


DON VELLER SEMINOLE GOLF COURSE

The Dave Middleton Golf Complex and the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course are home to the PGA Golf Management Program, which is one of only a few programs in the country that is accredited by the Professional Golfer's Association of America. A 27,000-square-foot clubhouse, the Dave Middleton Golf Complex boasts private technologically advanced Wi-Fi classrooms, study and teaching labs, an internship library, a fully equipped club repair room, a pro shop, public locker rooms and the Renegade Grill. The \$7 million facility (for use by the Florida State Golf teams and PGM students only) is a two-building complex, which also includes a multi-directional driving range, a video analysis instructional center with hitting bays for inclement weather, chipping and putting greens, as well as locker rooms, team lounge, auditorium and fitness facility.

The golf course was renovated in 2004 with the reconstruction of all 18 greens, complexes, tee boxes and the state-of-the-art TiffEagle Turf was installed on all the putting surfaces. Each year the facility hosts over 60,000 rounds of golf. The golf course was recently recognized as one of the top 10 golf courses in the country by the National Golf Foundation for customer loyalty and satisfaction.

2014-15 SEASON PREVIEW

SEMINOLES LOOK TO EARN 10th Consecutive NCAA Appearance

Florida State head coach Amy Bond is in her fifth season at Florida State with the most talented, deepest and experienced team she has assembled during her tenure as a head coach on the collegiate level. She returns all eight golfers from a year ago when the Seminoles made their school-record ninth consecutive NCAA appearance and has added an exciting group of players to Florida State's roster.

Led by 2014 All-American and All-ACC selection Matilda Castren, 2014 All-ACC pick Alex Milan and 2014 U.S. Amateur participant Carlton Kuhlo, Florida State is poised to continue its climb in the national rankings and its program success.

"We are looking forward to this season because every member of our team has helped us earn success and they are all hungry for more success," said Bond. "Our senior class includes Laure Castelain, Carlton Kuhlo and Alex Milan – three players who have elevated our program as well as their individual games to a point where they are all accomplished leaders. We are fortunate to have Matilda Castren, who I believe is one of the top players in the country, along with two players who played a great deal as freshmen last year in Lydia Gumm and Anna Sophia Böhmer all back for the 2015 season. That's an accomplished group of players and we haven't even begun to talk about our excellent freshman class," said Bond.

When Bond speaks about her freshman class, she speaks glowingly. She has assembled one of the most talented freshman classes in school history with the additions of sisters Kim and Morgane Metraux along with Kayla Jones. The Metraux sisters are two of the top juniors from Europe entering the college ranks this season while Jones was a high school All-American. Any one of those three players – or all three – could earn their way into Florida State's line-up as freshmen. "In looking at our roster, there are so many strong combinations of players that could easily make up our top five," said Bond. "All of the players on our roster have the ability to play extensively for us this

season. We have players who have distinguished themselves, those who will distinguish themselves and those who will immediately have the opportunity to distinguish themselves from the start of the season and be a part of our line-up. It is very exciting to have the opportunity to coach a group as strong as this one because they will all drive each other as competitors to become better players on a daily basis."

Castren is Florida State's marquee player and one of the top players in all of collegiate golf. She was an All-American Second Team selection by both the WGCA and GolfWeek while becoming only the second freshman in school history to earn All-ACC honors. Castren won two tournaments as a freshman, finished in the top 10 in nine events and set the school-record with a 71.31 stroke average. She was voted the ACC Player and Rookie of the Year runner-up in 2014.

"Matilda is one of those players who doesn't come around often because of her competitiveness," said Bond. "Her potential is unlimited and she works to get better every day. It's a lot of fun to coach her because of her abilities and her personality. I continue to grow more and more impressed with her as she continues to elevate her game each time she comes to the course. Castren will be one of the top players in the college game for the remainder of her career as a Seminole. She was one of eight players from the ACC and one of only 10 freshmen nationally to earn All-American honors in 2014. Castren completed her freshman season as the second ranked golfer by stroke average in the ACC. She won two individual championships as a freshman - the Florida State Match-Up and the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate and was named the National Golfer of the Week by GolfWeek.com on April 14, 2014 after winning the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate.

Incredibly, Castren did not finish outside of the top-20 of any of the 10 events she competed in as a freshman and was a cumulative total of one stroke under par for the entire spring 2014 season.

"Matilda is going to get better," said Bond. "Much better."

Milan, like Castren, was a first-time member of the All-ACC team in 2014 and returns as one of three seniors on the roster. She enjoyed the best year of her career as a junior and enters her senior year with a

tremendous amount of confidence. Milan earned her first career collegiate individual championship as she claimed medalist honors at the spring 2014 Florida Challenge and averaged a career-low 74.44 strokes in 11 events in 2014. She has played in two NCAA Regional Championships and in three ACC Championships in the first three years of her career. In earning All-ACC honors as one of the top golfers in the ACC in 2014, Milan played in a career-high 11 events. She won the Florida Challenge and finished in a tie for second place in the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate to earn the top two finishes of her career. Milan played in the British Ladies Amateur, the USGA Public Links and the Trans National Amateur Championship in the summer prior to the start of her senior season.

"We are really excited for Alex to play with a high level of confidence during her senior season," said Bond. "She earned All-ACC honors as a junior and played some outstanding golf in the summer of 2014. Alex has come along as far as any golfer I have worked as a coach during the first three years of her career as a Seminole. She has put herself into a really great position to be very successful this year and we are going to need her to play even better this year than she did last year."

Kuhlo, also a senior, played in the 2014 U.S. Women's Amateur, and is also playing her best golf in her final season as a Seminole. She has played in two career ACC Championships, two career NCAA Regional Championships and has been a member of three consecutive NCAA Championship Tournament teams while consistently displaying improvement throughout her career. She averaged a career low 75.85 strokes in a career-high nine matches and 26 rounds during her junior season.

Kuhlo enjoyed her best and most productive season as a Seminole during the spring of 2014 as she was a member of the Seminoles' line-up for the ACC Championships and the NCAA East Regional Championships. She established career-bests for a single round score (68), for 36 holes (145) and for three-round tournament score (219). Kuhlo earned the best finish of her career as she placed in a tie for 13th at the Lady Gator. She carded half (13 of 26) of her single round score at 75 or better in the spring.

"Carlton has really matured as a person and a golfer in the last year," said Bond. "We are looking for con-

tinued maturation in both areas during her senior season. With the experiences she had as a junior and during the summer of 2014, she has an excellent chance to be one of our top golfers this year."

Assistant Coach:

Robert Duck (Augusta State, 2001)

Castelain, who also enters her senior season, will look to re-establish herself as a team leader and one of the Seminoles' top golfers – two positions she has held during the first three years of her career. She has played in a total of 29 career matches and a total of 83 career rounds entering her fourth season and was at her best as a junior (fall and spring seasons) with a career-low 75.19 stroke average.

Castelain has been a member of three consecutive NCAA Championships qualifying teams during her career at Florida State. She finished as Florida State's third leading scorer with a career-low 74.93 stroke average during the spring of 2014 and has been in the Seminoles' ACC Championships line-up in each of her first three years at Florida State.

