### SERIES NOTES

- The Mercury and the Sky meet for the first time in the WNBA Finals.
- Phoenix swept the regular season series for the first time since 2011.
- The Mercury had lost three consecutive games against Chicago before winning on July 2.
- The Sky played their games at the UIC Pavilion from 2006-09. In games played at the Pavilion, the Mercury went 4-0.
- The regular season series dates back to 2006 and the Mercury own a 14-4 record against the Sky including winning the first nine games.
- Candice Dupree averaged a team-high 18.5 points against the Sky in two regular season games and tied a season-high with 26 points on July 2 vs. Chicago. Dupree was the first ever draft pick by the Sky in 2006 (sixth overall pick).
- Dupree and Brittney Griner each averaged double-figure rebounds against the Sky in 2014, with 12.5 and 10.5, respectively.

## Mercury vs. Sky, WNBA Finals Game 1

<b>MERCURY 83</b> <b>SKY 62</b>  US Airways Center Phoenix, Arizona	<b>PHOENIX, ARIZ.</b> – Brittney Griner swatted away just about everything within reach in the first quarter, setting the stage for a Phoenix rout. Griner set a playoff record with eight blocked shots, five in the first quarter, and the Mercury soared past the Chicago Sky 83-62 on Sunday in Game 1 of the WNBA Finals. Griner, the WNBA defensive player of the year, also had 12 points and seven rebounds. Dupree made her first 10 shots and scored 26 for the Mercury in their 19th consecutive home victory. Diana Taurasi added 19 points and 11 assists. Phoenix shot a finals record 58.5 percent from the field, Chicago 31.9 percent. Sylvia Fowles scored 19 points and grabbed 11 rebounds for Chicago but was just 8 of 20, usually against Griner in a matchup of the last two WNBA defensive players of the year. Elena Delle Donne only played 11 minutes because of a bad back. She finished with two points and didn't play in the second half with the game already out of reach. Delle Donne said she took herself out of the game because she thought she was hurting her team, and she hoped sitting the rest of the game out would make her better prepared for Game 2 of the best-of-5 series, set for Tuesday night in Phoenix. Alley Quigley, who was the league's sixth woman of the year, scored 13 points for the Sky. She missed 11 of her 15 shots. Phoenix led from the opening basket, was up by 22 at the half and by as many as 30 in the third. Griner's five first-quarter blocks broke the playoff record for a half. She finished with six at halftime.

## Mercury vs. Sky, Regular Season Game 2

<b>MERCURY 72</b> <b>SKY 66</b>  Allstate Arena Rosemont, Illinois	<b>ROSEMONT, IL.</b> – Despite recording a season-worst 37.3 percent, Mercury overcame an off shooting night and 17 turnovers to beat struggling Chicago Sky 72-66 on and extend their franchise-record winning streak to nine games. After trailing by as many as six, the Mercury rallied in the third quarter as Diana Taurasi scored 13 of her team-high 19 points in the second half. DeWanna Bonner added 13 points and Brittney Griner had 11 points and 10 rebounds for the Mercury (15-3), who have the league's best record and top the Western Conference standings. Candice Dupree added 11 points and 11 rebounds, and Penny Taylor had 10 points. Sylvia Fowles had 23 points and 11 rebounds while battling foul trouble for the Sky (8-12), who have lost four straight and 12 of 15. They were without All-Star forward Elena Delle Donne and point guard Courtney Vandersloot. Delle Donne had a flare-up of Lyme disease and Vandersloot missed her fifth straight game with a sprained knee. She could be sidelined up to 10 weeks. Sky coach Pokey Chatman doesn't expect Delle Donne to return until after the All-Star game on July 19. Fowles re-entered the game with five fouls with 5:06 to go and the Mercury leading 60-57. Taurasi's 3 gave Phoenix a 65-59 lead with 3:12 remaining. Tamera Young's layup pulled the Sky to within 65-61, but Dupree came up with a steal and layup for a 67-61 lead to all but seal it with 1:18 left. Jamierra Faulkner had 13 points and Young 12 for Chicago, which shot 40.9 percent from the field. Epiphanny Prince, who came in averaging 17.4 points, finished with five. The Mercury came in averaging nearly 85 points per game.

