Conference Information

Conference office

The office for the conference will be located with the registration desk. It will be staffed throughout the conference to take late registrations, prepare meeting announcements and answer general conference questions. Any announcements must be cleared through the Socialism 2014 office.

Press policy

Socialism 2014 welcomes authorized press coverage of the conference. Only authorized media will be allowed to take photographs or interview at the conference. Press credentials will be authorized and distributed by Keeanga-Yamahtta Taylor. Please direct all inquiries to her at the Socialism 2014 registration table.

Admission to sessions

You will receive a registration badge when you register. Keep this badge with you at all times—it is your admission ticket to sessions. If any of the meeting rooms reach overflow capacity, you may be turned away from attending, so please have a second choice in mind.

Conference guidelines

So that meetings run smoothly and to encourage maximum discussion, a chairperson will moderate all meetings. Questions and comments should be held until the chair calls for them after the speaker has finished his or her presentation.

The Socialism 2014 organizers ask for cooperation with these guidelines from everyone at the conference. Anyone who refuses to abide by the chairperson's instructions or who disrupts any meeting will be removed from the conference. Anyone displaying abusive, intimidating or violent behavior toward other conference attendees will be ejected from the conference.

Attendees should be aware that in some meetings interpreters may be talking quietly to those who have signed up for translation services.

Social media campaign in solidarity with Palestine

The Crowne Plaza hotel chain is a target of the Palestinian BDS movement for its sponsorship of the Jerusalem Marathon. The marathon course goes through East Jerusalem and is part of normalizing Israel's claim on Jerusalem as its capital city.

The conference consulted with Omar Barghouti, co-founder of the BDS movement and author of *Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions: The Global Struggle for Palestinian Rights* (Haymarket, 2011), about the best way to show our support for the boycott. Here is his advice:

Dear Socialism 2014 conference,

Thanks so much for checking with us on this. We always appreciate the principled support of the Socialism conference.

We cannot possibly consider asking you to cancel this important conference. We understand that the conference booked this hotel without knowing beforehand about the BDS National Committee's call for boycotting Crowne Plaza.

I personally suggest the following for your consideration:

- 1) Informing conference participants that the hotel was booked without knowing about the boycott and that now that the Socialism 2014 conference knows but cannot cancel, it will respect the boycott henceforth.
- 2) Informing Crowne Plaza management that the Socialism conference booked their hotel twice in a row but lately found out about the boycott and will no longer book any events at the hotel until it ends its complicity in Israel's clear violation of international law, as in sponsoring the so-called Jerusalem Marathon.
- 3) Helping us get the word around about the boycott against Crowne Plaza so that other progressive groups will join the boycott and make Crowne Plaza know about it.

I think the steps above may help apply significant pressure on the Crowne Plaza, contributing to our efforts to convince them to stop sponsoring illegal Israeli activities and events.





The Internationale

"*The Internationale*" has been the socialist movement's anthem for more than a century. Eugene Pottier, a French artisan who played a leading role in the Paris Commune, wrote the words while in hiding following the Commune's defeat in 1871. A Belgian worker, Pierre Degeyter, set the words to music in 1888.

"*The Internationale*" was sung by mutinous Russian sailors on the battleship Potemkin during the 1905 Russian Revolution, by the socialist defenders of the Warsaw Ghetto in 1943, and by workers and students in Tiananmen Square in 1989.