"We really need Laure to step up her game and continue to be a leader for us this year," said Bond. "She has played good golf for us during her career; we need for her to have her best year this year. She has the ability and the desire to be one of our top players. She needs to have an All-ACC type of year for us to continue to grow as a program.

Sophomore Lydia Gumm was the only player to appear in all 11 events for the Seminoles in 2014 and has the ability to be one of Florida State's top golfers during the remainder of her career in Tallahassee. She was at her best as a freshman in the postseason (ACC and NCAA Championships) as she averaged 74.67 strokes in six rounds and finished as Florida State's second highest finishing golfer in both events, Gumm carded five of her six scores in the two postseason events at 75 or better.

Gumm was Florida State's second leading golfer in the 2014 NCAA East Regional Championship and finished in a tie for 36th place in the individual standings. Her individual finish and play throughout the tournament had the Seminoles in contention for a top eight team finish and a berth in the NCAA National Finals until late in the final round.

"Lydia is going to continue to be an exciting player to coach because of her incredible potential to score low," said Bond. "She played well as a freshman and showed flashes of the type of excellent golf that we are going to see in her future. Her future needs to start this season for her to be able to cement herself in our line-up. All Lydia needs to do is to play in more events and she will become one of our leaders."

Böhmer also enjoyed a strong freshman season and will

need to play even better as a sophomore to consistently stay in the Seminoles' starting-line-up. She gained an incredible amount of experience in her first season of collegiate golf and should be one of the top candidates to be a member of the Seminoles' line-up for the remainder of her career. Böhmer played in 10 of the Seminoles' 11 events as a freshman and displayed her outstanding promise for the final three years of her Seminole career.

Böhmer finished in a tie for fifth at the spring 2014 season-opening Florida Challenge and in a tie for sixth at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate and was Florida State's second leading golfer in two events - the Lady Paladin Invitational (tied for 19th) and in the Florida Challenge (tied for fifth). Böhmer enjoyed her best outing as a freshman at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate as she finished in a tie for sixth place in the individual standings and carded career-best scores for a single round (69), for 36-holes (144) and for a three-round tournament (215).

"Anna Sophia is another one of our players who we are extremely excited about after how well she played during her freshman season," said Bond. "She earned her way into our line-up for the NCAA East Regional Championship and was third on the team with a solid stroke average. As her game continues to improve, so will our team because of her ability to be such a team player."

Florida State's three-member recruiting class will be considered one of the top groups in the country because of their collective ability and opportunities for all three to quickly become members of the Seminoles' starting line-up upon their arrivals in Tallahassee. All three have developed strong resumes, have played golf on the highest of levels and are advanced golfers for a group of freshmen arriving at the same time.

"The addition of this group of golfers to our team immediately makes us better," said Bond. "All three – or any combination of the three – will play a lot of golf for us this year. If they aren't in the line-up all at one time, they will make the other golfers on our team beter because of their skill and competitiveness. As a group, they elevate the level of our team from top to bottom and make us better as a group. That's exciting."

Jones is a highly regarded player who will contend immediately for playing time in the Seminoles' line-up. She is a very smart player who manages her game on the course very well and who played in a qualifying round for the U.S. Women's Open at age 14. Jones earned Rolex Junior Honorable Mention All-American honors in 2013 as one of 48 girls named to the Rolex All-America team which recognizes the world's premier junior golfers.

"Kayla is a great player and is just starting to come

into her own on the golf course," said Bond. "I am looking for big things from her and am looking forward to watching her excel as a Seminole."

Kim Metraux is an extremely dedicated player who is committed to her continued growth as a top notch golfer and who will play a vital role in Florida State's success during her career as a Seminole. Her international experience will allow her an easy transition to the top levels of collegiate golf in the United States. She was the No. 2 ranked player in the final Swiss Girls' ranking in 2013.

"Kim has all the attributes that I am looking for in a golfer," said Bond. "Her dedication to be the best she can be will serve her well both on and off the golf course. Her international experience and success will allow her to compete at the highest level here at FSU and she will play a vital role in the success of our team in the coming years."

Morgane Metraux is a very accomplished golfer who will quickly earn the opportunity to play among Florida State's top players in the starting line-up. Her vast international experiences will serve her well at Florida State as she quickly develops into a top collegiate golfer. She was the No. 1 ranked player in the final Swiss Girls' ranking in 2013 and finished second at the 2013 Swiss Girls' Championship

"Morgane has reached a very high level of golf in a very short time due to her desire to excel and be the best," said Bond. "She is coming off a great 2013 season where she has had tremendous success. I am looking for great things from her and am excited to see what the future holds for her and our team."

Kayla Bloor and Sherrell Buckley will also work to earn playing time in the Seminoles' line-up as sophomores. Bloor did not play as a freshman and Buckley played in one event during her first season as a Seminole.

"We have a number of quality players, players who have a great deal of experience and we have more depth on this team than on any other team I have coached," said Bond. "The combination of quality players, those with experience and most importantly a deep roster full of quality players sets us up for a successful year. As with any team, even the best teams in the country, all of the players have to be willing to work every day and that's what I expect from this team.

"Last year was the start of a breakthrough for our program. I expect the breakthrough and more this year."

HEAD COACH AMY BOND

FIFTH-YEAR HEAD COACH TAKING SEMINOLES TO NEW HEIGHTS



With her student-athlete first approach, her love of the game of golf, her unbridled enthusiasm for Florida State and her knack for recruiting top-level talent, Amy Bond is constantly working to take the Seminole women's golf program to a higher level. That higher level is in the class room, in her relationships with her players, on the golf course and in her role as the President of the Women's Golf Coaches Association.

In her fifth season as the Seminoles' head coach, Bond continues to build a team that will consistently qualify for the NCAA Championship Tournament, compete for ACC and national championships, produce academically successful student-athletes and develop All-ACC and All-American student-athletes.

In her first four seasons at Florida State, the Seminoles have played in four NCAA Championships, produced the school's first NCAA Regional Champion (Maria Salinas in 2012), earned three All-American citations (Matilda Castren in 2014, Salinas in 2011 and 2013), earned five All-ACC Selections (Salinas in 2011 and 2012, Jessica Negron in 2013, Castren and Alex Milan in 2014) and had 12 players earn All-ACC Academic honors.

As the fifth head coach in the history of the program, Bond's commitment to success at Florida State has become a way of life. First as a player, then an assistant coach and now as its head coach, Bond's energy and enthusiasm for elevating and securing the tradition of the program is rivaled by few coaches in all of collegiate golf.

As a player she earned a spot on the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, as an assistant coach she helped the Seminoles to three NCAA Tournament appearances and as the head coach, she has led Florida State to four NCAA Championship appearances in her first four years as the head coach of the Seminoles.

Throughout her career at Florida State, she has played as one of the Seminoles top players (she was named Florida State's team MVP in 1997, 1998 and 1999), played with a number of touring professionals (including LPGA major winner Karen Stupples) and has coached many of Florida State's recent greats including the only four-time golf All-American in school history (Caroline Westrup). While achieving success during her career as a player and a coach. Bond has never lost sight of her ultimate goal: the success and achievements of her student-athletes.

