- *Supporting the publication of a peer-reviewed scientific journal (Aeolian Research).*

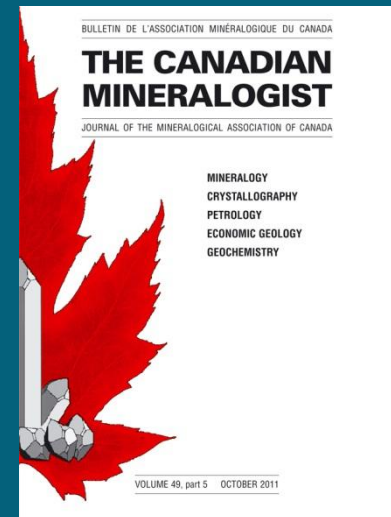
