NOTES FROM THE WEB



For a holiday related website we have the **Christmas Philatelic Club** based in Harmony, Minnesota. This site includes both normal postage stamps and Christmas Seals. On the home page is a

list (29 pages in PDF format) of Christmas stamps of the world. Most interesting is the "Exhibit Library". Members can order photocopies of exhibits for a nominal copy & postage fee. This unique service includes 44 exhibits – some nearly 100 pages in length! There is also a list of Christmas related resources from organizations to books and websites. Membership is \$20/year and includes their quarterly journal the *Yule Log*. Their website is http://www.hwcn.org/link/cpc/.



The **Christmas Seal and Charity Stamp Society** is based in Rochester, NY and has a website at http://cscss.home.att.net/. The society publishes the bible of US Christmas Seal collecting – *Green's Catalog* – which is also available now on CD! In fact,

the society states that "Keeping Green's

Catalog current and making it more useful is a primary goal of the CS&CSS." There are several versions of Green's catalog but the complete comb bound is only \$46. Prices on the other catalogs offered are also reasonable.

Membership is \$15/year and includes issues of the *Seal News* newsletter.



Next is a website titled **"The Lure of Forgeries – an introduction to the stamp forgeries of Portugal".** This site deals with forgeries from a bit different point of view though – the author specifically collects FORGERIES – and tries to avoid buying REAL stamps!!! The site starts with a description of what

a forgery is as opposed to reprints, cinderellas, handmade imitations or

computer printouts. The definition used is "printed from a plate of any type that was made or used specifically as a tool to imitate authentic stamps with deceitful intent". The site is found at http://www.portugal.tabacaria.com.pt/introduction.htm.

Go to the bottom of the first page and click on "General index of pages on forged stamps" to get to the index of images. Included are early embossed issues (1853-76), Colonies – Ceres issues, the India natives and the Mozambique Company elephant stamps with more to come. There is also a section on reprints of the classic Portuguese stamps from 1863 to 1953 (although not forgeries).

Each page displays an genuine stamp along with 1 or more examples of forgeries followed by a very good description of the distinguishing features of the forgeries and how to tell them from the genuine stamp. Also included are notes on the forger when available.

This is a very well done personal website with very usable information (in both English and Portuguese) for the average collector!



There are several sites on the web that help you identify those "unknown" stamps that are sitting in a binder or glassine envelope somewhere. Here is a well organized site by Rick Scott called **"Unidentified Philatelic**

Objects" or **UPO's** for short. The site is found at http://home.att.net/~RickScott/Unidentified/Unident.html.

Stamps are organized by region as well by "UPO #" which appears to be the order that they were added to the website. Each index page is a set of thumbnail images – click on an image and you get a page with larger image and whatever notes Rick has assembled for the stamp.

You can help by emailing information on stamps which aren't identified yet – there are plenty of those. You can also submit your own UPO's to be added to the website.

This site is a nice complement to others on the web such as Stefano & Casper's **"Here you can identify your weird stamps...**" at http://www.raster.it/stefano/a/ (which has been recently expanded). There are so many odd stamps out there that it never hurts to have another resource!

NEW ISSUES – U.S.A.

The US Postal Service unveiled the design for the Boy Scouting 100th Anniversary stamp on November 12, 2009 during an event at the Smithsonian National Postal Museum.

The Celebrate Scouting stamp will go on sale July of 2010 and will be dedicated at the Boy Scout Jamboree at Fort A.P. Hill near Bowling Green, Virginia. The Boy Scouts of America will celebrate it's 100th anniversary on February 8, 2010.

In conjunction with the Celebrate Scouting announcement and Veteran's Day observances, the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) announced it will begin a nationwide effort to support U.S. Armed Forces personnel serving overseas and veterans by sending letters and care packages using the Priority Mail Flat Rate Box through the Postal Service. Local DC-area scouts mailed letters and shared news about the scouting stamp from the museum this morning. The letter writing campaign continues the BSA's longstanding tradition of service and performing "a good turn" daily.

A number of US Senators and Representatives have taken leadership roles in scouting and worked to bring the Celebrate Scouting stamp to life. They include Rep. Pete Sessions, R-TX; Sen. Dick Lugar, R-IN; Rep. Ike Skelton, D-MO; and Sen. Ben Nelson, D-NB.

There have also been several stamps whose release has been delayed into 2010. These include the following:

This fourth set of state flags includes the flags of Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina and North Dakota along with a US Flag design that incorporates more of the "purple mountains majesty" design which was vignetted in the 1996 5c Non-Profit Organization non-

denominated stamp shown.

They will occur on the first Wednesday of the month:

Aug. 4^{th} (material must be turned in by 7/28).

Here are a few reminders about our sales:

The minimum bid should be \$1 & start in increments of \$.25

Bidding should be in increments of \$.25

Lots you bid on must be picked up the night of the sale

Lots not sold must be picked up the night of the sale.

In fairness to all, we appreciate you making access to the lotting cards to anyone interested (don't block the table so someone can't outbid you). The sale is done to be **a time of fun** as well as getting some of that excess out of your house & into someone else's collection.

Lotting cards can be picked up at any time in order for you to get ready ahead of time. Lotting sheets will be available at the Wednesday meeting three weeks prior to the sale.