In her nine seasons as a Seminole coach (five as an assistant and four as the head coach), every student-athlete who has played golf at Florida State has earned her bachelor's degree and every one played on at least two NCAA Tournament teams during their careers. The Seminoles are among the NCAA leaders with a perfect APR rating during the first four seasons on Bond's head coaching tenure at Florida State.

RETURNING HOME

Amy Bond joined the long and illustrious list of Florida State alumni who have returned to their alma mater when she was named the Seminoles' head coach on June 25, 2010. She returned to her Seminole roots after an outstanding playing career at Florida State (1995-99) during which she finished in 30th place in the 1999 NCAA Championship Finals and a five-year career as an assistant coach (2001-06) when she helped lead the Seminoles to the NCAA Championships three times. Bond is one of four Florida State alumni who are current head coaches at Florida State joining Frank Bradley (men's and women's swimming and diving), Jennifer Hyde (women's tennis) and Mike Martin (baseball).

FIRST FOUR YEARS AT FLORIDA STATE

Florida State head coach Amy Bond has guided each of her first four Seminole teams to the NCAA Tournament. Including her four years as a Seminole player (1996-99), her five years as a Seminole assistant coach (2002-06) and four as Florida State's head coach, Bond has participated in 11 of 13 NCAA Regional Championships while wearing the Garnet and Gold. The Seminoles will look to play in their school record 10th consecutive NCAA Championship Tournament in 2015.

2014 WAS A SPECIAL SEASON

Amy Bond led Florida State to its school record ninth consecutive NCAA Regional Championship, to the team championship at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate, had one player earn All-American honors (Matilda Castren), and had two players earn All-ACC honors (Castren and Alex Milan) in 2014. In earning All-ACC honors, Castren established a school record for low stroke average in a single season with her 71.83 scoring mark. Florida State's team victory at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate was the first team championship by the Seminoles since the 2010 season when it won the Bryan National Collegiate championship.

BOND AS A TOURNAMENT HOST

Bond's passion for growing the game of golf has increased her desire to plan and host large-scale tournaments at Florida State. She hosted the NCAA East Regional in 2014, a 24-team event that showcased the best in women's collegiate golf in the East regional for the first time in school history. Bond will play host to the Third Annual Florida State Match-Up in February of 2015 as she continues to attract high level competition to the city of Tallahassee on an annual basis.

SUCCESS AT PRINCETON

Bond was successful in her first head coaching position at Princeton (2006-10) as she guided the Tigers to eight tournament victories and top four finishes in four Ivy League championship tournaments. The Tigers finished in second place in the Ivy league championship in 2007. Bond coached Susannah Aboff to consecutive Ivy League individual championships in 2008 and 2009. It marked only the third time in league history that a player had won consecutive individual conference championships. Aboff earned All-Ivy League honors three times during her career in becoming just the second player in school history to be named to the all-league team three times in her career. During her four seasons at Princeton, only the Tigers and Harvard performed consistently in the conference championship by finishing in the top four of the team championship from 2007-10.

RECRUITING SUCCESS AT FLORIDA STATE

During her first four seasons as the head coach at Florida State, she has continued the tradition of recruiting talented players and outstanding student-athletes to Tallahassee. Her lists of top recruits include Matilda Castren, who earned All-American Second Team Honors, and Laure Castelain who was named to the WGCA All-America Scholar Athlete team in 2014. In five years as an assistant coach at Florida State, Bond

helped recruit four players who earned All-ACC honors a total of eight times and formed the nucleus of two top 20 ranked teams. The Seminoles finished in a tie for 16th nationally in 2006 and in a tie for 19th nationally in 2004. She was also instrumental in recruiting Caroline Westrup - the only four-time All-American and four-time All-ACC selection in school history.

RECRUITING SUCCESS AT PRINCETON

During her four seasons at Princeton, Bond coached/recruited two players (Susannah Aboff and Kelly Shon) who qualified to play in at least one NCAA Regional Championship each and five players who earned All-Ivy League honors a total of 11 times. Aboff won eight individual tournament championships during her career and finished in a tie for 23rd place at the NCAA East Regional Championship in 2009 - the third highest NCAA regional finish in school history. Shon played in the 2011 and 2012 US Women's Open and was ranked No. 4 nationally among junior golfers at the time she was recruited. She is still the highest ranked junior recruit to ever attend an Ivy League institution. Shon earned All-American Honorable Mention Honors from the Women's Golf Coaches' Association in 2013, played in the 2013 NCAA Rational Championship, was named the Ivy League Golfer of the Year and won Ivy League Championship in 2013

PROFESSIONAL PLAYERS

Bond has recruited and coached seven players who have played, or who are currently playing professional golf. She recruited and coached Kristin Tamulis (Florida State) who is currently playing on the LPGA Tour. She also recruited and coached four-time All-American Caroline Westrup (Florida State) who earned her LPGA Tour Card for the 2014 season (and who played in the 2013 U.S. Open), another who is playing on the LPGA Tour (Lacey Agnew), one who is currently playing in the Futures Tour (Macarena Silva), one who earned success on the Futures Tour (Jaclyn Burch), one (Maria Salinas) on the European Tour and two players (Susannah Aboff, Marlowe Boukis and Michelle Grilli) who began their professional careers on the LPGA Futures Tour.

SEMINOLES AT THE 2013 U.S. WOMEN'S OPEN

Bond and the Seminoles were well represented at the 2013 U.S. Women's Open at Sebonack Golf Club with four of the top players in the history of the program – Karen Stupples, Kristin Tamulis, Macarena Silva and Caroline Westrup – all playing in the event. Prior to the event, Bond said of the one of the greats foursomes in program history: "This is a great week for each of the four players and for the Florida State women's golf program. To have four of our players in the U.S. Open in the same year is exciting and illustrates the rich tradition of our program. I am very happy for Karen, who I have known for so many years and for Kris, Maca and Caroline who I had the good fortune of coaching during their careers at Florida State. Playing in the U.S. Open is an awesome accomplishment for all of them and I couldn't be happier for all of them."

BOND ON THE NATIONAL SCENE

Bond is the president of the Women's Golf Coaches Association Board of Directors; she was elevated to the position in December of 2013. She has risen steadily through the ranks of the national governing board after serving the organization as its treasurer. Bond began on the WGCA Board as its treasurer (2009-12), served as its vice president (2012-13) and is currently serving a two-year term as its president. The WGCA was formed in 1983 as an organization to promote participation in women's collegiate golf. The vision of WGCA since its inception has been to encourage the playing of intercollegiate golf for women in correlation with a general objective of education and in accordance with the highest tradition of intercollegiate competition.

