

GO Transit is the regional public transit service for the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area, with routes extending to communities across the Greater Golden Horseshoe. GO's distinctive green and white trains and buses serve a population of more than seven million across more than 11,000 square kilometres, stretching from Hamilton and Kitchener-Waterloo in the west to Newcastle and Peterborough in the east, and from Orangeville, Barrie and Beaverton in the north to Niagara Falls in the south.

Since May 1967, GO Transit has evolved from a single GO Train line along Lake Ontario's shoreline into an extensive network of train lines and bus routes. Since service began, more than a billion people have taken the GO Train or Bus – to work or school, to get home, or for leisure activities. GO provides its passengers with safe, fast, reliable and comfortable service to downtown Toronto and other urban centres.

GO Transit is a division of Metrolinx, an agency of the Government of Ontario.

AT A GLANCE

Annual ridership:

- 2010: 57 million passengers

Typical weekday ridership:

- 217,000 passengers – 180,000 of these customers ride on the train system, while 37,000 take the bus on other routes across the network.
- Ninety-six per cent of train commuters ride to and from Union Station, and 70 per cent of all bus passengers travel to and from the City of Toronto.
- GO connects with all 16 municipal transit systems in its service area, with coordinated services and discounted fares available to GO riders transferring to and from many of the local systems.
