



## MULTIWAY STOLE

Repeating panels of lace stitches in delicate Rowan *Kidsilk Haze* and *Fine Lace* held together, give this versatile stole its special character, and its button fastenings allow you to wear it in a variety of ways, such as a shrug, poncho, cape, or vest (see How to Wear, page 102).

# MULTIWAY STOLE

## YARN

4(4:5:6:6) x 7/8oz/229yd balls of Rowan Kidsilk Haze in Meadow 581 (A)

3(3:3:3:4) x 1 1/4oz/437yd balls of Rowan Fine Lace in Patina 924 (B)

**Note** Use 1 end of each held together throughout

## NOTIONS

10 buttons, 3/8in/10mm diameter

## GAUGE

19 sts and 28 rows before blocking over St st on size 7 (4.5mm) needles or size to obtain correct gauge.

## NEEDLES

Pair of size 7 (4.5mm) knitting needles

## SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

## STOLE

Cast on 93(93:93:117:117) sts.

Knit 4 rows.

Cont as foll:

**Row 1 (RS)** K2, yo, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, yo, k2.

**Row 2** K4, purl to last 4 sts, k4.

These 2 rows set edgings and should be worked throughout.

**Row 3** K2, yo, ssk, k1, work 12 st rep as set on row of chart 7[7:7:9:9] times, k2tog, yo, k2.

This row sets chart placement.

Cont as set until row 40 of chart has been completed, ending with RS facing for next row.

Rep rows 41 to 44, 9[10:11:12:14] times.

Work rows 1 to 40 of chart.

Rep rows 41 to 44, 10[11:12:13:14] times.

Work rows 1 to 40 as set on chart, then rows 17 to 40 only.

Rep rows 41 to 44, 10[11:12:13:14] times.

Work rows 1 to 40 of chart.

Rep rows 41 to 44, 9[10:11:12:14] times.

Rep rows 1 to 42 of chart, ending with RS facing for next row.

**Next row** K2, yo, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, yo, k2.

Knit 3 rows.

Bind off knitwise.

## FINISHING

Soak and block to size (see page 63). Using Diagram 1 as a guide, sew on buttons to sides A and D. Place the first button approx 1in/2.5cm up from cast-on/bound-off edge and last approx 17 3/4in/45cm up from this point with remaining three buttons equally spaced between the two.

# MULTIFUNCTIONAL DESIGN

*This design for the Multiway stole was planned with different ways to wear it, with buttons as part of the design—see Diagram 1 on page 57 (see pattern, page 56).*

## 1 LOOSE

*Here, the scarf is unbuttoned and shown laying flat, simply draped around the neck.*

## 2 SHRUG

*Button together A and C, then do the same with B and D. These now form “sleeves” so you can wear it as a shrug.*

## 3 CAPE

*Drape the stole over your shoulders to cover them and button A and B at the front.*

## 4 PONCHO

*Fasten A and B at the front of your body, along with as many buttons of C and D as you need to create a comfortable fit.*

## 5 BOLERO

*Wrap the stole “every which way” around your neck and fasten a few buttons to hold it in position.*