## Mercury vs. Sky, Regular Season Game 1

<b>MERCURY 87</b> <b>SKY 69</b>  US Airways Center Phoenix, Arizona	<b>PHOENIX, ARIZ.</b> - Candice Dupree had 26 points and 14 rebounds to lead the Phoenix Mercury to their sixth straight win, 87-69 over the Chicago Sky. Diana Taurasi added 15 points, hitting a 3-pointer with 6:46 left in the third quarter to move into second place on the WNBA's career scoring list. Taurasi, who now has 6,457 points, reached that total in her 316th game - 166 fewer than Smith, who has 6,452 points, played. Tina Thompson tops the list with 7,488 points. Dupree made two free throws in the first quarter to top 4,000 career points and is 22nd on the career scoring list. Dupree took advantage of the Sky's strategy of keying on phenom Brittney Griner, who set a league mark with 11 blocked shots on Sunday against Tulsa. Griner was held to four points on Wednesday but grabbed 11 rebounds and had three blocks for Phoenix (12-3). Allie Quigley scored 16 points to lead the Sky (8-9), who have lost four of six. Epiphanny Prince and Jamierra Faulkner added 11 each. The league-best Mercury, winners of eight of their last nine, scored 13 consecutive points in the third quarter to stretch their lead to 19. Faulkner was coming off a 27-point effort in a win against the Sparks on Tuesday, but shot just 4 for 16 from the field against Phoenix. The Sky again played without leading scorer Elena Delle Donne, who is out indefinitely with Lyme disease, and Courtney Vandersloot, who led the league in assists before spraining her knee. Vandersloot is expected to be out at least six weeks.

## 2014 PLAYOFFS QUICK NOTES

- **GLORY AWAITS...:** The Phoenix Mercury clinched home court advantage for the 2014 WNBA Playoffs thanks to a **WNBA-best 29-5 (.853)** regular season record. The team advanced to the WNBA Finals for the fourth time in franchise history after defeating the Minnesota Lynx in the Western Conference Finals. That series win snapped three consecutive WCF series losses for Phoenix. Phoenix advanced to the Western Conference Finals for the second straight season and the sixth time in the last eight years. The Mercury swept their first round playoff series against Los Angeles.
- The Mercury has won nine of the last ten WNBA Playoff series' when holding a 1-0 lead in the series.....the Mercury is making its **FIFTH** postseason appearance in the last **SIX** years and the **SIXTH** in the last **EIGHT** years.
- This marks the **FOURTH TIME THE MERCURY HAVE BEEN TO THE WNBA FINALS, TIED WITH DETROIT, HOUSTON AND NEW YORK FOR THE MOST FINALS APPEARANCES IN LEAGUE HISTORY**.....the team has two WNBA Championships (2009 and 2007).....Phoenix is 8-6 in WNBA Finals games.....each time the Mercury has been in the Finals, the series went the maximum number of games (three game series in 1998).
- The current Mercury roster has 213 career playoff games combined entering the 2014 WNBA Finals.....included in that total is 43 WNBA Finals games (through Game 1 of the 2014 WNBA Finals).....the roster has **SIX WNBA CHAMPIONSHIP RINGS** among them.
- **DIANA TAURASI HAS SCORED 220 CAREER POINTS IN 11 WNBA FINALS GAMES, GOOD FOR THIRD ALL-TIME** (Deanna Nolan 256, Katie Smith 231).....her career finals average of 20.0 points per game is good for fourth all-time
- **DIANA TAURASI** is second on the All-Time Finals list for both three-point field goals (33) and three-point field goals attempted (85).....Taurasi also holds the WNBA Finals record for most three-point field goals in a game with seven (September 8, 2007 at Detroit)
- **PENNY TAYLOR'S** Finals free throw percentage of 90.5 percent (67-of-74) is fifth all-time
- **PENNY TAYLOR** holds the WNBA Finals record for most free throws made, none missed in a game and most free throws made in a game with 18 on September 16, 2007 at Detroit
- Phoenix played in the highest scoring WNBA Finals game in history on September 29, 2009 against Indiana when the two teams combined for 236 points in an overtime game that saw the Mercury win 120-116. In that same game, the teams also combined for 109 first half points (Phoenix 56, Indiana 53) which was the highest combined total of first half points in WNBA Finals history.
- **DIANA TAURASI** and **PENNY TAYLOR** look to become the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> players in WNBA history to win three WNBA Championships with the same team.
- Coming in to the 2014 WNBA Finals, **CANDICE DUPREE** has played the most games on the Phoenix roster without a WNBA Finals appearance. She has played 282 career games without a Finals appearance. **MISTIE BASS** is second on that list among Mercury players at 219 games.
- The Mercury are riding a 19-game home winning streak (including playoffs and regular season).....the Mercury went 16-1 (.941) at US Airways Center during the regular season.
- The Mercury has homecourt advantage for the first time since the 2010 Western Conference Semifinal against San Antonio (Phoenix won, 2-0).....in Playoff history, the Mercury is 6-1 in series' they have had homecourt advantage with the only loss coming in the 2000 first round to Los Angeles.
- **WNBA JAM: BRITNEY GRINER** recorded the first dunk in WNBA Playoff history on August 24 at Los Angeles.....overall in her career, Griner has dunked **FIVE** times in two WNBA seasons (four regular season and one playoff).....the rest of the WNBA has recorded **SIX** dunks in league history.....Griner also dunked in the 2014 WNBA All-Star Game in Phoenix.