ACADEMIC ACCOLADES

Bond has made it part of her coaching philosophy to demand outstanding academic achievement from every one of her players. She began developing that philosophy as a player at Florida State as she was named an Academic All-American in 1998 and 1999 and earned ACC Academic Honor Roll accolades three times during her playing career (1996, 98, 99). A total of 35 players have been named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll during her Seminole career as a member of the Seminoles' coaching staff, five players (for a total of eight awards) have earned the honor have been named to the All-ACC Women's Golf Team in her first four seasons as the Seminoles' head coach. She has had one player named to the All-America Scholar Team and 11 players named to the ACC Academic team during her first four years as the Seminoles' head coach.

TOP 50 PLAYER IN ACC HISTORY

Bond was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary team in 2002 along with Seminole greats Karen Stupples and Louise Wright. Bond was a 1998 All-ACC selection and the Seminoles' top player from 1996-99. She earned ten top-10 finishes during her career and was named the Seminoles' Most Valuable Player each year during her career. Bond competed in the NCAA Championship tournament in 1999 and played in three NCAA regional tournaments while finishing in the top 20 in four consecuive ACC Championship tournaments. She was an All Region selection in 1999 and was the medalist at the 1998 Ryder/Florida State Championship tournament.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAMPIONS

The Seminoles women's golf team has won 12 of the last 13 (including 12 consecutive) Athletic Director's Cup for Service at Florida State's annual Golden Nole Banquet. The Athletic Director's Cup for Service is presented annually and is the most prestigious award given to the Seminole student-athletes. It goes to the team that contributes the most service hours to the community over the course of an entire year. The Seminoles won the Athletic Director's Cup for Service in each of Bond's five years as an assistant coach and in her first three seasons as the Seminoles' head coach.

PERSONAL

An Ocala, Fla., native, Bond earned a bachelor's degree in sport management from Florida State in 1997 before earning her master's degree in sport administration from Florida State in 1999. Bond's twin brother Tommy, is the Director of Athletics and head baseball coach at Trinity Catholic in Ocala, Fla. Tommy led Trinity Catholic to the 4A state championship in 2014.

ASSISTANT COACH MATT SAVAGE

DYNAMIC ASSISTANT COACH



In his third season as an assistant coach at Florida State for both the Seminole men's and women's teams, Matt Savage has earned a leadership role on the Seminoles' coaching staff because of his accomplishments as a collegiate player and the success he earned as a professional golfer. Because of his experiences and his incredible ability to relate to the Seminoles' players, he has quickly become one of the nation's hot young assistant coaches.

Savage plays an integral role in the continued success of the Seminoles as he works with each of the players on a daily basis while assisting with the day-to-day administrative responsibilities of each team. Savage works with both programs in the areas of skill development, recruiting, practice planning and match coaching.

In 2014, Savage helped the Seminole men to their third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championship finals. The Seminoles finished in fifth place in the NCAA Raleigh Regional and in second place in the ACC Championship for the second consecutive season. Florida State has won four tournament championships during his first two years as an assistant coach for the Seminoles. Savage helped the Seminole women's golf team to an appearance in the NCAA Championship tournament and to the team championship at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate.

While helping the Seminoles earn team success he is adept and working with Florida State's golfers on an individual level. He works with current Seminole sophomore Jack Maguire - who earned All-America honors in 2014. was the 2014 ACC Freshman of the Year, an All-ACC selection and a member of the 2014 United States Palmer Cup Team and Hank Lebioda – the 2013 ACC Freshman of the Year and a two-time All-ACC selection. He also works with Florida State sophomore Matilda Castren who earned All-American and All-ACC honors and set the school record for lowest stroke average in 2014.

Savage is one of the top golfers in Seminole history. He earned All-America honors in 2007, was the first player in school history to earn All-ACC honors three times, played on one NCAA Championship final and four NCAA Regional Championship teams and led the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history in 2008. Savage closed his career in 2009 with a 73.09 scoring average in 44 career tournaments - the fifth best average in school history.

Among Savage's greatest attributes is his ability to communicate with players and coaches alike and concisely teach the sport of golf to the Seminoles' student-athletes. Because of his recent experiences as a player and now as a coach, Savage's ability to relate to today's collegiate golfer allows him to expect the unexpected while creating long term plans and effectively teaching them on a daily basis.



Savage was one of the building blocks of the Seminole men's program under Director of Golf Trey Jones from 2006 through his graduation from Florida State in 2009. The Seminoles were nationally ranked during each of his four seasons and finished the 2008 season ranked 11th after winning the ACC Championship for the first time in school history. The Seminoles were ranked as high as No. 7 nationally and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA West Regional Championship in 2008.

Savage began his professional career on the NGA Hooters Tour soon after his graduation from Florida State and enjoyed three prosperous years on golf's third largest tour. He won his first event as a professional - the 2009 Kentucky Open - and was among the top money winners on the tour during his three seasons.

INDIVIDUAL RECOGNITION

Savage helped coach three All-Americans - Daniel Berger, Chase Seiffert and Jack Maguire - two ACC Freshmen of the Year and eight All-ACC selections - five men and three women - in his first two seasons as an assistant coach at Florida State. Daniel Berger earned PING and GolfWeek All-American First Team Honors in 2013, Seiffert earned All-American Honorable Mention honors by GolfWeek in 2013 and Maguire was an All-American Second Team selection by GolfWeek in 2014. Berger, Seiffert, Maguire and current junior Hank Lebioda have all earned All-ACC Honors with Lebioda and Maguire earning ACC Freshmen of the Year honors. He also helped coach Matilda Castren, who earned All-American and All-ACC honors and set the school record for lowest stroke average, and All-ACC selection Alex Milan in 2014 while Jessica Negron earned All-ACC and All-West Region honors in 2013.

OUTSTANDING SUCCESS IN 2014

Savage helped Florida State to outstanding team and individual success in 2014. The men's golf team finished in second place in the ACC championship, fifth in the NCAA Raleigh Regional and played in the NCAA Championship Finals for the third consecutive year. He helped coach All-American Second Team, ACC Freshman of the Year and All-ACC selection Jack Maguire and All-ACC selection Hank Lebioda. The Seminole men won the USF Invitational where they posted the best single round team and tournament score in team history in winning the championship. The Seminole women finished seventh in the ACC Championship and in a tie for 11th place in the NCAA East Regional which was held at Southwood Golf Club in Tallahassee. He helped coach freshman Matilda Castren who earned All-American Second Team and All-ACC Honors and who was the runner-up for ACC Player and Rookie of the Year honors as well as All-ACC selection Alex Milan.

NATIONAL SUCCESS

Savage earned medalist honors at the 2008 North and South Amateur Championship at Pinehurst, advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2006 U.S. Amateur Public Link Championship and played in the 2006 U.S. Amateur Championship.

2008 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Savage led Florida State to its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship on April 20, 2008 as the Seminoles defeated Duke by three strokes at the 55th Annual ACC Championship at the Old North State Club at Uwharrie Point. The Seminoles defeated the Blue Devils by four strokes in the third round as they rallied from a one stroke deficit after two rounds to claim the school's first ever ACC championship in the sport of golf. Each of the five team members contributed to the victory as the Seminoles closed the 54-hole tournament with four players under par and only one at over par. Savage led the way with an eight-under par 208 score and finished in a tie for third place in the individual standings.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS AS A PLAYER

In addition to leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history in 2008, Savage helped Florida State to four tournament championships during his career: the Inverness Intercollegiate (Fall 2007), the Seminole Intercollegiate (Spring 2008), the ACC Championship (Spring 2008) and the Florida State Spring Break Invitational (Spring 2009).

ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Savage earned regional All-American honors in both 2008 and 2009 and earned All-American Honorable Mention honors from the Golf Coaches' Association of America in 2007. He was named to the PING / All-Southeast Regional All-American team in 2008 as he led the Seminoles to the ACC Championship and was named to the Ping / Southeast Regional All-American team in 2009 and led Florida State to an appearance in the 2009 East Regional Championships.

ASSISTANT COACH ROBERT DUCK

NATIONALLY REKNOWNED ASSISTANT COACH



In his fourth season as an assistant coach with both the Seminoles' men's and women's programs, Robert Duck has helped Florida State continue its tradition of NCAA appearances, All-American selections and All-ACC performers. He works with both programs at Florida State in the areas of recruiting and player development along with his daily team and individual coaching responsibilities.

Duck has helped coach both programs into the NCAA Tournament in each of his first three years while working with All-Americans and All-ACC honorees on both teams. In his first three seasons at Florida State, the men have produced three All-Americans, seven All-ACC selections, one ACC Golfer of the Year and two ACC Freshmen of the Year while the women have produced two All-Americans and four All-ACC performers.

During his first three seasons, the Seminole men and the Seminole women have appeared in the NCAA Tournament three times each with the men finishing in ninth in the team standings in the 2012 NCAA Championship finals and tied for 11th in the 2013 NCAA Championship finals. In addition, neither team has finished outside of the top five in the ACC Championships as the men have finished in second (twice) and third once and the women have earned two fourth place finishes with Duck as a an assistant coach.

Duck's work with Florida State's players has led to incredible individual success in his first three seasons in Tallahassee. His teaching abilities and coaching philosophies have helped accelerate the careers of two of the top men's players in school history - Brooks Koepka and Daniel Berger - as well as three of the top performers on the women's team - Matilda Castren, Maria Salinas and Jessica Negron. Koepka was named the ACC Golfer of the Year in 2012 and was a three-time All-ACC selection while Berger earned All-ACC honors and played for the United States' Palmer Cup team in 2013. Duck also works with current Seminole sophomore Jack Maguire - who earned All-America honors in 2014, was the 2014 ACC Freshman of the Year, an All-ACC selection and a member of the 2014 United States Palmer Cup Team. Castren earned All-American and All-ACC honors and set the school record for lowest stroke average in 2014, Salinas finished in second place in the NCAA Central Regional and earned All-American honors in 2012 and Negron earned All-ACC honors in 2013.

Duck has helped coach the Florida State men to six tournament championships in his first three seasons. The Seminoles earned tournament championships at the 2012 Seminole Intercollegiate, the 2012 FAU Spring Break Invitational, the 2013 Gator Invitational, the 2013 Seminole Intercollegiate,



the 2013 Gary Koch Intercollegiate and the 2014 USF Invitational. He helped the Seminole women win the team championship at the 2014 Web.com/Marsh landing Intercollegiate and advance to the 2012 NCAA Central Regional, 2013 NCAA West Regional and 2014 NCAA East Regional Championships.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Duck, one of the rising stars in collegiate coaching, is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Florida State. He was the acting head coach at Augusta State in 2002, served the Jaguars as a volunteer assistant coach during the 2001-02 season and was an assistant coach for the program during the 2002-03 season. During his tenure as the acting coach at Augusta State, the Jaguars were ranked as high as No. 9 nationally.

COLLEGIATE PLAYING EXPERIENCE

Duck enjoyed a standout career at Augusta State (1998-01) where he earned All-America honors as a sophomore (1999) and led the Jaguars to three NCAA Championship appearances (1998, 1999, 2001). He is one of the top golfers in the storied history of the Augusta State program and remains listed prominently in the record book nearly 15 years after his playing career ended.

COLLEGIATE COACHING EXPERIENCE

Duck's ability to communicate with the players he coaches is illustrated by the success those players have earned on the golf course. In in first three seasons at Florida State he has worked with five All-Americans, eight All-ACC honorees, one ACC Golfer of the Year and two ACC Freshmen of the Year. Each of the six teams (three men's and three women's) he has helped coach at Florida State has played in the NCAA Tournament.

2014 WAS A BANNER YEAR

Duck enjoyed his best season as an assistant coach at Florida State in 2014. The men's golf team finished in second place in the ACC championship, fifth in the NCAA Raleigh Regional and played in the NCAA Championship Finals for the third consecutive year. He helped coach All-American Second Team, ACC

Freshman of the Year and All-ACC selection Jack Maguire and All-ACC selection Hank Lebioda. The Seminole men won the USF Invitational where the team posted the best single round team and tournament score in team history in winning the championship. The Seminole women finished seventh in the ACC Championship and in a tie for 11th place in the NCAA East Regional which was held at Southwood Golf Club in Tallahassee. He helped coach freshman Matilda Castren who earned All-American Second Team and All-ACC Honors and who was the runner-up for ACC Player and Rookie of the Year honors as well as All-ACC selection Alex Milan.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY AS A PLAYER

Duck led Augusta State (now Georgia Regents University) to three NCAA Championship tournament appearances and helped the Jaguars to a seventh place finish as a senior. The seventh place finish was the best in program history at the time. With the foundation put in place by Duck and his teammates, the Jaguars won the NCAA Titles in 2010 and 2011.

SUCCESS IN PROFESSIONAL WORLD

Duck enjoyed a successful career as a manager of professional golfers for the Hambric Sports Group (2003-2012) before accepting his current assistant coaching position at Florida State. Based in London, Duck was the supervisor of the European Division of Hambric Stellar Golf. He was a player manager who oversaw public relation and marketing for seven clients including 1988 Masters champion Sandy Lyle, 2005 European Tour Rookie of the Year Gonzalo Fernandez-Castano, former Augusta State All-American Oliver Wilson and Francesco Molinari.

PERSONAL

Duck is married to the former Michelle Digsby. The couple has two daughters, Annabel (7) and Hannah (4). He earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from Augusta State in 2001. A native of Northampton, England, he represented Great Britain-Ireland as a member of the 1998 Palmer Cup team. Duck played in the 1997 European Amateur Championship and finished tied as the runner-up with Sergio Garcia and Luke Donald.

DIRECTOR OF GOLF TREY JONES

ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP COLLEGIATE COACHES



Now in his 12th season as the head men's golf coach and Director of Golf, Trey Jones has lifted the sport of men's golf at Florida State to new heights. Top national finishes, All-Americans, professional success and academic achievment have become synonympus with the Fllorida State progream under Jones.

Under his direction, there is no limit on how high the Seminole progrma siwll go.

Jones is responsible for attracting nationally ranked recruiting classes, upgrading the Seminoles' schedule and creating one of the most functional player development facilities in college golf. Jones continues annually to build on the Seminoles' success in developing the nation's top talent into national contenders and collegiate golf's elite players. Named the 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year as he led the Seminoles to the first conference championship in the sport of golf, Jones is no stranger to competing with the nation's best in one of the top conferences for college golf.

