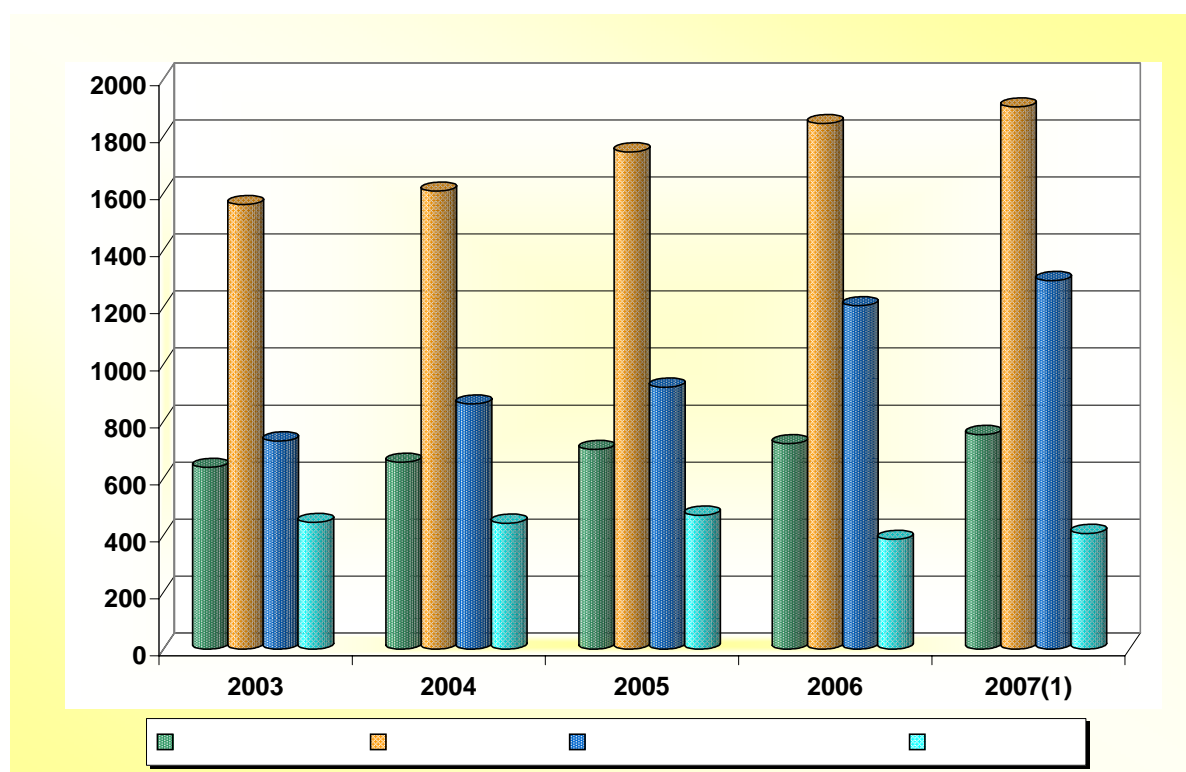