The 2014 Phoenix Mercury owned the best regular season record against other 2014 WNBA Playoff teams. Mercury guard **Diana Taurasi** recorded her **FIFTH** career WNBA Playoff game of 30 or more points in Game 3 of the Western Conference Finals. That is tied with **Angel McCoughtry** for the most in WNBA Playoff history. It was her second 30 point game of the 2014 Playoffs (Game 1 vs. Los Angeles).



- **9-FOR-9: BRITNEY GRINER** established a WNBA Playoff record in Game 2 of the first round on August 24 at Los Angeles by shooting a perfect 9-for-9 from the field.....it was the most field goals made, none missed in playoff history.....during the 2014 WNBA Playoffs, Griner is shooting 64.1 percent (41-of-64), fourth best in the league.
- **CANDICE DUPREE** is the second on the WNBA all-time Playoff field goal percentage list.....she is shooting 58.9 percent (149-of-253) in playoffs games during her career.
- **WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?:** The Mercury has outscored opponents by a total of 76 points in six playoff games this year, marking an average point differential of 12.67 points per game.
- Phoenix finished the season 16-1 (.938) at home, making the Mercury one of only six teams to record 16 wins at home in a season in league history. The lone home loss this season came in the second home game of the season to San Antonio (78-74). Phoenix has not at home since May 23.
- On the road this season, the Mercury recorded a franchise-best 13-4 record including seven consecutive road wins (June 15 – July 24).
- The Mercury won by double digits in **19** of their **29** regular season wins and owned a league-high point differential of **+9.412** points per game. That margin was the fourth-largest in league history. In WNBA history, 15 of the 17 WNBA champions have led the league in scoring differential (the other two champions had the second-highest differential). Phoenix boasts the highest-scoring offense (83.5) and second-best scoring defense (74.1). In 2012 and 2013 combined, the Mercury had a total of **SIX** double-digit wins. **11 OF THE 16** wins during the 16-game win streak were by double digits.
- **DEE-FENSE, DEE-FENSE:** The Phoenix Mercury allowed just 74.1 points per game this season, good for the second-best defense in the WNBA. It was the best Mercury defense since 2006—the year the league switched to a 24 second shot clock.
- **OFF-FENSE, OFF-FENSE:** The Phoenix Mercury scored 83.5 points per game during the regular season, leading the WNBA for the seventh time in franchise history. Phoenix has led the league in scoring more times than any other team in league history.
- The 16-game winning streak by the Mercury this season was the second-longest streak in WNBA history. Phoenix led for **532 MINUTES AND 59 SECONDS** of **640 MINUTES** during the streak, **83.3 PERCENT** of game action. Phoenix trailed for only **9 MINUTES AND 19 SECONDS** in the fourth quarter during the streak (June 27 at Indiana and July 6 at Los Angeles saw the only fourth quarter Mercury deficits of the streak). Phoenix didn't trail in the fourth quarter for the final **NINE** games of the streak. **TWO GAMES** did the Mercury **LEAD WIRE-TO-WIRE** (July 2 vs. Chicago and July 24 at Los Angeles). **THREE OTHER GAMES** saw the Mercury **TRAIL FOR LESS THAN 20 SECONDS**. The **LARGEST DEFICIT** the Mercury overcame to win during the streak was **13 POINTS** (June 27 at Indiana). The **LARGEST WIN** during the streak was **29 POINTS** on July 13 vs. San Antonio, the same game where they had their largest lead (31 points) of the streak. The **SMALLEST MARGIN OF VICTORY WAS THREE POINTS** (June 29 at Tulsa). The streak lasted 45 days (June 15 – July 29).
- **USA! USA! USA!:** Four members of the Phoenix Mercury were recently invited to participate in the fall USA Basketball training camp as Team USA prepares to defend its FIBA World Championship. **DEWANNA BONNER, CANDICE DUPREE, BRITNEY GRINER AND DIANA TAURASI** were among the 27 named to the training camp roster. The FIBA World Championship's will take place September 27 – October 5 in Ankara and Istanbul, Turkey. Taurasi is a three time Olympic gold medalist with Team USA while Dupree won a FIBA World Championship gold in 2010.