Building championship teams is nothing new to Jones who has earned four conference coach of the year awards and led 13 of his 18 teams at the Division I level to the NCAA Championship tournament. His teams consistently hold prominent places in the national rankings, are adept at winning conference championships and are annually among the top producers of All-American and all-conference performers.

In his first 11 years in Florida State, Jones has become one of the winningest coaches in school history. He is the only coach to lead the Seminoles to eight NCAA Tournament appearances (no other coach has led Florida State to more than five appearances) and he is ranked first with 13 tournament championships (second is nine by Don Veller). The Seminoles have appeared in a school record nine consecutive NCAA Tournaments entering the 2014-15 season.

2014 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State once again returned to the NCAA Championship Finals, but it was with a much different looking team from the previous year. The Seminoles fielded the youngest team in the tournament with two freshmen, two sophomores and a senior and was one of only three schools (in a field of 30), with only one upperclassman in the line-up. Freshman Jack Maguire became the first freshman to be named an All-American at Florida State as he was named to the second team by Golfweek and to the third team but the GCAA. Maguire and sophomore Hank Lebioda were named to the All-ACC team and Maguire was selected as the ACC Freshman of the Year. The Seminoles smashed apart the record book at the USF Invitational as the team posted the lowest round (24-under 264) and lowest three-round tournament score (41-under 823) in school history. Maguire created his mark with the lowest round in school history (10-under



62) and second lowest tournament score (16-under 200).

2013 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in 11th place at the 2013 NCAA Championship Finals at the Capital City Club Crabapple in Atlanta, Ga. The Seminoles are just one of two teams to finish in the top 11 of the NCAAs in three or the last four years. Sophomore Daniel Berger led the team at the Championships finishing tied for second with a 6-under 204. Both Berger and Chase Seiffert earned All-American status for the year as Hank Lebioda was named 2013 ACC Freshman of the Year.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State earned an eighth place national finish at the 2012 NCAA Championship Finals to mark the second time in three seasons the Seminoles finished in the top eight of the standings at the national tournament. The Seminoles entered the championship ranked No. 19 in the nation by GolfStat and finished as one of only two teams ranked outside of the top eight to finish in the top eight of the final standings.

2010 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in a tie for third place at the 2010 NCAA Championship Finals to earn the best national finish in school history. The Seminoles fell to Augusta State (the 2010 National Champion) in the semifinals of the championship tournament after defeating Texas Tech in the first round of match play. The Seminoles led the stroke play portion of the tournament and finished in second place to earn the No. 2 seed in the match play portion of the event. The third place finish at the NCAA Championship marked the best finish in school history - one better than the Seminoles fourth place national finish in 1957 and tied for fourth place finish in 1958.

2008 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State, which was led by All-Americans Jonas Blixt and Matt Savage, won its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference championship as it defeated Duke by three strokes at the 2008 ACC Championship at the Old North State Club at Uwharrie Point. The Seminoles defeated Duke as they rallied from a one stroke deficit after two rounds

to claim the school's first ever ACC championship in the sport of golf. Each of the five team members contributed to the victory as the Seminoles closed the 54-hole tournament with four players under par. Blixt and Savage led the way with eight-under par 208 scores as they both finished in a tie for third in the individual standings.

RECRUITING

Known as one of the nation's most dynamic recruiters, Jones is nationally recognized as one of the top talent scouts in all of collegiate golf. His ability to recruit talented players, which in turn helps him build solid teams, is one of the aspects of coaching that has made Jones a top Division I coach. Florida State's recruiting class ranked fourth best in the nation in 2007, fifth best in 2008, sixth best in 2005 and among the nation's top 15 in 2006, 2010 and 2012.

BROOKS KOEPKA

Jones coached Brooks Koepka - the school record holder for lowest stroke average in a single season (71.09) and for a career (71.85) - the ACC Golfer of the Year in 2010 and 2012 and a three-time All-ACC selection. Koepka was named the ACC Golfer of the Year twice, the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2009 and earned All-American twice in his career in leading the Seminoles to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and two top-10 NCAA Championship Finals finishes. As a senior, Koepka tied the school record with a nine under par score of 63 in the third round of the FAU Spring Break Invitational and set the school record with his 199 total for three rounds of the event. Koepka won three events as a senior - at the Brickvard Collegiate Championship, the Seminole Intercollegiate, the FAU Spring Break Invitational. Koepka secured his status on the PGA Tour by tying for fourth place in the 2014 U.S. Open.

JONAS BLIXT

Jones coached one of Florida State's all-time best players - Jonas Blixt - to All-American honors and the first individual ACC Championship in school history. Blixt earned Ping/Division I All-American First Team honors in 2008 and Ping/Division I All-American second team honors in 2007. He is one of only three players in school history to earn All-American First and Second Team honors during his career. Blixt won the ACC individual champion-

ship in 2007 to become the first Seminole to win ACC medalist honors. He helped lead Florida State to the 2008 ACC Championship - the first ACC golf championship in school history - and earned All-ACC honors twice during his career. Blixt is currently playing on the PGA Tour with two wins, the 2012 Frys.com Open and 2013 Greenbrier Classic. He finished tied for second in the 2014 Masters Tournament and 4th in the 2013 PGA Championship.

DREW KITTLESON

Jones also coached Drew Kittleson, who will long be remembered as one of the top golfers in school history. Kittleson played in the Masters Championship at Augusta in 2009, the U.S. Open at Bethpage Black in 2009, four NCAA Championships and four ACC Championships during his standout career as a Seminole. He earned All-American Honorable Mention honors from Ping/Golf Coaches' Association of America in 2010 and Southeast Regional All-American honors in 2011. Kittleson helped lead Florida State to the 2008 ACC Championship - the first ACC golf championship in school history and to a third place finish at the NCAA Division I Championship finals in 2010 - the highest national finish in school history. After a second place finish at the 2009 U.S. Amateur, he earned exemptions to play in both the 2009 Masters and U.S. Open Championships. Kittleson is currently playing on the Web.com Tour.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Committed to the academic and athletic success of his student-athletes, Jones has coached 31 members of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, seven members of the ACC Academic Golf Team and two members of the Golf Coaches' Association of America All-American Scholar team. His team was also nationally recognized in 2010 as one of the few schools in the NCAA to achieve a perfect APR score of 1000 since the inception of the Academic Progress Rate program in 2003. During his tenure at Georgia State, he coached 10 members of the Atlantic Sun All-Academic team and 20 members of the TAAC All-Academic team.

JONES NATIONALLY

Jones has been an active member of the Golf Coaches Association of America since 1993. He is currently a member of the steering committee for the Collegiate Golf Hall of Fame. Jones served the board as the Division I Director for the East Region and served as the chair of the District 3 South Regional NCAA Selection Committee. He was also a representative in the District 3 South NCAA Selection Committee from 1999-2002.

