

Buckle everyone properly - it's the law. All motor vehicle occupants must be secured in a safety belt or harness or in a child restraint system.

Wear your helmet. All motorcycle and motor operators and passengers must wear a motorcycle helmet.

Don't text/talk; texting & handheld cell phone use is prohibited in Oregon. Drivers should pay attention to the important task of driving - distracted driving kills.

Don't follow too close; don't cut in front. The most common factor in Oregon crashes is following too closely. Maintain your 3-second rule, and don't cut quickly in front of another vehicle.

Respect the Cone Zone, 24/7. Orange is your cue to slow down and be alert; watch for slowing vehicles in advance of highway work zones, and be aware that lane restrictions may apply.

Be extra cautious in safety corridors. Safety Corridors are stretches of highways that have higher than average fatal and serious injury rates.

Don't get stuck in the NO-ZONE. The "No-Zone" represents the danger areas around trucks and buses where crashes are more likely to occur.

Report erratic driving. You may be saving a life when you report a driver who is swerving, weaving in and out of traffic or otherwise appears impaired.

You are required to report most crashes. Drivers and witnesses are required to stop at a crash and provide names, addresses and other information to those involved.

Take a break at a safety rest area. Oregon's highway rest areas provide much-needed safety breaks for busy motorists.

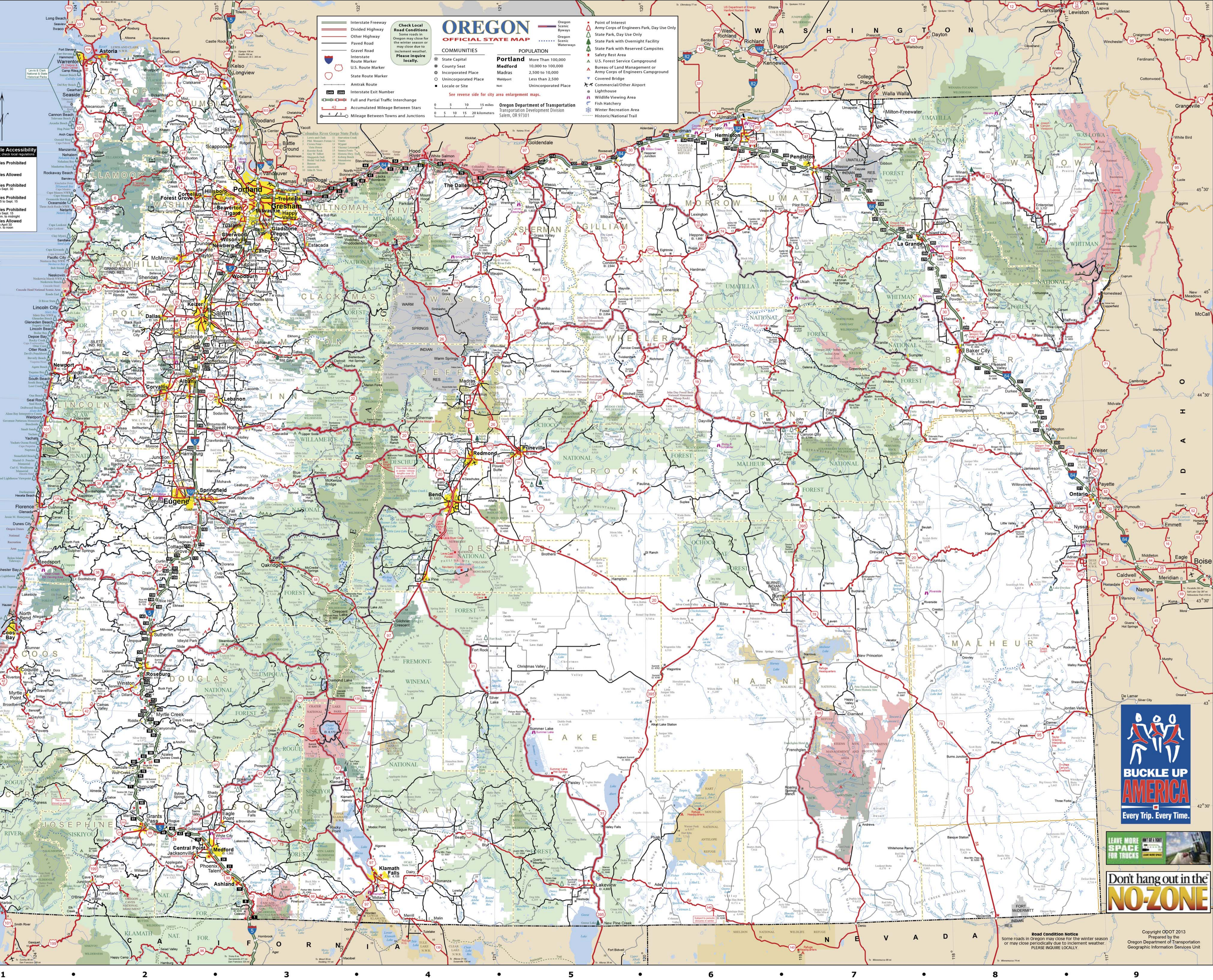
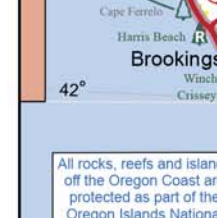
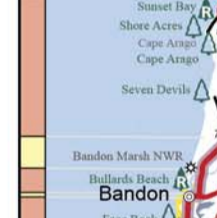
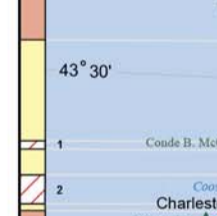
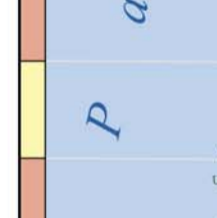
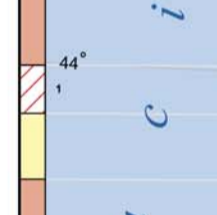
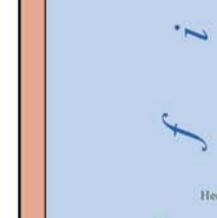
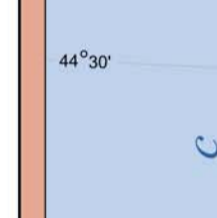
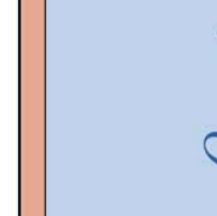
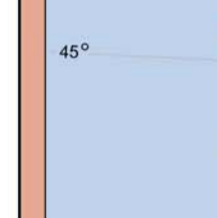
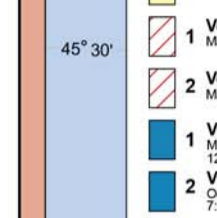
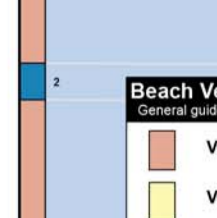
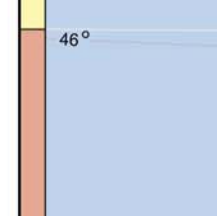
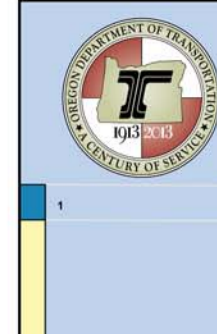
SNOW CHAINS & TRACTION TIRES. When traveling through Oregon in snow season, you must carry traction tires or chains and use them when required.

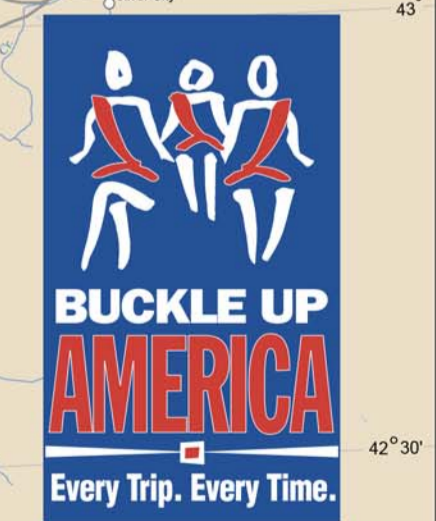


Check Local Road Conditions. Oregon may close for the winter season or may close periodically due to inclement weather. PLEASE INQUIRE LOCALLY.
