WE PLANTED BLUEBELLS

We planted bluebells—fresh bluebells, not bulbs, as they will grow better. Next spring it should be a wonderful sight. The paths in the Wet Woodland were also repaired and new bark laid.

ECO DAY PLANNING

And now preparations for ECO Day are in full swing. As you can appreciate, it's a huge organizational challenge, not only to find funding but also to gather volunteers, purchase supplies, etc. One hundred kids are a large crowd.