GEORGIA STATE

Trey Jones was named the head coach at Georgia State in 1995 and immediately began to assemble one of the dominant men's golf programs in the southeastern United States. He led the Panthers onto the national scene for the first time in school history including their first appearance in the NCAA Championship tournament (2003), first conference championship (1998, Trans America Athletic Conference) and highest national ranking (20th during the 2000 season). Jones was responsible for the program in its entirety including recruiting, coaching, fundraising, public relations, strength and conditioning, scheduling and ll budgetary matters. Under Jones' leadership, Georgia State amassed 91 wins over SEC teams and 33 wins over ACC opponents from 1997-2003. During that period, the Panthers earned 23 victories over top 25 opponents.

PERSONAL

Jones is married to the former Cathy McVeigh, who is the coordinator of financial aid for student-athletes at Florida State. They are the proud parents of a daughter, Jordan (13) and a son, Drew (9). Jones earned his bachelor's degree in health and physical education with a minor in business administration from North Alabama in 1991. Jones is a 24-year veteran of the collegiate coaching ranks. He was the head men's coach and Director of Golf Operations at Georgia State for eight years (1996-2003) before becoming only the fifth coach in the history of the Seminole program in 2004. Prior to his career at Georgia State, Jones was an assistant coach at Wallace State Junior College (1992-95) and his alma mater North Alabama (1991). Jones developed his teaching, coaching and recruiting philosophies as he helped hone those programs into national contenders.







SEMINOLES PLAY IN SCHOOL RECORD NINTH CONSECUTIVE NCAA REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP



FLORIDA STATE PLAYS IN SCHOOL RECORD NINTH STRAIGHTNCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State played in its school record ninth consecutive NCAA Regional Championship, finished in seventh place in the ACC Championship, won the team championship at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate, had one player earn All-American honors (Matilda Castren), and had two players (Matilda Castren and Alex Milan) earn All-ACC honors as it completed a successful campaign under fourth-year head coach Amy Bond. In earning All-ACC honors, Castren established a school record for low stroke average in a single season with her 71.83 scoring mark. The Seminoles have played in the regional championships in each season since 2006 and have finished among the top five teams at the



ACC Championships in four of the last five seasons. Florida State's team victory at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate was the first team championship by the Seminoles since the 2010 season when it won the Bryan National Collegiate championship.

CASTREN EARNS ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Freshman Matilda Castren, who established the record for the best stroke average in a single-season in school history, earned Second-Team All-American honors by the Women's Golf Coaches Association and GolfWeek. She is the first Seminole since Caroline Westrup in 2008 to earn second team or higher All-American honors and is only the second freshman in school history to earn All-American honors. Castren was one of four players from the ACC who earned All-American First or Second team honors and was one of eight ACC golfers who were named to the First, Second or Honorable Mention teams by the WGCA. She was one of only 10 freshmen among the 40 players named to the First, Second or Honorable Mention All-American teams by the WGCA. "It's been a great first year at Florida State," said Castren. "I'm very grateful for my teammates, coaches, and all the people who helped me throughout my freshman year. It means a lot to me to be an All-American. I'm looking forward to my sophomore year."

CASTREN SECOND IN ACC IN AVERAGE

Florida State University freshman Matilda Castren finished her first season as a Seminoles with a school-record 71.83 stroke average in 29 rounds during 10 tournaments. She finished second in the ACC in stroke average.

CASTREN AND MILAN NAMED ALL-ACC

Matilda Castren, who enjoyed one of the finest freshman seasons in the history of the Florida State women's golf program and Alex Milan, who enjoyed the best season of her three-year career as a Seminole were named to the 2014 All-ACC Women's Golf team as selected by the league's 11 head coaches. Castren is only the second freshman in school history to

earn All-ACC honors while the combination of Castren and Milan marks the fourth time in school history two Seminoles have been named to the All-ACC Women's Golf team in the same season. The selections of Castren and Milan to the All-ACC team marks the 14th consecutive season that at least one Florida State player has been named to the All-ACC team. Castren finished her freshman season with a 71.83 stroke average. Milan ranked second on the team with a career-low 74.44 stroke average. Florida State was one of only four of the 11 teams to have multiple players named to the All-ACC team. The Seminoles were joined by only conference champion Duke (three), NC State (two) and Clemson (two) as teams who had two or more players named to the All-ACC team. Florida State's two selections to the All-ACC team marks the first time since the 2010 season that multiple Seminoles have earned all-league honors.



FLORIDA STATE IN THE RANKINGS

Florida State completed the 2013-14 season ranked 35th nationally by GolfStat. The Seminoles were ranked as high as No. 22 during the 2013-14 fall and spring seasons. Freshman Matilda Castren finished her first collegiate season ranked 16th nationally among individuals.

CASTREN EARNS TWO VICTORIES

Seminole freshman Matilda Castren, the leading golfer in the ACC, earned victories at the Florida State Match-Up (206, -10) and at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate (school record 204, -12) during her freshman season. Castren became only the fifth golfer in school history to win at least two events in a season and fell one win shy of tying the all-time Seminoles record for wins in a season. Nadia Ste-Marie is the all-time Seminole leader with three wins during the 1998-99 season.

Junior Alex Milan earned the first individual title of her collegiate career at the Second Annual Florida Challenge on the Quarry Course at the Black Diamond Golf Club on January 27, 2014 in the Seminoles' spring season opening event. She carded scores of 72-70 in the 36-hole event which served as the first tournament of the season for the Big 6 women's golf teams in the state of Florida.

SEMINOLES IN NCAA EAST REGIONAL

Freshman Matilda Castren finished in a tie for 18th place in the individual standings, and



the Seminole women's golf team finished in a tie for 11th place in the team standings at the NCAA Division I East Regional women's golf championships at SouthWood Golf Club.

BOND WINS NINTH CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State's fourth-year head coach Amy Bond won her ninth career team championship when she guided the Seminoles to the victory at the spring 2014 Web.com/Marsh Landing Invitational. The championship was her first as Florida State's head coach and added on to her eight team championships while she was the head coach at Princeton (2006-10). Prior to leading Florida State to the championship of the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate, she led Princeton to the ECAC and Raor-EE Invitational championships in 2009. Florida State's three medalists (two by Matilda Castren and one by Alex Milan) in 2014 were the most in a single season under Bond and the most in a single season at Florida State since the fall 1988 and spring 1989 seasons when Nadia Ste-Marie won three individual titles by herself.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC

Florida State finished the 2014 fall and spring seasons with the third lowest team scoring average with a 295.6 per round average. The Seminoles trailed only Duke (288.7) and Maryland (291.7) in the conference statistics. The Seminoles' season best single round score of 280 (-8) was the fifth best single round score in the ACC this year. The Seminoles also boast three of the top 20 individual golfers in the ACC for the 2014 fall and spring seasons: Matilda Castren (First, 71.83), Alex Milan (14th, 74.44) and Laure Castelain (20th, 75.19). Florida State, Duke, Miami and Virginia were the only four schools in the 11-member ACC to have at least three golfers in the top 10 of the individual scoring for the conference in 2014.

CASTREN'S 66 TIES FOR LEAGUE BEST

Freshman Matilda Castren's 66 in the second round of the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate was tied for the best single round score by an ACC golfer in 2014. She was tied with Brittany Marschand of NC State (66 in the first round of the fall 2013 Cougar Classic) and Yu Liu of Duke (66 in the third round of the spring 2014 Ping/ASU Invitational) for low round honors in the ACC.

SEMINOLES HAD MULTIPLE WINNERS IN 2014

Florida State's line-up in 2014 featured two players – freshman Matilda Castren and Alex Milan – who both won individual tournament championships. Castren won the titles at the Florida State Match-Up and at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate and Milan won the championship the Second Annual Florida Challenge. It marked the first time since the 2009-10 season that Florida State had multiple players win individual championships. The last time the Seminoles had multiple winners in the same season came as Marcrena Silva finished in a tie for first place at the University of Kentucky / Bettie Lou Evans Invitational in the fall of 2009 and Lacey Agnew won the title at the Pinehurst Challenge in the spring of 2010.

CASTREN SETS RECORD

Freshman Matilda Castren set the school record for lowest stroke average a single season with her 71.83 mark in 29 rounds during 10 events in 2014

SEMINOLES LED BY A FRESHMAN

Freshman Matilda Castren led the Seminoles with a school-record 71.83 stroke average. It marked the first time since the 2006 season when Caroline Westrup led the Seminoles with a 73.63 average that a freshman had led the Seminoles in the stroke average category. Castren is only the third freshman to lead the Seminoles in stroke average in a single season in school history.

FSU, CASTREN EARN NATIONAL HONOR Florida State and its freshman star Matilda Castren were named the national women's collegiate team and national women's individual of the week by GolfWeek.com on April 14, 2014 after posting runaway wins at the Web.com/Marsh Landing Intercollegiate in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla. The Seminoles won team championship by an incredible 24 strokes while Castren won the individual title by four strokes.




1981 AIAW NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

With two players finishing in the top 15 of the individual standings, the 1981 Florida State Women's golf team won the AIAW National Championship. The Semi-noles, led by coach Verlyn Giles, finished in the top four of all ten regular season tournaments in which they participated. The team won the Lady Gator Invitational, the Lady Paladin Invitational, the Dick McGuire Invitational and the South Florida Invitational in Tampa, Fla. They also finished with one second place finish, four third place finishes, and one fourth place finish.

After the first two rounds of the four-day tournament Florida State found itself down by eight strokes – behind the host school, Georgia, and defending national champion Tulsa. The Seminoles shot a tournamentbest 298 in the third round and took over the lead from Georgia. The Seminoles finished strong in the fourth and final round outlasting Georgia on the last hole to win the tournament by three strokes.

Seminole junior Lisa Young, who won three LPGA events later in her career, finished in third place in the individual standings - only one shot behind the champions. Florida State's Barb Bunkowsky finished in a tie for 14th. Jane Geddes, the 1986 U.S. Women's Open and 1987 LPGA Championship winner, finished tied for 31st. Michele Guilbault finished 57th and Marla Anderson finished in a tie for 73rd.

Young and Guilbault earned All-America First Team honors while Bunkowsky were honored with All-American Second Team honors. Four of the six members of the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame were on the Seminoles' National Championship team including Young, Bunkowsky, Guilbault and Geddes.





COMMUNITY SERVICE / PAINT IT PINK

The Seminole women's golf team is an annual participant in the Tee Off For Tots program sponsored by the Tallahassee Memorial Health Care Foundation. The program has been developed to help spread awareness of juvenile diabetes. The pediatric team at the Diabetes Center at TMH works alongside children in the Big Bend communities and supports the program in local and regional school systems. Through the program, children learn about the disease and ways to develop a healthy lifestyle.

The Tee Off For Tots Golf Tournament, held annually at Golden Eagle Country Club, helps make the program successful. Funds generated from the tournament go directly into the program and is one largest fund raising activities sponsored by the foundation each year.



The Paint it Pink campaign helps spread breast cancer awareness. COMMUNITY SERVICE / DIRECTORS CUP

The Florida State University women's golf team has won the prestigious Athletic Director's Cup for Community Service in 13 of the last 14 years. The award is presented each year at the Golden 'Nole Banquet – one of the most important banquets of the year for all of Florida State's student athletes.

The Athletic Director's Cup for Service began during the 1996-1997 academic year in order to promote community service participation among all teams. The annual award recognizes the thousands of hours of community service Florida State student-athletes donate each year. Seminole student-athletes logged more than 4,300 community service hours in 2013 - an increase of 500 hours from last year. The women's golf team combined for 371.5 total hours of community service for an average of 33.8 hours per team member.

The members of the women's golf team donated their time to the Dick Howser Center, Refugee House of Tallahassee, mentoring and tutoring at Godby High School and to the YES Clinic at the 2002 ACC Women's Soccer Tournament held in Tallahassee.

"Winning the cup is important to us as a team and as people as well, said head coach Amy Bond.

The women's golf team donates much of its time to the Dick Howser Center for Childhood Services in Tallahassee every Friday during the school year. The organization in named for late Dick Howser, former Seminole head baseball coach and manager of the New York Yankees and Kansas City Royals. The center is a charitable organization that receives monetary support from the citizens of Tallahassee and its surrounding communities.

"Community service is an important part of our lives as student-athletes at Florida State," said junior Alex Milan. "We enjoy participating in the community service activities we are involved in. It's a part of what we do as members of the women's golf team at Florida State."













ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

Consistency.

It is the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 61st year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

In women's golf, Duke is second in all-time NCAA championships with its five titles (1999, 2002, 2005, 2006 and 2007), only trailing Arizona State's seven. Miami claimed one NCAA national title in 1984, before joining the ACC. Duke is tied with Southern California for third in NCAA individual champions, claiming three national medalists - Candy Hannemann (2001), Virada Nirapathpongporn (2002), and Anna Grzebien (2005).

The ACC currently has 12 teams competing in women's golf with the newest additions being Miami, (2004), Boston College, (2005) and Notre Dame (2013).

The conference recognized women's golf as a conference sport in 1984-1986 when a minimum of four teams (Duke, North Carolina, NC State and Wake Forest) competed. After a five-year hiatus, women's golf became a sponsored sport once again in 1992 with Duke, Florida State, North Carolina and Wake Forest competing. Maryland joined the ranks during the 2000 season, while NC State joined the following year (2001).

Duke has won 18 ACC championships, followed by Wake Forest (5) and North Carolina (1). Duke leads the schools in ACC individual championships with 14, followed by Wake Forest (6) and North Carolina (2).

Eight of the 12 women's golf teams (Duke, Florida State, Miami, Notre Dame, North Carolina, NC State, Virginia and Wake Forest) were represented at the NCAA Regionals in 2014. The 10 schools that will carry the ACC banner this search bear produced 75 forth respect to the ALL American bear words and 75 forth respect to the ALL Americans. son have produced 75 first or second team All-Americans, five National Player of the Years, four NGCA Division I Player of the Years, three national Freshman of the Years, and six National Coach of the Years.
